WHEREAS by "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1902" (1 and 2 Edwardi VII., No. 20), and "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1905" (5 Edwardi VII., No. 22), the Governor may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, after the opinion of the Road Board of the District has been requested, close any road or reservation for a road which may have been surveyed or shown as a road on any plan published by the Department of Lands and Surveys: Provided such road is not within the limit of a Municipality, and has not been declared a Government road or a road under "The Roads Act," or any Act amending the same: AND WHEREAS the roads hereinafter described have been surveyed and shown as roads on the under-mentioned plans as published by the Department of Lands and Surveys: AND it is desirable to close such roads: AND WHEREAS the opinion of the undermentioned Road Boards has been requested: NOW THEREFORE I, Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, G.C. B., Governor as aforesaid, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the said surveyed roads to be closed.

PUBLIC RESERVE 10250.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of South Perth made under Section 167 of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," and in pursuance of the Act No. 5 of 1906, for the General Management of Public Reserve No. 10250.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Acts, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of South Perth order as follows.

Passed this 26th day of October, 1906.

Hours.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public at all hours free of charge, but subject to the restrictions hereinafter contained.

Injury to things.

2. No person shall pluck any of the flowers, or walk on the beds or borders or greens, nor pull up or dig or otherwise disturb any grass, or climb upon or get through or over the fences, or remove or injure any of the fences, buildings or flags, nor disturb, damage or destroy any of the property or things within the bounds of the Reserve.

Shooting.

3. No person shall carry or discharge firearms through or on the Reserve, or shoot, snare or destroy any birds or animals, except as in the next paragraph mentioned.

Dogs, Goats, etc.

4. All dogs, goats, and poultry found within the Reserve may be destroyed by any of the persons hereinafter referred to as being authorised to prosecute for breaches of this by-law, and the owner shall make compensation, to be recovered before any Justice of the Peace, for any damage done by such dogs, goats, or poultry.

Works.

5. During the constructing, building, making, repairing, or maintaining of any beds, borders, or greens, links, buildings, or other improvements, no person shall interfere with the workmen, gardeners, caretakers, or rangers, or do, or cause to be done, any act which will, or may be likely to interfere with, or prevent such constructing, building, making, repairing, or maintaining.

Misconduct.

6. Any person in a state of intoxication or misconducting himself or herself shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve.

Rubbish.

7. No person shall deposit rubbish or any offensive matter on any part of the Reserve.

Fires.

8. No person other than the workmen, gardeners, caretakers, or rangers referred to in paragraph 5 hereof shall light any fire on the Reserve.

Games.

9. In the event of the lease or permit of the Reserve being granted to any person or persons, or club, for the purpose of enabling any particular game or games to be established on the Reserve, then so long as such lease or permit remains in force, no game shall be played on the Reserve which may prevent, hamper, interfere, or compete with such person or persons, or club in the use of the Reserve for the purposes set forth in such lease or permit, and no person shall do or cause to be done anything which will, or may be likely to interfere or compete with such person or persons or club, in any manner, in commencing, playing, or carrying on such game or games.

Enforcement.

10. Any member of the South Perth Council, or the Town Clerk or acting Town Clerk, or Engineer to the South Perth Municipality, or any person authorised under the seal of the South Perth Municipality, or in the event of the Reserve being leased to any person or persons or club, such lessee or permit-holder, or any person authorised by such lessee or permit-holder, shall have power to enforce this by-law and take any proceedings hereunder at any time.

Penalties.

11. Any person offending against any part of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 for each offence.

MUNICIPALITY OF BOULDER.

BY-LAW No. 80.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Boulder, made under Section 167 of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," and numbered 80, to prohibit betting or wagering in any street or way within the Municipality of Boulder.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Boulder order as follows:—

1. Any person who shall frequent or use any street or way within the Municipality of Boulder, either on behalf of himself or any other person, for the purpose of bookmaking or betting or wagering, or agreeing to bet or wager with any person, or paying or receiving or settling bets, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

2. Any person who shall, together with any other person or persons, assemble in any street or way for the purpose of betting or wagering, or agreeing to bet or wager, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

NARROGIN LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH BY-LAWS.

WHEREAS by "The Health Act, 1898," and "The Health Act, Amendment Act, 1900," the Local Board of Health may make By-laws, and also by the provisions contained in said Acts may amend, alter, or repeal any by-laws so made: Now, therefore, the Narrogin Local Board of Health hereby amends its By-laws as follows:—

By-law No. 24 is amended by omission of the words "person shall erect any," in the first line of paragraph "a," and the insertion in the second line of the said paragraph, after the word "urinal," of the words "shall be situated."

Schedule "A" is hereby amended to read as follows:—

- (1.) Removal of night-soil or urine pans, including removal of five cubic feet of household refuse from each premises per week, and all works or duties incidental thereto, thirty shillings and four pence (30s. 4d.) per annum per pan, payable by weekly instalments of sevenpence per week, and the same sum for each additional nightsoil or urine pan per removal, the contractor paying to the Board upon the first day of every month the sum of one half-penny for each and every pan removal effected during the previous month.
- (2.) Removal of contents of extra household refuse and other refuse receptacles including all works or duties incidental thereto, per five cubic feet: One shilling.
- (3.) Removal of slops or other foul liquids, including all works or duties incidental thereto, at per 10 gallons and at per gallon over: One shilling and sixpence per 10 gallons; twopence per gallon over.
- (4.) Typhoid services, including all works or duties incidental thereto: Sevenpence per pan per removal.
- (5.) Removal and destruction of carcases of horses, camels, or cattle: Seven shillings and sixpence per head.
- (6.) Removal and destruction of carcases of goats, pigs, or dogs: Two shillings and sixpence per head.
- (7.) Removal and destruction of carcases of other domestic animals: One shilling per head.

In case the owners of such carcasses or the occupiers of the premises cannot be found, then the Board shall pay the contractor.

SUBIACO LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH BY-LAWS.

WHEREAS by "The Health Act, 1898," and "The Health Act Amendment Act, 1900," a Local Board may make By-laws: And whereas a Local Board may amend, alter, or repeal such By-laws: Now, therefore, the Local Board of Health of the Municipality of Subiaco hereby amends its By-laws by the addition of the following By-law:—

Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk under a subsisting license heretofore granted by the Subiaco Local Board of Health, and every person who shall become registered under this By-law as hereinafter mentioned, shall, within 15 days from and after 1st day of January in every year, register himself with the Local Board in manner hereinafter following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary an application in the form hereunder written; and every person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of £1, excepting that when registration is made after the 1st day of July a fee of 10s. only shall be paid. Provided that any unlicensed person who shall be carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk at the time of the coming into force of this By-law shall, within 15 days thereafter, and every person hereafter about to carry on the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, previous to carrying on such trade, register himself under this By-law.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulation under the provisions of Section 161 of "The Land Act, 1898":—

No person shall, without the special permission in writing of the Minister for Lands or his agent (such permission only to be given where the timber is required for use within the boundaries of the said State Forest), fell, cut, split, or remove any timber growing or standing on the area of Crown land hereafter to be known and distinguished as Mt. Monger State Forest, the boundaries of which are described hereunder:—

Bounded on the South and West by lines starting from a point on the East boundary of Hampton Location 45, situate 160 chains from its South-East corner, and extending East 600 chains, and North 450 chains; the opposite boundaries being parallel and equal.

Any person offending against this Regulation shall, on conviction, be subject to a penalty not exceeding £20.

GUANO.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING THE REMOVAL OF GUANO.

*Department of Lands and Surveys,
Perth, 16th January, 1907.*

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations respecting the removal of Guano existing upon islands or coasts within the territorial limits of Western Australia; and to repeal all former Regulations:—

Minister may issue Licenses.

1. The Minister for Lands may, at his discretion, license the master of any vessel to collect and remove guano. The license shall be deemed to be under the Act 40 Victoria, No. IX.

Classes and forms of Licenses.

2. A license to remove guano shall be either General, Special, or Exclusive, according to the forms annexed.

General License.

3. A general license shall apply, save as excepted under these regulations, to all coasts and islands within the territorial limits of the State. It shall only be issued in exceptional cases, to encourage the discovery and utilisation of new deposits of guano. Localities comprised within any previously issued exclusive license, or localities which the Minister for Lands may deem it desirable to reserve, shall be excepted from the operation of a general license, and so noted thereon. The localities comprised within any subsequently issued exclusive license shall also be excepted from the operation of a general license, but not until the exclusive license has been exhibited by the holder thereof, or his agent, to the master of the vessel acting under the general license.

Special License.

4. A special license shall apply to localities specified and described therein, but shall not exclude the holder of a general license, or the holder of any other special license, applicable to the same locality.

Exclusive License.

5. An exclusive license shall only be issued to the master of a vessel the owners or charterers of which are under special agreement with the Government to remove the whole of the guano in a particular locality. An exclusive license shall confer the sole right to guano in the locality specified therein.

Licenses not transferable.

6. A license under these Regulations shall not be transferable, and shall apply only to the vessel named therein, and the voyage therein referred to.

Guano not to be exported.

7. Every license shall be for the removal of guano for use in the State and not for export, and the Minister for Lands may require the licensee to enter into a bond with one or more sureties to duly observe this regulation.

Royalty on Guano.

8. A royalty of one shilling per ton, calculated on the registered tonnage of the vessel, shall be paid to the Minister for Lands or a duly authorised officer before the issue of any license to collect guano; but this charge may, in the case of an exclusive license, be increased by the Governor in Executive Council.

Term of Licenses not to exceed 12 months.

9. Licenses shall be for a period not exceeding 12 months, to be fixed by the Minister for Lands.

Minister may impose further conditions.

10. Licenses shall be subject to any special conditions and limitations which the Minister for Lands may deem it proper to indorse thereon.

Minister for Lands to supervise removal of Guano.

11. Guano shall be removed under the direction and supervision of the Minister for Lands or of his agent resident upon the spot. The Minister or his agent may mark off spaces from which only the guano is to be taken, and may order accordingly, and shall prevent waste and unprofitable working of the deposits.

Penalties. Revocation of License.

12. Holders of licenses and their agents are liable to the penalties specified in Act 40 Victoria, No. IX., in respect of any act not duly covered by the terms of their licenses and these Regulations; and the license of any ship infringing the conditions of the license, or of these Regulations, or any order thereunder, shall be held to be revoked, on intimation to that effect given to the master of the ship or his principals by the Minister for Lands or his agent.

Government do not guarantee Guano.

13. The Government will not be responsible for the quantity or quality of any guano licensed to be removed under these Regulations.

Questions to be decided by Governor in Executive Council.

14. Licenses under these Regulations shall be subject to the condition that any question or matter in dispute arising between the Government and the holder of a license shall be referred for the decision of the Governor in Executive Council, and that such decision shall be final and binding upon both parties.

LOWER GASCOYNE ROAD BOARD.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws of the Lower Gascoyne Road Board, under Section 117 of the Roads Act (2 Edward VII., No. 48).

WHEREAS by virtue of the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1902" (2 Edward VII., No. 48), the Road Board of every district is empowered to make, publish, alter, modify, amend, or repeal by-laws for any of the purposes of the said Act mentioned: It is therefore ordered by the Lower Gascoyne Road Board that from and after the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette* the following Special By-laws relating to the registration of camels, licensing of camel-drivers and bicycles, tricycles, motor cars, etc., shall come into force.

LOWER GASCOYNE ROAD DISTRICT.

SPECIAL BY-LAWS FOR THE REGISTRATION OF CAMELS AND THE LICENSING OF CAMEL-DRIVERS, AND FOR THE LICENSING OF BICYCLES, TRICYCLES, AND MOTOR CARS, AND REGULATING THE USE THEREOF.

The Lower Gascoyne Road Board, in exercise of the powers conferred by "The Roads Act, 1902," and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make the following by-laws:—

CAMELS TO BE REGISTERED.

1. No person shall own, keep, or use within the Road District (hereinafter referred to as "the District") any camel unless such camel is registered for the time being at the office of the Road Board of the said District. Provided that no person shall be required to register a camel under this By-law during such time as the camel is duly registered in the office of some other Road District.

APPLICATION FOR REGISTRATION.

2. Application for registration shall be made to the Secretary to the Board by writing in the Form "A" in the Schedule, and shall contain the particulars indicated thereby, and shall be signed by the applicant or his agent.

REGISTRATION FEES.

3. The following fees shall be payable on registration of camels plying for hire:—

In respect of every bull camel over three years of age	£1 per annum.
In respect of every camel used for packing—	
For every bull camel under three years of age	£1 per annum.
For every cow or gelding	10s. per annum.
In respect of every camel used for draught only (except bull camels over three years of age)	10s. per annum.

Provided that no registration fee shall be payable in respect of camels used solely by prospectors for prospecting purposes.

CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION.

4. A certificate of registration shall be issued by the Secretary to the Board to the applicant in the Form "B" in the Schedule.

DURATION.

5. Every registration shall expire on the thirty-first day of December in the year for which such registration is effected.

REGISTRATION DISCS.

6. On the annual registration of every camel the Board will issue to the applicant a registration disc inscribed with the name of the district and the registration number.

Every person in charge for the time being of such camel shall keep the disc attached to the neck of the camel.

CAMEL-DRIVERS' LICENSES.

7. No person shall drive any camel or camels within the district unless he is the holder of a camel-driver's license in force for the time being issued by the Board of the said district, or unless he is the holder of a license in force for the time being issued by the Board of some other road district.

FORM OF LICENSE.

8. A camel-driver's license shall be in the Form "C" in the schedule, and the licensee shall be required to sign his name in the margin thereof before the license is issued to him.

LICENSE FEE.

9. The fee payable for a camel-driver's license shall be five shillings per annum.

DURATION OF LICENSE.

10. Every camel-driver's license shall expire on the thirty-first day of December in the year for which it was granted.

TRANSFER.

11. A camel-driver's license shall be transferable by indorsement at the office of the Board on payment of a fee of one shilling, the transferee to sign his name in margin thereof.

LICENSE AND REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE TO BE PRODUCED.

12. Every camel-driver shall produce his camel-driver's license and the certificate of registration for each and every camel in his charge whenever called upon so to do by any constable or officer of police or any member or officer of the Road Board.

LIMIT OF NUMBER OF CAMELS TO BE DRIVEN.

13. No person shall at the same time drive or take the charge of more than eleven camels, whether draught or pack camels, or partly draught and partly pack camels.

CAMELS TO GIVE PLACE TO HORSES, ETC.

14. Every camel-driver or other person driving or having the charge of any camel or camels on any road or track, or at any well or watering place, shall, at the request of any person in charge of any horse or mule, forthwith remove any camel or camels which he is driving, or of which he is in charge, to a distance of not less than a quarter of a mile from such road, track, well, or watering place.

UNREGISTERED CAMELS MAY BE DESTROYED.

15. Any unregistered camel found straying in any part of the Board's district may be seized and either sold or destroyed, after such camel has been advertised for three weeks in some paper circulated in the district; the owner shall be liable to pay to the Board the cost and expense incurred, in addition to registration fees.

PENALTY FOR SUFFERING CAMELS TO STRAY.

16. If any camel is suffered to stray, the owner thereof and any person who having been in charge thereof has suffered it to stray shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

PENALTY FOR DRIVING DISEASED CAMELS.

17. If any person drives or rides any camel suffering from any infectious or contagious disease on any road within the district, he shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

PUBLIC WATERING PLACES NOT TO BE USED BY DISEASED CAMELS.

18. No camel suffering from any infectious or contagious disease shall be allowed to water at any public watering place.

Any person who, having as owner, driver, or otherwise, the custody of any camel suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, permits such camel to water at any public watering place, shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

DISEASED CAMELS MAY BE DESTROYED.

19. It shall be lawful for any officer of the Board or any person acting with the authority of the Board or of any officer of the Board to slaughter or destroy any camels found suffering from any infectious or contagious disease on any road.

CYCLES AND MOTOR CARS TO BE LICENSED.

20. No person shall use any bicycle, tricycle, or motor car in the district unless such bicycle, tricycle, or motor car is licensed.

Provided that if a license is taken out for a bicycle, tricycle, or motor car by any person in the district in which he resides he shall not be required to take out a license in any other district.

FORM OF LICENSE.

21. A bicycle, tricycle, or motor car license shall be in the form "D" in the schedule, and application for the same shall be made to the Secretary to the Road Board at the office of the Board.

FEE.

The fee for every bicycle, tricycle, and motor car license shall be five shillings per annum.

DURATION.

22. Every license for a bicycle, tricycle, or motor car shall expire on the thirty-first day of December in the year for which it was issued.

NUMBER TO BE AFFIXED.

23. Every licensee of a bicycle, tricycle, or motor car shall affix and keep affixed the license number on some conspicuous part of the bicycle, tricycle, or motor car.

DISCS.

[Alternative 23. On the issue of every license for a bicycle, tricycle, or motor car, the Board will issue to the licensee a disc inscribed with the name of the district and the number of the license.

The licensee and every person for the time being in charge of the bicycle, tricycle, or motor car shall keep the said disc attached to some conspicuous part of the bicycle, tricycle, or motor car.]

RIDING ON FOOTPATHS PROHIBITED.

24. No person shall ride or impel a bicycle, tricycle, or motor car of any kind upon any footpath within the district.

LAMP TO BE CARRIED.

25. No person shall, between the hours of sunset and sunrise, ride a bicycle, tricycle, or motor car along any road unless there is attached thereto a lamp which shall exhibit a white light in the direction in which he is proceeding, and at all times be kept lighted.

BELL TO BE USED.

26. Every bicycle, tricycle, or motor car shall carry a bell or other instrument suitable for giving warning of approach, which shall be used as a signal whenever any person on foot or horseback or vehicle is being approached or passed.

ROADS AND FOOTPATHS NOT TO BE OBSTRUCTED.

27. No person shall leave any bicycle, tricycle, or motor car in or on any road or footway so as to become an obstruction, and every person shall remove his bicycle, tricycle, or motor car immediately upon being requested to do so by any police officer or constable or member or officer of the Board.

SPEED.

28. No person riding on a bicycle, tricycle, or motor car shall pass, at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour, any person who shall be riding or driving any horse or other animal.

TO DISMOUNT ON MEETING RESTIVE HORSE.

29. When a cyclist or motorist meets a horse or other animal, and such horse or other animal becomes restive, or appears likely to get beyond the control of the person in charge thereof, such cyclist or motorist shall dismount, and remain dismounted till such horse or other animal has been passed.

SPEED ON TURNING CORNERS.

30. No person shall ride any cycle, bicycle, tricycle, or motor car round the corner formed by the junction of any roads in the district, or across the intersection of any of the said roads, at a pace exceeding six miles an hour.

PENALTIES.

31. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of the foregoing By-laws, or commits, or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and any person guilty of an offence against these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

SOUTH GUILDFORD WATER DISTRICT.

BY-LAW No. 87.

Water rates shall be levied upon the net annual value of all rateable land within the South Guildford Water District at the rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum.

The minimum sum payable as rate on each separately assessed property in the South Guildford Water District shall be Ten shillings per annum on vacant land and One pound per annum upon all other land.

Every ratepayer in the South Guildford Water District will be entitled to consume on each separately assessed property for which he is rated that quantity of water which, if calculated at One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons, would amount to the equivalent of the water rate paid on such property, provided that such water is taken during the period for which the rate is struck, and that the maximum to be taken in consideration of the rate for any one-half of a year shall not exceed one-half of the quantity to which the consumer is entitled in respect of an annual rate.
