BY virtue of the Ordinance 18 Victoria, No. 15, and of the Act 37 Victoria, No. 14, and all other Acts and Ordinances conferring powers on me in this behalf, I, the

Additional Regulation for the Navigation of the Swan River.

41. The speed of passenger steamers on the Swan River shall not exceed five knots when passing to and fro between the notice "SLOW" in Rocky Bay and North Fremantle Road Bridge, also when navigating the Narrows Channel and Channel leading to Barrack Street Jetties.

WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 39 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order, and with power of leasing for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of the lease: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that Reserve ²²⁵⁴₁₉₀₅ 9837 (Yundamindera) should vest in and be held by the Honourable Minister for Mines: NOW, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Honourable Minister for Mines in trust for "Explosives," with power to the said Honourable Minister for Mines to lease the whole or any portion of the said Reserve for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of the lease.

The Royal Warrant signifying His Majesty's pleasure in this behalf is dated the 29th November, 1906, and is to the following effect:—

EDWARD R. & I.

EDWARD THE SEVENTH, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting!

Whereas We, by a Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual, countersigned by one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, and bearing date at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, the eighth day of August, in the year of Our Lord nineteen hundred and two, and the second year of Our Reign, did institute and create a new Civil Order of Distinction to be styled and designated the Imperial Service Order:

Now, therefore, We do, by these Presents for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, ordain and appoint that the Imperial Service Order shall rank next to, and immediately after, Our Distinguished Service Order, and before the Fifth Class of Our Royal Victorian Order, and the Companions thereof shall, in all places and assemblies whatsoever, have place and precedence next to, and immediately after, the Companions of the Distinguished Service Order, and shall rank among themselves according to the dates of their respective nominations.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve the following By-Law made by the Burtville Local Board of Health.

WHEREAS by "The Health Act, 1898," and "The Health Act Amendment Act, 1900," a Local Board of Health may make By-laws, and in particular and by virtue of the provisions of Section 194 of "The Health Act, 1898," may in respect to any specified river, creek, or stream, make by-laws providing that no person shall discharge, or cause or allow to be discharged any offensive matter or drainage into any such river, creek, or stream: Now, therefore, the Local Board of Health of the District of Burtville does hereby make the following By-law:—

- (1.) No person shall cause, suffer, or permit any animal to graze or wander or remain within 100 yards of the creeks known as Tempest Creek, Karridale Creek, Bell's Creek, Riddle Creek, Mikado Creek, and Carib Creek, situated near Burtville.
- (2.) No person shall discharge, or cause, or allow to be discharged any offensive matter, or drainage, into the said Tempest Creek, Karridale Creek, Bell's Creek, Riddle Creek, Mikado Creek, and Carib Creek.

And to exempt the following machinery (in addition to that specified in Section 4 of "The Inspection of Machinery Act, 1904":—"All machinery to which "The Inspection of Machinery Act, 1904" now applies, or any machinery which may hereafter be added to Schedule II. where the maximum horse power of the engine or motor used in connection therewith is under one-horse power. AMENDMENTS AND ADDITIONS.

Regulation 6.—(1.) Amended by adding after word "Revenue," last line:—

"Or if a candidate absents himself from an examination without sufficient reasonable excuse, his application fee may be forfeited."

(2.) (c.) Amended by adding after the word "duties," last line:—

"Provided that in certain cases applications for Engine-drivers' certificates may be received without a medical certificate, but a certificate shall not be issued under the Act until after the production of a satisfactory medical certificate, as provided by the Act."

Regulation 15.—New clause (f.)—"Provided that where an applicant has had experience on only one engine or class of engine the Board may restrict the privileges conferred by any of the certificates mentioned in clauses (a.), (b.), (c.), (d.), and (e)."

Regulation 17.—Clause (c.) amended by adding after the word "diameter," last line:—

"This clause shall not apply to an applicant who has served an apprenticeship of at least four years as an engineer, and has been employed on the making or repairing of steam engines, boilers, etc., for at least three years, or if he has not served an apprenticeship he must prove that for not less than three years he has been employed as a journeyman mechanic in a factory or workshop in the making or repairing of engines."

Regulation 19.—Clause (c.) amended by striking out the words "commencement of this Act," in sixth line, and inserting "date of examination" in lieu thereof; and

By striking out the words "Six (6) months prior to the commencement of the Act," and inserting "twelve (12) months prior to the date of examination" in lieu thereof.

Regulation 38.—Amended by striking out the words "or either of them," in line five.

Regulation 40.—Clause (a) amended by inserting after the word "Certificate," second line, "of similar grade."

First Schedule.—Amended by striking out the words "Outside the State" after the word authority.

THE annexed report and finding of the Chief Harbour Master, under the provisions of "The Navigation Act, 1904," relative to the preliminary inquiry held by him into the circumstances attending the damage to three blades of the propeller of the steamer "Cape Corso" by striking the Bunbury Jetty when being berthed on the West side on the 18th February last, has been approved by the Hon. the Minister.

From the Chief Harbour Master to the Under Secretary.

I have the honour to report, for the information of the Hon. the Minister, having held a preliminary inquiry at Bunbury on the 1st and 2nd inst. into the circumstances attending the damage to three blades of the propeller of the steamer "Cape Corso" by striking the Bunbury Jetty when being berthed on the West side on the 18th February last.

The "Cape Corso" is a steel screw steamer, 2,510 tons register, official number 117396, Colin McLeod, Master, and owned by the Cape Corso S.S. Company of Greenock.

After taking the evidence of the Master, Harbour Master (who was the Pilot in Charge at the time of accident), the Chief Mate, the Third Mate, the Chief Mate of the s.s. "Glenlyon," then berthed on the East side of the jetty and the Assistant Pilot (who was standing on the jetty at the time of the accident), I find that the steamer "Cape Corso" arrived at Bunbury and anchored in Koombana Bay on the 18th February last. On the same day, after obtaining pratique, the vessel was boarded by the Harbour Master and Pilot (Captain J. G. Abrahamson) about 2:30 p.m., to remove her to a berth on the West side of the jetty. The vessel was got under way about 3 p.m., and the Pilot proceeded in the usual course for berthing a vessel on the West side, taking a sweep or circle to square the vessel up for the jetty. There is some conflicting evidence of the amount of way the vessel was carrying when nearing her allotted berth, but when near her berth, and the order was given to reverse the engine astern, the vessel canted her head very quickly to starboard, which threw her stern or quarter on to the jetty, and though the order was given to stop the engines, the notice does not appear to have been sufficient, as the engines at the time of contact were turning over with the power of the vacuum and the remaining steam.

My finding is that the vessel's quarter and propeller were brought into conflict with the jetty owing to the Pilot having given the ship a little too much way ahead in bringing her towards her berth, which had the result, when the engines were put astern, of swinging the ship's head to starboard and her port quarter towards the jetty, causing the propeller blades to touch the piles. The Harbour Master was not guilty of any carelessness or want of attention to his duties as Pilot, but committed a slight error of judgment in calculating the speed of the vessel.

REGULATIONS TO BE STRICTLY OBSERVED WITH A VIEW TO EFFECTING ECONOMY IN THE PRINTING AND PUBLICATION OF THE "GOVERNMENT GAZETTE."

1. The *Government Gazette* will be published once a week—on Friday, unless otherwise interfered with by Public Holidays or other unforeseen circumstances, when the alteration will be duly notified.

2. Supplements to the *Gazette* will only be published when approved by a Minister, except such as are required by statutory obligation or to meet the special requirements of the Colonial Treasurer.

3. Notices for insertion in the *Gazette* must be sent to the Government Printing Office in reasonable time—none later than 10 o'clock of the day preceding the day of publication, and when possible, several days before that time.

4. Proofs of Departmental Notices will be supplied, but must be returned not later than 3 p.m. of the day preceding the day of publication, and duly certified for issue by a responsible officer.

5. Notices or proofs delayed beyond the time mentioned will be held over for insertion in the following issue.

6. Wherever possible, in order to economise space without altering the sense, Notices shall be grouped, or tabulated with one date and signature.

7. Notices should bear the date of the *Gazette* in which they are first to be inserted, unless there are special reasons for giving any Notice a different date.

8. Every Notice forwarded for publication in the *Gazette* must show the number of insertions required, and the responsibility of indicating the requirements of the law in that respect will rest with the Department from which it issues. Unless so notified, only one insertion will be made.

9. When any Notice is marked for more than one insertion it must be stated whether such Notice should be published in full in each issue or in the first issue only. If only one insertion in full is necessary, abbreviated notice should be furnished for subsequent insertions. Nothing in this Regulation will affect the Government Printer's right to repeat a notice when required for "make-up" purposes.

10. Care must be exercised in the preparation of Departmental Notices for the *Gazette*, to save as far as possible corrections, alterations, and additions when in type. The Notices should be legibly written on one side of the paper only. Signatures and proper names must be written very plainly in the text. All documents illegibly written will be returned unpublished.

11. Demands for copies of Notices which appear in the *Gazette* should be sent in with the MS. or the returned proofs. Such demands should be as limited as possible, and not made unless necessary.

12. Private advertisements forwarded for publication in the *Gazette* must be written on one side of the paper only, and must be legible (signatures and proper names in particular), otherwise they will be returned unpublished. Such Notices must be paid for prior to insertion.
