# BY-LAWS OF THE MOUNT MARGARET ROAD BOARD.

THE Mount Margaret Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

Whereas by "The Roads Act, 1902," and the amendments thereto, the Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned: It is hereby resolved by the Board of the District of Mount Margaret, by and with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the following By-laws shall be in force within the said District from the date of the publication thereof in the Government Gazette.

#### CHAPTER I.—THE INTERPRETATION.

- 1. In these By-laws the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meanings set against them respectively, that is to say:
  - "District."—The Mount Margaret Road Board District.
  - "Board."—The Board of the said District.
  - "Chairman."—The member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board.
  - "Member."—A member of the Board.
  - "Secretary."—The Secretary of the Board,
  - "The Acts."—"The Roads Act, 1902," and amendments.
  - "Meeting." -- A meeting of the Board.
  - "Road" or "Reserve."—A public road or reserve, as the case may be, under the control of the Board.

#### CHAPTER II.—THE BOARD.

2. The Board shall consist of seven members, elected by the ratepayers as laid down in the Act.

#### Vacancies.

- 3. If any member be absent without leave from three consecutive ordinary meetings, his seat may be declared vacant.
- 4. The Board shall commence business as soon after the time appointed as there is a sufficient number of members present to form a quorum.
- 5. Three members shall form a quorum for the transaction of business.
- 6. If, after 30 minutes of the time appointed for the meeting, there be no quorum, the meeting shall stand adjourned.

#### Meetings and proceedings.

- 7. Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds, ordinary and special. It shall rest with the Chairman and any three members to exclude the public when, in their opinion, it is expedient to do so, providing the business before the Board warrants such action being taken.
- 8. Meetings shall be held at the office of the Board on the second Tuesday in the month at 8 p.m., unless otherwise arranged by resolution carried to that effect at the last ordinary meeting of the Board.
- 9. The Chairman may call a meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper, by giving each member due notice. No business shall be transacted at an ordinary or special meeting unless at least three of the members of the Board, inclusive of the Chairman or member chosen to preside in his absence, shall be present; and no business shall be transacted other than that for which the special meeting was called, unless urgent.

#### Notice of meetings.

- 10. Notice shall be given by the Chairman or Secretary of ordinary or special meetings at least 24 hours before such meeting, and also of every meeting adjourned for a term exceeding two days.
- 11. The Chairman, if present, shall preside at all meetings of ratepayers and of the Board, and, in his absence, or if, after being present, he shall retire, one of the members of the Board, chosen by the ratepayers or members present, as the case may be, shall preside.
- 12. The Chairman shall preserve order at all meetings, and his decision, subject to the provision of No. 21 of these By-laws, shall be final and binding upon every member.

#### Votina.

13. Each member, including the Chairman, shall have one vote, and such Chairman shall, in case of an equality of votes, have a casting vote in addition to his ordinary vote, and all questions at such meeting shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present.

#### Minutes of proceedings.

- 14. (a.) In addition to the minute book prescribed to be kept by the Act, a rough minute book shall be kept, in which any item of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be then and there entered by the Secretary and subsequently re-entered by him in the manner prescribed by the Act in the minute book.
- (b.) Minutes of special or ordinary meetings shall be confirmed at the next subsequent ordinary meeting.
- (c.) No discussion shall take place upon the minutes of proceedings except as to their accuracy, or for the rectification of a clerical error.

#### Order of business.

- 15. The order of business at all ordinary meetings shall be as follows, that is to say—
  - (a.) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary and of special meeting (if any).
  - (b.) Consideration of business arising out of minutes
  - (c.) Reading of correspondence (in and out) and taking such immediate action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto.
  - (d.) Presentation of petitions or memorials, or committee reports and consideration thereof.
  - (e.) Consideration of tenders.
  - (f.) General business.
  - (g.) Passing of accounts for payment.
- 16. A petition shall be presented only by a member who makes himself responsible for the respectful nature of its language, and as far as possible acquaints himself, before presentation, with the subject to which it refers.

#### Call to order.

- 17. It shall be competent for any member to rise to order, on which the member speaking must at once resume his seat and remain silent until the point of order has been clearly but briefly stated by the member who has risen.
- 18. The Chairman must thereupon decide the point of order or practice, and, if required, cite the rule applicable to the case, without argument or comment.
- 19. It is then competent for any member, not being the member interrupted by the member who rose to order, to demand that the sense of the Board be taken on the point, when the majority shall prevail, and be final and binding on every member.

#### The speaker shall not digress.

20. A member having audience shall not digress from the subject of debate.

#### Motions and amendments.

- 21. (a.) A motion once moved at a meeting cannot be withdrawn, unless by consent of the Board.
- (b.) One amendment may be proposed on a motion before the Board, and the amendment shall be put first.
- (c.) A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, or put by the Chairman.
- (d.) In submitting a motion or an amendment, the Chairman must put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.

#### Amendment becomes a substantive motion.

(e.) When an amendment is carried, the motion as amended thereby becomes a substantive motion, upon which a further amendment may be moved before it is finally dealt with.

#### Appointment of Committee.

- 22. The Board may, at any meeting, appoint three or more members as a Committee to inquire into any matter, and make a report thereon, but no Committee shall incur any financial liability, or commit the Board to any re-sponsibility whatever, without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws or by a resolution of the Board.
- 23. The quorum of a committee of three shall comprise two members.

#### Financial accounts.

- All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the Board by the Chairman at the ordinary meetings, and after being certified as correct shall be paid by cheque.
- 25. An account shall be opened with such bank as the Board may direct, and all moneys received, from whatever source, shall be paid into such bank to the credit of the Board, and no account shall be paid except by cheque signed by the Chairman of the Board together with another member of the Board and Secretary.
- All moneys shall, within seven days after they have come into the hands of the Board, or of any of its officers, servants, or clerks, for the use of such Board, be paid into such bank.
- 27. The accounts shall be balanced annually up to an 30th June in each year, and, after such balancing, the auditor or auditors shall audit the said accounts as pro-

#### Urgent work.

28. Any one member may, in case of urgency, authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding £3, but shall in every case report the same at the next following meeting of the Board.

#### Unauthorised work.

Every item of expenditure and every liability incurred by any committee or member of the Board, otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure.

#### Appointments.

30. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board.

#### Bonds.

31. Every officer whose duty it is to receive or have the custody of moneys, the property of the Board, may be required to furnish a fidelity bond to such amount as the Board may direct.

#### Guarantee.

32. The Board may require a deposit to be made as guarantee on any contract taken from the Board.

#### Camels to be registered.

33. No person shall own, keep, or use within the district any camel, unless such camel is registered for the time being at the office of the Road Board of the said district: Provided that no person shall be required to register a camel under these By-laws during such time as the camel is duly registered in the office of some other road district.

#### Application for registration.

34. Application for registration shall be made to the Secretary to the Board by writing in the Form "A" in the Schedule, and shall contain the particulars indicated thereby, and shall be signed by the applicant or his agent.

#### $Registration \, fees.$

35. The following fees shall be payable on registration of camels plying for hire:—

In respect of every bull camel over three years of age, £1 per annum. In respect of every camel used for packing— For every bull camel under three years of age, £1 per annum.

For every cow or gelding, 10s. per annum.

In respect of every camel used for draught only (except bull camels over three years of age), 10s.

per annum:

Provided that no registration fee shall be payable in respect of camels used solely by prospectors for prospecting purposes.

#### Certificate of registration.

36. A certificate of registration shall be issued by the Secretary to the Board to the applicant in the Form "B" in the Schedule.

#### Duration.

37. Every registration shall expire on the thirty-first day of December in the year for which such registration is

#### Registration discs.

38. On the annual registration of every camel, the Board will issue to the applicant a registration disc inscribed with the name of the district and the registration number.

Every person in charge for the time being of such camel shall keep the disc attached to the neck of the camel,

#### Camel-driver's licenses.

39. No person shall drive any comel or camels within the district unless he is the holder of a camel-driver's license in force for the time being issued by the Board of the said district, or unless he is the holder of a license in force for the time being issued by the Board of some other road district.

#### Form of license.

40. A camel-driver's license shall be in the Form "C" in the Schedule, and the licensee shall be required to sign his name in the margin thereof before the license is issued to

#### License fee.

41. The fee payable for a camel-driver's license shall be five shillings per annum.

#### Duration of License.

42. Every camel-driver's license shall expire on the thirty-first day of December in the year for which it was granted.

#### Transfer.

43. A camel-driver's I cense shall be transferable by endorsement at the office of the Board on payment of a fee of one shilling; the transferee to sign his name in margin

License and registration certificate to be produced.

44. Every camel-driver shall produce his camel-driver's license and the certificate of registration for each and every carnel in his charge, whenever called upon so to do by any constable or officer of police, or any member or officer of the Road Board.

#### Limit of number of camels to be driven.

45. No person shall, at the same time, drive or take the charge of more than eleven camels, whether draught or pack camels, or partly draught and partly pack camels.

#### Camels to give place to horses, etc.

46. Every camel-driver or other person driving or 46. Every camel-driver or other person driving or having the charge of any camel or camels on any road or track, or at any well or watering place, shall, at the request of any person in charge of any horse or mule, forthwith remove any camel or camels which he is driving, or of which he is in charge, to a distance of not less than a quarter of a mile from such read, track, well, or watering place.

#### Unregistered camels may be destroyed.

47. Any unregistered camel found straying in any part of the Board's district may be seized and either sold or destroyed, after such camel has been advertised for three weeks in some paper circulated in the district; the owner shall be liable to pay to the Board the cost and expense incurred, in addition to registration fees.

#### Penalty for suffering camels to stray.

48. If any camel is suffered to stray, the owner thereof and any person who, having been in charge thereof, has suffered it to stray shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

#### Penalty for driving diseased camels.

49. If any person drives or rides any camel suffering from any infectious or contagious disease on any road within the district, he shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

Public watering places not to be used by diseased eamels.

50. No camel suffering from any infectious or contagious disease shall be allowed to water at any public watering place.

Any person who having, as owner, driver, or otherwise, the custody of any camel suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, permits such camel to water at any public watering place shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

#### Diseased camels may be destroyed.

51. It shall be lawful for any officer of the Board or any person acting with the authority of the Board, or of any officer of the Board, to slaughter and destroy any camels found suffering from any infectious or contagious disease on any road.

#### Cycles and motor cars to be licensed.

52. No person shall use any bicycle, tricycle, or motor car in the district unless such bicycle, tricycle, or motor car is licensed:

Provided that if a license is taken out for a bicycle, tricycle, or motor car by any person in the district in which he resides he shall not be required to take out a license in any other district.

#### Form of license.

53. A bicycle, tricycle, or motor car license shall be in the Form "D" in the Schedule, and application for the same shall be made to the Secretary to the Road Board at the office of the Board.

#### Fee.

53a. The fee for every bicycle, tricycle, and motor car license shall be five shillings per annum.

#### Duration

54. Every license for a bicycle, tricycle, or motor car shall expire on the thirty-first day of December in the year for which it was issued.

#### Number to be affixed.

55. Every licensee of a bicycle, tricycle, or motor car shall affix and keep affixed the license number on some conspicuous part of the bicycle, tricycle, or motor car.

#### Riding on footpath.

56. No person shall ride or impel a bicycle, tricycle, or motor car of any kind upon any footpath within the district.

#### Lamp to be carried.

57. No person shall, between the hours of sunset and sunrise, ride a bicycle, tricycle, or motor car along any road unless there is attached thereto a lamp which shall exhibit a white light in the direction in which he is proceeding, and at all times to be kept lighted.

#### $Bell\ to\ be\ used.$

58. Every bicycle, tricycle, or motor car shall carry a bell or other instrument suitable for giving warning of approach, which shall be used as a signal whenever any person on foot or horseback or vehicle is being approached or passed.

#### Roads and footpaths not to be obstructed.

59. No person shall leave any bicycle, tricycle, or motor car in or on any road or footway so as to become an obstruction, and every person shall remove his bicycle, tricycle, or motor car immediately upon being requested to do so by any police officer or constable or member or officer of the Board.

#### Speed.

60. No person riding on a bicycle, tricycle, or motor car shall pass at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour any person who shall be riding or driving any horse or other animal.

#### To dismount on meeting restive herse.

61. When a cyclist or motorist meets a horse or other animal, and such horse or other animal becomes restive, or appears likely to get beyond the control of the person in charge thereof, such cyclist or motorist shall dismount and remain dismounted till such horse or other animal has been passed.

#### Speed on turning corners.

62. No person shall ride any cycle, bicycle, or tricycle, or motor car round the corner formed by the junction of any reads in the district, or across the intersection of any of the said roads, at a pace exceeding six miles an hour.

#### Penalties.

63. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of the foregoing By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

#### Licenses.

64. All licenses for carriages, carts, dogs, camels, cycles, etc., shall be payable to the officer appointed by the Board on the 1st day of January in each year, in advance, as prescribed by the Act.

#### Custody of records, etc.

65. The Secretary shall have the custody of all contract books and records of the Board, or relating to the property of the Board, and the same shall be kept by him in such place as the Board may direct from time to time.

#### Free use of roads.

66. The free use of the roads in the district shall not in any manner be obstructed, except as hereinafter provided. Any person obstructing the free use shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall, on conviction thereof, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

#### Unlawful acts.

67. A person who commits within the district any of the following acts, that is to say:—

#### Removing timber, etc.

(a.) Cuts or removes, without the consent, in writing, of the Chairman of the Board, timber, earth, sand, gravel, stone, or other material from a road;

#### Erecting structures.

(b.) Erects, without the consent aforesaid, a structure upon a road so as to encroach thereon;

#### Depositing earth, etc.

(c.) Deposits, without the consent aforesaid, earth, stone, timber, or other material or rubbish upon a road;

#### Crossing water-tables, etc.

- (d.) Draws, without the consent aforesaid, across the water-side of a road, except over a properly constructed pipe-approach or c lvert, a dray or other wheeled vehicle;
- (e.) Draws upon a road timber, stone, or other material otherwise than on a wheeled vehicle, or suffers such material carried principally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle to drag or trail upon a road, or draws upon a road timber in bulk, or logs, or piles, otherwise than on a four-wheeled vehicle, or suffers such material carried principally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle to drag or trail upon a road, or draws upon a road a whim or timber carriage, any portion of which, or any portion of chains attached thereto, or any portion of any other attachment trails or drags upon a road.

#### Nuisances.

- (./.) Keeps or causes to be kept any swine or pig-sty within one hundred feet of any house or running water without consent of the Board; or establishes a piggery within five chains from any Government road in the district of the Board, or so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to the public health:
  - "Piggery" shall mean and include the buildings and places commonly called piggeries, and any building or place used for the enclosure or housing of not less than ten pigs kept for profit.
- (g.) Deposits or casts upon a road or public place the carcase of a dead animal, or any refuse or offen-ive matter, or, being the owner of the same, allows it to remain.
- (h.) Causes or permits the drainage from a sewer, slaughter-house, closet, or stable to discharge on any road or public place, or injures or pollutes any well, watering-place, or natural watercourse within the district of the Board,

shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each such offence.

#### ADDITIONAL BY-LAWS FOR REGULATING HEAVY TRAFFIC.

Whereas by virtue of the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1902," the Road Board of every district is empowered to make, publish, alter, modify, amend, or repeal By-laws for any of the purposes of the said Act mentioned: The Bunbury Road Boad, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act, doth hereby make and publish the following additional By-laws for providing for Special License Fees for vehicles engaged in heavy traffic:

- 1. That a special yearly license fee for vehicles engaged in heavy traffic shall be payable as follows:—
  - (a.) For carts or wagons engaged in carting sleepers or other timber in bulk, or otherwise plying for hire, Ten shillings per wheel per annum.
  - (b.) For any whim or jinker used in the Board's district, Five pounds (£5) per annum.

Such amounts shall be additional to those prescribed under "The Cart and Carriage Licensing Act, 1876."

The penalty for the use by any person of any such vehicle in respect of which the license feet is not paid shall be a fine not exceeding £10.

THE annexed Report and Finding of the Chief Harbour Master, under the provisions of "The Navigation Act, 1904," relative to the preliminary inquiry held by h m into the circumstances attending the total loss, by fire, of the ship "Carnarvon Castle," whilst on a voyage from Liverpool to Melbourne, on the 31st January, 1907, has been approved by the Hon. the Minister.

From the Chief Harbour Master to the Under Secretary.

I beg to report, for the information of the Hon. the Minister, having held a Preliminary Inquiry into the circumstances attending the total loss, by fire, of the ship "Carnarvon Castle" at sea.

The "Carnarvon Castle" was a full rigged ship, 1719 tons gross and 1644 tons net register; official number 102670; owned by the Carnarvon Castle Ship Company, Limited, of 26 Chapel Street, Liverpool, and registered in Liverpool.

After taking the evidence of the Master (Captain Evan Jones), who holds a Board of Trade Master's Certificate, No. 92823, issued at Liverpool 13th December, 1873; Lewis No. 92823, issued at Liverpool 13th December, 1873; Lewis Davies (Chief Mate), who holds a First Mate's F.C. Board of Trade Certificate No. 038610; Owen Roberts (Second Mate), holding a Second Mate's Certificate No. 439839, issued at Liverpool; August Olsen (Carpenter), and Joseph Beswick, A.B., I have to report that the vessel left Liverpool on the 3rd November, 1906, for Melbourne, Victoria, and experienced the usual weather, with occasional gales, till January the 28th last, when a strong gale was encountered and the following day a heavy see was running countered, and the following day a heavy sea was running which caused the ship to labour considerably, and the cargo aft among the slates was heard from the sail locker to be working slightly.

On the following day, January 31st, 1907, at noon, the ship's position was taken as 42° 54′ South Latitude and 101° 49′ East Longitude, and at about 5°30 p.m. the alarm was given that the vessel was on fire, smoke having been seen coming through the deck between the galley and the main hatch, and afterwards through the ventilators.

The main hatch was then opened with a view to getting at the seat of the fire, which was located as being between the galley and the fore part of the main hatch. An en-deavour was then made to remove some cargo to get at the fire, and openings were made in the deck on each side of the house and water poured into same from the appliances available. Every effort was made by all hands to get the fire under, but it is evident that it had a firm hold before being discovered, and it was soon found that the ship was doomed, as the fire broke through the decks in several places and through the ventilator that came through the house on deck, thereby setting fire to the forward boats placed on skids, one on each side of the house.

The vessel was abandoned between 9 and 10 o'clock p.m., the Master taking charge of the starboard life-boat, which the Master taking charge of the starboard hie-boat, which was fitted with air tanks, and having with him 13 of the crew, and the Mate taking charge of the port boat, which was not fitted with air tanks, and having besides himself 12 of the crew. On the following day, owing to the want of free board, two apprentices were transferred from the Mate's to the Master's boat, thus leaving a total of 16, including 7 apprentices, in the Master's and 11 in the Mate's. Each boat was provisioned with about 150lbs. of biscuits, some preserved meats, and about 30 gallons of water. Master and Mate arranged to keep together and to steer a North-East course to bring them in the track of trading vessels or to the South-West coast of Western Australia, but on the night of the 6th February the two boats became separated, and the part boat, in charge of the First Mate, arrived in Fremantle on Sunday morning, the 24th February, without loss of life, but with her crew in a terribly exhausted state owing to want of water and exposure; and the starboard boat, in charge of Captain Jones, landed on the West side of Cape Naturaliste, providentially in the only safe boat-landing spot in the vicinity, but unfortunonly safe boat-landing spot in the Vicinity, but unfortunately with the loss of two lives, the sail-maker, Alexander Naylor, having died on the 18th February, and John Owen on the 20th February, from want of sufficient nourishment and exposure. Harry Blauire, an apprentice, in a dying condition, and the whole of the crew, including the Master, being utterly exhausted from the same cause. The apprentice, Harry Blamire, died the day after landing, not having recovered consciousness.

On reviewing the evidence, I find:-

- 1. That the ship "Carnarvon Castle," after loading a general cargo, including crates of crockeryware packed with straw and flannelette goods, under proper supervision, sailed from Liverpool on the 3rd November, 1906, for Melbourne, and became a total loss by fire in the vicinity of Latitude 42° 54′ S, and Longitude 101° 49′ E., on the 31st January, 1907.
- 2. That everything possible under the circumstances was done by the Master, Officers, and crew to save the vessel.
- 3. That from the evidence the cause of the fire cannot be determined, but it is evident from the inaccessible seat of same that it orignated from spontaneous combustion in the crates with straw packing or flannelette, or friction of the cargo caused by the heavy labouring of the ship the two days previous.
- 4. That when it was realised that the ship must be abandoned it was too late to launch one of the forward boats, as the fire had then unexpectedly burst through the ventilator going through the deck house and set fire to same, thus necessitating the crew leaving on the two remaining boats aft, and as the said boats, with 14 men in one and 13 in the other were deeply laden, a greater supply of water and provisions could not have been prudently taken.
- 5. That no blame can be attached to the Master, Officers, or crew, but, on the contrary, the Masters and Officers are to be highly commended on their efforts in bringing the crew safely to land, and the crew on their manly behaviour through such a trying experience.

REGULATIONS TO BE STRICTLY OBSERVED WITH A VIEW TO EFFECTING ECONOMY IN THE PRINTING AND PUBLICATION OF THE "GOVERNMENT GAZETTE."

- 1. The Government Gazette will be published once a week—on Friday, unless otherwise interfered with by Public Holidays or other unforeseen circumstances, when the alteration will be duly notified.
- 2. Supplements to the Gazette will only be published when approved by a Minister, except such as are required by statutory obligation or to meet the special requirements of the Colonial Treasurer.
- 3. Notices for insertion in the Gazette must be sent to the Government Printing Office in reasonable time—none later than 10 o'clock of the day preceding the day of publication, and when possible, several days before that time.
- Proofs of Departmental Notices will be supplied, but must be returned not later than 3 p.m. of the day preceding the day of publication, and duly certified for issue by a responsible officer.
- 5. Notices or proofs delayed beyond the time mentioned will be held over for insertion in the following issue.
- 6. Wherever possible, in order to economise space without altering the sense, Notices shall be grouped, or tabulated with one date and signature.
- 7. Notices should bear the date of the Gazette in which they are first to be inserted, unless there are special reasons for giving any Notice a different date.

- 8. Every Notice forwarded for publication in the Gazette must show the number of insertions required, and the responsibility of indicating the requirements of the law in that respect will rest with the Department from which it Unless so notified, only one insertion will be
- 9. When any Notice is marked for more than one insertion it must be stated whether such Notice should be published in full in each issue or in the first issue only.
