WHEREAS by Proclamation [dated the 2nd day of November, 1904, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 4th day of November, 1904, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by virtue of the Ordinance 18 Victoria, No. 15, and of the Act 37 Victoria, No. 14, proclaimed the Port Regulations therein set forth, which were duly made in pursuance of the said Ordinance and Act: AND WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the 17th day of February, 1905, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th day of February, 1905, the said Regulations were amended and an additional Regulation (No. 55A) added thereto: AND WHEREAS it is desirable to further amend the said Port Regulations in the manner hereinafter appearing: Now THEREFORE, I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby repeal

Regulations Nos. 54 and 55A of the said Port Regulations, and proclaim the Regulations set forth in the schedule hereto in lieu thereof. This proclamation to take effect at the expiration of one month from the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

THE SCHEDULE.

VESSELS CALLING FOR COAL OR SUPPLIES.

54. All vessels calling at any port in this State, other than the Port of Fremantle, for coal or supplies, and not broaching or shipping cargo, or landing or embarking passengers, shall pay a fixed sum of £5 to cover all port charges.

All vessels calling at any port in this State, other than the Port of Fremantle, for coal or supplies, and not broaching or shipping cargo, may land and embark passengers, total not exceeding ten in number, on payment of the fixed sum of £10 to cover all port charges.

All vessels calling at the Port of Fremantle for coal or supplies, and not broaching or shipping cargo, and landing and embarking passengers, total not exceeding ten in number, shall pay the fixed sum of £5 in payment of light dues only.

VESSELS WORKING CARGO LESS THAN ONE-FOURTH OF THEIR NET REGISTERED TONNAGE.

55A. All vessels, except where otherwise specially provided in these Regulations, arriving from beyond seas at any port in the State, and landing and shipping cargo totalling in extent less than one-fourth of their net registered tonnage, or landing and embarking passengers, total exceeding ten in number, shall pay light dues at the rate of one penny per ton on their net registered tonnage, such payment to cover both inwards and outwards working.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this twenty-seventh day of March, 1907.

WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed or grant, to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that Reserve

8831, Eucla (travellers and telegraph officials), should be placed under the control of Thomas George Davey, A. J. Besley, and J. Darby as a Board of Management: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserve under the control of Thomas George Davey, A. J. Besley, and J. Darby as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said Reserve, for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon, for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

WHEREAS by Section 20 of "The Goldfields Water Supply Act, 1902," the Governor may, by Order in Council, constitute and define the boundaries of a Water Area for the purposes of the said Act, and may from time to time alter the boundaries of the Water Area: AND WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the 11th day of February, 1903, the boundaries of a Water Area were duly constituted and defined: AND WHEREAS the boundaries of the said Water Area were altered by Orders in Council dated respectively 1st June, 1904, 31st May, 1905, 6th December, 1905, and 30th May, 1906: AND WHEREAS it is desirable to further alter the boundaries of the Water Area as defined by the aforesaid Orders in Council: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and under the powers of the said Act, doth order that as and from this date the boundaries of the said Water Area shall be constituted and defined as follows:—

The area of land described in the plan deposited in the office of the Minister for Works and marked "Plan of the Catchment Area of the Coolgardie Goldfields Water Supply" (P.W.D., W.A., 6535), and coloured pink in the said plan, which area of land is referred to in "The Coolgardie Goldfields Water Supply Construction Act, 1898" (62 Vict. No. 19), as the "Catchment Area."

All land situated within the Reserve for Goldfields Water Supply, and numbered 8059 on Plan 1C/40, in the Lands Department.

All land situated within a circle having as its centre Midland Junction Post Office, and the radius of which shall be five miles.

All land situated within a distance of five miles of the pipe main from Helena Weir, Mundaring, to Mt. Charlotte Reservoir, Kalgoorlie, on either side of the said pipe main and throughout the length thereof.

All land situated within a circle having as its centre the Railway Station at Southern Cross, the radius of which shall be ten miles.

All land situated within a circle having as its centre the Service Reservoir at Toorak Hill, Coolgardie, and the radius of which shall be ten miles in length.

All land situated within a circle the centre of which shall be Mt. Charlotte Reservoir, Kalgoorlie, and the radius of which shall be fifteen miles in length.

All land situated within a circle having as its centre the Railway Station at Kanowna, and the radius of which shall be five miles in length.

All land situated within a circle having as its centre the Post Office at Bulong, and the radius of which shall be nine miles in length.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following additions and amendments to Regulations under "The Inspection of Machinery Act, 1904," as set forth hereunder; to take effect as from 1st February, 1907.

AMENDMENTS AND ADDITIONS.

Regulation 6.—(1.) Amended by adding after word "Revenue," last line:—

"Or if a candidate absents himself from an examination without sufficient reasonable excuse, his application fee may be forfeited."

(2.) (c.) Amended by adding after the word "duties," last line:—

"Provided that in certain cases applications for Engine-drivers' certificates may be received without a medical certificate, but a certificate shall not be issued under the Act until after the production of a satisfactory medical certificate, as provided by the Act."

Regulation 15.—New clause (f).—"Provided that where an applicant has had experience on only one engine or class of engine the Board may restrict the privileges conferred by any of the certificates mentioned in clauses (a.), (b.), (c.), (d.), and (e.)."

Regulation 17.—Clause (c.) amended by adding after the word "diameter," last line:—

"This clause shall not apply to an applicant who has served an apprenticeship of at least four years as an engineer, and has been employed on the making or repairing of steam engines, boilers, etc., for at least three years, or if he has not served an apprenticeship he must prove that for not less than three years he has been employed as a journeyman mechanic in a factory or workshop in the making or repairing of engines."

Regulation 19.—Clause (c.) amended by striking out the words "commencement of this Act," in sixth line, and inserting "date of examination" in lieu thereof; and

By striking out the words "Six (6) months prior to the commencement of the Act," and inserting "twelve (12) months prior to the date of examination" in lieu thereof.

Regulation 38.—Amended by striking out the words "or either of them," in line five.

Regulation 40.—Clause (a) amended by inserting after the word "Certificate," second line, "of similar grade."

First Schedule.—Amended by striking out the words "Outside the State" after the word authority.

4. Proofs of Departmental Notices will be supplied, but must be returned not later than 3 p.m. of the day preceding the day of publication, and duly certified for issue by a responsible officer.

5. Notices or proofs delayed beyond the time mentioned will be held over for insertion in the following issue.

6. Wherever possible, in order to economise space without altering the sense, Notices shall be grouped, or tabulated with one date and signature.

7. Notices should bear the date of the *Gazette* in which they are first to be inserted, unless there are special reasons for giving any Notice a different date.

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10. Care must be exercised in the preparation of Departmental Notices for the *Gazette*, to save as far as possible corrections, alterations, and additions when in type.
