New Electoral Rolls.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } FRED. G. D. BEDFORD, Governor. [L.S.]

By His Excellency Admiral Sir Frederick Grorge Denham Bedford, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc.

WHEREAS by the Electoral Act it is provided that new Electoral Rolls shall be prepared by the Electoral Registrars whenever directed by Preclamation, and in the manner therein specified: Now therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council and in the agreement of the Executive Council and the Executive Counc and in the exercise of the powers conferred by the Electoral Act, do hereby direct that new Legislative Assembly Rolls Act, do hereby direct that new Legislative Assembly Rolls shall be prepared by the Registrars for the undermentioned Electoral Districts, viz., Perth, East Perth, North Perth, West Perth, Balkatta, Subiaco, Claremont, Fremantle, North Fremantle, East Fremantle, South Fremantle, Coolgardie, Kalgoorlie, Boulder, Hannans, Ivanhoe, and Brown Hill; and I further direct that the following rules shall be observed in the preparation of such rolls, namely:

- 1. The name of every elector appearing on existing registers who, to the satisfaction of the Registrar, still retains his qualification, shall be included in the new roll, with such alteration of address as may be caused by applications lodged subsequent to original enrolment.
- 2. The name of every person who has, since the last print of the rolls, lodged "claim" or "transfer" forms, and who, to the satisfaction of the Registrar, still retains his qualification, shall be added to the new rolls.
- 3. Every person whose name appears on existing registers, but who, to the satisfaction of the Registrar, no longer retains his qualification, shall, in the form prescribed by the Min ster, be given fourteen days clear notice of the preparation of the new rolls, and of the intention of the Registrar to omit such names from the new roll if, within the time prescribed, the elector fails to satisfy the Registrar that he still retains the qualification as an elector, and such name shall be omitted by the Registrar accordingly.

Provided that it shall be deemed satisfactory evidence to the Registrar as to the qualification of an elector, if such el ctor was, at any Electoral canvass undertaken within three months prior to the preparation of the new rolls, found to then retain his qualification.

WESTERN AUSTRALIAN GOVERNMENT RAILWAYS.

Rules and Regulations to be observed by all persons employed in the Workshops of the Western Australian Government Railways.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Government Railways Act, 1904, the Commissioner of Railways for the State of Western Australia hereby makes the following Rules and Regulations to be observed by all persons employed in the Workshops of the Western Australian Government Railways, which Regulations may, for all intents and purposes, be cited as "The Workshops Regulations, 1907," and which shall come into operation and take effect from the fifth day of August, One thousand nine hundred and seven:—

Interpretation.

For the purpose of these Regulations,

- "Commissioner" shall mean the Commissioner of Railways for the State of Western Australia for the time being, or such other person as may be appointed to act for or on behalf of the Commissioner.
- "Head of Branch" shall mean the Chief Mechanical Engineer or the Chief Engineer of Existing Lines, or such other Head of Branch as the Commissioner may determine.
- "Department" shall mean the Western Australian Government Railways Department.
- $\lq\lq$ Employee $\lq\lq$ shall mean any employee engaged in the Workshops Branch of the Department.
- 1. Each employee must devote himself exclusively to the business of the Department. He must be prepared to go to any part of the Railway Service to which he may be appointed from time to time, and attend at such hours as may be required, and must strictly observe all Rules, Regulations, and Instructions which may be in force from time to time.

Each employee now engaged, and each person who may hereafter be engaged, must acknowledge in writing that he will conform to such Rules, Regulations, and Instructions.

- 2. The time of starting and leaving off work will be fixed by the Head of the Branch from time to time as circumstances require, and a notice will be posted at the entrance to the Workshops, stating the hours fixed.
- 3. A signal will be given to summon employees to work, and a similar signal will be given for them to cease work.
- 4. Each employee must be at his work when the starting signal ceases. Any employee arriving up to five (5) minutes after the starting signal will have one half-hour deducted from his time. An employee arriving after that time will not be admitted until the next starting time. Any employee habitually losing time will render himself liable to dismissal.
- 5. An employee must not be absent from duty without permission. Should circumstances arise preventing attendance at duty, advice must be forwarded to the Foreman the same day, notifying cause of absence.

An employee absent from duty on account of illness must furnish medical certificates from time to time, as may be required by the Head of the Branch.

- 6. No employee will be allowed to alter his appointed hours of duty, or to exchange duty with any other employee without the special permission of his foreman.
- 7. In any case in which one employee is appointed to relieve another, the person about to be relieved shall not, under any pretext, leave duty until the employee appointed to relieve him arrives.

On the change of duty between employees, all circumstances which may have occurred out of the ordinary course of working must be communicated to the employee coming on duty, before he takes charge.

No person employed in any capacity shall give up charge to any other person whose duty it may be to relieve him, unless the person being relieved shall be satisfied of the sobriety of the person whose duty it may be to relieve him.

8. Each employee must exercise proper care in getting between vehicles for the purpose of coupling and uncoupling them, or in the performance of any other duty which necessarily exposes the employee to danger or risk of personal injury.

Each employee must, as far as possible, prevent reckless exposure to danger on the part of any other employee.

9. Each employee must enter and leave the Works through the proper entrance, and anyone going by train must pass out through the proper exit and enter the station by the public entrance.

No employee must leave the Shops during working hours under any circumstance without first obtaining a permit on the proper form from the Foreman and depositing it with the Timekeeper. He must also report to the Timekeeper as he returns to duty.

10. Each employee will be given a number and supplied with a check bearing such number. This check must be lifted from the board on entering the Shops to work in the morning and after the dinner hour. When ceasing work for the day, it must be deposited at the place appointed for its reception. Should the check of an employee be removed from the board, such employee shall not proceed to work without the permission of the Foreman.

Employees must not under any circumstances lift or deposit a check belonging t another employee.

- 11. An employee must not loiter nor waste time during working hours, nor must he cease work, nor make preparations to leave his work, before the signal has been given for work to cease.
- 12. Each employee must confine himself to that part of the Shop in which he is engaged, and must not visit or engage in any other part unless authorised by his Foreman.
- 13. An employee must not remain in or return to the Workshops premises after working hours without the permission of his Foreman.

Visitors must not be allowed on the Works without the permission of the Workshops Manager.

- 14. Each employee must promptly obey all instructions issued by the Foreman or Leading Hand, and must pay strict regard to order, regularity, and system throughout the Works.
- 15. Leading Hands must see that each employee working under them is competent for the work he is set to do, and that the work is performed in a proper manner. Any carelessness, negligence, or incompetency must be at once reported to the Foreman.
- 16. All work must be executed in a workmanlike manner, and each employee must be economical in the use of stores and material, and must not use oil or other substance for cleaning his hands, and must call the Foreman's attention to any instance of property exposed or liable to waste or damage.
- $17.\,$ Each employee must appear as clean as circum stances will permit.
- 18. Each employee will be provided with a time-book, in which must be entered daily the work order numbers, particulars of the work performed, and the exact time spent on each job.

Special attention is directed to this rule, as any instance of wrong booking, or charging time that has not been worked, will lead to summary dismissal.

- 19. Each tool, special or otherwise, must bear the Departmental brand, and employees must see that the brand is made and maintained on each and every tool. Tools must not be used until they are properly branded.
- On leaving the Department, each employee must account for all Departmental tools entrusted to his care.
- 20. Each employee will have a proper drawer, box, or cupboard provided to him for keeping the tools belonging to the Department under lock and key. This will be examined periodically, and the contents checked.

An employee must not open or interfere with the locker of any other employee, or take therefrom any tools without the permission of such employee unless directed to do so by the Foreman, and in the Foreman's presence.

- 21. An employee must not damage, destroy, or otherwise make away with any tool or other article, nor deface, mutilate, or destroy any drawing, pattern, notice, or other article the property of the Department.
- 22. An employee in the course of his work breaking or otherwise damaging tools or machinery or other property of the Department, must at once report the matter to the Foreman.

Attention is drawn to the following section of the Government Railways Act, 1904:—

"Sec. 52. Every person employed on or about a rail-way shall be responsible for any damage caused by his wrongdoing or neglect, and the loss occasioned thereby may be deducted from any salary, wages, or emolument due to such person, or may be recovered in a summary way."

- 23. The employee in charge of the tool making shop or tool store will be held responsible for the safety, accuracy, branding and condition of all portable and special tools, gauges, templets, etc., and must report to the Foreman any case of injury to such tools by any employee which is not due to fair wear and tear. He must not allow any tool to go out of or return to his charge without carefully booking the name of the employee who obtains and returns it, and the date of issue and return. If tools are not punctually returned he must communicate at once with the Foreman of the employee who retains them. He must see that the whole of the tools are returned to the tool store at the end of each week.
- 24. An employee must not take any property of the Department from the Workshops premises without permission. Any employee having occasion to take tools or material from the Shops to any place where he may be temporarily employed must obtain a written permit from the Foreman, and hand it to the Workshops storeman, who must check the articles before they are taken off the premises. Such tools and any surplus materials must be returned to the Workshops through the storeman. An employee will be liable for any loss or damage beyond fair wear and tear.
- 25. Tools, appliances, or material of any description belonging to the Department are not to be loaned or borrowed without permission of the Workshops Manager.
- 26. Employees requiring to take from the Workshops, for any reason whatever, tools belonging to themselves must obtain a written permit from their Foreman.
- 27. No employee shall be allowed to alter any special tool, or to make any new tool, without the authority and under the direction of the Foreman, and no gauges or master-taps are to be altered under any pretence whatever.
- 28. No drawing must be altered or departed from without written authority.
- 29. An employee must not order any eastings, smith work, or any description of work whatever to be made or supplied without being duly authorised by the Foreman.
- 30. An employee must not take stores out of the storeroom, forged work from the smithy, or work of any description from any shop, without an order signed by the Foreman, and without the stores or work being properly accounted for to the person in charge.
- 31. An employee is expressly forbidden to bring into the Workshops material or goods of any description, other than tools required for his work, which are not provided by the Department.
- 32. An employee is also expressly forbidden to take any Departmental property from the Workshops under any pretence whatever (other than for Departmental purposes), and must not convert to his own use any material or article the property of the Department, however small its value may be, and under no circumstances must an employee make tools, patterns, models, or articles of any description, nor do work of any nature whatever upon the premises for private purposes. Any infringement of this rule will lead to summary dismissal.
- 33. Any employee found introducing, or causing to be introduced, intoxicating liquors into the Workshops premises, or showing the slightest sign of intoxication whilst on duty, will be immediately suspended, and will be liable to summary dismissal.
- 34. Any employee disobeying instructions, doing his work in an unworkmanlike manner, interfering or wranging with any other employee, using obscene or abusive language on the Workshops premises, or being absent from duty without leave, shall be liable to dismissal.
- 35. Any employee who has cause to complain of the conduct of another employee must make his complaint within seven days of the date on which such conduct is alleged to have occurred.
- 36. An employee is strictly forbidden to borrow money from or to place himself under any pecuniary obligation to any subordinate employee.
- 37. An employee must not smoke on Workshops premises during working hours. At meal hours smoking is permitted only in places where no danger from fire exists.
- 38. An employee must not trade, either directly or indirectly, for himself or others.
- 39. No betting, lotteries, raffles, or sweeps will be permitted within the Workshops premises.
- 40. All canvassers are strictly excluded from entering the Workshops premises for any purpose whatever.

- 41. No meeting must be held or collection made within the Workshops premises. Notices or advertisements must not be posted in the Workshops without permission of the Head of the Branch.
- 42. The place of residence of each employee will be registered, and any change of residence must be at once notified to the Foreman.
- 43. Wages will be paid fortnightly, as early as convenient after the close of the pay period. If an employee has reason to believe that he has received the wrong amount, he must at once report the matter in writing to the Foreman. If, however, an employee fails to make claim within forty-eight (48) hours from the time of receiving his wages docket, he shall only be entitled to receive such sum of money as is entered on the pay docket against his name.
- 44. Any employee whose pay does not agree with the amount appearing on the wages docket must notify the Paying Officer before leaving the pay window or spot at which he has been paid, otherwise no claim for alleged shortage will be entertained by the Department. Should there be any instance of overpayment, it must at once be reported to the Foreman.
- 45. Any employee using artificial light must extinguish it before leaving the premises. Each smith is responsible for extinguishing his fire and closing his blast before leaving the works.
- 46. Should a fire be discovered on Railway premises in connection with or adjacent to the Workshops, the alarm will be sounded. Outside of working hours, members of the Workshops Fire Brigade, and all other employees hearing the signal, must hasten to the fire and render assistance if required. In the event of a fire occurring during working hours, the members of the Workshops Fire Brigade must turn out, and such other employees only as should be specially summoned.
- 47. Any employee wishing to leave the service of the Department must give fourteen days' notice of his intention so to do, and (excepting in case of summary dismissal) fourteen days' notice will also be given by the Department in the case of regular employees whose services are not further required.
- 48. Excepting in regard to appeals to the Railway Appeal Board, constituted under the Government Railways Act, 1904, and Regulations thereunder, all communications must be addressed by an employee to the Foreman, subject to the following exceptions:—
 - (1.) In the event of the reply of a Foreman being unsatisfactory, and an employee considering himself aggrieved, such employee may address the Workshops Mauager.
 - (2.) In the event of the reply of the Workshops
 Manager being considered unsatisfactory, an
 appeal may be made to the Head of the Branch.
 - (3.) Should such employee still consider himself aggrieved, he may address the Commissioner (each communication to be forwarded through the Foreman).
- 49. An employee is forbidden to address communications in connection with his duties in the Department, other than through his superior officer, and must not obtain or use outside influence, either directly or indirectly, to represent his requirements.
- 50. The Commissioner or the Head of the Branch may impose fines not exceeding £5 for breaches of Rules, Regulations, or Instructions, and may deduct the amount from the wages of the employee.
- 51. An employee suspended for a breach of Rules, Regulations, or Instructions, will not be entitled to payment during such suspension, unless authorised by the Head of the Branch.
- 52. In the event of any breach of the foregoing Rules, by an employee, or of any conduct inconsistent with the proper discharge of his duties, such action may be taken as may be determined by the Head of the Brauch.
- 53. Each employee will be granted Annual Holidays in December, and the Workshops will be closed for the necessary period. The Workshops will also be closed on the following Public Holidays throughout the Year, but payment will not be granted for these days, viz.,

Anniversary Day Good Friday Easter Saturday Easter Monday Eight Hours Day Birthday of the Sovereign.

The closing of the Workshops on special holidays and occasions will be decided upon by ballot of the employees, but in no case shall the Shops be closed unless there two-thirds majority in favour thereof. When it is decided not to observe any such special day, employees must abide by the decision, and must not absent themselves from

General.

In the event of any dispute or question arising as to the meaning of these Regulations, or any portion thereof, or as to anything done or alleged to have been done thereunder or contrary thereto, it will be referred to the Commissioner, whose decision will be final.

All Departmental Regulations and Instructions in force at the coming into operation of these Regulations are hereby modified in so far as they are in conflict with these Regulations.
