SHIPPING AND PILOTAGE CONSOLIDATION  
ORDINANCE, 1855.

Swan River Regulations.

On and after the 1st August, 1907, the owners of all vessels shall pay as Wharfrage Dues the sum of Sixpence per ton, except where Special Licenses have been issued, on all cargo landed and shipped on any of the Wharves and Jetties of the Swan River; provided that any cargo landed or shipped from one part of the Swan River to any other shall pay such Wharfrage Dues one way only.

## MUNICIPALITY OF KANOWNA.

By-laws of the Municipality of Kanowna, made under Section 179 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," for the prevention of obstruction of any street, way, and footways.

## By-Law No. 74.

No person shall congregate with another or others, or by himself or with another or others behave, act, or stand in any street within the town so as to obstruct the free passage and traffic thereon, along or upon any part of the same.

## By-Law No. 75.

Every person who, in the opinion of any traffic inspector or other officer of the Council or of any police constable, is obstructing, by himself or with any other person or persons, the free traffic through, along, or upon any part of a street or footway, shall, when so required by such inspector, officer, or constable, move on, so as to remove such obstruction.

The above By-laws were adopted by the Council at a meeting held on the 13th day of August, 1907.

## CENTRAL BOARD OF HEALTH BY-LAWS.

## By-Laws.

Whereas by "The Health Act, 1898," and "The Health Act Amendment Act, 1900," the Central Board of Health has power to make By-laws; and further, has power to repeal, alter, and amend any By-law so made: Now, therefore, the Central Board of Health hereby repeals, alters, and amends its By-laws published in the *Government Gazette* of the 1st December, 1905, as follows:—

## Part I.

Schedule "G" (By-law No. 13) is hereby amended by the addition of the following after the last line thereof:—

- (c.) If the person to be registered does not sell milk, but only cream, butter, or cheese, the produce thereof, *nil*.

## Part VI.

is hereby amended by adding the following By-law, No. 17:—

The provision of paragraphs *a*, *b*, and *c* of By-law 8, and paragraph *d* of By-law 9 shall not apply in the case of cowkeepers producing and selling dairy produce other than milk.

By-law No. 9, paragraph *a*, is hereby amended to read as follows:—

- (a.) Every cowkeeper and every purveyor shall provide on his premises a detached room of sufficient dimensions, or in the case of a purveyor or cowkeeper producing or selling dairy produce, other than milk, such other structure of such size, dimensions, shape, and construction, and containing such fittings as may be approved by the Board to be used for straining, cooling, or housing milk, or for housing vessels used for containing milk, or in the collection or distribu-

tion of milk, when such vessels or utensils are not in actual use, and all the provisions of paragraphs *i*, *j*, *k*, *l*, *m*, *n*, *o*, and *p* of By-law No. 9 shall apply to such By-law as hereby amended.

My Lord,

I have the honour to transmit for the information of your Government the enclosed copies of a Notice to Mariners which has been drawn up by the Admiralty for the guidance of ships when approaching Defended Ports while the Examination Service is in force and in order that the Mercantile Marine may become familiar in peace with signals which would be of the greatest importance to them in war.

2. I have to request you to invite your Government to issue instructions for the observance of the rules laid down in the Notice to the authorities responsible for the Examination Service at the Defended Ports of Australia, named on the second page, which are Adelaide, Albany, Brisbane, Fremantle, Hobart, Melbourne, Newcastle, Sydney, Thursday Island, Townsville, and Wollongong.

## NOTICE TO MARINERS.

The last Notice to Mariners published in 1906 was No. 1532.

[No. 1 of the year 1907.]

(The bearings are Magnetic, and those concerning the visibility of lights are given from seaward.)

*Caution when approaching British Ports.*

My Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, having taken into consideration the fact that circumstances may arise in which it may be necessary, on account of

periodical exercises, manœuvres, or otherwise, to forbid all entrance to the naval ports at night, this is to give Notice that on approaching the shores of Great Britain, or any British dependency, if search lights are observed to be in constant operation, the Naval harbours should be approached with great caution, as it may be apprehended that obstructions may exist outside the port, or that the entrances may be altogether closed, and the Examination service may be in force.

In the event of relations becoming strained between this country and any Naval Power, an Examination service may come into force at the ports or localities in the United Kingdom, and H.M. Possessions abroad, mentioned at the end of this Notice.

Masters are warned that before attempting to enter any of these ports they must, in their own interests, strictly obey all instructions given to them by the vessels which will be charged with the duty of examining ships desiring to enter the ports, and allotting positions in which the ships shall anchor. In case of fog they should on no account attempt to enter before receiving permission from the Examination officer.

The institution of an Examination service at any port will never be publicly advertised, but at all times when the relations of Great Britain with foreign Powers are known to be in a state of tension, especial care should be taken in approaching the ports, by day or by night, to keep a sharp look-out for the Examination steamer, and to be ready to "bring to" at once when hailed by her or warned by the firing of a gun.

*If an entrance to a port is closed three red vertical lights by night, or three red balls by day, will be exhibited in some conspicuous position, in or near to its approach, and as far as possible notice of this fact will be given by look-out vessels in the offing.*

If the Examination service is in force the Examination steamer will be distinguished at night:—

- (a.) When the port is closed, by three red vertical lights.
- (b.) When the port is open, by three white vertical lights.

The pilots attached to the ports will be acquainted with the regulations to be followed.
