WHEREAS by "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1902" (1 and 2 Edward VII., No. 20), and "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1905" (5 Edward VII., No. 22), the Governor may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, after the opinion of the Road Board of the District has been requested, close any road or reservation for a road which may have been surveyed or shown as a road on any plan published by the Department of Lands and Surveys: Provided such road is not within the limit of a Municipality, and has not been declared a Government road or a road under "The Roads Act," or any Act amending the same: AND WHEREAS the roads hereinafter described have been surveyed and shown as roads on the under-mentioned plans as published by the Department of Lands and Surveys: AND it is desirable to close such roads: AND WHEREAS the opinion of the undermentioned Road Boards has been requested: NOW THEREFORE I, Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, G.C.B., Governor as aforesaid, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the said surveyed roads to be closed.

#### Broad Arrow-Paddington Municipality.

##### By-law No. 63 *re* Goats.

A By-law of the Municipality of Broad Arrow-Paddington made under Section 179 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 63, for prescribing and regulating the manner and mode of keeping and depasturing Goats and the driving of Goats through or over any streets.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Broad Arrow-Paddington order as follows:—

1. In this By-law, Goat means and includes any goat or kid being of or over the age of three months.

2. No person being the owner or having the control of any goat shall cause, permit, suffer, or allow any such goat to wander or stray or be at large within the following boundaries:—

Broad Arrow.—Forrest Street on the North, McDonald Street on the East, Todd Street on the South, Duke Street on the West.

Paddington.—Paddington Street on the East, Mona Street on the West, Iolanthe Street on the North, Palmer Street on the South.

3. No person shall take or drive any goat to or from pasture through or over any street, or depasture any goat within the Municipal district, unless such goat is registered, and under proper control, so as to prevent it wandering, straying, or being at large; and no goat shall be driven or taken to or from pasture or depastured before the hour of six o'clock in the forenoon, or after six in the afternoon.

4. All goats kept within the Municipality must be registered. Registration fee, 2s. 6d. per year, ending on the 31st December in each year.

5. Any unregistered goat kept within the Municipal district shall be liable to be impounded according to "Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882."

6. No person shall keep more than six goats within the Municipal district.

7. On any goat being registered, a full description of such goat shall be given; such description to be inserted in registration form.

8. Any person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction for each and every offence, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

My Lord,

I have the honour to transmit for the information of your Government the enclosed copies of a Notice to Mariners which has been drawn up by the Admiralty for the guidance of ships when approaching Defended Ports while the Examination Service is in force and in order that the Mercantile Marine may become familiar in peace with signals which would be of the greatest importance to them in war.

2. I have to request you to invite your Government to issue instructions for the observance of the rules laid down in the Notice to the authorities responsible for the Examination Service at the Defended Ports of Australia, named on the second page, which are Adelaide, Albany, Brisbane, Fremantle, Hobart, Melbourne, Newcastle, Sydney, Thursday Island, Townsville, and Wollongong.

## NOTICE TO MARINERS.

The last Notice to Mariners published in 1906 was No. 1532.

[No. 1 of the year 1907.]

(The bearings are Magnetic, and those concerning the visibility of lights are given from seaward.)

*Caution when approaching British Ports.*

My Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, having taken into consideration the fact that circumstances may arise in which it may be necessary, on account of periodical exercises, manœuvres, or otherwise, to forbid all entrance to the naval ports at night, this is to give Notice that on approaching the shores of Great Britain, or any British dependency, if search lights are observed to be in constant operation, the Naval harbours should be approached with great caution, as it may be apprehended that obstructions may exist outside the port, or that the entrances may be altogether closed, and the Examination service may be in force.

In the event of relations becoming strained between this country and any Naval Power, an Examination service may come into force at the ports or localities in the United Kingdom, and H.M. Possessions abroad, mentioned at the end of this Notice.

Masters are warned that before attempting to enter any of these ports they must, in their own interests, strictly obey all instructions given to them by the vessels which will be charged with the duty of examining ships desiring to enter the ports, and allotting positions in which the ships shall anchor. In case of fog they should on no account attempt to enter before receiving permission from the Examination officer.

The institution of an Examination service at any port will never be publicly advertised, but at all times when the relations of Great Britain with foreign Powers are known to be in a state of tension, especial care should be taken in approaching the ports, by day or by night, to keep a sharp look-out for the Examination steamer, and to be ready to "bring to" at once when hailed by her or warned by the firing of a gun.

*If an entrance to a port is closed three red vertical lights by night, or three red balls by day, will be exhibited in some conspicuous position, in or near to its approach, and as far as possible notice of this fact will be given by look-out vessels in the offing.*

If the Examination service is in force the Examination steamer will be distinguished at night:—

(a.) When the port is closed, by three red vertical lights.

(b.) When the port is open, by three white vertical lights.

The pilots attached to the ports will be acquainted with the regulations to be followed.

Notes on the Climate for the month of August, 1907.

This has been an exceptionally severe winter in S.W. districts, "low" after "low" passing along the Southern Ocean from West to East, and keeping the weather almost perpetually squally, with high seas. The record spell of wet weather for Perth broke up on the 16th. Rain was recorded on every day between July 18 and August 16, the total fall for the 30 days being

and on the 28th the first "low" of a summer type approached the Western coast near Sharks Bay, coming down the Indian Ocean, rounded the Leeuwin and moved rapidly Eastward. On the 29th the temperature at every station throughout the Coolgardie and Murchison goldfields was higher than has ever before been experienced in August, the maximum being 89° at Menzies and Kalgoorlie.

On the whole the rainfall was in excess of the average throughout S.W. districts, but light elsewhere; and, as usual at this season, none fell in the tropics.

Pressure was below normal all South of the tropics, and in the extreme S.W. was the lowest on record.

Temperature was generally slightly above the average, but on the Coolgardie fields and S.E. district it was much above the normal, being in most cases the highest on record for August.

Very few frosty nights were recorded. The following table shows the mean of the daily and the lowest reading of a minimum thermometer placed on the surface of the ground:—
