WHEREAS by "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1902" (1 and 2 Edwardi VII., No. 20), and "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1905" (5 Edwardi VII., No. 22), the Governor may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, after the opinion of the Road Board of the District has been requested, close any road or reservation for a road which may have been surveyed or shown as a road on any plan published by the Department of Lands and Surveys: Provided such road is not within the limit of a Municipality, and has not been declared a Government road or a road under "The Roads Act," or any Act amending the same: AND WHEREAS the roads hereinafter described have been surveyed and shown as roads on the under-mentioned plans as published by the Department of Lands and Surveys: AND it is desirable to close such roads: AND WHEREAS the opinion of the undermentioned Road Boards has been requested: NOW THEREFORE I, Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, G.C.B., Governor as aforesaid, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the said surveyed roads to be closed.

WHEREAS by Sections 222 and 227 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edwardi No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

And whereas the North Perth Municipal Council has requested that certain lands named and described in the Schedule hereunder which have been used for streets or ways within the Municipality of North Perth, be declared public highways: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my proclamation declare the said lands to be public highways, and such lands shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as highways within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

WHEREAS by Section 3 of "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," the Governor may, from time to time, by Proclamation, prohibit, either absolutely or except in accordance with regulations under this Act, the bringing into any specified portion of Western Australia, from any other portion or specified portion of Western Australia, of any specified plant, fruit, fungus, parasite, insect, or other thing, which, in his opinion, is diseased or likely to spread disease: Now therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, and in the exercise of the powers conferred by the Insect Pests Amendment Act, do hereby direct that the conveyance of fruit, fruit trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds, seeds, pits, or scions in the State of Western Australia North of the 26th parallel of South Latitude to any part of the State of Western Australia South of the 26th parallel of South Latitude is prohibited, except via Port of Fremantle or Albany and subject to the regulations governing the importation and disinfection of plants from outside this State.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, made on the 5th day of August, 1903, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, directed that from and after the first day of July, 1903, the fees and moiety of fees payable to district registrars and assistant district registrars respectively for the duties to be performed by them under "The Registration of Births, Deaths, and Marriages Act, 1894," where the duties were performed by district registrars or assistant district registrars holding an office of profit under the State Government, should be paid to the general revenue of the State, and should not be retained by the district registrars or assistant district registrars for their own use, either in whole or in part: And whereas it was not intended that such Order in Council should apply to police officers or constables, school teachers in the Education Department, or officers in receipt of allowances in lieu of fixed salary: Now, therefore, His Excellency Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, G.C.B., Governor as aforesaid by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby directs that the said Order in Council of the 5th day of August, 1903, shall not apply, and as from the 1st day of July, 1903, shall be deemed not to have applied to police officers or constables, school teachers in the Education Department, or officers in receipt of allowances in lieu of fixed salaries: and that in addition to the fees which they are entitled to receive and retain, as provided by the Order in Council, dated the 10th day of June, 1903, the following fees shall be paid, and, as from

the 1st day of July, 1903, shall be deemed to have been payable by the Registrar General to district registrars and assistant district registrars for the registration of births and deaths, that is to say:—

*To District Registrars.*

For every registration of a birth within 60 days ... 2s.

For every registration of a death within 14 days ... 2s.

And that, as heretofore, a minimum payment of £1 per quarter be paid to any district registrar whose claim for that period shall fall short of such amount.

*To Assistant District Registrars.*

For every registration of a birth within 60 days ... 1s.

For every registration of a death within 14 days ... 1s.

#### NOBEL PEACE PRIZE.

All proposals of candidates for the Nobel Peace Prize, which is to be distributed December 10th, 1908, must, in order to be taken into consideration, be laid before the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament by a duly qualified person before the first of February of the same year.

Any one of the following persons is held to be duly qualified: (a) Members and late members of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, as well as the

advisers appointed at the Norwegian Nobel Institute; (b) Members of Parliament and Members of Government of the different States, as well as Members of the Inter-parliamentary Union; (c) Members of the international Arbitration Court at the Hague; (d) Members of the Commission of the Permanent International Peace Bureau; (e) Members and Associates of the Institute of International Law; (f) University Professors of Political Science and of Law, of History and of Philosophy; and (g) Persons who have received the Nobel Peace Prize.

The Nobel Peace Prize may also be accorded to institutions or associations.

According to the Code of Statutes §8, the grounds upon which any proposal is made must be stated, and handed in along with such papers and other documents as may therein be referred to.

According to § 3, every written work, to qualify for a prize, must have appeared in print.

For particulars, *qualified persons* are requested to apply to the office of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, Drammensvei 19 Kristiania.

The following Regulations in connection with the carriage of firewood for the public shall be observed by lessees or licensees holding permits to construct a Timber Tramway under Section 8 of "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1902":—

1. HAULAGE RATES.—Twenty miles and under, 3s. per ton. One penny halfpenny per mile or fraction thereof over 20 miles, in addition to the minimum charge of 3s. per ton.

These charges shall include any bush haulage payable to the Railway Department.

MINIMUM LOADS.—Trucks—Classes G, Gb, and H, 6 tons per truck; Ga, Gd, and similar trucks, 8 tons per truck; R and Rx, 12 tons per truck; Ra, 16 tons per truck. All other trucks, 6 tons per four-wheeled, and 12 tons per eight-wheeled truck. If a truck marked to carry five tons only is used, the minimum charge will be as for five tons.

All weights in excess of above to be charged for *pro rata*.

2. The charge for shunting shall not exceed 3s. and 6s. for four and eight-wheeled trucks respectively.

3. The haulage and shunting charges specified in Clauses 1 and 2 shall include all haulage, shunting, and marshalling charges at the Government junction station, and on the Company's lines and sidings.

4. The Company may require the consignors to indemnify them in the case of damage by fire to the Government trucks whilst standing in a private siding only. No extra charge shall be made for insurance whilst the trucks are in transit or standing at a public siding, nor shall any charge be made for the weighing of trucks.

5. PUBLIC SIDINGS shall be placed where directed by the Minister, provided that no such siding shall be required at a less distance than 16 miles from the junction of the Timber Tramway with the Government Line, nor within nine miles of any public siding on such Timber Tramway.

6. PRIVATE SIDINGS shall be laid down by the licensee for any person desiring the same on payment by such person of the actual cost (but not exceeding £30) of laying and removing such siding. A rental of £3 per month shall also be payable to the licensee as rent for a private siding.

7. The licensee shall at all times convenient to him permit the loading of firewood on the main line provided there is not less than a train load of 100 tons. The loading of smaller lots shall be entirely at his discretion. In all such cases he may charge freight from the nearest siding in the rear and also levy a charge not exceeding 30s. per hour for engine and train men while loading.

8. Ticketing and consigning shall be a matter for private arrangement between the licensee and the public.

9. The licensee shall be responsible to the Commissioner of Railways for all charges on, and for damage to, trucks after being handed over to him at the junction station, and until same are again handed back to the Commissioner's officer at such station.
