NOTICE is hereby given that, at a special meeting of the Executive Council held in the Council Chamber, Perth, on Monday, 18th November, 1907, it was reported that His Excellency the Governor had, with the leave of His Majesty, left the State for a period of six months; and that in pursuance of his Commission as Lieutenant-Governor, Sir Edward Albert Stone, Knight, was commanded to assume the Governorship during the absence of His Excellency Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford. The necessary oaths were thereupon administered to the Lieutenant-Governor by His Honour the Chief Justice, and His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor thereupon issued the following Proclamation:—

PROCLAMATION by His Excellency Sir Edward Albert Stone, Knight, Lieutenant-Governor of Western Australia.

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting.

WHEREAS by a Commission under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, dated the 7th day of May, 1906, I, Sir Edward Albert Stone, Knight, was duly appointed Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, and by the said Commission I was authorised and required in the event of the Office of Governor becoming vacant, or of the Governor being incapable, or of his departure from the said State, to administer the Government thereof, with all and singular the powers and authorities contained in certain Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date at Westminster the twenty-ninth day of October, 1900, constituting the Office of Governor in and over the said State of Western Australia, and according to such instructions as the said Governor for the time being had already received, or might thereafter receive from His Majesty or through one of His Principal Secretaries of State, and according to such Laws as were then or might thereafter be in force in the said State: And whereas Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., has this day, with the leave of His Majesty the King, quitted the State: Now this is to give notice that I, the said Sir Edward Albert Stone, having duly taken the oaths as required by the said Letters Patent, have this day, in pursuance of the said Commission, assumed the Office of Administrator of the Government during the absence

of the said Governor, Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, or during His Majesty's pleasure: And that by the terms of the said recited Commission His Majesty doth command all and singular His Officers, Ministers, and loving subjects in His said State and its Dependencies, and all others whom it may concern, to take due notice thereof and to give their ready obedience accordingly.

WHEREAS by Section 12 (7) of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Governor is empowered to alter the boundaries of the wards existing in any municipal district: And whereas a petition has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, signed with the common seal of the Municipality of North Perth, praying for the alteration of the boundaries of the Central and West Wards of the said Municipality: And whereas the said petition was publicly advertised in the "Government Gazette" on the 18th day of October, 1907: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, in pursuance of the powers so vested in him by the said Act, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby alter the boundaries of the Central and West Wards of the Municipality of North Perth, and declare them to be as follows:—

Central Ward.—Bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centre of Vincent Street with the centre of Norfolk Street, and extending North along the said centre of Norfolk Street to the centre of Robinson Street; thence North-Westward along the centre of Robinson Street to the centre of York Road; thence East along the centre of York Road to its intersection with the centre of Walcott Street; thence North-Westward along said centre of Walcott Street to the centre of Charles Street, and South-Eastward along said centre of Charles Street to its intersection with the centre of Vincent Street; thence East along the said centre of Vincent Street to the starting point.

West Ward.—Bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centre of Vincent Street with the centre of Charles Street, and extending West along the centre of Vincent Street to the South-West corner of Perthshire Location 115; thence North passing along its West boundary and those of Swan Locations 112 and 613; thence North-Westward to the East corner of Swan Location 661; then West passing along its South boundary and those of Swan Locations 669, 782, and 673; thence North-Westward passing along the latter's South-West boundary to its South-West corner; thence North passing along the East boundary of Perthshire Location Aq to its North-East corner; thence East and North-East passing along portion of the Southern boundaries of Perthshire Location Au to the centre of Charles Street; thence South-Westward along said centre of Charles Street to the starting point.

I have to request that you will take such action with reference to this document as may seem calculated to make the conditions of the Prize known to those bodies and persons who are qualified to nominate candidates.

It will be noted that names of candidates should be received by the Committee before the 1st of February next

NOBEL PEACE PRIZE.

All proposals of candidates for the Nobel Peace Prize, which is to be distributed December 10th, 1908, must, in order to be taken into consideration, be laid before the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament by a duly qualified person before the first of February of the same year.

Any one of the following persons is held to be duly qualified: (a) Members and late members of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, as well as the advisers appointed at the Norwegian Nobel Institute; (b) Members of Parliament and Members of Government of the different States, as well as Members of the Inter-parliamentary Union; (c) Members of the international Arbitration Court at the Hague; (d) Members of the Commission of the Permanent International Peace Bureau; (e) Members and Associates of the Institute of International Law; (f) University Professors of Political Science and of Law, of History and of Philosophy; and (g) Persons who have received the Nobel Peace Prize.

The Nobel Peace Prize may also be accorded to institutions or associations.

According to the Code of Statutes §8, the grounds upon which any proposal is made must be stated, and handed in along with such papers and other documents as may therein be referred to.

According to § 3, every written work, to qualify for a prize, must have appeared in print.
