## Temporary Quarantine Station. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, TO WIT. E. A. STONE, Lieutemant-Governor. By His Excellency Sir Edward Albert Stone, Knight, Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc. E. A. STONE, Lieutenant-Governor. [L.S.]

WHEREAS by "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to set apart, by Proclamation in the *Govern*-Governor to set apart, by Proclamation in the Govern-ment Gazette, such ground as may be required for one or more Quarantine Stations: And whereas it is deemed expedient by me, the said Governor, to set apart Quaran-tine Stations: Now therefore I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in me as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby set apart, as a temporary Quarantine Station for the pur-pose of growing potatoes imported from Scotland, all that piece of land known as lot 8 of Wellington Loca-tion 4.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the said State, at Perth, this twenty-fourth day of December, 1907.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of "The Water Boards Act, 1904," the Governor may, by Order in Council, consti-

tute and define the boundaries of a water area for the purposes of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby constitutes and defines the boundaries of a water area, to be known as the Leonora Water Area, as follows:—Starting at the 70-mile post on Malcolm to Lawlers Telegraph Line; thence West 80 chains, South 1,200 chains, East 640 chains, North 1,680 chains; thence West 560 chains, and South to starting point 480 chains.

(1.) All stone accepted for treatment at State Batteries shall be estimated at 22 cubic feet per ton, except where weighing machines are provided, when stone must pass over same to ascertain weight.

The manager of the Battery may refuse any (2.)stone considered too poor to pay crushing charges, un-less a deposit is paid in advance.

(3.)The charge for crushing at each Battery, determined from time to time by the Hon, the Minister for Mines, shall be posted up at each Battery and strictly adhered to while in force.

(4.) A minimum charge will be made for all parcels of less tonnage than will return five pounds on the rate charged per ton.

(5.) Payment for treatment shall be made to the Mauager on completion of crushing, or sufficient gold will be retained to pay the amount due.

(6.) Where a cyanide plant has been erected at a battery, tailings consisting of sands and slimes resulting from stone crushed at that battery may be purchased, but the Manager may, in his discretion, refuse to purchase any tailings should he consider them unsuitable for treatment by cyanide.

(7.) The tailings produced from each parcel crushed may be purchased by the Department paying for 75 per cent. of the gold contents as shown by assay after de-ducting three pennyweights per ton to cover losses and cost of cyaniding.

Gold to be paid for at the rate of 80s. per ounce.

(8.) The number of tons of tailings to be paid for from each parcel shall be determined by the Manager whose decision shall be final, but the amount shall not be less than 80 per cent. or more than 90 per cent. of the tons crushed.

The Manager shall take samples of the tailings (9.)(9.) The Manager shall take samples of the tailings as they pass through the battery or from the vats into which the tailings may be deposited. The sample collected shall be thoroughly mixed and divided into four samples, one for assay by the manager, and one for the vendor; the other two shall be sealed, one being sent to the Perth office of the Mines Department, and the other kept by the Manager for reference or umpire if necessary.

(10.) Within three weeks of the completion of the crushing the vendor and manager shall compare assays, and if these differ by not more than six grains per ton the mean of the assays shall be accepted as correct. If there should be a greater difference than six grains between the assays, the unpire sample shall be sent by the Manager to the Government Assayer at Perth, whose assay shall be accepted as final by both parties. The cost of the unpire's assay (10s.) shall be borne by the party whose assay differs most from the unpire's result. The Manager's assay shall not be made known to the vendor until he has produced his assay certificate for comparison of assays or has agreed in writing to accept the manager's assay. If the vendor does not produce an assay certificate for comparison of the crushing, the Manager's assay shall be final. (10.)Within three weeks of the completion of the be final.

If the manager considers any sample shows an abnormal assay value for the grade of ore producing the tailings, he may refer the matter to the Minister, whose decision as to the values to be paid on shall be indisputable and final.

(11.) All tailings assaying less than three (3) penny-weights per ton shall become the property of the Government.

(12.)Where no cyanide plant has been erected at a Battery, any person desirous of claiming tailings, the proceeds of his crushing, may remove them to a site clear of the settling area immediately the crushing is completed, and must notify the manager of his intention to do so previous to commencement of the crushing. -A11 tailings not so removed shall be deemed abandoned, and may be dealt with as the Minister may direct.

All stone will be delivered and received for (13.)treatment absolutely at the owner's risk, and the Govern-ment shall not be responsible for any suspension of operations, delays in treatment, or for any loss or damage arising from any cause whatsoever.
