WHEREAS by Sections 222 and 227 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

And whereas the Leederville Municipal Council has requested that certain land named and described in the Schedule hereunder which has been used for a street or way within the Municipality of Leederville, be declared a public highway: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

FREMANTLE BOAT LICENSING BOARD. Addition to Regulation No. 19.

The Regulations framed by the Fremantle Boat Licensing Board, and dated 31st May, 1907, are hereby amended by adding to Regulation No. 19 the following clause, that is to sav :

Every rowing or sailing boat of a net tonnage not exceeding two tons, let or held for hire, navigating the river or harbour at night, shall be provided with a lantern of approved design, from which shall be temporarily exhibited a white light in sufficient time to prevent collision.

GAOL REGULATIONS.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following addition to the Regulations relating to the Management and Control of the Gaols and Prisoners of Western Australia:—

Prisoners at Fremantle shall be classified as follows and, as far as the construction of the prison and the necessities of the works and trades will admit, shall be kept apart:-

- 1st.—Prisoners under sentence of imprisonment with hard labour or penal servitude on first conviction.
- 2nd.—Prisoners under sentence of imprisonment with hard labour or penal servitude on a second or subsequent conviction.
- 3rd.—Prisoners under sentence of imprisonment only and who have not previously been convicted.
- 4th.—Prisoners under sentence of imprisonment only who have been previously convicted.
- 5th.—Prisoners awaiting trial or on remand who have not been previously convicted.
- -Prisoners awaiting trial or on remand who have been previously convicted

7th.—Debtors and persons imprisoned for contempt of Court or for failing to give security for the peace or for good behaviour.

Youthful offenders up to 25 years of age shall, as far as practicable, be kept apart from the other prisoners and subdivided according to their disposition, previous history,

"Previously convicted" shall mean "previously convicted in the State or elsewhere.'

BY-LAW OF THE SOUTH PERTH LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

WHEREAS by "The Health Act, 1898" (62 Vict... No. 24), the Local Board of Health has power to make by-laws: Now, therefore, in pursuance thereof, the following by-law has been made, and shall come into operation from the date of publication in the Government Gazette:

"In the event of any earth-closet, privy, or urinal being situated in or upon any lands or premises having a frontage to any right-of-way or street that is macadamised or made and also a frontage to a right-of-way or street which is not macada-mised or made, the Local Board of Health may direct or order the nightman to and the nightman shall thereupon remove and is by this Bylaw empowered to remove all and every and any pan or pans from any such earth-closet, privy, or urinal from the said lands or premises by entering any such lands through the frontage to such macadamised or made right-of-way or street.''

THE KALGOORLIE ROAD DISTRICT LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

By-law No. 33. Slaughter-houses.

No. 1.

- (1.) No occupier of a slaughter-house shall slaughter or allow to be slaughtered on his premises any cattle, sheep, goats, or swine, or any other animal, nor shall any such occupier remove or permit to be removed from his premises the carcase of any slaughtered animal unless and until such animal or carcase, as the case may be, is previously inspected by the Inspector.
- (2.) If the ante-mortem inspection does not furnish any ground for preventing slaughter, the Inspector shall permit it to take place under any special precautions which in his judgment shall be adopted.
- (3.) The slaughter of the animal presented for inspection shall not take place before permission is given, and then only under the special precautionary measures ordered by the Inspector.
- (4.) It slaughter does not take place at latest two days after permission is given, then it shall be allowable only after a re-inspection and a second permit.
- (5.) No slaughtered animal or part thereof shall be taken away before permission for such removal is given by an Inspector.
- (6.) No alteration shall be made in any of the parts of a slaughtered animal before permission for such alteration has been given by an Inspector.
- (7.) Slaughtering shall not be carried on after sunset or before sunrise, unless the killing pens are illuminated by artificial light to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

No. 2.

- (1.) Any carease or part of a carease or any viscus which has been condemned by an Inspector as of a nature deleterious to health or unwholesome shall be immediately removed from the slaughter-house by the occupier thereof to an approved enclosure, and there be by him effectually disinfected or otherwise treated or disposed of in such manner and at such time as may be directed by the Inspector.
- (2.) The offal and also the stomach and intestinal contents of any slaughtered animal, if so required by an Inspector, shall be immediately removed from the slaughter-house by the occupier, and be by him thoroughly disinfected forthwith as may in such case be directed by the Inspector.
- (3.) Skins and hides of dead or slaughtered diseased animals shall not be removed from the premises other than in a completely dried condition, unless they are delivered immediately to a tanner; in either case the permission for such removals must be obtained from the Inspector in writing.
- (4.) If an Inspector so requires, the occupier of every slaughter-house shall, after the slaughtering of any diseased animal, cause all knives or other tools used in such slaughtering to be sterilised.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897" (61st Vict., No. 23), and "The Cemeteries Act, 1899" (63rd Vict., No. 38), for the management of the Drakesbrook Public Cemetery (Reserve 4835).

PUBLIC CEMETERY, DRAKESBROOK, W.A. By-Laws.

By virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Drakesbrook, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:—

- 1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in the Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.
- 2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the Cemetery shall make an application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial.
- 3. All applications for interment shall be made at least five working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Magistrate's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least six working hours as above.
- 4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.
- 5. Before any interment is allowed, the "Order for Burial" shall be handed to and retained by the grave-digger,

- 6. Every grave shall be at least 6 feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 4 feet 6 inches from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.
- 7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application,
- 8. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Trustees.

 - 9. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—
 1st September to 30th April—Week days, from
 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.
 - 1st May to 31st August—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Sundays, from 2 p.m. to

5 p.m.; and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery, at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

- The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.
- 11. No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the Cemetery, or proceed except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions may be forthwith expelled from the Cemetery.
- 12. Children under the age of ten years entering the Cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.
- 13. Smoking shall not be allowed within the Cemetery nor any fireworks discharged therein.
 - 14. No dogs shall be allowed within the Cemetery.
- 15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, or in any way infringing these By-laws shall be expelled from the Cemetery.
- No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by eards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever; and any person infringing this By-law shall be expelled from the Cemetery.
- No person employed by or under the Trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall be be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cometery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees, and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.
- 18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive Right of Burial" in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.
- 19. Subject to the By-laws, the Superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the Cemetery.
- 20. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans, and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.
- 21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.
- Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the ''Order for Burial'' aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.
- Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.
- 24. If application be made for an "Order for Burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

- 25. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."
- Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Trustees, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.
- 27. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor for the erection.
- All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing the same.
- 29. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the Cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.
- 30. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct; and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.
 - No catacomb shall be allowed.
- 32. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give; and any workman permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees, shall be removed from the Cemetery.
- 33. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—
 - (a.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoin-ing ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed.
 - (b.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.
 - (c.) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council. under the powers conferred upon him by Section 29 of 'The Mining Development Act, 1902,' has been pleased to cancel the Regulations gazetted on the 8th April, 1904, and in lieu thereof to make the following Regulations under which stone will be crushed and tailings purchased at the State Batteries.

Minister for Mines.

- All stone accepted for treatment at State (1.)Batteries shall be estimated at 22 cubic feet except where weighing machines are provided, when stone must pass over same to ascertain weight.
- (2.) The manager of the Battery may refuse any stone considered too poor to pay crushing charges, unless a deposit is paid in advance.
- (3.) The charge for crushing at each Battery, as determined from time to time by the Hon. the Minister for Mines, shall be posted up at each Battery and strictly adhered to while in force.
- A minimum charge will be made for all parcels of less tonnage than will return five pounds on the rate charged per ton.
- Payment for treatment shall be made to the Manager on completion of crushing, or sufficient goldwill be retained to pay the amount due.
- Where a cyanide plant has been erected at a battery, tailings consisting of sands and slimes resulting from stone crushed at that battery may be purchased, but the Manager may, in his discretion, refuse to purchase any tailings should he consider them unsuitable for treatment by cyanide.
- (7.) The tailings produced from each parcel crushed may be purchased by the Department paying for 75 per cent. of the gold contents as shown by assay after deducting three pennyweights per ton to cover losses and cost of cyaniding.
 - Gold to be paid for at the rate of 80s. per ounce.
- (8.) The number of tons of tailings to be paid for from each parcel shall be determined by the Manager whose decision shall be final, but the amount shall not be less than 80 per cent. or more than 90 per cent. of the
- (9.) The Manager shall take samples of the tailings as they pass through the battery or from the vats into which the tailings may be deposited. The sample collected shall be thoroughly mixed and divided into four samples, one for assay by the manager, and one for the vendor; the other two shall be sealed, one being sent to the Perth office of the Mines Department, and the other kept by the Manager for reference or umpire if pagescars. if necessary.
- Within three weeks of the completion of the crushing the vendor and manager shall compare assays, and if these differ by not more than six grains per ton the mean of the assays shall be accepted as correct. If there should be a greater difference than six grains be-tween the assays, the umpire sample shall be sent by the Manager to the Government Assayer at Perth, whose assay shall be accepted as final by both parties. The cost of the umpire's assay (10s.) shall be borne by the party whose assay differs most from the umpire's result party whose assay differs most from the umpire's result. The Manager's assay shall not be made known to the vendor until he has produced his assay certificate for comparison of assays or has agreed in writing to accept the manager's assay. If the vendor does not produce an assay certificate for comparison within 21 days of the completion of the crushing, the Manager's assay shall be final.

If the manager considers any sample shows an abnormal assay value for the grade of ore producing the tailings, he may refer the matter to the Minister, whose decision as to the values to be paid on shall be indisputable and final.

- All tailings assaying less than three (3) pennyweights per ton shall become the property of the Government.
- (12.)Where no cyanide plant has been erected at a Battery, any person desirous of claiming tailings, the proceeds of his crushing, may remove them to a site

- clear of the settling area immediately the crushing is completed, and must notify the manager of his intention to do so previous to commencement of the crushing. tailings not so removed shall be deemed abandoned, and may be dealt with as the Minister may direct.
- (13.) All stone will be delivered and received for treatment absolutely at the owner's risk, and the Government shall not be responsible for any suspension of operations, delays in treatment, or for any loss or demands arising from any approximately a state of the damage arising from any cause whatsoever.
- (14.) Any customer or his deputy may be present during the crushing of his parcel, but shall take no part in the treatment except by the express permission and under the direction of the Manager.
- (15.) At every Battery there shall be kept a book in which shall be recorded the number of tons in each parcel left for treatment, the name, locality, and number of the lease or holding from which it is obtained, and the name of the person for whom the stone is to be crushed.
- (16.)A copy of the foregoing rules shall be inserted in the said book, and every person sending stone for treatment shall sign opposite the entry relating to the stone lodged by him, and such signature shall be sufficient evidence that he is cognisant of the foregoing rules and agrees to be bound by them.

BY-LAWS.

SECTION 1 .- BY-LAWS FOR PROTECTING THE GROUNDS, WATER, WORKS, ETC., FROM TRESPASS AND INJURY.

Interpretation Clause.
The terms "House," "Land," "Owner," "Person," shall have the meanings severally attached to them in Section 3 of "The Health Act, 1898."

- "Catchment Area" shall mean that area of land from which rain water is drained into Station Creek Reservoir.
- "Inspector" shall mean an Inspector appointed for the purpose of these By-laws.
- 1. No person shall trespass within the fenced area adjacent to the Pump Station at Station Creek.
- No person shall bathe or wash clothes or other articles in the reservoir near the pumping station, or other waterworks within the water area, or wash, throw, or cause to enter therein any dog or animal; or throw or convey, or permit to be conveyed or thrown therein any rubbish, dirt, filth, dead animal, or other noisome thing.
- 3. Picnic parties or other persons shall not camp or light fires in the vicinity of the pump station on land fenced off, without special permission.
- No person shall deposit, or permit to be deposited any fæcal matter, refuse, dung, manure or other offensive matter in or near any water-course within the catchment area, or in any place where, in the opinion of the Inspector, storm waters will be liable to wash such matter into any water-course.

- 5. In the event of the death, or of any accident necessitating the slaughter of any horse, cattle, sheep, or other animal, the carcase of such animal shall be removed by the owner thereof to such place as the Inspector may direct, and the owner shall immediately dispose of same by burning, to the satisfaction of the Inspector.
- 6. No person shall, without obtaining a license, cut or remove timber within the catchment area, or from any reserves or other properties of the Board.
- 7. No person shall, without proper authority, enter any machinery house, valve house, or other portion of the works not open to the public
- No person shall shoot or hunt within one mile of high water mark of Station Creek Reservoir, or of the service tanks on Mount George.
- 9. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 (Twenty pounds).

SECTION 2.—BY-LAWS FOR THE LICENSING OF PLUMBERS-

- 10. In these By-laws the terms used are to be interpreted by the meanings given by Section 3 of "The Water Boards Act, 1904." "Chairman" shall mean Chairman of the Board, and "Officer" shall mean an Officer who has been appointed, in writing, by the Chairman for purposes of these By-laws, and whose appointment has been notified in the Government Gazette.
- 11. No person shall affix, alter, or repair any service pipe or fitting to be used in connection with any main or other pipe belonging to the waterworks, or interfere in any way therewith, unless licensed as a plumber or holding an operative plumber's certificate under these By-laws.
- 12. An application for a plumber's license or an operative plumber's certificate shall be in writing, signed by the applicant, and addressed to the Chairman.
- 13. Every applicant for a plumber's license or an operative certificate shall satisfy the Chairman that he is a competent plumber, and may be required to submit to an examination in the theory and practice of plumbing work.
- 14. Every license or certificate shall be granted by the Board; and the granting and cancellation of any license or certificate shall be in the absolute discretion of the Board.
- 15. Every license or certificate shall be annual, expiring on the 10th day of January next following the granting thereof, and may be in the Form A or Form B in the Schedule hereto.
- 16. A fee of one pound shall be payable for every license or certificate, except when a license or certificate is granted after the 10th day of July in any year, in which case the fee shall be Ten shillings.
- 17. Every applicant for a plumber's license shall, before receiving a license, deposit with the Board the sum of Five pounds, to be held by the Board during the currency of the license as security for the proper performance of all work undertaken by the licensee.
- 18. The Board may deduct from such deposit the expense of making good any bad work of the licensed plumber or his workmen (notwi hstanding that such workmen are holders of operative plumber's certificates), and as often as any expense is so deducted the licensed plumber shall make good the deposit to the sum of Five pounds, and in default his license will be cancelled.
- 19. Every licensed plumber shall, within forty-eight hours of any change in his address, give notice in writing thereof to the Board.
- 20. The mains shall be tapped only by the workmen of the Board.
- 21. No licensed plumber or operative plumber shall interfere with any pipe or fitting belonging to the waterworks without the permission, in writing, of an officer appointed by the Board under these By-laws first obtained.
- 22. No ground shall be opened, nor shall any work be 22. No ground shall be opened, nor shall any work be undertaken for the purpose of laying and fixing a new service or fittings, or in the extension or alteration of an existing service or fittings, until notice shall have been given by the responsible plumber to an officer appointed by the Board under these regulations. Such notice shall be in writing, in the Form C in the Schedule, and shall describe the statement of the prepared week and shall describe the nature and extent of proposed work, and shall be given forty-eight hours at least before the work is intended to be commenced, unless the officer expressly accepts shorter notice.

- 23. On the completion or extension of any service the responsible plumber shall report the work as ready for
- 24. In no case shall the ground be filled in or water turned on to any land until the work executed by the responsible plumber has been examined and passed by an officer, and a certificate in writing has been given by such officer to that effect.
- Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing By-laws shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty no exceeding Twenty pounds.

SECTION 3.—BY-LAWS FOR GENERAL PURPOSES.

- 26. Within the Leonora Water Area the water rate shall be at the rate of Two shillings (2s.) in the pound per annum upon the net annual value of all rateable land.
- 27. Within the water area, water services to nonrated premises will be given on the terms and conditions as set forth hereunder; provided that in accordance with the provisions of "The Water Boards Act, 1904," other terms and conditions may be agreed on as occasion may require.

- 28. The minimum sum payable as rate on each separately assessed property in the Water Area shall be One pound per annum.
- 29. Rates shall become due and payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July. Provided that in all cases where a water rate is made after the 1st day of January or the 1st day of July in any year, the notice for the order for the making and levying of such rate, published in the Government Gazette and a newspaper, as provided by Section 94 of the said Act, shall specify the minimum sum payable as rate as aforesaid, and the date or dates when the rates shall be due or payable, and such rate shall be and become due and payable in accordance with the terms of such notice.
- 30. Within the Leonora Water Area every ratepaying consumer will be entitled to a supply of water at the rate of eight shillings (8s.) per thousand gallons in return for the amount of rates paid by him. Provided that such water shall be taken during the period for which the rate is struck, and that the maximum quantity to be taken in consideration of the rate during any one half of a year shall not exceed one half of the quantity to which the consumer is entitled in respect of an annual rate.
- 31. Every ratepaying consumer taking water in excess of the qu niity to which he is entitled in respect of the rate will be charged for the excess in accordance with the prices set forth in Schedule I, hereto.
- 32. Every half year shall end on the 30th June or 31st December in every year.
- 33. When water is supplied by measure to the owner or occupier of land not rated under the Act, payment for the same shall be made at such times and in such manner as may be agreed upon between the Board and the consumer.
- 34. Any person or persons requiring a water service to town or suburban premises in respect of which for the time being a water rate may not be made, may be supplied on payment of a min muon charge, which shall be fixe I by the Board in each case. The minimum charge shall then take the place of a water rate, and the general provisions of these By-laws, as applying to rate-paying consumers, shall apply to minimum-charge paying consumers.
- 35. Applications for services shall be made on the printed form procurable at the Board's office, and shall be lodged not less than three days before the service is required.
- 36. Applications will not be entertained unless full information, as indicated on the printed form, is supplied, and the full amount of rates due on the premises to which a service is required is paid.
- 37. The Board may from time to time, when necessary for the purpose of tapping or repairing the main or otherwise, cut off the supply of water from any part or parts of the Water Area.

- 38. It shall be at the discretion of the Board as to whether or not a meter shall be fixed to any service, and the Board will also determine the size and class of meter in each case.
- 39. Meters will be supplied by the Board, and may, in the discretion of the Board, be open or encased.
- 40. The quantity registered by the meter at any date between ten days before the end of the half-year and ten days after the end of the half-year, may be taken by the Board as the reading of the meter at the end of such year.
- 41. During the time any meter is undergoing repairs, or should it cease to properly register the consumption of water, the Board may, at its option, estimate the quantity of water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous month or quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, and shall charge for the consumption so ascertained.
- 42. If the consumer shall at any time be dissatisfied with any particular reading of a meter, and shall be desirous of having same tested, he shall give written notice thereof to the Board within seven days of such reading, and thereupon the said meter shall be tested by passing through it a predetermined quantity of water; and if upon such testing it shall appear to the satisfaction of the Board that the said meter registered above five per cent. more than was actually passed through it at such testing, then the said Board will bear the expense of and incidental to such testing, and will also adjust the charge to the said consumer; but if the said meter upon such testing shall not register above five per cent. more than the quantity that shall actually have passed through it, then the said consumer shall pay to the said Board all the expenses of and incidental to such testing; provided that the amount representing the expense of each and every test shall be fixed by the Board and shall in no case exceed the sum of Forty shillings: Provided also, that the said consumer shall not be at liberty to avail himself of the right to test the registration of the said meter for any period other than one month next preceding the date of reading in respect of which he shall have given notice as aforesaid.
- 43. In every case in which the supply of water shall have been cut off by reason of non-payment of rates or other charges, or by reason of a defective service, a reconnection fee of Five shillings shall be charged and shall be payable by the consumer on demand.
- 44. No person to whom water is supplied by the Board shall, without written permission, sell or supply water to any person who may not reside on the premises of which he is the occupier.
- 45. The occupier of any premises to which the water has been laid on, or, in the event of there being no occupier, the owner, shall cause proper means to be taken, by locks or otherwise, subject to the approval of the Board, to prevent the use of water from the main by persons not connected with the premises supplied.
- 46. The owner or occupier of any allotment of land within the water area who shall erect or make, or cause to be erected or made, any building or addition to an existing building on such land shall, within one calendar month thereafter, give notice in writing the eof to the Board.
- 47. Officers or workmen employed by the Board shall not solicit or receive from the public any fee, gratuity, or reward.
- 48. Any person committing a breach of or failing to observe any one of the foregoing by-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

Appendix to By-laws for General Purposes.

Attention is invited to the following provisions of "The Water Boards Act, 1904":---

Part IV.—The Supply and Distribution of Water.
Water may be cut off from unoccupied premises, etc.

- $49.\,$ The Water Board may turn or cut off the water supply—
 - (1.) If the land to which water is supplied is unoccupied; or
 - (2.) When any rates or moneys due for water supplied, or agreed to be supplied, or any rent or charges for any meter or other fittings remain unpaid for seven days after they become due; or
 - (3.) If the occupier refuses to permit a meter to be attached to any pipe on his land; or
 - (4.) If the occupier commits or permits any breach of any of the provisions of this Act or the By-laws thereunder.

Turning or cutting off the water shall be a cumulative remedy for enforcing payment of water rates or other moneys due, and shall not relieve the owner or occupier from liability in respect thereof.

GUVERNMENT

Supply of Water not Compulsory.

50. It shall not be compulsory on the Water Board to supply or continue to supply water to any person; and the Water Board shall not be liable to any penalty or damages for not supplying or continuing to supply water.

PART V.—THE PROTECTION OF WORKS AND FITTINGS AND THE PREVENTION OF WASTE.

Duty to keep Fittings in Repair.

Every person supplied with water under this Act shall keep the service or communication pipe, and all prescribed fittings within or attached to his land, in good repair, so as to effectually prevent the water from running

Fittings not to be connected or disconnected without notice.

- 52. No person shall—
 (1.) Connect a meter, pipe, or other fitting through which water is or is intended to be supplied;
 - (2.) Disconnect a meter, pipe, or other fitting from any other meter, pipe, or other fitting through which water is or is intended to be supplied.

unless he has given the prescribed notice of his intention so to do, and has received the consent, in writing, of the Water Board or of an authorised officer in that behalf.

Power to enter and examine whether water is wasted, etc.

53. (1.) Any officer of the Water Board may, at all reasonable times, enter upon any land to which water is supplied under this Act, and may examine and ascertain—

What quantity of water has been consumed there;

Whether there has been or is any waste, misuse, fouling, or contamination of the water; and

Whether all fittings, with the materials and mode of arrangement thereof, used or intended to be used are in accordance with the By-laws, and in proper order and repair.

When a fitting is not in accordance with the Bylaws, or is out of proper order and repair, the officer of the Water Board may repair or remove it, and, if necessary, substitute others in its stead, or may alter the mode of arrangement, as the case requires.

Any expense incurred by the Water Board in that behalf shall, on demand, be repaid by the owner or occupier of the land, and if not repaid on demand may be recovered by the Water Board in the same manner in which water rates may be recovered.

Protection of fittings.

54. No person shall remove, alter, repair, renew, or uncover any pipe or other fitting which is the property of the Water Board until the prescribed notice has been given to the Water Board, and the corsent of the Water Board, in writing, obtained.

No such pipe or fitting shall be subject or liable to be seized or taken in execution by process of law under distress for rent.

Power to enter on land and fix fittings.

Any person authorised by the Water Board may at all reasonable times enter upon any land to which water is or is intended to be supplied under this Act, and may place and fix thereon and attach thereto, wherever the Water Board thinks proper, such fittings as the Water Board may think expedient, and may there do all other acts and execute all other works which the Water Board may think fit.

Any person so authorised may, at all reasonable times, enter upon such lands and examine, remove, repair, alter, or replace all or any of such fittings.

Penalty for using unauthorised fittings.

- 56. If any person supplied with water by the Water Board does any of the following things for the purpose of taking water in a manner not authorised by this Act, that is to say
 - (1.) Uses in, places upon, or attaches to the land, or permits to be so used, placed, or fitted any fitting, instrument, or thing not authorised by the Water Board; or
 - (2.) Alters, misuses, injures, or removes any authorised fitting, except for the purpose of necessary repair,

necessary repair, he shall forfeit and pay to the Water Board a sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, and shall, in addition, be liable to pay to the Water Board any damages sustained by the Water Board in respect of any injury done to their property, and the value of any water wasted, misused, or unduly consumed.

Penalty for not repairing fittings.

57. If any person supplied with water by the Water 57. If any person supplied with water by the Water Board causes or suffers any pipe, receptacle, fitting, or other apparatus used in connection with water supplied to him by the Water Board to be out of repair without repairing it within a reasonable time, or to be so used or contrived that the water supplied to him by the Water Authority is, or is likely to be wasted, misused, unduly open and on contaminated on each sulley the return of consumed or contaminated, or so as to allow the return of foul air or any noisome or impure matter into a pipe belonging to the Water Board, or connected with any such pipe, he shall forfeit and pay to the Water Board a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

Penalty for destroying Valves, etc.

- 58. If any person, not being authorised by the Water Board,-
 - (1.) Wilfully or carelessly breaks, injures, opens or shuts, or wilfully permits to be broken, injured, or opened or shut, any lock, sluice, cock, valve, pipe, or other authorised fitting, or any work belonging to the Water Board;
 - (2.) Flushes or draws off the water from any reservoir or other work of the Water Board; or
 - (3.) Does any other wilful act, or wilfully permits to be done any act whereby such water is wasted,

he shall forfeit and pay to the Water Board a sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, and shall, in addition, be liable to pay to the Water Board any damage sustained in respect thereof, as well for the value of the water wasted as in repairing the fittings or other parts of the works, and the amount of such damage shall be ascertained, determined, and recovered in the same manner as such forfeited sum.

Penalty for taking, etc., Water in contravention of this Act.

59. If any person uses, or consumes or permits to be used or consumed, any water belonging to the Water Board, contrary to the provisions of this Act and the By-laws thereunder, he shall forfeit and pay to the Water Board a sum not exceeding Fifty pounds.

Fraudulent taking of Water.

60. Any person who fraudulently takes, or procures to be taken, any water belonging to the Water Board from a reservoir, main, or pipe belonging to the Water Board, or from any pipe leading to or from any such reservoir, main, or pipe, is guilty of a misdemeanour, and liable to imprisonment, with or without hard labour, for any term not exceeding two years.

Other consequences of contravening this Act or the By-laws.

- 61. If any person supplied with water by the Water Board-
 - (1.) Does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of the provisions of this Act or of the By-laws; or
 - (2.) Omits to do so, or prevents being done, anything which under any of those provisions ought to be done for the prevention of the waste, misuse, or undue consumption of the water of the Water Board,

the Water Board may (without prejudice to any other remedy against him) cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied by the Water Board to him or for his use, and may discontinue the supply of water to him so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied; but such cutting off shall not affect or take away his liability to payment of rates.

PART VI.-WATER RATES AND PAYMENT FOR WATER. THE RATE BOOK.

Recovery of Rates by Distress.

62. If any person liable to pay money due for rates or for water supplied by measure under the provisions of this Act fails to pay the same for the space of fourteen days after demand thereof made, in writing, by the clerk or secretary, or any authorised collector, the chairman may issue his warrant for levying the amount with costs, by distress and sale of the goods and chattels found on the land in respect of which the money is due in accordance with the law for the time being relating to distress for

A warrant of distress may be in the form or to the effect of the Fifth Schedule.

The chairman may include in any one warrant any number of persons liable to pay rates.

The fees prescribed in the Sixth Schedule shall be payable on every distress.

Recovery by Action or Complaint,

63. Instead of proceeding by distress and sale, or in case no sufficient distress can be found on the premises, the Water Board may, fourteen days after demand thereof, in writing, by the clerk or secretary or any authorised collector, and notwithstanding any change of occupation or ownership, recover any money due for rates or for water supplied by measure from the occupier or owner for the time being of the land in respect of which the money is due, by complaint before two Justices of the Peace, or by action in any court of competent jurisdiction.

Recovery of Rates paid by Owner from Occupier.

64. (1.) When the owner of any land has paid any money due for rates or water supplied, which, as between the owner and occupier, should have been paid by the occupier, the owner may recover the sum so paid, on demand, from the occupier as arrears of rent could be recovered from the occupier by the owner.

Recovery of Rates paid by Occupier from Owner.

(2.) When the occupier of land has paid any money due for rates or water supplied, which, as between such occupier and the owner should have been paid by the owner, the occupier may deduct the amount paid from any rent due or to become due to the owner, or may recover the amount from the owner in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

Apportionment of Rates between successive Owners or Occupiers.

65. When an occupier or owner ceases to be the occupier or owner of the land in respect of which a rate is made, before the end of the period in respect of which such rate was made, such occupier or owner shall, as between himself and the succeeding occupier or owner, be liable to pay a portion only of the rate payable for the whole of such period proportionate to the time during which he continued to be the occupier or owner.

Any person who is the occupier or owner of the land during the remainder of the period shall, as between himself and the preceding occupier or owner, be liable to pay a portion of such rate in proportion to the time during which he is such occupier or owner.

But any rate made in respect of such property, and any money due for water supplied, shall continue in force, and may be recovered by the Water Board from the owner or occupier for the time being, without regard to any change in the occupation or ownership.

$Notices\ and\ demands,\ how\ served.$

- 66. (1.) Any notice or demand required by this Act to be given to or made upon any person may be served:—
 - (a.) By delivering the same to such person;
 - (b.) By leaving the same at his usual or last known place of abode;
 - (c.) By forwarding the same by post in a prepaid letter addressed to such person at his usual or last known place of abode.

When deemed to have been given.

(2.) A notice or demand forwarded by post shall be deemed to have been given or made and to have been received at the time when, by ordinary course of post, the letter would be delivered.

When name of owner or occupier unknown.

(3.) When a notice or demand under this Act is required to be given or made to any owner or occupier whose name or address is unknown to the Water Board, it shall not be necessary to name such owner or occupier, and such notice or demand may be served by placing it on some conspicuous part of the land of such owner or occupier, and by publishing it three times, at intervals of not less than a week between any two publications, in a newspaper usually circulating in the district.

Service on corporations.

(4.) A notice or demand may be served on a corporation, or incorporated company, or the members of a partnership, by being delivered, left, or posted in a prepaid letter; the notice or demand being addressed in each case to the corporation, company, or partnership at the principal effice or place of business thereof in the State.

Recovery of value of water misused, etc.

67. When any water supplied under this Act has been wasted, misused, or unduly consumed, the Water Board may recover the value thereof as a debt due to them by the person who wasted, misused, or unduly consumed the same, and the remedy given by this section shall be additional

to any other remedy which the Water Board may possess, and to the liability to any penalty which such person has incurred.

Obstructing Water Board or Officers in performance of duty.

68. Every person who obstructs the Water Board or any member thereof, or any person employed by the Water Board, in the performance of any act or thing which they are respectively authorised or required to do in the execution of this Act or any by-law made thereunder, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

GOVERNMENT ASSAYS.

ASSAYS, Analyses, and Determinations of any Western Australian Ore or Rock will be made by the Assayer to the Geological Survey, when not unduly interfering with official work, subject to the following conditions:—

- 1. Each sample must weigh at least 6oz., but not more than 2lbs.
- 2. Each sample must be enclosed in a separate canvas bag or strong paper wrapper, with a slip of paper bearing the name and address of the sender, together with a private mark by which it may be readily identified.
 - 3. The parcel must be forwarded prepaid to:

The Mineralogist and Assayer,
Geological Survey Office,
Perth.

4. A letter must be sent at the same time to the same address, stating for what metals the samples are to be assayed, or containing other instructions, as the case may

(N.B.—It is always advisable to keep duplicate samples of those submitted.)

- 5. Before any assay is made the prescribed fee must be paid to the Mineralogist and Assayer, or sufficient reasons, in accordance with Section 7 below, be furnished for having the samples treated free of cost.

A By-law of the Irwin District Road Board, made under the powers conferred by Section 117 Subsection 23, of "The Roads Act, 1992," to prevent and prohibit animals from strangage on the roads

The area in which this By-law operates is "the du'y declared district of the Local Board of Health, Dongara."

No person or persons being the owners or having the control of any cattle, horses, sheep, pigs, goats, or any other animals shall cause, permit, suffer, or allow any such animals to wander, stray, or be at large on any road or street in the area declared in the foregoing paragraph during the hours which elapse between sunset and sunrise.

Any of the animals before-mentioned found straying on the streets or roads within the said area, during prohibited hours, shall be pounded in the Public Pound, and the owner or person having control of such animals shall be liable to the poundage and driving fees as published in the "Government Gazette" of 20th September, 1907, according to "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882," and shall also be liable to a fine not exceeding Twenty shillings for each animal or Twenty pounds for any one offence.
