Romulations for the Guidance of Pablie Sorvants tating or mahing A方datits in the Supreme Court.

1. All persons, being officers of the Publie Service or holding any appointment under the Crown, who also hold the position of Commissioner for taking Affidavits in the Supreme Court, and all such persons in future apphinted by His Honour the Chicf Justice Commissioners for taking Afidavits, are permitted to retain tor their wha use the fees preseribed by the Supreme Court Rules for taking an affavit or affirmation and marking an exhibit, except in the following cases:-
2. No such Commissioner shall accept, for his own use and benefit, any tee for taking an affilavit or afirmation, or marking an exhibit, intended for use in any matter over which such officer has quasi-judicial control, or in regard to which he has any judicial or public functions or duties to discharge, but in all such cases the regular fees shall be charged and pad to revenue.
3. Where an affidavit, affirmation, or exhibit referred to in paragraph 2 is dealt with in the Supreme Court building, such fee shall be accounted for in accordance with the rules governing the payment of Supreme Court Fees by means of adhesive stamps; but where the fee is payable in some place in which the Supreme Court stamps are not obtainable, a reveme stamp or stamps of the proper value may be substituted and cancelled by the Commissioner.
4. Officers of the Publie Service or holding any appointment under the Crown whose duties require the making of any affilavit or affrmation, or the marking of any exhibit, intended or proposed to be used in the Public Service, or in the execution of their public duties,
shall, where possible, take such oath or affirmation as may be requisite before some Commissioner who is also an officer of the Public Service, and such Commissioner shall not charge or accept any fee for such affidavit, affirmation, or exhibit.
5. On taking an afidavit or affirmation or marking an exhibit under paragraph 4 , the Commissioner shall add after his signature the worts "Taken O.H.M.S. free," or "'Taken O.S. free," or some similar mark of sufficient significance to enable Audit Offcers to distinguish such special affidavits, affirmations, and exhibits.
6. When, hovever, an affidavit, affirmation, or exhibit referred to in paragraph 4 above is required in any action or other contentions matter, or in any case where the fee is recoverable on taxation from some second party, paragraphs 2 and 3 shall apply in lien of paragraph 4, the Commissioner shall act accordingly and bring the fee to Revenue in the prescribed manner. On recovery after taxation of the fee so paid, it shall be usel for the purpose of refunding the amount to the public official by whom the advance was originally made.

(1.) All stone accepted for treatment at State Batteries shall be estimated at 22 cubic feet per tom, except where weighing machines are provided, when stone must pass over same to ascertain weight.
(2.) The manager of the Battery may refuse any stone considered too poor to pay crushing charges, un. less a deposit is paid in advance.
(3.) The charge for trushing at each Battery, as determined from time to time by the Hon. the Minister for Mines, shall be posted up at each Battery and strictly adhered to while in force.
(4) A minimum charge will be made for all parcels of less tonnage than will return five pounds on the rate charged per ton.
(5.) Payment for treatment shall be made to the Mamager on completion of erushing, or suffeient gold will be retained to pay the amount due.
(6.) Where a cyanide plant has been erected at a battery, tailings consisting of sands and slimes resulting from stone crushed at that battery may be purchased, but the Manager may, in his discretion, refuse to purchase any tailings should he consider them unsuitable for treatment by cyanide.
(7.) The tailings produced from each parcel crushed may be purchased by the Department paying for 75 per cent. of the gold enntents as shown by assay after deducting three pennyweights per ton to cover losses and cost of cyaniding.

Gold to be paid for at the rate of 80 s . per ounce.
(8.) The number of tons of tailings to be paid for from each parcel shall be determined by the Manager whose decision shall be final, but the amount shall not be less than 80 per cent. or more than 90 per cent. of the tons erushed.
(9.) The Manager shall take samples of the tailings as they pass through the battery or from the vats into which the tailings may be deposited. The sample collected shall be thoroughly mixed and divided into four samples, one for assay by the manager, and one for the vendor; the other two shall be sealed, one being sent to the Perth office of the Mines Department, and the other kept by the Manager for reference or umpire if necessary.
(10.) Within three wecks of the completion of the crushing the vendor and manager shall compare assays, and if these differ by not more than six grains per ton the mean of the assays shall be accepted as correct. If there should be a greater difference than six grains between the assays, the umpire sample shall be sent by the Manager to the Government Assayer at Perth, whose assay shall be accepted as final by both parties. The cost of the umpire's assay (10s.) shall be borne by the party whose assay differs most from the umpire's result. The Manager's assay shall not be made known to the rendor until he has prodnced his assay cortificate for comparison of assays or has agreed in writing to accept the manager's assay. If the vendor does not produco an assay certificate for comparison within 21 days of the completion of the crushing, the Manager's assay shall be final.

If the manager considers any sample shows an abnormal assay value for the grade of ore producing the tailings, he may refer the matter to the Minister, whose decision as to the values to be paid on shall be indisputable and final.
(11.) All tailings assaying less than three (3) pennyweights per ton shall become the property of the Gorernment.
(12.) Where no eyanide plant has been erecter at a Battery, any person desirons of claiming tailings, the proceeds of his crushing, may remove them to a site clear of the settling area immediately the crushing is completed, and must notify the manager of his intention to do so previous to commencement of the crushing. All tailings not so removed shall be deemed abandoned, and may be dealt with as the Minister may direct.
(13.) All stone will be delivered and received for treatment absolutely at the owner's risk, and the Government shall not be responsible for any suspension of operations, delays in treatment, or for any loss or damage arising from any cause whatsoever.
(14.) Any customer or his deputy may be present during the crushing of his parcel, but shall take no part in the treatment exeept by the express permission and under the direction of the Manager.
(15.) At every Battery there shall be kept a book in which shall be reented the number of tons in each parel left for treatment the nome localite and number of the lease or holdiag from which it is sbtained, and the name of the person for whom the stone is to be crushed.
(16.) A copy of the foregoing rules shall be inserted in the salid book, and every person sending stone for treatment shall sign opposite the entry relating to the stone ledged by him, and such signature shall be sufficient evidence that he is cognisant of the foregoing rules and agrees to be bound by them.

BY-LAWS OF THE PERTH ROAD BOARD.
Public Works Department,
Perth, W.A., 25 th November, 1907.
IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Comeil has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws of the Perth Road Board, under Section 117 of the Roads Act (2 Edward VII., No. 48).

WHEREAS by " The Roads Act, 1902," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned: the Perth Roal Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act and of efery other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:-

## TNTERPRETATMON.

1. In these By-laws the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meaning set against them respectively, that is to say:-
' Board.' --The Perth Road Board.
"Chairman." -The nember acting for the time being as the Chairman of the Board.
"Gycle."--A bicyele, trieyele, or other velocipede.
" Cyclist."-Any person riding, impelling, or otherwise using or having the management or control of any cycle.
" District.' --The District under the jurisdietion of the Perth Road Board.
" Footpath", or " Footway" shall include any part of a street set apart for the sole use of toot passengers, and whether the same be made or kerbed or otherwise.
"Member."-A member of the Board, and inchudes the Chairman.
" Motor." Any vehicle, not including traction engines or steam rond rollers, moved or propelled by other than mimal power.
"Oceupier."--The inhabitant oceupicr of any land within the Distriet, and if there be no oecupier the porson entitled to the posses. sion thereof.
"Owner."- Imoludes the prrson, other than the King, for the time being entitled to receive the rent of the land, whether on his own account or as fruste, attornes, or agent for any other persen, or who wauld be entitied to receive the rat if the land ware let at a rent.
"Person" includes a Corporation, sole or aggregate.
"Road."-Any land under the control of the Poard, and notified in the "Govermment: Gazette" as a road; also any publie highway, bridge, eulvert, ferry, ford, gate, drain, builiing, or other thing appertaining thereto.
"Reserve."- Any latud under the control of the Board, and notified in the "Govermment Gazette " as a reserve.
"Secretary." - The Secretary of the Band.
"The Act. "- Whe Ronds Act. Iooe,' and all mandments theme whinh may herefter rome into forre.
"Vehicle."-Any mart, dray, carriage, vam, omnibus, tap, tration engine, or other concey ance whatsoever (not being a hand wat). with or without springs.

## DUTIES OF SECRETARY.

2. The duties of the Seeretary shall be:-
(a.) To attend all Board meetings.
(b.) To attend all Committee meetings.
(e.) To take notes of minutes and prepare reports of commitices.
(d.) Conduct all comrespondence, and to give the other officers instructions as directed by the minutes.
(e.) Answer all questions on the Board's business.
(f.) See that the accounts are audited once a year, and the balance sheets prepared and published yearly in the "Government Gazette" and at least one nowspaper cirenlating in the district, and any other duties specified under the Roads Act.
(g.) Prepare and pace before the Bond the quarterly fimancial statement at the end of each quarter of the financial year, and enter the same on the minutes as required by the Act.
(h.) Superrise the meparation of the ratebooks and the Board's Electoral lists; to examine proof of the latter, and to arrange for the distribution of copies prior to elections; also to attend all Courts of revision or appal ; to make the neeessary arrangements for the elections; to issue instructions to the supervisor in accordance with the Board's resolution.
(i.) Summon the mombers to Board and Committee meetings.
(j.) Keep all books entered up to date in accord ance with instractions issmed by the Minister, and adlitional instruetions of Board.
(k.) Check all arconnts sent into the Foard, and see all arcounts for works have stated in them the athority under which such works have been dome, abll to check all returns mate be the collector or other of the Board's offierss, and to see that the combtortoils of the receipt hook accompany all returas; to supervise and attend to the due payment of all moneys coming through the hands of the Board's officers and payable to the evedit of the Board.
(1.) Report to the Board at its next moeting any offecr noglectine to make his returns as provided, with the meensary voublers at tached thereto.
(m.) To pay into the bank after reecint, to the credit of the Poerd all moners mectived by him on behalt of the Buatd when such moneys shall amomet in the aggregate to the sum of es or orex, with the exeeption of moness gantod by Government, which are pad ino Treasury book.
(a.) Have the bank pass-book made m, in readiness for the moting of the Board, and to produce it or a bank certificate and an approximate bolanee shect, showing as nearly as possible the fmaneial position of the Board as regatis payments aheady made at each mooting therof, and to any member of the Boad desiring to see the same or any of them at athy time during office hours. No money shall be pait into the bank to the erredit. of the Board by any officer of the Board exept by or through the Secretary, as directed by the Board, and the Sementry shall give all rewipts on printed foms.
(o.) Readily and wherfully oboy all lawtul commands or orders of the Board, amt to attend to all other matters affecting the finanees and welfare of the Board and not herein speeified.

## SUPERVIROR'S DITTIES.

3. The duties of the Suparisor shall be:-
(a.) To promptly atto bid to all iastmetions me ecived through the Secretary, in respent of the following matiers:-
(b.) To prepare proper phans and specifations for all work and imporements as regarts roads, bridges, culverts, buidings, or premises ander the control of the Board situate within the District; examine all material to be amploved in such works, and see the sama fathfully and properly arented and pertomme lay ont such work as to height, lines, levels, and dimensions, and wateh the progerss and formation, thereot; submit all specifications and phas to the Board before tenders are ealled.
(e.) Tos se that the work of cleaning and repairing all public roads and footways is properly carried out.
(d.) To see that no labourers are engaged but those who aro able-boded and sober, and to immentately discharge any lahourer guiley of disobehence or insubordination, or found incapable of perfoming the duties allotted to him.
(e) To see that all drans, sewers, culverts, and bridges are mointained in atate of eficiencr.
(f.) To see that all offeers mader his control capy out their duties emientry and to reppt any doparture therehom.
(g.) To attond all Dont and fimmittoe meetings it required.
(h.) To spectaly ammine all roads throughont The District at lengt twhe a yone or as requived by the Bontd.
(i.) To remmer to the Soctetay, when requined, repurts am Bomats of all matters moder his controi ; to supply monthly, or oftener if required, to the Bond, returns of all work eompleted or in progress, with remarls thereon.

## APPOTNTMENT OE OTWLOBRS.

4. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Bond. In the ovent of there being mow than one applicant for such appointment, the election thereto shall be conducted by ballot so as to obtain an absolute majority of the mombers present.
5. The election of all other offeers shan be conducted by a show of hands, anless a ballot be demanded, in which case the procelure in the foregoing By-law shall be followed.

## MEETTNOS AND PROCEDDTNGS.

6. Notice shat be grea in wating by the Chairman or Secretary, of ontinary mectings at least three days before such moctings, and also of every mecting adoumed for a tem cxeeding six days. The Chairman, if present, shall preside at all meetings of ratefayers and of the Board, and in his absence, or after being present. he shall retire, one of the members of the Board elosen by the ratepayers or members present, as the case mary be, shall preside.
7. Meetings of the Boat shall be of two kinds"Ordinary" and "Special." Ordnary meetings are those called by the Chmman or Secretary as often as it scems proper for the transaction of the ordnary business of the Bond. Special meetings are those called to consider special business, the nature of which shall be notiacd on the notice paper summoning the mocting. for which seven days' notice shall he given-ide Clause 81 of the Roads Act. No busimess shall be transated at a special meeting other than that for which the sperial meeting was called.
S. Ordinary meetings shan be held at the office of the Board, Path, monthy at 3 o'clock p.m., unless otherwise amanged by resolution carried to that effect at the preceling ordnary meeting of the Board.
8. A special mecting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, he called at any time in the manner prescribed by the Act, but the Chairman may call a spechal meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper. No business shall be transacted at any ordinary or special meetiog maless at least three of the Board. inchisive of the Chamman or the member of the Board chosen to preside in his absence, shall be present.
9. Any three nombers may require the Boardroon to be cleared of stangers, and the Chairman, or other presiding Chaiman, sholl immediately give directions to have the order executed.
10. At all meetiags of the Board. When there is not a guorm prosent, of when the Board is counted out (which conting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than a (utorum present), such circumstances, together with the names of the mombers then present, shall be recorded in the minutebook.
11. The first busimess of all mectings of the Board shall be the reading of the minutes of the preceding mecting alond with a view to their confrmation.

## voting.

13. Each momber (including the Chaiman) shall have ono vote, and such Chaimatn shall, in case of equality of cotes, have a casting rote in addition to his ordinary rote, and all questions at sheh meetings shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present. All motions and amendments shall be decided by a show of hands, muless a division is demanted, before the next business is proceeded with.

## MINUTES OF MEETINGS.

14. The minute-book preseribed by the Act shall be kept, in which any item of business transacted by the Board at a moeting shall be then and thore eutered by the Secretary. Minutes of special or ovdinary meetings shall be confmed at the next ordinary monting. No discmssion shall take place upon the minntes of procedings, except as to their aecurary or for the retifention of a clerical error.

## ORDER OF PUSTNESS.

15. The order of business at all ordinary meetings shall be as follows, that is to say :-
(a.) Reading and coufirmation of minutes of last ordinary mat spetal meetings (if any).
(b.) Consideration of business arising out of mimates.
(e.) Reading of correspondence (in and ont) and takim action as may be deemed expedient in regerd thereto.
(d.) Presentation of petitions or memorials, and Committee reports and consideration thereot.
(e.) Consideration of tenders and ratification of contraets.
(f.) Geneml business.
(g.) Passing of accounts for payment.
16. Th the crent of any member having urgent business to place before the meeting he may move the suspension of the Stauting Orders, and, if agreed to by the Board, siteh business shall take precedence of all other.
17. Any member wishing to rescind any motion carried at any previous meeting shall give to the Secretary at least seven days' notice of his intention to move such rescission, particnlars of which shall be posted to each member.

## PETITIONS.

18. Every petition or memorial shall be respectfinl and tomperate in its language, and shall be presented to the Board by a menber only, and any member presenting a pettion or memorial to the Board shall affix his name to the beginning thereof, with the number of signatures; and any member presenting a petition or memorial shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectul to the Board. The nature or prayer of every potition or memorial shall be stated to the Board by the momber presenting the same.

## TENDERS.

19. Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject matier of the tenders come on to be considered at the mecting of the Board, or by a Committec appointed for the purpose.

## ORDERS OT DEBATE.

Speakers must not digress.
20. A member having andience shall not digress from the subject of debate.

## MOTTONS AND AMENDIENTS.

21. A motion once moved at a meeting cannot be Withdrawn unless by consent of the Board.
22. One or more amendments may be proposed on a motion before the Board. When more than one amendment is mored, the question shall be first put on the last amendment, then on the next in succession, and then on the original motion, in the reverse order in which they were moved.
23. A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the Chairman.
24. In submitting a motion or amendment the Chairman shall put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.
25. When an amendment is carried, the motion amended thereby becomos a substantive motion, upon which further amendments may be moved before it is finally dealt with.
26. No member shall speak twice on the same subject, except by way of explanation, or to an amendment, or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the last carried motion; nevertheless any member who may have been misunderstood or misrepresented shall be allowed to explain immediately before the mover rises to reply, but not after, and after the reply the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall immediately be put to the vote.

## APPOINTMENT OF COMMITTEE.

27. The Board may at any time appoint three or more members as a Committee to inquire into any matter and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no Committee shall incur any financial liability, or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever, without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws, or a resolution of the Board. The quorum of a Committee shall comprise two members.

## FTNANCE COMMITTEE AND FINANCE ACCOUNTS.

28. A Finance Committec shall consist of the Chairman and two or more members appointed by the Board for the purpose of examining all accounts, hills, and vonchers. Such Committee shall meet at some hour previous to every ordinary meeting, but on the same day.
29. All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the Finance Committee prior to the ordinary meeting, and after being certified as correct, shall be paid by cheque.
30. An account shall be openod with such bank as the Board may from time to time direct, and all moneys receised from whatever somre, with the exdeption of money granted by the Government, shall be paid into such bank to the eredit of the Board, and no account shall be paid excopt by cheque signed by the Chairman and one or more members of the Board, and countersigned by the Secretary. All moneys belonging to the Board shall, within 24 hours after they come into the hands of any offcer, servant, or clerk, be maid to the Secretary or to any other responsible offeer if directed by the Board.

## URGENT WORKS.

31. The Chairman, with one member, or in the absence of the Chairman, any two members may, in case of urgency, authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceding £10. Any one member is empowered to authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding Two pounds ten shillings in ase of very urgent necessity upon " deelared voads," but shall in every case report the same at the next meeting of the Board.

## UNAUTMORISED EXTENDITURE.

32. Every item of expenditure and every liability incurred by any Committee, or member of the Board. otherwise than under the athority of the Let or of these By-laws, shall be deemed untawful expenditure, and a breach of this By-law by such person.

## PREVENTION OF NUISANOLS.

33. Any person who-
(a.) Shall keop, or muse to be kept, any abattoir, slaughter-house, pigsty, manure works, works for boiling down meat, bones, blood, or offal, bone mill, bone manure depot, fellmongery, tannery, woolseoming establishment, glue factory, soap or cande works, fish-curing establishments, place for storing, drying, or preserving bones, hides, hoofs. or skins, dairy, or other work or establishment; or
(b.) Shall keep, or cause to be kept, any house, passage, yard, way, cellar, drain, stable, cowshet, carth or other closet or cesspool; or
(c.) Shall permit any accumulation of stagnant water, manure, dung, offal, or other filth upon any premises owned or oceupied by him; or
(d.) Shall deposit, or cast, or allow to remain uron any road or public place the carcase of a dead animal, or any refuse or offensive matter ; or
(c.) Shall cause or permit any foul or offensive liquid to flow from any land, house, or premises owned or occupied by him in and upon any road or footpath,
so as to be or likely to become a nuisance or injurious to public health, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding $£ 20$.

## OFRENCES, OMLSSIONS, OR NEGLECTS.

34. Any person guilty of any of the following offences shall, on conviction thereof, pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds:-
(a.) Riding or driving cattle or horses, or other animals, or wheeling any barrow, or driving any carrage or eart npon or along any footpath.
(b.) Placing any timber, bricks, or other material upon any footpath, channel, surface drain, or road without the permission of the Board having becn first obtained.
(c.) Burning any shavings or other material or matter in any road or open or publie place.
(d.) Damaging or destroying any dam, well, tank, pump, windmill, windlass, bucket, rope, piping, troughing, fence, or gate under the control of the Board
(e.) Placing any placard or other document, writing, printing on or otherwise defacing any house or building abutting or contiguous to a publie road, or on any wall, fence, gate, or lamp-post withont the consent of the ocenpior or owner thereof.
(t.) Opening or obstructing any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footpath or rodd, without the permission of the Board having first been obtained.
(g.) Rolling any cask, beating any earpet, breaking in any horse, flying any kite, using any bow and arow, or playing at any game to the amoyance of any person in any public place, or allowing any cart or animal to rembin upon any footpath, placing goods upon any footpath, or otherwise obstructing any footpath.
(1.) Throwing of discharging any stone or other missile in any road to the damage or danger of any person.
(i.) Inaving any awning upon or over any footpath in any road not being eight foet clear above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning over the footway without permission of the Board.
(i.) Blasting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any road without the permission of the Board, and not attending to such direcfions in regard thereto given by such Board.
(k.) Purionsly of negligently driving or riding along any road.
(1.) Making any cellar-door or other opening from the footway of any road without the consent of the Board.
(m.) Plying for hire without a license in the form set forth in Schedule " 0 " hereto.
(11.) Fishing off any bridge.
(o.) Using or having in possession or control any anlicensed vehicle or machine engaged or to be engaged in heary traffic without haviug a license in the form set forth in Schedule " B " hereto.
(p.) Tsing of having in possession or control any milicensed cyele or motor without having a lieense in the form set forth in Schedrle " D " hereto.

## GENERAL REGULATION OF TRAFFIO.

35. Every person having the care or conduct of any carriage shall keep the same on the left side or near side of the road, except in case of actual necessity or other sufficient reason for deviation, and shall not interrapt or interfere with any person or carriage passing or attempting to pass his carriage.
36. No person shall ride or drive any horse or other animal along any road at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour.
37. No person shall drive any vehicle between sunset and the following sumpe along any road without having a proper carriage lamp securely fixed on the off side of the front of such vehicle, which shall exhibit a white light in the direction in which he is proceeding, at all times to be kept lighted.
38. No person having the care or control of a horse or other animal, or of any velicle, shall allow the same to remain in any road of the district, or to obstruct any portion of such road, for a longer period than necessary for loading and unloading the rehicle; provided that where suitable bridle posts are provided the horses may be securely fastened thereto, for any period not exceeding sixty minutes, but immediately upon the request of any officer or member of the Board or police constable such shall be removed.
39. Any person leading any horses or cattle shall, on passing any rehicle or equestrian, keep on the right side of the road, and the attendant must be on the near side of such horses or cattle.

## TO PREVENT TREES FALLING ACROSS ANY

 ROAD OR TRACK.40. No person shall make or leave a fire near any road or track or reserve mader the jurisdiction of the Board without taking proper precautions against such fire spreading, and any person offending against this By-law shall, upon conriction, pay a penalty not exceeding $£ 20$.
41. No person shall set fire to any standing tree mpon or near to any road or track, and any such offender shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding £20.

TO PREVENT AOCCIDENTS FROM RIDING, Ete. ON BICYCLES, Fte.
42. (a.) No person shall, between sunset and sumrise, ride a cycle or motor within the district umess there is attached thereto a lamp or lamps which shall exhibit a white light in the direction in which he is proceeding, at all times to be liept lighted.
(b) Every eycle or motor shall carry a bell, or other instrument suitable for giving warning of approach, which shall be used as a signal whenever any person on foot or on horseback, or vehicle, is being approached or passed.
(c.) No person shall leave any cycle or motor in or on any road or footway so as to become an obstruction, and every person shall remove his cycle or motor immediately upon being requested to do so by any constable or officer or member of the Board.
(d.) No person shall pass at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour any person who shall be riding or driving any horse or other animal.
(e.) When a cyclist or motorist shall meet any horse or animal, and such horse or animal shall become restive, or appear likely to get beyond the control of the person in charge thereof, such eyclist or motorist shall stop his eycle or motor, and shall not proceed until such horse or animal has passed.
(f.) No person shall ride any cyele or motor round the corner formed by the junction of any roads in the district, or across the intersection of any of the said roads, at a pace exceeding six miles an hour.

TO PREVENT OBSTRUCTTONS ON THE FOOTPATHS.
43. No person shall permit any box, case, coal, sand, firewood, goods, wares, merchandise, or other articles or effects to remain on any part of a road, or on any part of a footpath, within the district after sunset, nor in any case tor a longer period than shall be necessary for housing and removing same.
44. No person shall place, lay, deposit, shoot, or discharge any rubbish or materials whatsoever on the surface of any street, road, footway, or public reserve within the distriet without having first obtained permission of the Board.
45. Every person shall, atter having received from the Board, as in the last preceding section provided, a permit to deposit rubbish or materials on the surface of any road, footway, or public reserve, have and keep sufficient and continuous light burning thereon from sunset to the following sunrise during the time such rubbish or material shall remain or continue so deposited.

## TO PREVENT DAMAGE TO TOOTPATHS AND ANY OTHER BOARD PROPERTY.

46. No person, without first having obtained the written sanction of the Board, shall break up, cut down, damage, destroy, or injure any footpath, gutter, drain, cuivert, bridge, rond, public way, tree, plant, gate, fence, post, lantern, lamp-post, implements, materials, buildings or other property of the Board, or under the control thereot.

## PRESERVATION OF TREES, Ete.

47. Any person who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remore from its place any tree, shmb, or plant standing in any of the roads, enclosures, public places of, belonging to, or under the care or superintendence of the Board, or who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove ont of its place, or ride or drive against any of the tree-guards, fences, or other protection to any such trees, shrubs, or plants as aforesaid, shall forfeit for every such offence a penalty not more than $£ 10$.

## THROWING DANGEROUS SUBSTANCES ON FOOTITA Y'S.

48. Auy person who shall throw vegetable substances, or any offensive, noxious, or dangerous substance upon any footway within the district shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £1 for every such offence. Any person or persons placing, or cansing to be placed, or broken in or upon any road, pathway, reserve, or park lands under the control or supervision of the Board, any glass, metal, or earthenware bottles or untensils, without having first obtained the consent of the Board so to do, shall be liable, beyond the costs and charges incidental to the removal of auy such glass, metal, or earthenware, to a fine, upon conriction, not exceeding $£ 2$, in addition to amount of damages caused thereby.

## PARK LANDS, RESERVES, AND RECREATION

 GROUNDS.49. All park lands and recreation grounds shall be open to the public daily for recreation purposes, excopting as otherwise provided for in these By-laws. The Board shall have the power to grant exclusive right to use and occupy any park lauds, recreation grounds, or reserves placed under its control within the district for holding public sports or amusements to any responsible person or persons; and any person or persons obtaining such right shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences, buildings, and trees, or other improrements upon or enclosing such park lands, recreation grounds, and reserves, and shall pay the Board a fee to be fixed for admission on such occasions.
50. No horses, cattle, or vehicles shall be allowed on any park lands or recreation ground without the written permission of the Board.
51. All persons using or being upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves shall at all times conduct themselves in a becoming manner, and any person crating any distubance or annoyance to the public shall be liable to be expelled from such lands by any police constable or officer of the Board.
52. The Board may, in its diseretion, prohibit any games or gymatstics from being played or carried on by any person or persons upon any park lands, recreation gronnds, or reserves on any Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday.
53. No person shall sell, or expose for sale, any goods, wares, fruit, or merchandise in any park lands, recreation ground, or reserve without first having obtained the permission of the Board, and shall pay a fee, the amount of such fee not to execed £lo.
5t. No person shall damage or injure any tree, shab, or phant in any park lands, rectation grounds, or reserves. Any person offonding against this Byhaw shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penality not exceeding thin for every such offence.

## SAND AND TTMBER.

55. Auy persom who shall remove any sand or other materials from any lands belonging to or in charge of, or under the control of the Board, without a license in form set forth in Sehedule " L ", hereto shall fofeit and pay, upon wonviotion, a penalty not execeding $£ 5$.
56. Any person who shall dat or remove any timbe. or bush ot ayy lamb belonging to or in charge of or mader the control of the Board, without a liense in the fomm set forth in Sohedule "G" hereto, shall fortit and pay, upon conviction, a peataty not exeqeding $£ 5$.

## TAMPTOSTS, Ete.

69. No lamp-post, bedlopost, watertrongh, telegraph, telephone, or cocthir itghting pole or flagstaf shail be erected by atry presom in any street or road without the writcon romsent of the Boma, and upon consent being obtained shall be phared in such position, and shall be painted at loast one in every thee years, as mar be dreeted by the Boam; and the Roand may orter the remoral by the owners of all bent, dangerons, or unsighty posis or poles. Any preson offending aganst this By-law shatl forfeit and may, on conviction, a pemalty int exweding eo for every such offence.
PRESGRIBING THE RENOOVAL OP VERANDAISS AND BALCONIEA, Wte, AT BXPENSE OF OWNER OR OCCUPIER.
70. Any verandah or haleony which obstmets the footway or roadway, or is dangerons, and all other obstructions on the footways or roadways, or orerhangiag same, shall he removed when oftered within such time as shall be notified by the Boam, and all axpenses incured in removing some shatl be borne by the owner ar areuprom of sheh wandah, bakemy at other obstruetion, whether momed by the Board or otherwise; and any person whatsocser intortering or obstruting any oflew or person employed hy the Boad in arrying out this By-law, on constetion, shall pay a sum not excecling \&io.

## ENOROAGINENTS OR OBSTRUCTIONS TO BE

 REMOVED.61. On the order of the Board, the Secretary or other apponted ofleer may direct the removal, within it days, of any building, tonce, or other obstruetion or cheroachment in or won any strect, road, lane, or public place muder the control of the Board.

In any ase where, fter servee of notice tor such rearoval, any such obstruetion or encroachment has not been removed within the suefifed time, it shatl be lawful for the offrer apoointed by the Board to remove same at the eost and eharges of the person so ofending and to proced against the oftender for the breach of this By-haw, the ponaty for which breach shall be not more than Exd for every day or part of a day during which sum oftence shall be committed or continned after the expiry of the notice prestribed therein.

## DAMAOING ROADS.

62. No persoa shall damage or destroy by means of horse, team, wagon, day, or any other means, any road or pothon ot a rad under constuction or repair, and aby person foum gulty ot sach damage or destruction shall be lithte to a penalty not exeeding EOD.
(93. Any person who:-
(a.) Cuts of remores, withont the consent in Writing of the 'fhemman of the Board, timber, cart, sam, gmvel, stoue, or other material tron a road; or
(b.) Eicets, without the consent aforesaid, upon a road so as to encmah themon ; or
(e.) Draws, whomt the ronsent aforesaid, ateross the water-side of a road, aregot over a propery-constmotw apmoath or anlvert, a dray, or other wheded rehicle; or
(d.) Draws upon a rond, bimber, stone, or other naterial othemise than on a whoeled rehicle, or sumers such materiat, when caried principally of in part upo a wheeled vehiclo, to datg or trail upon a road, or draws vpon a soded a whim or timber carrage any portion of which, of aty portion of chains attaching thereto, or any portion ot any other athehment, trails or drags upon a road
shall be deemed gulty of th ofteme tganst these Bylavs, and shall be litho to a pematy not exceeding Es for every such onence.

## UATNLE TO KRHP OFP THE ROADS.

64. The owner of any cable, sherp, homs, pig, or ollor thimal straying on ony roal within the district thall be liable to a pemalty not exereding tas.
(9.5. The owner wit any bitl, stalion, or bear straying on any roth whan tho district shall be liable to a pomaliy not excecding Elu.

TEAVY TRAFMTG,
60. The owner of erery rehiche of engine which, fogether with its load, shall weigh more than five fons, shall travel the roads, bridges, and culvers at his own risk, and shall be liable to pay for any damatge done.
67. The Bumer may, by motice affixed to any bridge or envert, dectare tho maximum weight ot any engime agrientimal or other methine or vehicle of any kind, and of any load or materal which shall be permitted to eross sach bidge or culvert, and also the face or speed at which sueh engine machine, vohicle, or load shall be driven, fed, of taken over any such bridge or colvert, and any person who shall aross such bridge or culvert in contrationtion of this Dy-law shatl, in addition to any lability for damage he may have ransed, he liable, on conviction, to a penaty not exceeding elo.

## POUND.

68. Any persan who shall break, damage, or destroy any pand foner, gate, loek, shed, Trongh, or bemises shatl, on conriction, be linble to a penalty not exwoding et.
(6). Any berson who shall onftemate dufate or damage any lable of fers, patard, or other motice remuited by "the cathe Trespass, Fencing, and Impombling Aet, 1842." shat be ghilty of an oftence aghinat this By-law, and shath, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding es.
69. Any person who shall release, or attempt to release, any cattle which shall be lawfully seized for the purpose of being impounded, whether such cattle shall be in the pound or on the way to or from any such pound, shall be guilty of an oftence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding fo.

## BATHING.

71. No person shall bathe in any river or open public water within the limits or abutting on the boundary of the Road District, within the jurisdiction of the Board, between the hours of seven in the morning and eight in the evening, without suitable bathing costume or clothing.
72. Every person offonding against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding $£ 20$.

## WATER SUPPLI.

73. Auy person who shall injure or damage any well, bore, pipe, tank, or place for storage of water under the control of the Board, or any machinery, appliances, or property used in connection therewith, shall be guilty of an olfence against this Dy-law, and notwithstanding any civil remedy for damages so caused shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding $£ 5$.
74. Any person who shall waste, or allow water to escape, foul or pollute any water contained in any bore, pipe, tank, or place of storage shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding $£ 20$, in addition to any other sum which he may be legally required to pay for damages.

## LICENSES.

75. The several licenses contained in the schedules hereto may be granted by the Board for such periods not exceeding twelve months, or for such purposes irrespective of any period of duration, and upon payment of such fees as shall be prescribed; and if any person holding any such license shall make default in any of the conditions contained in such license the license shall thereupon become absolutely null and void, and the fees paid therefor shall be forfeited to the Board, and such person shall, in the event of any breach of the said license be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction thereof, be liable to a penalty not exceeding 45 .
76. The owner of every licensed vehicle plying for hire or engaged in heavy or medium traffic, and of every licensed bicycle or motor shall have their license number affixed on some conspicuous part of such vehicle, eycle, or motor, and any person who shall refuse or neglect to have such numbr so affixed shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding $£ 2$.

## PENALIUES.

77. Where any person by these By-laws, or any of them, is required to do or perform any act, and such act is not done, or remains undone or unperformed, it shall be lawtul for the Board to perform the same and charge the cost and expenses against such person, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.
78. Erery person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these Bylaws, or commits, or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed gnilty of an offence against these By-laws, and, where not otherwise provided shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.
79. All penalties or other sums recovered under the provisions of these Br-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board, and shall become the property of and fom part of the ordinary income of the district, except so much as may be payable to any informer.

PREVIOUS BY--IAWS.
