WHEREAS by "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1902" (1 and 2 Edwardi VII., No. 20), and "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1905" (5 Edwardi VII., No. 22), the Governor may, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, after the opinion of the Road Board of the District has been requested, close any road or reservation for a road which may have been surveyed or shown as a road on any plan published by the Department of Lands and Surveys: Provided such road is not within the limit of a Municipality, and has not been declared a Government road or a road under "The Roads Act," or any Act amending the same: AND WHEREAS the roads hereinafter described have been surveyed and shown as roads on the undermentioned plans as published by the Department of Lands and Surveys: AND it is desirable to close such roads: AND WHEREAS the opinion of the undermentioned Road Boards have been requested: Now THEREFORE I, Sir Edward Albert Stone, Knight, Lieutenant-Governor as aforesaid, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the said surveyed roads to be closed.

ATTENTION is drawn to Sections 3 (c.) and 13 of "The Registration of Births, Deaths, and Marriages Amendment Act, 1907," which came into force on the 12th instant, and enacts the following special provisions for the registration of still-births.

3. (c.)... Still-born child means any child of seven months' gestation or over, not born alive.

13. (1.) Notwithstanding anything contained in the principal Act, the birth of any still-born child shall, within fourteen days after the birth, be registered, without fee or reward, both in the Register of Births and the Register of Deaths at the office of the district projectors of the district in which such birth district registrar of the district in which such birth has occurred; and for all the purposes of the Regis-tration of Births, Deaths, and Marriages Act, 1894, such child shall be deemed to have been born alive

and to have subsequently died.
(2.) No interment of such child shall take place unless the interment is authorised by the certificate of a duly qualified medical practitioner, or a certificated midwife or nurse, or of a police or resident magistrate or officer of police not under the rank of sergeant, who has made personal inquiry into the cir-

cumstances. (8.) Any person interring a still-born child without first obtaining such certificate shall be guilty of an offence, and liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds, or to imprisonment with or without hard labour, for any term not exceeding six months.

(4.)Provided that if any still-born child is born at a place situated more than ten miles from the nearest duly qualified medical practitioner, magistrate, or officer of police, and the mother was not attended by a certificated midwife or nurse, such child may be interred without such certificate, but the birth of the child so buried shall be reported within fourteen days from the date of the burial, by the person who interred the horizontal property and the person who interred the property and the person who interred the property relies of the person who interred the property relies of the person who interred the body, to the nearest police officer, who shall forthwith make a full inquiry into the circumstances of the case, with a view of taking further action if necessary; any person who so buried the body of a stillborn child and neglects to make the report required by this subsection shall be guilty of an offence, and subsection three of this section.
