THE QUARANTINE ORDINANCE OF NETHERLANDS INDIA.

Government Gazette, 1892, No. 44, as amended and enlarged.

IN THE NAME OF THE QUEEN!

The Governor General of Netherlands India, with the advice and consent of the Council of Netherlands India, sends greeting, To all who shall see this or hear read: and makes known:

Whereas he has found it expedient that the Regulations for the Prevention of the Introduction and Spread of Contagious Diseases in Netherlands India be repealed and substituted;

Having considered Articles 20, 29, 31, and 33 of the Regulations for the Administration of the Government of Netherlands India;

By virtue of a Royal Decree has approved and enacted the following:—

Regulations for the Prevention of the Introduction and Spread of Contagious Diseases in Netherlands India.

CHAPTER 1.

Definition of Contagious Diseases.

Article 1.

(1.) The stipulations of this Ordinance are only applicable to cases of Yellow Fever, Asiatic Cholera, Small-pox (variola and varioloid) and—as far as not dealt with by the special stipulations of a later Ordinance to be enacted—to cases of Plague.

(2.) The Governor General may, if deemed expedient, and subject to later Royal approval, declare this Ordinance to be applicable to other contagious diseases, by public decree.

CHAPTER 2.

Declaration of Inspection.

Article 2.

(1.) Whenever a contagious disease breaks out at a seaport in Netherlands India in such manner that a large number of persons are suddenly attacked and speedily succumb thereto, especially when several centres of the epidemic are formed, then such port must be declared infected.

(2.) The Chief local authority in consultation with the health officer if present, decides regarding the declaration of infection and immediately gives notice thereof, if possible telegraphically, to the Director of Education, Religion and Industry, and the Chief of the Residency.

(3.) The Director aforesaid publishes in the *Government Gazette*, with the utmost possible despatch, that the port is declared infected, in accordance with the stipulations of this Ordinance, and at the same time advises the Chief of the Medical Service. The Chief of the Residency gives notice of the declaration of infection to the senior medical officer of the Residency.

(4.) If the Chief local authority—after consultation with the Health Officer if present—is of opinion that there is no longer any danger of infection, he withdraws the declaration of infection, after which this decision is made public in the same manner as prescribed by the two preceding paragraphs.

(5.) The Chief of the Residency gives notice of the declaration of infection and the withdrawal of same, if possible telegraphically, to the Chief Government Officials at all ports which are likely to be soon visited by a ship from the infected, or lately infected, port.

(6.) The Governor General decides which portions of territory or seaports outside of Netherlands India are declared infected, and withdraws such declaration as soon as the disease which was the cause of the declaration has subsided. This declaration and the withdrawal thereof must be published, on behalf of the Governor General, in the *Government Gazette*.

CHAPTER 3.

Bills of Health.

Article 3.

(1.) The Harbourmaster must hand to Masters of ships leaving one port in Netherlands India for another port in Netherlands India a foul bill of health if the port of clearance has been declared infected, or if a case of contagious disease has broken out on board, or if the ship, in consequence of such disease, is still in a state of infection when ready to leave.

(2.) No claim may be made on the ground of non-possession of a Bill of Health if the Master has intentionally broken the stipulations of Article 9.

(3.) The Bill of Health will be issued by the Harbourmaster corresponding to Model A or B, in the Dutch or Malay language, according to whether the Masters are European or Native. Mention is made on the Clearance as to the issue thereof.

(4.) The Bills of Health must be issued to Native Masters in the presence of two witnesses who, together with the Harbourmaster, make an endorsement thereon that the Masters have also been verbally informed that at the port of clearance a contagious disease exists or has broken out on board.

(5.) Masters of ships leaving a Netherlands Indian seaport, whether direct or indirect for a foreign country can, on application, always obtain a Bill of Health from the Harbourmaster. The Bills are drawn up in accordance with Model C.

(6.) He who receives a Bill of Health as referred to in the previous paragraph, and touches at other ports in Netherlands India before leaving for a foreign country, is bound to have the state of health at those ports recorded on his Bill of Health.

(7.) An endorsement must immediately be made on the clearance of the ship, of the issue of a Bill of Health and of the *visa* thereof at the succeeding ports.

Article 4.

Bills of Health are exempted from stamp duty and are issued gratis.

Article 5.

(1.) Masters of ships entering from ports outside of Netherlands India are bound to produce to the Harbourmaster, on arrival at a port in Netherlands India, a Bill of Health issued by a competent authority.

(2.) If there is a Dutch Consul present at the port of departure, the Bill of Health must be issued by that authority, or at least be *visé* by him.

(3.) A vessel may only possess one Bill of Health.

(4.) If the vessel touches at a port on the way, the Consul there must sign the Bill of Health as exhibited with notice as to the state of health at said port and whether the vessel has had free pratique or not. The authorities are forbidden to retain the Bill of Health or to issue another in its place.

(5.) In the absence of a Dutch Consul, the Masters must have the Bill of Health *visé* by the local competent authority.

(6.) The Masters may in no case destroy or do away with the Bills of Health before they have arrived at their ultimate port of destination.

(7.) The Bill of Health is only considered valid if issued within 48 hours before the vessel's departure.

(8.) The foregoing Regulations are applicable to vessels plying between Singapore, Penang, and several ports in Netherlands India only in so far that those vessels must be in possession of a Bill of Health, whenever one of the two said ports of departure, or at which they have touched, have been declared infected on account of a contagious disease.

CHAPTER 4.

Cases in which the stipulations of the Ordinance are, or are not applicable.

Article 6.

The stipulations of this Ordinance are not applicable:

- (1.) To fishing boats, customs vessels, pilot boats, and other vessels of less measurement than one "last" (100 c. ft.) capacity.
- (2.) To guardships of stations.

Article 7.

(1.) To ships lying at anchor or ships coming in which must be considered as infected—owing to their falling under the category referred to by Article 3, or owing to a case having shown itself on board while the ships were on the way or after arrival—the authority concerned immediately allows the flag hoisted in accordance with Article 9 to be hauled down whenever the same sickness for which the ship is declared infected has also broken out at the port of arrival or at a place which is in communication therewith by land, and at a distance of not more than 60 paals (of 1506.94 Metres) if the communication is kept up by ordinary roads, or 200 Kilometres if there is communication by railroads or tramways.

(2.) The order to haul down the yellow flag is given immediately after receipt of the advice, referred to in Article 10 para. 2, of the reason of the hoisting of that flag and without a previous visit on board of the medical officer charged with that duty.

(3.) The Chief local authority immediately advises the Harbourmasters at the seaports situated within the distance referred to by para. 1, of the breaking out of a contagious disease, as also when the disease may be considered as having subsided.

(4.) For the application of this article, the disease may be considered as having broken out whenever three cases are reported simultaneously among the population at any of the places referred to in the first para. It may be considered as having subsided whenever no cases have been reported among the population there during three days.

Article 8.

(1.) Notwithstanding the stipulations of the foregoing articles, the regulations of this Ordinance are applicable to ships entering Netherlands Indian roads or a Netherlands Indian port, or anchoring there after arrival:

- 1st. If they have touched at ports on the voyage, or come from places, which at the time of departure were declared infected in consequence of one of the diseases referred to in Article 1, and the ships have not yet undergone the prescribed medical inspection in a Netherlands Indian port and are granted free pratique;

2nd. Whenever such disease has occurred during the last voyage, or breaks out on board while the ship is lying in the roads.

(2.) The word "roads" in this Ordinance also includes the usual anchorages for ships coming from the high seas, inside the bays, and on the rivers and streams.

(3.) The Masters take measures with all means at their disposal for a rigorous compliance with the regulations of this Ordinance.

(4.) For as far as these regulations wholly or partly do not apply to their vessels, they still have, in accordance with orders to be given on behalf of the Government, to comply with the Epidemic Ordinance (*Government Gazette*, 1892, No. 45).

(5.) With the exception of the stipulations of para. 2 of Article 16, everything which is prescribed regarding masters in this Ordinance also refers to the Commanding Officers of war ships, irrespective which flag they fly and for the commanders of the ships belonging to the Government Marine.

CHAPTER 5.

The hoisting of the yellow flag.

Article 9.

(1.) The Master of a vessel, falling under one of the categories referred to by paragraph 1 of Article 8, hoists a yellow flag in the daytime from the fore topmast, while after sunset, two burning lanterns are placed on the foretop one under the other.

(2.) He takes care that from the moment he falls under the category mentioned by para. 1 of this article, no communication takes place from the ship to the shore or with other vessels until sanction has been given to his hauling down the yellow flag.

(3.) He is bound to take the berth appointed by the competent authority and to remain there, save as stipulated by Article 18, till free pratique is granted.

(4.) Whenever ships with the yellow flag flying arrive at the old roads of Batavia, they may not anchor there but must proceed to the roads belonging to the Harbour of Batavia, Tandjong Priok, being only admitted to the firstnamed roads whenever the authority referred to in Article 11 has granted permission to haul down the yellow flag.

(5.) Ships destined for Pontianak and falling under one of the categories referred to in Article 8, para. 1, must first proceed to Padang—Tikar Bay and remain there till the authority referred to in Article 11 has granted permission to haul down the yellow flag.

Article 10.

(1.) The hoisting of the yellow flag takes place as soon as the ship sights land, before entering the roads or harbour, and for ships already lying in the roads or harbour as soon as the disease has been discovered.

(2.) The Masters are bound to report immediately the reason of the hoisting of the yellow flag either by signalling or by the despatch of a sloop flying the yellow flag in the forepeak, which must hold no communication with other vessels on the way, or with the shore, and remain in sight of the Harbourmaster's Office, awaiting further orders.

Article 11.

(1.) The Harbourmaster is authorised to grant permission for the hauling down of the yellow flag.

(2.) He is at the same time charged with the maintenance of the prohibition concerning communication with the shore and reports to the Chief local authority the measures taken or considered necessary, as also the name of the disease giving rise thereto.

(3.) The granting of the permission referred to in para. 1 may also, at the request of the Harbourmaster, be issued by the medical authority referred to in Article 15.

Article 12.

(1.) The person in charge of a pilot boat is bound to see that his crew have no communication with ships flying the yellow flag, or with ships regarding which he may learn that there is reason for their doing so. He, however, may not withhold his assistance or that of the pilot from the ship. The pilot taken on board is bound to take precautions that the condition mentioned in Article 9 is carried out, and to instruct the Master as much as possible of his obligations under this Ordinance. If necessary written instructions may be issued to the pilot for delivery to the Master.

(2.) The Master is bound to answer the questions put him by the pilot as truthfully and carefully as possible.

Article 13.

(1.) By prohibition of communication with the shore it is understood:

- 1st. that none of the passengers or crew may leave the ship, unless with the permission or order of the person charged with the medical inspection;
- 2nd. that nobody may go on board the ship excepting:
 - a. the pilot;
 - b. the persons charged with medical inspection;
 - c. the persons to whom the disinfection is entrusted;
 - d. doctors or clergymen ordered to give medical or spiritual assistance to patients;
 - e. the customs authorities in the performance of their duties;
 - f. the Officers of Justice and Police service whenever their duties compel to do so;
- 3rd. that, before the medical inspection is finished, and the authority charged with this inspection has given permission thereto, no goods may be discharged, and thereafter, only with due observance of the stipulations of paras. 5 and 6 of Article 20, while the persons entrusted with the discharge may not go on board;
- 4th. that no other goods may be taken on board besides those which are necessary for the subsistence of passengers and crew on board or for the treatment of the sick, on condition that the persons entrusted with the conveyance thereof may not go on board.

(2.) The clothing of the persons who, in accordance with the preceding para., are allowed on board must, as far as possible, be disinfected immediately after they leave the ship, in accordance with the terms of the disinfection regulations of Article 33 of the Epidemic Ordinance (*Government Gazette*, 1892, No. 45).

(3.) Those persons who, in spite of the prohibition of communication, have gone on board, are looked upon as belonging to passengers and crew and are subject to the same regulations as they are, without in any way lessening the punishment to be imposed for violating the Ordinance.

CHAPTER 6.

The medical inspection.

Article 14.

(1.) The ships referred to in Article 8, para. 1, with the exceptions referred to in Articles 6 and 7, are subject to a medical inspection.

(2.) It takes place in accordance with the following articles and the instructions to be fixed by the Governor General.

Article 15.

(1.) The medical inspection is conducted:

- a. if a guardship is present, by a medical officer appointed to that ship;
- b. in all other cases, by the European medical officer in charge of the local Civil Medical Service;
- c. in the absence or prevention of attendance of the medical officer referred to in sub *b*, by any other European medical officer who has been appointed for that purpose by the Chief local authority.

(2.) Whenever no European medical officer is available, the Harbourmaster is charged with the medical inspection.

(3.) The Chief local authority may, however, appoint one of the local native doctors to help the Harbourmaster

(4.) In case there are objections to following the rotation fixed by this article, the Chief local authority is authorised to deviate from such rotation and appoint a European medical officer.

Article 16.

(1.) The Master is bound to answer the questions put to him by the authority charged with the medical inspection, truthfully and carefully, as also to deliver to him the documents referred to in Article 3, para. 1, and Article 5, in so far as he possesses same.

(2.) With regard to ships of war, the inspection may be limited to a written reply to the questions put by one of the persons referred to in Article 15. Such reply must be signed by the Commanding Officer and the Senior Medical Officer on board.

(3.) If no written replies are handed in or the replies are insufficient, the medical inspection takes place in the manner laid down by para. 1.

Article 17.

(1.) Whenever the yellow flag is shown in compliance with para. 1, sub 2, of Article 8, but it appears from the inspection that no contagious disease as referred to in Article 1 is found existing on board, the authority charged with the medical inspection must decide in how far danger of infection for others still exists, or whether disinfection must take place or not, before granting permission to haul down the yellow flag.

(2.) In case such precautions are not necessary, he can immediately grant the permission referred to; in the opposite case, the disinfection must take place according to his instructions and under his supervision, unless in his judgment the application of the general stipulations in force for infected, or suspected to be infected, ships is necessary, while the Master is responsible for the carrying out of the instructions to be given hereafter, in accordance with the stipulations of para. 5 of Article 8.

Article 18.

(1.) In case the Master of a ship which is in an infected state will not submit to the instructions given to him by the competent authority, he is at liberty to proceed to sea.

(2.) The Master may, in that case, be allowed by the authority charged with the medical inspection to land his passengers, who express their desire to do so, with their luggage, provided they submit themselves to the prescribed, or (in the opinion of last named authority) necessary precautions regarding disinfection.

(3.) The Master may also, in that case, be authorised to discharge his cargo after the prescribed or, in the judgment of the authority charged with the medical inspection, necessary precautions have been taken such as: isolation of the ship with passengers and crew, discharge of the bilge water after disinfection thereof, and replacing of the drinking water on board by pure water from the shore.

Article 19.

The person who conducts the inspection referred to in Article 14 gives written notice to the Chief local authority through the intermediacy of the Harbourmaster, if, in the interests of the public health, measures must be taken which the medical officer does not consider himself empowered to take, and the Chief local authority immediately carries out same, as far as possible in accordance with the stipulations of this Ordinance, unless he finds insurmountable objections thereto. In such case he brings same to the notice of the Chief of the Residency, who finally decides.

Article 20.

(1.) Ships found infected, or suspected of being infected, at the medical inspection must in so far as the authority charged with the medical inspection considers necessary, be immediately disinfected, after the removal of the passengers and that portion of the crew which is not required to take charge of the ship, or to lend assistance at the disinfection.

(2.) As soon as the disinfection of the ship is finished, the persons remaining on board must also be disinfected.

(3.) When there are patients still on board, a portion of the ship can be disinfected and later on the remainder or once again the whole ship according to circumstances.

(4.) The disinfection takes place in accordance with the stipulations of the Disinfection Regulations.

(5.) The merchandise present on board is allowed to be taken on shore without hindrance, unless the state of the ship or the description of the goods makes disinfection necessary.

(6.) Clothing and bedclothes together with other objects which have been in contact with sick persons or deceased must be disinfected, or destroyed after expropriation, in accordance with the rules referred to in para. 4, or in accordance with Article 27 of the Epidemic Ordinance (*Government Gazette*, 1892, No. 45).

(7.) After the taking of all measures considered necessary in terms of this Article and according to the following Chapter, against the spread of infection, permission may be granted to haul down the yellow flag, which is a signal that the prohibition of communication with the shore and other vessels has been withdrawn.

Article 21.

(1.) The expenses of the medical inspection and the measures taken in consequence thereof, are for account of the Government excepting:

- 1st. in the event referred to by para. 1 of Article 25;
- 2nd. whenever, owing to the violation of Article 5, a medical inspection takes place;
- 3rd. whenever the Master has hoisted the yellow flag without such action having been prescribed by the regulations, and he could have known that such was unnecessary.

(2.) In the cases mentioned under 2 and 3, the expenses are for account of the ship.

(3.) Medical Officers and Harbourmasters are authorised to charge whatever fees may be fixed by the Governor General.

CHAPTER 7.

The care of passengers and crew.

Article 22.

(1.) The passengers and crew who are not found suffering from a contagious disease at the medical inspection may, as soon as permission is granted by the authority charged with the medical inspection, be allowed to go ashore without hindrance; disinfection must, however, take place if the medical officer considers such necessary.

(2.) They may not come aboard again before free pratique has been granted.

Article 23.

(1.) The passengers and crew who at the medical inspection are found suffering from a contagious disease, or show signs which lead to the expectation of the outbreak of such disease, must be conveyed to an establishment appointed by the Chief local authority, in the manner prescribed by Article 17 of the Epidemic Ordinance (*Government Gazette*, 1892, No. 45), fitted up as suitably as possible for the treatment of patients suffering from contagious diseases, and there be isolated and treated unless the authority charged with the medical inspection declares that the state of the patient does not admit of his transportation, or that there are other circumstances which render the transportation inadvisable.

(2.) Patients residing in the place where the inspection is conducted, or in the immediate neighbourhood, may, with the permission of the Chief local authority, be granted after consultation with the authority charged with the medical inspection, be conveyed to their residences.

(3.) No carriages or boats may be used for the transportation referred to in the two preceding paras. than those appointed or approved of by the Chief local authority. They must, if necessary, be disinfected after being used, in accordance with the stipulations of the Disinfection Regulations.

(4.) Articles 18 and 19 of the Epidemic Ordinance (*Government Gazette*, 1892, No. 45) are applicable to the burial of persons who have died from one of the diseases mentioned.

Article 24.

(1.) If there is no local establishment for the treatment of patients, the patients mentioned in the preceding article must, if possible, be conveyed to a neighbouring establishment.

(2.) The Chiefs of Residencies are, in accordance with Article 13 of the Epidemic Ordinance, also authorised to have temporary sheds built for the treatment of patients suffering from a contagious disease.

Article 25.

(1.) The expenses of erectment and burial are, as far as the crew are concerned, for account of the ship, and as far as the passengers are concerned, paid by themselves or by their heirs.

(2.) Destitute passengers are treated and buried for account of the Government.

(3.) The Governor General fixes the Tariff of Expenses.

CHAPTER 7a.

The embarkation of private soldiers, contract coolies, convicts, and prisoners.

Article 25a.

(1.) At seaports which are declared infected owing to cholera or small-pox, and where a medical officer is present, private soldiers, contract coolies, convicts, and prisoners, and members of their families who accompany them, may not be embarked for conveyance by sea to a port either within or beyond Netherlands India, unless after a medical inspection they are found free from all symptoms of aforesaid diseases.

(2.) The medical inspection takes place by day on shore and as shortly as possible before the embarkation.

(3.) A medical certificate will be granted in favour of those who have been found free from cholera or small-pox. This certificate may hold good for a number of persons, provided each one is mentioned therein by name.

(4.) The Master of the ship in which the embarkation takes place does not allow the passengers mentioned in para. 1 to embark unless on production of the medical certificate mentioned in the preceding paragraph.

(5.) The inspection is conducted by the medical officer who, in accordance with Article 15, is entrusted with the medical inspection therein referred to.

(6.) The Consular representative of the country to which the ship belongs may be present at the inspection.

Article 25b.

(1.) The medical officers charged with the medical inspection referred to by Article 25a have the right to charge whatever fee may be fixed by the Governor General.

(2.) The expenses of the inspection are for account of the Government.

Article 25c.

The Master who allows passengers to embark in violation of Article 25a will be punished with a fine of from one hundred and ten to five hundred and fifty Guilders for each passenger thus embarked.

CHAPTER 8.

The enforcement of the regulations.

Article 26.

Anyone who hinders or opposes the carrying out of the stipulations of this Ordinance, or the medical inspection, will be punished, as far as Europeans are concerned, with imprisonment, and natives with imprisonment with hard labour, from one month to two years, and a money fine of from F 100.—to F 2000.—, together or separately, unless a heavier punishment is fixed for same by the Penal Code.

Article 27.

Violation of the stipulations of the sixth para. of Article 3 and Articles 9, 10, 12, 13, 16, para. 2 of Article 17, para. 2 of Article 22, and para. 3 of Article 23, will be punished, as far as Europeans are concerned, with imprisonment, and natives with imprisonment with hard labour, unmanacled, from 14 days to one year, or a money fine of from F 25.—to F 500.—.

Article 28.

The penalty for the non-hoisting of the flag and for non-burning of lanterns as prescribed by the first para. of Article 9 is, in cases referred to by para. 1, section 1, of Article 8, not applicable to those who, while in default, could not have known that the port of departure was infected.

Article 29.

(1.) Ship and cargo are distrainable and executable for the money fines imposed on the Master in accordance with Articles 26 and 27 and for expenses which are to be paid by him.

(2.) The sentence of judgment must always contain a declaration of the authority of the officer charged with the execution, to continue the embargo on the vessel and to prevent the departure thereof till the money fine has been paid, if the sale under execution is, in the interests of the public health, considered inadvisable by the Chief local authority.

Article 30.

The Chief local authority and the staff approved by, and accompanying him, are authorised, for the carrying out of this Ordinance, to board, at all times, ships entering from the high sea or on arrival even without the permission of the Master.

Article 31.

For the due observance of all orders issued in accordance with this Ordinance, the Chief of the Residency may, if necessary, call in the help of the Naval or Military forces.

Article 32.

The Inspector of the Civil Medical Service for Java and Madura, and the Senior Medical Officers of the Residencies, supervise the working and application of the stipulations, if necessary give information to the local authorities, of everything which must be taken into consideration for the carrying out thereof, and report at the end of each year, and if necessary at shorter intervals, to the Chief of the Medical Service, of everything that has been done and observed by them.

CHAPTER 9.

The coming into force of the Ordinance.

Article 33.

The Ordinance of 21st February, 1879 (*Government Gazette* No. 99), 5th June, 1882 (*Government Gazette* No. 157), and of 6th March, 1887 (*Government Gazette* No. 53), as also the decrees of 21st February, 1879, No. 5 (*Government Gazette* No. 100), and 23rd February 1883, No. 11 (*Government Gazette* No. 74), are repealed.

Article 33a.

This Ordinance may be cited as the "Quarantine Ordinance."

Article 34.

This Ordinance takes effect on the 20th of August, 1892.

By-laws as to Registration of Camels, the Licensing of Camel-drivers, Bicycles, and Motor Cars.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws of the Victoria Plains Road Board, under Section 117 of The Roads Act (2 Edwd. VII., No. 48).

The Victoria Plains Road Board District.

WHEREAS by virtue of the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1902" (2 Edward VII., No. 48), the Road Board of every district is empowered to make, publish, alter, modify, amend, or repeal By-laws for any of the purposes of the said Act mentioned: It is therefore ordered by the Victoria Plains Road Board that, from and after the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*, the special By-laws set forth in the Schedule hereto, relating to the registration of camels, licensing of camel-drivers, and bicycles, trieycles, motor cars, etc., shall come into force.

Special By-laws for the Registration of Camels and the Licensing of Camel-drivers, and for the Licensing of Bicycles, Trieycles, and Motor Cars, and regulating the use thereof :—

Camels to be Registered.

1. No person shall own, keep, or use within the Road District (hereinafter referred to as "the District") any camel unless such camel is registered for the time being at the office of the Road Board of the said District. Provided that no person shall be required to register a camel under this By-law during such time as the camel is duly registered in the office of some other Road District.

Application for Registration.

2. Application for registration shall be made to the Secretary to the Board by writing in the Form "A" in the Schedule, and shall contain the particulars indicated thereby, and shall be signed by the applicant or his agent.

Registration Fees.

3. The following fees shall be payable on registration of camels plying for hire :—

Provided that no registration fee shall be payable in respect of camels used solely by prospectors for prospecting purposes.

Certificate of Registration.

4. A certificate of registration shall be issued by the Secretary to the Board to the applicant in the Form "B" in the Schedule.

Duration.

5. Every registration shall expire on the thirty-first day of December in the year for which such registration is effected.

Registration Discs.

6. On the annual registration of every camel the Board will issue to the applicant a registration disc inscribed with the name of the district and the registration number.

Every person in charge for the time being of such camel shall keep the disc attached to the neck of the camel.

Camel-drivers' Licenses.

7. No person shall drive any camel or camels within the district unless he is the holder of a camel-drivers' license in force for the time being issued by the Board of the said district, or unless he is the holder of a license in force for the time being issued by the Board of some other road district.

Form of License.

8. A camel-drivers' license shall be in the Form "C" in the Schedule, and the licensee shall be required to sign his name in the margin thereof before the license is issued to him.

License Fee.

9. The fee payable for a camel-drivers' license shall be five shillings per annum.

Duration of License.

10. Every camel-drivers' license shall expire on the thirty-first day of December in the year for which it was granted.

Transfer.

11. A camel-driver's license shall be transferable by indorsement at the office of the Board on payment of a fee of one shilling, the transferee to sign his name in margin thereof.

License and Registration Certificate to be Produced.

12. Every camel-driver shall produce his camel-drivers' license and the certificate of registration for each and every camel in his charge whenever called upon so to do by any constable or officer of police or any member or officer of the Road Board.

Limit of Number of Camels to be Driven.

13. No person shall at the same time drive or take the charge of more than eleven camels, whether draught or pack camels, or partly draught and partly pack camels.

Camels to give place to Horses, etc.

14. Every camel-driver or other person driving or having the charge of any camel or camels on any road or track, or at any well or watering place, shall, at the request of any person in charge of any horse or mule, forthwith remove any camel or camels which he is driving, or of which he is in charge, to a distance of not less than a quarter of a mile from such road, track, well or watering place.

Unregistered Camels may be Destroyed.

15. Any unregistered camel found straying in any part of the Board's district may be seized and either sold or destroyed, after such camel has been advertised for three weeks in some paper circulated in the district; the owner shall be liable to pay to the Board the cost and expense incurred, in addition to registration fees.

Penalty for suffering Camels to Stray.

16. If any camel is suffered to stray, the owner thereof and any person who having been in charge thereof has suffered it to stray, shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

Penalty for driving Diseased Camels.

17. If any person drives or rides any camel suffering from any infectious or contagious disease on any road within the district, he shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

Public Watering Places not to be used by Diseased Camels.

18. No camel suffering from any infectious or contagious disease shall be allowed to water at any public watering place.

Any person who, having as owner, driver, or otherwise, the custody of any camel suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, permits such camel to water at any public watering place, shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

Diseased Camels may be Destroyed.

19. It shall be lawful for any officer of the Board or any person acting with the authority of the Board or of any officer of the Board to slaughter and destroy any camels found suffering from any infectious or contagious disease on any road.

Cycles and Motor Cars to be Licensed.

20. No person shall use any bicycle, tricycle, or motor car in the district unless such bicycle, tricycle, or motor car is licensed.

Provided that if a license is taken out for a bicycle, tricycle, or motor car by any person in the district in which he resides he shall not be required to take out a license in any other district.

Form of License.

21. A bicycle, tricycle, or motor car license shall be in the form "D" in the schedule, and application for the same shall be made to the Secretary to the Road Board at the office of the Board.

Fee.

The licensing fee per annum for every bicycle and tricycle shall be 5s., and for motor cars 5s. per wheel.

Duration.

22. Every license for a bicycle, tricycle, or motor car shall expire on the thirty-first day of December in the year for which it was issued.

Number to be affixed.

23. Every licensee of a bicycle, tricycle, or motor car shall affix and keep affixed the license number on some conspicuous part of the bicycle, tricycle, or motor car.

Riding on Footpaths prohibited.

24. No person shall ride or impel a bicycle, tricycle, or motor car of any kind upon any footpath within the district.

Lamp to be carried.

25. No person shall, between the hours of sunset and sunrise, ride a bicycle, tricycle, or motor car along any road unless there is attached thereto a lamp which shall exhibit a white light in the direction in which he is proceeding, and at all times to be kept lighted.

Bell to be used.

26. Every bicycle, tricycle, or motor car shall carry a bell or other instrument suitable for giving warning of approach, which shall be used as a signal whenever any person on foot or horseback or vehicle is being approached or passed.

Roads and Footpaths not to be obstructed.

27. No person shall leave any bicycle, tricycle, or motor car in or on any road or footway so as to become an obstruction, and every person shall remove his bicycle, tricycle, or motor car immediately upon being requested to do so by any police officer or constable or member or officer of the Board.

Speed.

28. No person riding a bicycle, tricycle, or motor car shall pass, at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour, any person who shall be riding or driving any horse or other animal.

To dismount on meeting Restive Horse.

29. When a cyclist or motorist meets a horse or other animal, and such horse or other animal becomes restive, or appears likely to get beyond the control of the person in charge thereof, such cyclist or motorist shall dismount, and remain dismounted till such horse or other animal has been passed.

Speed on turning Corners.

30. No person shall ride any cycle, bicycle, tricycle, or motor car round the corner formed by the junction of any roads in the district, or across the intersection of any of the said roads, at a pace exceeding six miles an hour.

Penalties.

31. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of the foregoing By-laws, or commits, or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and any person guilty of an offence against these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

ATTENTION is drawn to Sections 3 (c.) and 13 of "The Registration of Births, Deaths, and Marriages Amendment Act, 1907," which came into force on the 12th instant, and enacts the following special provisions for the registration of still-births.

3. (c.).... Still-born child means any child of seven months' gestation or over, not born alive.

13. (1.) Notwithstanding anything contained in the principal Act, the birth of any still-born child shall, within fourteen days after the birth, be registered, without fee or reward, both in the Register of Births and the Register of Deaths at the office of the district registrar of the district in which such birth has occurred; and for all the purposes of the Registration of Births, Deaths, and Marriages Act, 1894, such child shall be deemed to have been born alive and to have subsequently died.

(2.) No interment of such child shall take place unless the interment is authorised by the certificate of a duly qualified medical practitioner, or a certificated midwife or nurse, or of a police or resident magistrate or officer of police not under the rank of sergeant, who has made personal inquiry into the circumstances.

(3.) Any person interring a still-born child without first obtaining such certificate shall be guilty of an offence, and liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds, or to imprisonment with or without hard labour, for any term not exceeding six months.

(4.) Provided that if any still-born child is born at a place situated more than ten miles from the nearest duly qualified medical practitioner, magistrate, or officer of police, and the mother was not attended by a certificated midwife or nurse, such child may be interred without such certificate, but the birth of the child so buried shall be reported within fourteen days from the date of the burial, by the person who interred the body, to the nearest police officer, who shall forthwith make a full inquiry into the circumstances of the case, with a view of taking further action if necessary; any person who so buried the body of a still-born child and neglects to make the report required by this subsection shall be guilty of an offence, and liable, on conviction, to the penalty prescribed by subsection three of this section.

Section 26.

(1.) It shall not be lawful for any non-resident agent to act as agent, or for any non-resident trader to carry on business in Western Australia, unless he is the holder of a warrant in that behalf under the hand of the Commissioner.

(2.) Every warrant shall be in the prescribed form, and shall be issued without fee by the Commissioner on application to him in that behalf.

(3.) In all proceedings against any person for breach of this section it shall lie on the defendant to prove that he is a warrant holder.

(4.) The Commissioner may from time to time, as he thinks fit, assess any specified non-resident agent or non-resident trader for income tax in respect of any specific transaction, or of all transactions during any specified period, and may fix the amount of the tax at the rate then last in force (if the rate of tax is not then fixed by law), and on the assumption, subject to adjustment within the prescribed time at the instance of the Commissioner or taxpayer, that the specified transaction, or, as the case may be, all the transactions during the specified period, have produced a net profit of five per centum of the gross proceeds resulting therefrom.

(5.) The tax so fixed by the Commissioner shall be payable on demand, and shall be recoverable forthwith in the same manner in all respects as in the case of income-tax in arrear, but subject to adjustment as aforesaid.

CENTRAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

Model By-Laws.

WHEREAS by "The Health Act, 1898," and "The Health Act Amendment Act, 1900," the Central Board of Health has power to make Model By-laws for the guidance of Local Boards in the execution of the said Act; and every Local Board may, and so far as expressly directed by the Central Board shall, adopt the Model By-laws prepared by the Central Board: Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in the said Act and the Acts amending the same, the Central Board doth hereby make the following Model By-laws for the purposes aforesaid:—

PART I.—BY-LAW No. 32a.

For regulating the Unloading, Inspecting, Handling, and Carriage of Imported Meat, etc.

1. Every importer of meat shall, at least two days before the same is landed from the vessel on which it is carried, notify an Inspector duly appointed under "The Health Act, 1898," of the expected arrival thereof, either personally or in writing by letter sent through the post and addressed to him at his office, and shall, before the same is removed from the wharf after being landed, procure an inspection thereof by the Inspector. No such meat shall be removed by the importer until such inspection has been made, except with the permission of or under the conditions imposed by the Inspector.

2. The master or person in charge of any ship or vessel in which such articles have been imported—

(a.) Shall take every reasonable precaution, when unshipping, discharging, or landing such articles, to protect them from contamination or deterioration, or from contact with unclean gear or other things that may injuriously or detrimentally affect them; and

(b.) Shall not suffer or permit any person who is or is suspected to be affected with any contagious or infectious disease, or who is dirty in his person or clothing, to be employed or to assist in the handling, discharging, or unloading of such article.

3. Every importer of meat shall—

- (a.) After the same is landed or discharged cause such meat to be, without delay, completely and effectually protected from the injurious effects of sun, weather, dust, or other impurities, and flies, dogs, or other sources of contamination, and shall maintain them so protected whilst they are in his charge or care or under his control; and
- (b.) Not suffer or permit anyone who is or is suspected to be affected with any contagious or infectious disease, or who is dirty in his person or clothing, to be employed or to assist in the handling, trucking, packing, unpacking, or the carriage of any such articles; and
- (c.) Cause all trucks or other conveyances or things used in the removal or carriage of such articles to be thoroughly cleansed before being so used; and
- (d.) Cause every carcase or part of a carcase to be properly covered with a clean and suitable covering before removal from the landing or discharging place as aforesaid.

4. No person who is engaged in any of the operations before mentioned shall sit on any carcase or part of a carcase or any covering thereof.

5. "Importer" includes the person for the time being entitled to delivery or possession of such meat on discharge thereof by the vessel, and the agent of the importer.

6. "Meat" includes all flesh, whether of poultry, game, or fish.

Any "unsectarian public charitable building supported in the main by voluntary contributions for the reception of sick poor, for treatment medically or quasi-medically, medicinally or surgically, combined with such possibilities of out-door life as would be calculated to make that treatment more effective, and which is not maintained for private gain."

"Poor Houses":

"Alms-houses being charitable foundations for the housing of the poor and infirm in body from age or some other dis enabling cause of a kindred character, the word 'dis enabling' being used in the sense that they can no longer earn their livelihood by work, and the word 'age' being used to include extreme youth which would similarly dis enable them from earning their livelihood."

And by the said Order it was declared that the words "lunatic asylums" do "not include Government Institutions in the said State."
