WHEREAS by the provisions of "The Mining Act, 1904," Section 10, Sub-section 4, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to abolish any Goldfield: Now therefore I, Sir Edward Albert Stone, Knight, Lieutenant-Governor as aforesaid, by and with the advice and con-sent of the Executive Council, do hereby abolish as a Gold-field that portion of Crown Lands known as the Donnybrook Goldfield and described in the Proclamation dated the Goldfield and described in the Proclamation dated the 15th day of November, 1899, and published in the *Govern-ment Gazette* of the 17th November, 1899, and do hereby order that the Warden's Court established at Greenbushes for and in respect of the Donnybrook Goldfield be discontinned.

CITY OF PERTH.

BY-LAW No. 2.

Licensed Vehicles.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Muni-cipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Mayor and Councillors of the City of Perth hereby repeal Section 17 of By-law No. 2 regulating licensed vehicles, and do hereby order as follows:

17. No driver of a licensed cab shall-

- (a.) Stand for hire at any place within the City of Perth, except upon a job stand or upon a special stand.
- (b.) Solicit fares for any sports grounds, racecourse, or place of entertainment, except from a special stand.
- (c.) Place or keep his cab upon a special stand, except whilst and for a reasonable time be-fore any sports, race meeting, or public entertainment are or is actually in progress.

17a. The places described in Part I. of Schedule "B" to By-law No. 2 are hereby appointed as Job stands.

17b. The places described below are hereby appointed as ''Special Stands '':—

Special Stands.

A stand on the South side of St. George's Terrace, opposite the General Post Office, commencing from a point one chain distant from the Eastern side of Bar-rack Street and extending Easterly along the said Terrace.

A stand on the Eastern side of Barrack Street, distant about one chain South from the Southern side of Hay Street, for one cab only

A stand on the Eastern side of Barrack Street, distant about three chains South from the Southern side of Hay Street, for one cab only.

17c. Licensed cabs and drays shall take their places on the appointed stands in the order of their arrival there, and when any cab or dray shall be called or driven off any stand, the driver of the cab or dray immediately behind shall draw the same up to the place thus vacated, and the drivers of the cabs or drays in the rear shall follow up in a like manner. Provided that after every fourth each or dray any strand there shall be left fourth cab or dray on any stand there shall be left a space of eight feet for foot passengers to pass through, and after every eighth cab or dray a space of eighteen feet for vehicles to pass through.

17d. Whenever at any theatre, place of entertain-ment, or public meeting the Traffic Inspector shall deem it necessary so to do, he may appoint temporary stands for engaged and disengaged cabs respectively, and every driver of a licensed cab shall take such place upon any such stand as the Traffic Inspector shall direct.

17e. No licensed driver shall-

- (a.) Place his cab upon a temporary stand appointed for engaged cabs unless his cab is actually engaged.
- (b.) Accept an engagement whilst his cab is standing upon a temporary stand appointed for engaged cabs.

Should the Traffic Inspector at any time be of 17f. an opinion that it is necessary to move any licensed cab or dray from any appointed stand or place, it shall be lawful for him to direct the driver of the same to move to any place he shall deem fit, and any driver who shall refuse to obey such directions shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

17g. The driver of every licensed cab or dray shall at all times whilst plying for hire, or whilst on any stand, act under the directions of the Traffic Inspector, and any driver who shall refuse to obey any such directions shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

17h. No person shall, whilst in charge of any licensed eab or dray, drive the same furiously, recklessly, or care-lessly, or be drunk, or cruelly beat or illtreat or torture any horse used in such cab or dray, or conduct himself noisily, or use any indecent, threatening, or insulting language.

17i. In the construction of the foregoing provisions the words "Traffic Inspector" shall mean and include the person for the time being appointed by the Council to carry out the duties of Traffic Inspector, and any assistant of such person.

17j. Every person offending against any of the fore-going provisions shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20,

BY-LAW No. 25.

Advertising Hoardings.

A By-law of the Municipality of the City of Perth, made under Part VIII. of "The Municipal Corpora-tions Act, 1906," and numbered 25, for the regulation and control of hoardings erected upon private property.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the City of Perth order as follows:-

1. In the construction of this By-law the word "Lessee," as applied to a hoarding, means the person who for the time being has control of the hoarding, or who has the right to post or charge for the posting upon such hoarding of any bills, placards, or advertisements.

2. No person shall erect or cause to be erected a hoarding for the purposes of advertising, unless, and until a plan and specification showing clearly the posi-tion and size, and the method of and the materials to be used in the construction of and the manner of fixing the same, shall have been deposited with and approved by the Building Surveyor, and except in accordance with such plan and specification.

3. No alteration or addition shall be made to any barding unless and until the proposed alteration or addition shall have been shown on a plan, deposited with the Building Surveyor, and shall have been ap-proved by the Building Surveyor, and except in ac-cordance with such plan.

4. If the owner or lessee of any hoarding which is, 4. If the owner or lessee of any hoarding which is, in the opinion of the Council, dangerous, shall fail, upon receiving written notice to that effect, to remove or cause to be removed the said hoarding within such time as shall be named in the said notice, the Build-ing Surveyor or other person authorised by the Coun-cil may remove such hoarding, and thereupon the Council may recover the cost of the removal from the raid owner or besco said owner or lessee.

5. If, in the opinion of the Council, any bill, placard, or advertisement attached to or pasted or painted on any hoarding erected on private property be objectionable, and the owner or lessee of such hoarding shall, upon receipt of written notice to that effect, fail to remove or cause to be removed, such bill, placard, or advertisement within such time as shall be mentioned in the said notice, the Building Surveyor or other officer authorised by the Council may remove the same, and thereupon the Council may recover the cost of the removal from the owner or lessee.

6. No person shall erect a hoarding upon private property for advertising purposes unless and until he shall have obtained a license from the Council in the form in the Schedule hereto in respect of such hoard-

No person shall maintain any hoarding upon 7. private property for advertising purposes without a license from the Council, or except during the currency of such license.

8. The fee for a license under this By-law shall be at the rate of sixpence for every superficial yard com-prised in such hoarding: provided that the minimum fee for a license shall be ten shillings.

9. Every such license shall remain in force for a period of twelve months from the date of issue and no longer.

10. Every person offending against the provisions of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

BY-LAW No. 26.

Hawking of Fish.

A By-law of the Municipality of the City of Perth, made under Part VIII. of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 26, for regulating the hawk-ing and issue of licenses for hawking fish.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act the Mayor and Councillors of the City of Perth order as follows:-

1. In the construction of this By-law the word "fish" shall include fish, whether fresh, salt, smoked, or dried, oysters, crayfish, crabs, prawns, and shrimps.

2. The scale of fees fixed by the Council on the 23rd day of February, 1903, and amended on the 30th day of July, 1906, to be paid for licenses for hawking within the Municipality shall not apply to the hawking of fish.

No person shall hawk fish in a wheeled vehicle 3 within that portion of the Municipality which is bounded on the East by the Eastern side of Pier Street, on the West by the Western side of King Street, on the North by the Northern side of Wellington Street, and on the South by the Southern side of St. George's Terrace.

There shall be levied and charged for a license to 4 hawk fish in a wheeled vehicle, in any part of the Munici-pality, outside the area described in the next preceding section, the fees specified in Part I. of the Schedule here to.

There shall be levied and charged for a license 5. to hawk fish by basket, box, or tray, the fees specified in Part II. of the Schedule hereto.

6. Subject to the proviso to Section 181 (g), (h), of the "Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," no person shall hawk fish in any part of the Municipality unless he is the holder of a current license issued by the Council, or except by the mode and in the area prescribed by such license.

7. Every person offending against any of the pro-visions of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20. Passed by the Council of the Municipality of the City

BY-LAW No. 28.

Regulating of Shooting Galleries.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of the City of Perth made under Part VIII. of "The Municipal Corpora-tions Act, 1906," and numbered 28, for the regulation of Shooting Galleries.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the City of Perth order as follows :-

1. The proprietor of a shooting gallery shall-

- Cause the several parts of such shooting gallery to be properly put together and securely fixed to the satisfaction of the Building Surveyor.
- Cause every part of such shooting gallery, within, along, or towards which it may be intended that any firearms shall be discharged, to be constructed of iron of such strength and thickness as is sufficient to resist any missile or projectile that may be discharged from such firearms.
- Cause such shooting gallery to be so constructed that no missile or projectile that may be dis-charged from any firearms used therein can escape from such shooting gallery, if such firearm, at the moment of discharge, is pointed towards any target or mark that may be within such shooting gallery.
- Cause every part of such shooting gallery, within, along, or towards which it may be intended that any firearm shall be discharged, to be maintained

at all times in good repair and condition to the satisfaction of the Building Surveyor.

- Cause such shooting gallery, at all times when open for public use, to be under the management and control of a sufficient number of competent persons.
- Cause the letting to hire and use by any person of any firearm in such shooting gallery to be under the management and control of a competent person directly responsible therefor.

The proprietor or other person for the time being having the management or control of a shooting gallery shall, in the exercise of such management or control, take all reasonable and proper care so as to prevent danger from the use of firearms in such shooting gallery.

3. Every person having the management and control of the letting to hire or use by any person of any firearm in a shooting gallery shall not at any time cause or suffer to be used in such firearm any greater charge than is con-sistent with safety, and shall cause every such firearm when led on the bar ball to be partial to be made to be the safety of the safety o when loaded, or being loaded, to be pointed towards the larget in such shooting gallery, and shall not suffer any loa led firearm to be taken out of such shooting gallery.

4. No person hiring or using any firearm in a shoot-ing gallery shall, while such firearm is loaded or being loaded, allow such firearm to be pointed otherwise than towards the target in such shooting gallery, and shall not take any loaded firearm out of such shooting gallery.

5. No person shall wilfully and improperly or carelessly or negligently interfere with the due management and control of the letting to hire and use by any person of any firearm in a shooting gallery, or with any shield, fastening, or fitting to secure or contribute to the safe use of flearms therein.

6. Every person offending against any of the pro-visions of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

BY-LAW No. 29.

Regulating the licensing and use of Motor Vehicles.

A By-law of the Municipality of the City of Perth, made under Part VII. of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906, and numbered 29, for regulating the licensing and use of Motor Vehicles.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the City of Perth order as follows:

1. In the construction of this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires:-

(a.) "Motor Vehicle" shall mean and include any motor car, automobile, motor carriage, motor cycle, or other carriage, or vehicle propelled either partly or wholly by any volatile spirit, steam, or electricity, or by any other means than animal power.

No motor vehicle shall be kept and used within 2.the Municipality of Perth, unless and until a license shall be first had and obtained therefor, or except dur-ing the currency of such license, and if any motor vehicle shall be so kept and used, the owner thereof shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

3. The fees to be paid for licenses under this Bylaw shall be as follows:-

Motor car (for the conveyance of persons only), 10s. for every person exclusive of the driver, which the motor car is licensed to carry, with a minimum of $\pounds 2$.

Motor wagon, for the conveyance of goods or merchandise, £5.

Motor cycle, 5s.

Every license in respect to any motor vehicle shall expire on the 31st day of October next after the same shall be granted, provided that in respect of any license granted after the 30th day of April in any year, the fee payable for such year shall be one-half of the annual fee for such license.

4. Every application for a license for a motor vehicle shall be made by the owner, or his duly authorised agent, in the form prescribed in the schedule here-to.

5. The owner of any motor vehicle licensed under this By-law shall, within seven days after any alteration in the colour of the painting or in the form of the body thereof, give written notice to the Council of such alteration.

6. If any person shall become the owner of a licensed motor vehicle during the currency of the license thereof, he shall, upon production of the license to the Traffic Inspector, and upon payment of the sum of 5s., be entitled to have a license issued to him in respect of such motor vehicle for the balance of the term for which the original license was granted.

7. No person shall drive, ride, or impel a motor vehicle:--

- (a.) Across the intersection or round the corner of any streets or ways at a speed exceeding four miles an hour.
- (b.) Within the area bounded on the East by the East side of Pier Street, on the West by the West side of King Street, on the North by the North side of Wellington Street, and on the South by the South side of Hay Street, at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour.
- speed exceeding eight miles an hour.(c.) Within any other portion of the Municipality at a speed exceeding 12 miles an hour.
- (d.) At any time or in any portion of the Municipality, recklessly or negligently, or at a speed or in a manner which is dangerous to the public, having regard to the nature, condition, and use of the street or way, and to the amount of traffic then upon, or which might reasonably be expected to be upon such street or way.

8. No person shall drive or impel a motor vehicle other than a motor cycle in any street or way between sunset and sunrise, unless there shall be attached thereto two lamps so constructed and placed as to exhibit a white light in the direction in which such vehicle is proceeding or intending to proceed, and one lamp so constructed and placed as to exhibit a red light from the rear of such vehicle, and all such lamps shall during such time as aforesaid, and whilst such vehicle is in any street or way be kept lighted, and shall show light sufficiently clear and strong to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such motor vehicle.

9. No person shall ride or impel a motor cycle in any street or way between sunset and sunrise, unless there shall be attached thereto an efficient lamp, so constructed and placed as to exhibit a white light in the direction in which such motor cycle is proceeding or intending to proceed, and such lamp shall be lighted and kept lighted during such time as aforesaid and whilst such motor cycle is in any street or way, and shall show a light being sufficiently clear and strong to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such motor cycle.

10. No person shall ride, drive, or impel a motor vehicle in any street or way which has not attached thereto a proper bell, horn, or other instrument, which is capable of giving audible and sufficient warning of the approach or position of such motor vehicle.

11. Every driver or rider of a motor vehicle shall, whenever necessary, by sounding a bell, horn, or other instrument give audible and sufficient warning of the approach or position thereof.

12. No person shall drive or ride a motor vehicle upon any footpath, except when crossing from or to any premises at a regulation crossing place.

13. No person shall drive a motor vehicle backwards for a greater distance or time than the necessity of the case or the purposes of safety shall require.

14. The driver of any motor vehicle shall, if an accident occurs to any person, whether on foot, or horseback, or in a carriage, or to any horse or carriage in charge of any person, owing to the presence of the motor vehicle in the street, stop and remain stationary for a reasonable time, and shall give his name and address, and (if he be not the owner) the name and address of the owner of the motor vehicle if required by

any constable or officer of the Council, or by any person acting on behalf of the person injured, or of the owner of the property damaged.

15. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a motor vehicle who shall meet or overtake any animal, which shall become restive or alarmed, shall stop such motor vehicle, and shall remain stationary as long as may be reasonably necessary.

16. The driver of a motor vehicle whilst driving or riding the same in or along any street or way, shall keep the same on the left hand or near side of such street or way.

17. Every driver or rider of a motor vehicle shall, when passing any other vehicle or any animal proceeding in an opposite direction along any street or way, keep such motor vehicle or animal on his right, and when passing any other vehicle or any animal proceeding in the same direction, shall pass on the right hand side thereof.

18. No person shall drive, ride, or impel any motor vehicle in any street or public place abreast of, or side by side with more than one other vehicle, except when taking part in a duly authorised parade or procession.

19. No driver or rider of a motor vehicle shall, when on such vehicle, be in a position in which he cannot have control over the same, nor shall he quit the motor vehicle without having stopped the machinery and taken due precautions against it starting in his absence, or allow the motor vehicle to stand on such street so as to cause an unnecessary obstruction thereof.

20. The driver or rider of a motor vehicle shall always have an efficient silencer attached to such motor vehicle, in full and efficient working order, and always connected with the proper portion of the engine of such motor vehicle so as to reduce by at least 40 per cent. the noise which would otherwise result from the working of the engine of such vehicle, and shall not in any case have attached to such silencer, or otherwise connected therewith, any device or machinery whereby such silencer may be rendered inefficient or unworkable, or its efficiency in any way lessened.

21. Every driver of a motor vehicle, when taking up or setting down persons in any street, or when waiting for any such purposes, shall act under the directions of any officer of the Corporation of the City of Perth, or police constable who may be on duty in such street.

22. The owner of any motor vehicle shall, when required by the Traffic Inspector or any police constable, furnish the name and address of the person driving such motor car at any particular time.

23. No person shall use or drive any motor vehicle unless the same is licensed by the Council of the Municipality in which the same is kept.

24. No person shall use or drive a motor vehicle not being a motor cycle in the said Municipality, unless there shall be fixed in a conspicuous position in the front and on the back thereof a rectangular plate in an upright position, upon which is inscribed the licensed number of the said vehicle, together with the distinguishing letter or letters of the Municipality in which the same is licensed in characters of not less than three and a-half inches high, and of the corresponding breadth, painted in white on a black ground, so that the inscription upon such plates shall be easily distinguishable from in front or behind as the case may be, and no person shall use or drive any licensed motor vehicle in the said city between sunset and sunrise unless the said plates shall be easily distinguishable.

25. No person shall drive, ride, or impel any motor cycle unless a number plate shall be attached thereto in a conspicuous position containing the number of the license of such cycle. The said number to be at least two inches in height, and to be in white figures on black ground.

26. The Traffic Inspector may, on payment to him of an annual fee of £4, assign to any manufacturer of, or dealer in, motor vehicles, general identification numbers, not exceeding six, which may be used for motor vehicles on trial after completion, or on trial by an intending purchaser.

27. The colouring of the plates having placed thereon or annexed thereto any of such distinguishing numbers, shall be different from that used for the plates required to be used by owners, and specified in Section 24 of these By-laws, but all other provisions of these By-laws as to the size and position of the plates shall apply.

Whenever any manufacturer or agent shall use 28.any number assigned to him under these By-laws, he shall keep a record of the name and address of the person driving the motor vehicle on each occasion, and such record shall be open to inspection at any time by the Traffic Inspector, or any person appointed by him, in writing, to make an inspection.

29.The Traffic Inspector shall keep in the register of motor vehicles a record showing the name of the manufacturer or dealer to whom any general identifi-cation numbers have been assigned, the place of busi-ness of the manufacturer or dealer, and a description of the colouring adopted under the provisions of Section 27 of these By-laws.

BY-LAW No. 27.

Fish Market.

A By-law of the Municipality of the City of Perth made under Parts VII. and XXI. of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 27, for regulating the Wholesale Sale of Fish:

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the City of Perth order as follows:-

1. In the construction of this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires:-

(a.) The word " market," whenever occurring shall mean the market, whenever becuring shar mean the market provided by the Council for the wholesale sale of fish, comprising the portion of the Perth City Markets situate at the intersection of William and Wellington the intersection of William and Wellington Streets, Perth, hereinafter described, viz.: — Commencing at a point in the North align-ment of Wellington Street, distant 185ft. 3in. from the West alignment of William Street; thence by the North alignment of Wellington Street a further distance of 37ft. 9in.; thence in a North-Westerly direction 33ft. 2in.; thence in a Westerly direction 2ft. 5in.; thence in a Northerly direction 4ft. 5in.; thence in an Northerly direction 29ft. 5in.; thence in an Easterly direction 29ft.; thence in a Northerly direction 8ft. 10in.; thence in an Easterly direction 35ft. 6in. to

the corner-post; thence in a Southerly direc-tion 35ft. 6in. to the point of commencement, as shown on a certified drawing deposited in the Town Clerk's Office, Town Hall, Perth.

- (b.) The words "Market Inspector," whenever occurring, shall mean any person appointed by the Council as an inspector in regard to the market, and any acting or assistant inspector:
- (c.) The word "fish" shall include fish whether fresh, salt, smoked, or dried, oysters, crayfish, crabs, prawns, and shrimps.

No person shall sell fish wholesale, within the said 2 Municipality, excepting in the market.

3. No person shall place fish upon the floor of the market.

4. No person shall bring or cause to be brought into the market any fish otherwise than through such entrance or entrances thereto as may be authorised by the Market Inspector, from time to time, by notice in writing to be posted up in the market.

No person shall place or expose for sale any fish 5. in the market except upon the tables and trolleys provided for the reception thereof.

6. No person shall act as auctioneer or agent for the sale of fish in the market, excepting the auctioneer or agent appointed from time to time by the Council for that purpose.

7. No person shall occupy any standing place or use any table, trough, or trolley without the approval of the Market Inspector, and then only after payment of the fees therefor respectively specified in the first part of the Schedule hereto.

8. No person shall use or occupy any portion of the market for the purpose of sleeping therein.

9. All persons purchasing fish in the market shall re-move the same from the tables or trolleys from which it may have been sold, immediately after the sale thereof.

There shall be levied and charged by the Council, 10. for the use of troughs, tables, or trolleys in the market, the fees specified in the first part of the Schedule hereto.

11. There shall be levied and charged by the Council, in respect of fish brought into the market, the tolls or fees specified in the second part of the Schedule hereto.

12. No person shall bring any fresh fish (other than shell-fish) into the market except in baskets of a capacity of either two bushels, one bushel, or half-a-bushel.

13. No person shall enter the market whilst drunk, or gamble or smoke or excite any riot, or curse, swear, or fight, or use any gross, indecent, obscene, filthy, or abusive language therein, or spit or put any dirt or offen-sive matter upon the floor, slabs, furniture, or appliances, or be guilty of any indecent or improper conduct therein.

Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding $\pounds 20$.
