AMENDMENT OF THE BOUNDARIES OF THE EAST COOLGARDIE AND NORTH-EAST COOLGARDIE GOLDFIELDS, AND THE EAST COOLGARDIE, BULONG, KANOWNA, AND KURNALPI DISTRICTS.

By His Excellency Sir Edward Albert Stone, Knight, Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Mining Act, 1904," it is lawful for the Governor by Proclamation to alter or amend the boundaries of a Goldfield or District Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers in me vested in that behalf by the said Ordinance, do hereby alter the existing boundaries of the East Coolgardie and North-East Coolgardie Goldfields, and the East

Coolgardie, Bulong, Kanowna, and Kurnalpi Districts and hereby proclaim the boundaries of the said Goldfields and Districts to be as follows:—

EAST COOLGARDIE GOLDFIELD.

Bounded by line starting from the North-East corner of Location 53; thence along the surveyed Eastern boundary of the Coolgardie Goldfield at a bearing of $324^{\circ} 46'$ for a distance of 26 miles 62 chains 37 links to the 40-mile post; thence along the South-Eastern boundary of the Broad Arrow Goldfield at a bearing of $54^{\circ} 50'$ for about $14\frac{1}{2}$ miles to the South-Eastern corner of the Broad Arrow Goldfield; thence along a surveyed line at a bearing of $141^{\circ} 35'$ for about 12 miles 53 chains to the 18-mile post on the said surveyed line; thence at a bearing of about 57° about 6 miles to survey mark B5; thence at a bearing of about $68^{\circ} 45'$ about 20 miles to survey mark B16, near the Kanowna-Kurnalpi Road; thence South-South-East about $15\frac{1}{2}$ miles to the North-West corner of Location 40; thence South to the South-West corner of Location 40; thence South-Easterly to Trig. Station M5; thence South to a point East of the South-East corner of Location 48; thence West to the South-East corner of Location 48; thence along the boundaries of Location 48 Westerly 443 chains 19 links and Northerly 564 chains 87 links to the South-East corner of Location 51; thence along the boundaries of Location 51 Westerly 160 chains, Southerly 60 chains, and Westerly 119 chains 87 links; thence North along the East boundary of Location 51 and the West boundary of Location 53 to the starting point.

East Coolgardie District.

Bounded by lines starting from the North-East corner of Location 53; thence along the surveyed Western boundary of the East Coolgardie Goldfield at a bearing of $324^{\circ} 46'$ for a distance of 26 miles 62 chains 37 links to the 40-mile post; thence along the South-Eastern boundary of the Broad Arrow Goldfield at a bearing of $54^{\circ} 50'$ for about $14\frac{1}{2}$ miles to the South-Eastern corner of the Broad Arrow Goldfield; thence along a surveyed line at a bearing of $141^{\circ} 35'$ for about 30 miles 53 chains to the North-East corner of Location 44; thence East-South-Easterly about 55 chains to the South-West corner of Location 42; thence Easterly 206 chains to another corner of Location 42; thence South about 46 chains; thence East about 7 miles 34 chains to the post marked 62M on the Bulong to Randall's Road; thence South-Easterly along the road about 57 chains; thence South passing through Trig.

Station on Mt. Monger to a point East of the South-East corner of Location 48; thence West to the South-East corner of Location 48; thence along the boundaries of Location 48 Westerly 443 chains 19 links and Northerly 564 chains 87 links to the South-East corner of Location 51; thence along the boundaries of Location 51 Westerly 160 chains, Southerly 60 chains, and Westerly 119 chains 87 links; thence North along the East boundary of Location 51 and the West boundary of Location 53 to the starting point.

Bulong District.

Bounded by lines starting from the 18-mile post on a surveyed line forming part of the North-East boundary of the East Coolgardie Goldfield; thence at a bearing of $141^{\circ} 35'$ to the North-East corner of Location 44; thence East-South-Easterly about 55 chains to the South-West corner of Location 42; thence Easterly 206 chains to another corner of Location 42; thence South about 46 chains; thence East about 7 miles 34 chains to post marked 62M on the Bulong to Randall's Road; thence South-Easterly along the road about 57 chains; thence South passing through Trig. Station on Mt. Monger to a point East of the South-East corner of Location 48; thence East to a point South of Trig. Station M5; thence North to Trig. Station M5; thence North-Westerly to the South-West corner of Location 40; thence North to the North-West corner of Location 40; thence North-North-West about $15\frac{1}{2}$ miles to survey mark B16; thence West-South-Westerly along portion of the Northern boundary of the East Coolgardie Goldfield to the starting point.

NORTH-EAST COOLGARDIE GOLDFIELD.

Bounded by lines starting from a point on the South boundary of the North Coolgardie Goldfield, situated about 17 miles 30 chains East from survey mark R3; thence South along the East boundary of the Broad Arrow Goldfield about 29 miles 70 chains; thence along a surveyed line at a bearing of $141^{\circ} 35'$ for about 12 miles 53 chains to the 18-mile post; thence at a bearing of about 57° about 6 miles to survey mark B5; thence at a bearing of about $68^{\circ} 45'$ about 20 miles to survey mark B16 near the Kanowna-Kurnalpi Road; thence South-South-East about $15\frac{1}{2}$ miles to the North-West corner of Location 40; thence South to the South-West corner of Location 40; thence South-Easterly to Trig. Station M5; thence South to a point East from the summit of the Granite Rock near the 50-mile Soak on the Coolgardie-Norseman Road; thence East to the 125th meridian of East longitude; thence North passing along that meridian to a point East of survey mark R3; thence West to the starting point.

Kanowna District.

Bounded by lines starting from the most North-Westerly corner of the North-East Coolgardie Goldfield; thence East along the North boundary of the said goldfield about 32 miles to a point North of survey mark B16 near the Kanowna-Kurnalpi Road; thence South to survey mark B16; thence at a bearing of about $248^{\circ} 45'$ about 20 miles to survey mark B5; thence at a bearing of about 237° about 6 miles to the 18-mile post on a surveyed line which forms part of the Western boundary of the North-East Coolgardie Goldfield; thence along the said surveyed line at a bearing of $321^{\circ} 35'$ for about 12 miles 53 chains; thence North along the Western boundary of the North-East Coolgardie Goldfield to the starting point.

Kurnalpi District.

Bounded by lines starting at survey mark B16, near the Kanowna to Kurnalpi Road; thence North to the North boundary of the North-East Coolgardie Goldfield; thence East to the 125th meridian of East longitude; thence South along that meridian to the South-Eastern corner of the North-East Coolgardie Goldfield; thence West to a point South of Trigonometrical Station M5; thence South of Trigonometrical Station M5; thence North-North-Westerly to the South-West corner of Location 40; thence North to the North-West corner of Location 40; thence North-North-West about $15\frac{1}{2}$ miles to survey mark B16, the starting point.

IMMIGRATION DEPOT.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the establishment of an Immigration Depot for the reception of Immigrants upon their arrival in the State, and also to approve of the Rules of Admission hereunder.

IMMIGRATION DEPOT.

Rules.

1. Nominated immigrants will not be admitted to the Depot.
2. Immigrants must assist in the household duties as instructed. Men will take their instructions from the Caretaker, and women from the Housekeeper.
3. All immigrants admitted to the Depot will be allowed three days free board and residence; the date of admission shall count as one day.
4. After the first three days, men will be charged 1s. 9d. a day for each following day up to seven days.

5. After the first three days, women will be charged 1s. 6d. a day for each following day up to seven days.

6. Parents will be charged 9d. per day for each child between two and twelve years of age, but in all cases children under two years of age must be provided for by their parents.

7. Immigrants will not be permitted to remain in the Depot for a longer period than ten days following admission, except in special cases, when the charge for adults will be 2s. 6d. per day, children between two and twelve years of age half rate.

8. Any immigrant sleeping or having any meal on the premises will be considered an inmate for that day, and will be charged as for the full day.

9. No intoxicating liquor will be allowed on the premises, and any immigrant found with intoxicants in his possession, or being under the influence of drink, will be expelled from the Depot forthwith.

10. No smoking will be allowed in the bedrooms.

11. Personal baggage will only be allowed in the Depot, all heavy luggage must be stored elsewhere at the immigrant's expense.

12. Friends or relatives will not be allowed to visit immigrants at the Depot without the permission of the Caretaker.

13. Immigrants must not leave the Depot before 9 a.m. or remain out later than 10 p.m. without the permission of the Caretaker.

14. All complaints must be entered in the book kept for the purpose, and such complaints shall be forwarded by the Caretaker to the Under Secretary to be dealt with.

15. Failure to comply with all or any of these rules will be followed by instant expulsion from the Depot, and any immigrant who is ordered to leave the Depot by the Caretaker must do so forthwith.

GERALDTON DISTRICT ROAD BOARD.

The following By-laws are published in accordance with the provisions of Section 117 of "The Roads Act, 1902."

THE ROADS ACT, 1902.

Whereas by "The Roads Act, 1902," the Road Board of any district is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned. The Geraldton District Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

Interpretation.

In these By-laws the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meanings set against them, respectively, that is to say:—

- (a.) "District."—The locality or area for the time being under the control of the Geraldton District Road Board.
- (b.) "Board."—The Geraldton District Road Board.
- (c.) "Chairman."—The member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board.
- (d.) "Member."—A member of the Board.
- (e.) "The Act."—The Roads Act of 1902, and all amendments which may come into force hereafter as far as the Act allows.
- (f.) "Road or Reserve."—A road or reserve, as the case may be, under the control of the Board.
- (g.) "Person."—The word person shall include the plural and also a body corporate.
- (h.) "Owner."—Any person in possession or receipt either of the whole or of any part of the rents or profits of any house, building, land, or tenement.
- (i.) "Occupier."—Any person who shall have occupied any rateable property within the district during the time specified in the Act.
- (j.) "Permission or Consent."—The consent of the Board in writing.

Acts, Omissions, or Neglects.

1. The following acts, omissions, or neglects are hereby forbidden to be done or allowed to be done, and any person guilty of any of the following offences shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds:—

- (a.) Riding or driving horses, cattle, or other animals, or wheeling any barrow or drawing any carriage, velocipede, or motor car upon or along any footpath.
- (b.) Placing any fencing wire, timber, bricks, or other materials upon any footway, channel, surface drain or road without the permission of the Board having first been obtained.
- (c.) Burning any shavings or other material or matter in any footway, carriage road, or open or public place adjoining a roadway without permission.
- (e.) Opening any drain or sewer or removing the the Board.
- (d.) Damaging, destroying, or unlawfully interfering with any property under the control of surface of any footway or carriage road without the permission of the Board having been first obtained.
- (f.) No person shall keep or cause to be kept any swine or pigstye within 100ft. of any house or running water without the consent of the Board, and no piggery shall be kept within five chains from any Government road without the consent of the Board.
- (g.) No person shall keep or cause to be kept any livestock within 100ft. of any house or running water without the consent of the Board.
- (h.) Neglecting to clean all private yards, ways, passages, or avenues, by which neglect a nuisance by offensive smell or otherwise is caused.

- (i.) No person shall deposit or cast, or allow to remain upon any road or public place the carcase of a dead animal or any refuse or offensive matter.
- (j.) Cause or permit foul or offensive liquid matter to flow from any land, house, or premises owned or occupied by him in or upon any road or footpath, or injure or pollute any well or watering place which shall have been made or constructed by or under the control of the Board.
- (k.) Rolling any cask, beating any carpet, breaking in any horse, flying any kite, using any bows and arrows, or playing at any game to the annoyance of any person in any public road, or obstructing any footpath or carriage road, whether by allowing any cart or animal to remain across footpath or carriage road, or by placing goods thereon or otherwise.
- (l.) Having any awning over any footpath in any public road or thoroughfare not being eight feet clear above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning of the footway.
- (m.) No person shall kill, poison, or maim any horse, cow, camel, pig, dog, or other animals, and leave the same in any part of the district without making proper provision for the burial or the burning of the carcase thereof, and any person so doing shall commit an offence against these By-laws, and upon conviction shall pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and shall pay all expenses attending on the proper burial or burning of any such animal.
- (n.) Blasting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any public road without the permission of the Board, and not attending any direction in regard thereto given by such Board.
- (o.) Furiously or negligently driving or riding along any public road.
- (p.) Making cellar door or other opening from the footway of any road or public thoroughfare without the consent of the Board.
- (q.) Making any footway or any road or public thoroughfare without the consent of the Board, or allowing any footway to remain which, in the opinion of the Board, is an obstruction.
- (r.) The plying for hire by carts or vehicles without a license.
- (s.) Damaging or destroying any dam, well, tank, pumps, windmills, windlass, bucket, rope, piping, troughing, fence or gate under the control of the Board; carelessly leaving any tap connected with water tanks running, thereby letting the water escape from such tanks and waste; bathing in any dam, well, or in any way polluting the water contained in such tanks, wells, or dam as to render it unfit for human consumption.
- (t.) No person shall leave open any gate across a public road that has been erected by permission of the Board.

Sign Boards, etc.

2. Any person who shall erect or place any sign-board, sign-awning, blinds, overhanging lamps, or other things over or near any footway or roadway without obtaining the consent of the Board shall forfeit and pay upon conviction a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

General Regulation of Traffic.

3. Every person having the care or conduct of any vehicle shall keep the same on the left or near side of the road, except in case of actual necessity or other sufficient reason for deviation, and shall not interfere with any person or vehicle passing or attempting to pass his vehicle.

4. The driver of any vehicle, or the rider of every horse or other animals turning for the purpose of proceeding in an opposite direction, or turning the corner of any road in the district, shall bring the horse or other animal to a walking pace before commencing to turn.

5. No person having the care or control of a horse or other animal, or of any vehicle, shall allow the same to remain on any road of the district, or to obstruct any portion of such road for a longer period than necessary for loading or unloading the vehicle.

6. No vehicle with three or more horses shall proceed along any made or macadamised road within the district less than two abreast.

7. Any driver of a camel or camels on any road neglecting to draw off on the approach of a vehicle shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. The owner of every vehicle or engine which together with its load shall weigh more than seven tons shall travel the roads, bridges, and culverts at his own risk, and shall be liable to pay for any damage done.

9. All vehicles licensed under the Cart and Carriage Act shall exhibit a disc showing a registered number of owner, such disc to be supplied by the Board.

Careless use of Fire.

10. No person shall make or leave a fire by the road or trackside without taking proper precautions against such fire spreading, and any person offending against this By-law shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

To prevent Accidents from Bicycles, etc.

11. No person shall ride or impel a bicycle or motor car of any kind upon any footpath within the district.

12. No person shall, within the hours of sunset and sunrise, ride a cycle or motor along any road unless there is attached thereto a lamp which shall exhibit a light in the direction in which he is proceeding, and at all times to be kept lighted.

13. Every cyclist or person driving any bicycle or motor car shall carry a bell or horn, which shall be sounded as a signal whenever any person on foot or horseback or vehicle is being approached or passed.

14. No person shall leave any cycle or motor car in or on any road or footway so as to become an obstruction, and every person shall remove his cycle or motor car immediately upon being requested to do so by any constable or officer or member of the Board.

15. No person shall pass at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour any person who shall be driving any horse or any animal.

16. When a cyclist or motorist meets any horse or animal, and such horse or animal becomes restless or appears likely to get beyond the control of the person in charge thereof, such cyclist shall dismount, and shall remain dismounted till such horse or animal has been passed.

17. No person shall ride any cycle or drive a motor round the corner formed by the junction of any road in the district, or across the intersection of any of the said roads, at a pace exceeding six miles an hour.

To prevent obstruction on the Footpaths or Roads.

18. No person shall permit any boxes, cases, coal, sand, firewood, goods, wares, merchandise, or other articles or effects to remain on any part of the road or any part of the footpath within the district after sunset, nor in any case for a longer period than shall be necessary for housing and removing same.

To prevent damage to Roads, Footpaths, and other Road Property.

19. No person, without having first obtained the written sanction of the Board, shall break up, cut down, damage, destroy or injure any road, footpath, gutter, drain, culvert, bridge, public way, tree, plant, gate, fence, post, lantern, lamp-post, implements, materials, buildings, or other properties of the said Board, or under the control thereof.

20. No person shall damage or destroy by means of horse team, wagon, dray, or any other means, any road or portion of road under construction or repair. Any person found guilty of such damage or destruction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

21. Any person who—

(a.) Cuts or removes, without the consent of the Board, timber, earth, sand, gravel, stone or other material from a road.

(b.) Erects, without the consent aforesaid, a structure upon a road so as to encroach thereon.

(c.) Draws, without the consent aforesaid, across the drain of a road except over a properly constructed pipe, approach, or culvert, a dray, or other wheeled vehicle.

(d.) Draws upon a road timber, stone, plough, or other material or implement otherwise than on a wheeled vehicle, or suffers such material carried principally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle to trail or drag upon a road, or draws upon a road a whim, or timber carriage, any portion of which, or any portion of chains attached thereto, or any portion of any other attachment trails or drags upon a road, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each such offence.

Removal of Gravel, etc.

22. No person shall dig for or remove any gravel or stone from any reserve without first obtaining permission from the Board, and also paying a fee or license of six-pence per cubic yard.

Registration of Dogs, Bicycles, etc.

23. The owners of all dogs shall pay a yearly registration fee as prescribed by Statute. Numbered discs with registered number of owners shall be supplied by the Board and must be worn by the dog.

24. The yearly license fee on all bicycles used within the district shall be Five shillings.

25. The yearly license fee on all motor cars used within the district shall be Two pounds.

26. The yearly license fee on all vehicles used in the district shall be as prescribed by Statute. Numbered discs will be supplied by the Board, and must be affixed to the licensed vehicle.

27. The owners of all camels kept, or who may be travelling within the district, must pay a license fee of £1 each for the current year. Any person infringing this By-law will be subject to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

28. The current year for the issue of all licenses by the Board shall be from the first day of January to the 31st day in December in each year.

Penalties.

29. Every person who does, permits or suffers, any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and where not otherwise provided shall be liable to a fine or penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for every such offence, upon conviction, before any one or more Justices of the Peace.

Stock to be kept off the Roads.

30. The owner of any cattle, horse, sheep, goat, pig, or other animal straying on any road fenced on both sides within the district shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, without a written permission from the Board being first obtained to graze such roads as abut on the applicant's property.

31. The owner of any bull, stallion, or camel straying on any road within the district shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

32. No person shall erect any barbed wire on the outside of any post or fence on a public road in the district.

It is hereby resolved by the Geraldton District Road Board, subject to and by and with the approval and confirmation of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the above By-laws shall be enforced within the district controlled by the said Board, from the date of publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

BY-LAW No. 29.

Regulating the licensing and use of Motor Vehicles.

A By-law of the Municipality of the City of Perth, made under Part VIII. of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906, and numbered 29, for regulating the licensing and use of Motor Vehicles.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the City of Perth order as follows:—

1. In the construction of this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires:—

(a.) "Motor Vehicle" shall mean and include any motor car, automobile, motor carriage, motor cycle, or other carriage, or vehicle propelled either partly or wholly by any volatile spirit, steam, or electricity, or by any other means than animal power.

2. No motor vehicle shall be kept and used within the Municipality of Perth, unless and until a license shall be first had and obtained therefor, or except during the currency of such license, and if any motor vehicle shall be so kept and used, the owner thereof shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

3. The fees to be paid for licenses under this By-law shall be as follows:—

Motor car (for the conveyance of persons only),
10s. for every person exclusive of the driver,
which the motor car is licensed to carry, with
a minimum of £2.

Motor wagon, for the conveyance of goods or merchandise, £5.

Motor cycle, 5s.

Every license in respect to any motor vehicle shall expire on the 31st day of October next after the same shall be granted, provided that in respect of any license granted after the 30th day of April in any year, the fee payable for such year shall be one-half of the annual fee for such license.

4. Every application for a license for a motor vehicle shall be made by the owner, or his duly authorised agent, in the form prescribed in the schedule hereto.

5. The owner of any motor vehicle licensed under this By-law shall, within seven days after any alteration in the colour of the painting or in the form of the body thereof, give written notice to the Council of such alteration.

6. If any person shall become the owner of a licensed motor vehicle during the currency of the license thereof, he shall, upon production of the license to the Traffic Inspector, and upon payment of the sum of 5s., be entitled to have a license issued to him in respect of such motor vehicle for the balance of the term for which the original license was granted.

7. No person shall drive, ride, or impel a motor vehicle:—

(a.) Across the intersection or round the corner of any streets or ways at a speed exceeding four miles an hour.

(b.) Within the area bounded on the East by the East side of Pier Street, on the West by the West side of King Street, on the North by the North side of Wellington Street, and on the South by the South side of Hay Street, at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour.

(c.) Within any other portion of the Municipality at a speed exceeding 12 miles an hour.

(d.) At any time or in any portion of the Municipality, recklessly or negligently, or at a speed or in a manner which is dangerous to the public, having regard to the nature, condition, and use of the street or way, and to the amount of traffic then upon, or which might reasonably be expected to be upon such street or way.

8. No person shall drive or impel a motor vehicle other than a motor cycle in any street or way between sunset and sunrise, unless there shall be attached thereto two lamps so constructed and placed as to exhibit a white light in the direction in which such vehicle is proceeding or intending to proceed, and one lamp so constructed and placed as to exhibit a red light from the rear of such vehicle, and all such lamps shall during such time as aforesaid, and whilst such vehicle is in any street or way be kept lighted, and shall show light sufficiently clear and strong to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such motor vehicle.

9. No person shall ride or impel a motor cycle in any street or way between sunset and sunrise, unless there shall be attached thereto an efficient lamp, so constructed and placed as to exhibit a white light in the direction in which such motor cycle is proceeding or intending to proceed, and such lamp shall be lighted and kept lighted during such time as aforesaid and whilst such motor cycle is in any street or way, and shall show a light being sufficiently clear and strong to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such motor cycle.

10. No person shall ride, drive, or impel a motor vehicle in any street or way which has not attached thereto a proper bell, horn, or other instrument, which is capable of giving audible and sufficient warning of the approach or position of such motor vehicle.

11. Every driver or rider of a motor vehicle shall, whenever necessary, by sounding a bell, horn, or other instrument give audible and sufficient warning of the approach or position thereof.

12. No person shall drive or ride a motor vehicle upon any footpath, except when crossing from or to any premises at a regulation crossing place.

13. No person shall drive a motor vehicle backwards for a greater distance or time than the necessity of the case or the purposes of safety shall require.

14. The driver of any motor vehicle shall, if an accident occurs to any person, whether on foot, or horseback, or in a carriage, or to any horse or carriage in charge of any person, owing to the presence of the motor vehicle in the street, stop and remain stationary for a reasonable time, and shall give his name and address, and (if he be not the owner) the name and address of the owner of the motor vehicle if required by any constable or officer of the Council, or by any person acting on behalf of the person injured, or of the owner of the property damaged.

15. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a motor vehicle who shall meet or overtake any animal, which shall become restive or alarmed, shall stop such motor vehicle, and shall remain stationary as long as may be reasonably necessary.

16. The driver of a motor vehicle whilst driving or riding the same in or along any street or way, shall keep the same on the left hand or near side of such street or way.

17. Every driver or rider of a motor vehicle shall, when passing any other vehicle or any animal proceeding in an opposite direction along any street or way, keep such other vehicle or animal on his right, and when passing any other vehicle or any animal proceeding in the same direction, shall pass on the right hand side thereof.

18. No person shall drive, ride, or impel any motor vehicle in any street or public place abreast of, or side by side with more than one other motor vehicle, except when taking part in a duly authorised parade or procession.

19. No driver or rider of a motor vehicle shall, when on such vehicle, be in a position in which he cannot have control over the same, nor shall he quit the motor vehicle without having stopped the machinery and taken due precautions against its starting in his absence, or allow the motor vehicle to stand on such street so as to cause an unnecessary obstruction thereof.

20. The driver or rider of a motor vehicle shall always have an efficient silencer attached to such motor vehicle, in full and efficient working order, and always connected with the proper portion of the engine of such motor vehicle so as to reduce by at least 40 per cent. the noise which would otherwise result from the working of the engine of such vehicle, and shall not in any case have attached to such silencer, or otherwise connected therewith, any device or machinery whereby such silencer may be rendered inefficient or unworkable, or its efficiency in any way lessened.

21. Every driver of a motor vehicle, when taking up or setting down persons in any street, or when waiting for any such purposes, shall act under the directions of any officer of the Corporation of the City of Perth, or police constable who may be on duty in such street.

22. The owner of any motor vehicle shall, when required by the Traffic Inspector or any police constable, furnish the name and address of the person driving such motor car at any particular time.

23. No person shall use or drive any motor vehicle unless the same is licensed by the Council of the Municipality in which the same is kept.

24. No person shall use or drive a motor vehicle not being a motor cycle in the said Municipality, unless there shall be fixed in a conspicuous position in the front and on the back thereof a rectangular plate in an upright position, upon which is inscribed the licensed number of the said vehicle, together with the distinguishing letter or letters of the Municipality in which the same is licensed in characters of not less than three and a-half inches high, and of the corresponding breadth, painted in white on a black ground, so that the inscription upon such plates shall be easily distinguishable from in front or behind as the case may be, and no person shall use or drive any licensed motor vehicle in the said city between sunset and sunrise unless the said plates shall be so illuminated that the inscriptions thereon shall be easily distinguishable.

25. No person shall drive, ride, or impel any motor cycle unless a number plate shall be attached thereto in a conspicuous position containing the number of the license of such cycle. The said number to be at least two inches in height, and to be in white figures on black ground.

26. The Traffic Inspector may, on payment to him of an annual fee of £4, assign to any manufacturer of, or dealer in, motor vehicles, general identification numbers, not exceeding six, which may be used for motor vehicles on trial after completion, or on trial by an intending purchaser.

27. The colouring of the plates having placed thereon or annexed thereto any of such distinguishing numbers, shall be different from that used for the plates required to be used by owners, and specified in Section 24 of these By-laws, but all other provisions of these By-laws as to the size and position of the plates shall apply.

28. Whenever any manufacturer or agent shall use any number assigned to him under these By-laws, he shall keep a record of the name and address of the person driving the motor vehicle on each occasion, and such record shall be open to inspection at any time by the Traffic Inspector, or any person appointed by him, in writing, to make an inspection.

29. The Traffic Inspector shall keep in the register of motor vehicles a record showing the name of the manufacturer or dealer to whom any general identification numbers have been assigned, the place of business of the manufacturer or dealer, and a description of the colouring adopted under the provisions of Section 27 of these By-laws.
