WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the said State made and passed in the fourth year of the reign of His Most Gracious Majesty King Edward the Seventh, No. 26 (Act No. 51 of 1904), intituled "The Local Courts Act, 1904," the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to order that Courts, to be called Local Courts, shall be held at such places as he thinks fit; and may, in like manner, alter the place for the holding of a Court, or order that the holding of any Court be discontinued: And whereas it is deemed expedient to discontinue the holding of a Local Court at Bulong: Now therefore I, the said Lieutenant-

Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby order that the holding of a Local Court at Bulong shall be discontinued, and that all proceedings pending in the said Bulong Local Court shall be transferred to and continue in the Kanowna Local Court, and that all records of the said Bulong Local Court (the holding of which is discontinued) shall also be transferred to the said Kanowna Local Court as from the 1st of June, 1908.

WHEREAS by Section 17 of "The Health Act, 1898," the area of any District defined for the purpose of a Local Board of Health may from time to time be extended, altered, or contracted by the Governor in Council; and whereas it is desired to extend the District of the Moora Local Board of Health: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, on the recommendation of the Central Board of Health, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby extend the area of the Moora Local Board of Health to embrace all lands within a radius of 20 miles of the Post Office, Moora.

1. In these By-laws unless the context otherwise requires—

"Refreshment room" includes the kitchen or other offices connected therewith.

2. Whenever refreshment rooms are to let from time to time, tenders will be called by public notification in the form following or to the like effect:—

Leases will be for five years from, and subject to "The Government Railways Act, 1904," and the By-laws made thereunder.

5. On receipt of the application and fee the Commissioner may grant a license to the lessee in the form following:—

Whereas,, being the lessee of the Railway Refreshment Room at Station, has applied to me for a license to sell liquor by retail at the said station, and has paid the sum of £....., being the fee fixed by me under "The Government Railways Act, 1904," and the By-laws as payable for such license: Now I, the undersigned, being the Commissioner of Railways for Western Australia, do hereby license the said to sell liquor by retail during the prescribed hours at the said Refreshment Room. This license shall remain in force until the.....day of.....19...., unless earlier revoked by me.

6. When the annual rent of any refreshment room does not exceed two hundred pounds, the annual license fee shall be five pounds. When the annual rent exceeds two hundred pounds the license fee shall be increased by £1 for every additional £40 rent.

Provided that the maximum license fee shall be £30.

And provided further that when a license is granted for part of a year the Commissioner may make a proportionate reduction in the fee.

7. The Commissioner may exercise a discretionary power as to granting, limiting, refusing, or revoking any license.

8. The license will not convey the right to sell liquor at any time other than for thirty minutes before and thirty minutes after the stopping of passenger or mixed trains at the station where the refreshment room is situated.

9. Liquor may be sold only to persons in possession of tickets or passes entitling them to travel by rail, and any such person may be required to produce his ticket before being served.

10. The fixtures and articles belonging to the Commissioner shall remain in the refreshment room for the use of the licensee until the determination of the lease; and if, in the opinion of the Commissioner, such fixtures and articles are damaged otherwise than by fair wear and tear, the cost of repairs shall be deducted from the sum deposited with the tender or may be recovered from the lessee.

11. The lessee (hereinafter called the licensee) shall find and provide all earthenware, glass, dinner service, table-linen, china, and other articles for the refreshment room, and also all movable implements and utensils necessary for the kitchen and other offices in connection with such rooms.

12. The refreshment room shall be supplied with water, fuel, and light, to the satisfaction of the Commissioner, and at the expense of the licensee.

13. The licensee may be required to insure and, during the term of his lease, keep insured his refreshment room against loss or damage by fire, in the name of the Commissioner, to the amount of its full value, and if so required shall deposit with the Commissioner the policy and all receipts for premiums paid, and on any breach

or non-observance of this By-law the Commissioner may insure the refreshment room, and the cost of effecting such insurance shall be added to and recovered as rent.

14. The licensee shall pay all rates and taxes payable in respect of his refreshment room, or the proportion thereof where the same are not separately assessed.

15. The licensee must personally supervise and manage the business of his refreshment room, and he shall not permit any person to supervise and manage such business during his absence, for a longer period than fourteen days in any one year without the previous consent in writing of the Commissioner.

16. The licensee shall at all times within thirty minutes of the arrival and departure of any passenger or mixed train have in readiness the meals and light refreshments specified in the tariff at the end of these By-laws.

Such meals and light refreshments must be of the best quality, well cooked, of appetising appearance, and promptly and cleanly served by attendants suitably attired.

Provided that the Commissioner may, at any time, dispense with the obligation as to providing meals.

17. The tariff may be departed from by increasing the variety or number of articles supplied, or by decreasing the prices, but not otherwise.

18. All liquors brought into the refreshment rooms must be of the best quality, and the licensee shall keep for sale such brands as the Commissioner may from time to time direct.

19. Nothing in the lease shall be construed to create a yearly tenancy in favour of the licensee; but his right to occupy the refreshment room shall cease whenever the license is revoked or shall come to an end, and thereupon the Commissioner may re-enter on and retake and absolutely retain possession of the said rooms, without being in any way liable to pay compensation to the licensee.

20. (1.) The licensee shall not permit any of the servants of the Commissioner to be supplied with intoxicating liquor in the refreshment room, unless such servants are off duty and holding railway tickets or free passes.

(2.) Engine-drivers, firemen, and guards when working on trains passing through a station where a refreshment room is situated shall be entitled to be served with meals and light refreshments at half the prices mentioned in the tariff.

21. The licensee shall not employ in his refreshment room any person of Asiatic or African race without the permission in writing of the Commissioner.

22. All persons employed by the licensee shall be paid weekly or fortnightly in cash or bank notes, at the rate of wages current in the district and without any deduction by way of contra account.

23. (1.) The licensee shall not use his refreshment room as a lodging-house or boarding-house, except with the consent in writing of the Commissioner.

(2.) Such consent will be given only with respect to stations where suitable accommodation exists, and where it would, in the opinion of the Commissioner, be convenient for passengers to break the journey.

(3.) The licensee shall not accommodate any persons under this By-law other than passengers holding tickets or passes.

24. The licensee shall not transfer his license without the consent in writing of the Commissioner.

25. The Commissioner or any of his authorised officers shall have free access to the refreshment rooms, and every facility shall be given by the licensee for an inspection of the liquor and refreshments found therein.

26. Nothing in the lease or license shall restrict the right of the Commissioner—

(a.) To alter the times or reduce the number of trains;

(b.) To open additional refreshment rooms;

(c.) To supply and sell liquor and refreshments in any restaurant car or railway carriage; or

(d.) To effect structural alterations or additions to the buildings at any station where a refreshment room is situated.

And on any such right being exercised the licensee shall have no claim for compensation against the Commissioner.

27. The Commissioner may revoke the license in any of the following cases:—

- (a.) If the rent remains unpaid for seven days after it becomes due.
- (b.) If the licensee dies or becomes bankrupt, or enters into any arrangement or composition with his creditors;
- (c.) If the licensee assigns his license or executes a bill of sale of his stock or effects without the consent in writing of the Commissioner.
- (d.) If the licensee is convicted under Part I. of the "Sale of Liquors Amendment Act, 1897," for adulteration.
- (e.) If the licensee commits any other breach of his license or lease a second time, after having been warned by the Commissioner with respect to a first breach.

On the revocation of a license the sum deposited with the tender shall be absolutely forfeited to the Commissioner.

28. For each and every breach of these By-laws the licensee shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
