The fixtures and articles belonging to the Commissioner shall remain in the retreshment room for the use of the licensec until the Ietermination of the lease; and if, in the opinion of the Commissioner, sweh fixtures and articles are damaged othervise than by fair wear and tear, the cost of repairs slall be dedueted from the sum deposited with the tender or may he reovered from tho lessec.
11. The lessee (hereinafter called the liconsee) shall find and provide all earthomme, glass, dimer service, table-linen, china, and other artieles for the refreshment room, and also all movable implements and utensils necessary for the kitchen and other olliees in comention with such rooms.
12. The refreshment room shall be supplied with water, fuel, and light, to the satisfaction of the Commis. sioner, and at the expense of the licensee.
13. The licensee may be required to insme and, during the term of his lease, keep insured his refrestment room agtinst loss or damage by fire, in the name of the Commissioner, to the amount of its fall whe, and if so reguirel shall deposit with the Commissioner the poliey and all receipts for premiums paid, and on thy breach

Or mom-olstrance of this By-law the Commissioner may insure the refreshment room, and the cost of effecting sued insmance shall be adeled to and recovered as rent.
14. The licenser shall pay all motes and tares payable in respere of his refreshment room, or the proportion thereof where the same are not separately assessed.
15. The licensee must personally supervise and manage the business of his refreshment room, and he shall not permit any person to supervise am manage such business during his absence, for a longer period than fourteen days in any one year without the previons consent in writing of the Commissioner.
16. The iicensee shall at all times within thirty minutes of the arival and departure of any passenger or mixed train have in readiness the meals and light refreshments specified in the tariff at the end of these By-laws.

Snch meak and light refreshments most be of the best quality, well cooked, of appetising appeamence, and promptly and deanly served by attemdants suitably attired.

Drovided that the Commissioner may, at any time, dispense with the obligation as to providing meals.
17. The tariff may be depariod from by increasing the variety or nomber of articles supplied, or by decreasing the prices, but not otherwise.

1s. All liquors bronght into the refrestment rooms must he of the best quality, and the lieensee shall keep for sale such brams as the Commissioner may from time to time direet.
19. Nothing in the lase shall be construed to create a yealy tenancy in favour of the licensee; but his right to occupy the refreshment room shall cease whencver the license is revoked or shall come to an end, and therebuon the Commissioner may reenter on and retake and absolutely retain possession of the said rooms, without being in any way liable to may rompensation to the licenser.
20. (1.) The herensee shall not permit any of the sorvants of the Commissioner to be supplied with intoxiating liquor in the rofreshmont room, unless such servants are off duty and holding railway tickets or free passes.

(9.) Suh consent will be given only with respect to stations where sutable acommodation exists, and where it wonld, in the opinion of the Commissioner, be convenient for passengers to brak the journey.
(3.) The licensee shatl not accommodate any persons under this By-law other than passengers holding tiekets or passes.
24. The lieensee shall not transfor his leense without the consent in writing of the Commissioner.
25. The Commissioner or any of his anthorised officers shall have free access to the refreshment rooms, and every facility shall be given by the licensee for an inspecfion of the liquor and refresliments fomd therein.
26. Nothing in the lease or license shall restrict the right of the Commissioner--
(a.) To alter the times or reduce the number of trains:
(b.) To open additional refreshment rooms;
(a) To supply and sell liquor and refreshments in any restamant ear or milnay camiage; or
(d.) Fo effect structural alterations or additions to tho buildings at any station where a refreshment room is situated.
Amd on aty such right being exereised the licensee shall hare no daim for compensation against the Commissioner.
27. The Commissioner may revoke the license in any of the following cases:--
(a.) If the rent remains unpaid for seven days after it becomes due.
(b.) If the licensee dies or becomes bankrupt, or enters into any arrangement or composition with his creditors;
(c.) If the licensee assigns his license or executes a bill of sale of his stock or effects without the consent in writing of the Commissioner.
(d.) If the licensee is convicted under Part I. of the "Sale of Liquors Amendment Act, 1897,' for adulteration.
(e.) If the licensee commits any other breach of his license or lease a second time, after having been warnel by the Commissioner with respect to a first breach.

    If an officer is promoted whose present salary is below the minimum fixed for the new position, the commencing salary will be based on the scale fixed for increases to be granted this financial year; i.e., an officer promoted to a higher class will not necessarily forthwith receive the minimum salary attached to that class.
