HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to cancel the Order in Council as to the Defence of Destitute Persons charged with Capital Offences dated the 11th of July, 1900, and the amendment thereto dated the 10th of June, 1903, and to approve of the following in lieu thereof:—

*Regulations as to the Defence of Destitute Persons charged with Capital Offences.*

1. A list of practitioners of the Supreme Court who are prepared to act as Counsel for prisoners who are to be tried on a capital charge, and who have no means to defend themselves, shall in future be kept in the Crown Law Department.

2. On the Sheriff being satisfied that a prisoner awaiting trial on a capital charge possesses no means, or insufficient means, to retain Counsel on his own behalf, he will, by writing under his hand, notify the Judge (or Commissioner), upon whom the duty of presiding at the trial will fall, of such fact, and the Judge will nominate such practitioner from such list as to him may appear proper, regard being had to the locality of the trial and to Counsel selected being a practitioner in practice in such locality.

3. On the Judge duly nominating Counsel the Judge's Associate will notify the Crown Law Department, and the Counsel nominated will be informed and supplied with a copy of the depositions taken in the case.

No. 8 will be up to the first year's course of the Technical School.

No officer can sit for this examination unless he has been in the Service for at least three years prior to November, 1908.
