WHEREAS by "The Aborigines Act, 1905," it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation in the "Government Gazette" to declare any Crown lands to be Reserves for Aborigines: And whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Aborigines should be declared on Bernier Island, in the Gascoyne Magisterial District: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare a Reserve of two thousand (2,000) acres on Bernier Island, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, a Reserve for Aborigines.

*Schedule.*

That portion of Bernier Island lying between a West line from Wedge Point on the North, and a West line from Cleft Rock on the South, containing about two thousand (2,000) acres.

#### REGULATIONS.

The following Regulations are incorporated with the Regulations made on the 24th day of September, 1902, and published in the "Government Gazette" on the 26th day of September, 1902:—

1. All horses imported into Western Australia from beyond the limits of the Australian States and New Zealand shall, within one month before leaving the place of shipment, be subjected by a duly qualified veterinary surgeon to the Mallein test for glanders, and a certificate of the veterinary surgeon that they have been submitted to such test and are free from disease or infection must be produced before the landing of such horses will be permitted.

2. All such horses may be again subjected to the Mallein test after their arrival and before they are released from quarantine if, in the opinion of the Chief Inspector of Stock, such test is necessary.

3. All cattle imported into Western Australia from beyond the limits of the Australian States and New Zealand shall, within one month before leaving the place of shipment, be subjected by a duly qualified veterinary surgeon to the tuberculin test for tuberculosis, and a certificate of the veterinary surgeon that they have been submitted to that test and are free from disease or infection must be produced before the landing of such cattle will be permitted.

4. All such cattle must be again submitted to the tuberculin test after their arrival and before they are released from quarantine if, in the opinion of the Chief Inspector of Stock, such test is necessary.

5. All horses and cattle so tested must be kept isolated from all other stock during the period between testing and shipment.

*By-Law of the Bayswater Local Board of Health.*

WHEREAS by the "Health Act, 1898," and the Acts amending the same, the Local Board of Health has power to make By-laws: Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in the said Act and the Acts amending the same, the Local Board of Health doth hereby make the following By-law:—

"No person shall transport any nightsoil or urine in any part of the district, or remove any sanitary pan from any privy in the district, before eleven o'clock, p.m."

WHEREAS by "The Health Act, 1898," and the Acts amending the same, the Local Board of Health has power to make By-laws. Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers

in that behalf contained in the said Act and the Acts amending the same, the Local Board of Health doth hereby make the following By-law:—

"Within seven days after the coming into operation of this By-law, every owner or occupier of any house or tenement shall cause to be kept, in every closet appurtenant to such house or tenement, a sufficient quantity of a suitable deodorant or disinfectant, and shall cause such deodorant or disinfectant to be used at such times and in such manner, and in such quantity, as to ensure that all faecal deposits in such closets are entirely covered so as to prevent access of flies to such deposits."

2. Every person, being the holder of one or more Exclusive Licenses under "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act, 1892" (55th Vict., No. 9), shall be entitled, on the payment to the Inspector of Fisheries, Sharks Bay, of the sum of £1, to one special permit to gather, collect, or remove pearls or pearl shells from the said Government reserve in Useless Inlet; such permit shall extend over the period of one week from the date thereof, and may be renewed from week to week during the continuance of the period during which the reserve shall be so thrown open as aforesaid, on payment of the sum of £1 per week, in advance, to the said Inspector.

3. The holder of such special permit shall not be entitled to work more than one boat for the purposes aforesaid, either by himself or any agent or agents, assistant or assistants, whom he may appoint or employ.

4. All pearls or pearl shells gathered, collected, or removed under the provisions of any special permit to be granted as aforesaid shall be gathered, collected, or removed subject to the provisions and restrictions contained in Clauses Nos. 6 and 13 of the Regulations for the control and management of the Pearl Shell Fishery at Sharks Bay, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 16th May, 1898.
