WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the said State, made and passed in the fourth year of the reign of His Most Gracious Majesty King Edward the Seventh, No. 26 (Act No. 51 of 1904), intituled "The Local Courts Act, 1904," the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to order that Courts, to be called Local Courts, shall be held at such places as he thinks fit, and may, in like manner, alter the place for the holding of a Court, or order that the holding of any Court be dis-

continued: And whereas it is deemed expedient to discontinue the holding of a Local Court at Gingin: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby order that the holding of a Local Court at Gingin shall be discontinued, and that all proceedings pending in the said Gingin Local Court shall be transferred to and continue in the Moora Local Court, and that all records of the said Gingin Local Court (the holding of which is discontinued) shall also be transferred to the said Moora Local Court, as from the 30th day of June, 1908.

Central Board of Health By-laws.

WHEREAS by the "Health Act, 1898," and "The Health Act Amendment Act, 1900," the Central Board of Health has power to make By-laws; and further has power to

repeal, alter, and amend any By-laws so made: Now, therefore, the Central Board of Health hereby amends its By-laws published in the *Government Gazette* of the 1st December, 1905, by making the following additional By-laws:—

BY-LAW No. 14.

- (f.) He shall, for the purpose of protecting milk against infection or contamination at any time, and from time to time, permit the tuberculin test to be applied to any cow or other bovine animal in his possession or under his control by any inspector or other person duly appointed by the Central Board of Health to perform such test, and he shall afford every assistance in his power by yarding or stabling the aforesaid animals at the time and place appointed by the said inspector or other person, and keeping them yarded or stalled as may be required until released by the said inspector or other person.
- (g.) He shall register (free of charge) with the Central Board a full description of each of his dairy cattle and of such animal or animals as may be added from time to time to his dairy herd immediately such addition is made, and such description shall include brands, colours, markings, and other distinctive characteristics, and in the event of any such dairy cattle ceasing to be part of such dairy herd he shall immediately notify in writing the Secretary of the Central Board such a change in his dairy herd.
- (h.) He shall make no addition to his dairy herd of any animal or animals without the written permission of the Central Board, whose officers may examine such animal or animals and apply such tests as may be deemed necessary to ascertain the freedom from disease or otherwise of such animal or animals, and the Central Board may withhold such permission until such examination or tests have been satisfactorily made.
- (i.) He or any other person shall not allow, permit or suffer any diseased cow or other diseased animal to come in contact with or be in propinquity to any cattle, or to be at large on any ground occupied or traversed by such cattle.
- (j.) Any cow or other bovine animal coming in contact with, being in propinquity to, or being at large on any ground occupied or traversed by any dairy cattle, may be forthwith isolated or caused to be isolated by any inspector, and such inspector may, if any such cow or other bovine animal shall be suspected to be diseased, apply any such tests as are necessary to ascertain the freedom from disease or otherwise of such cow or bovine animal, and the Central Board may cause any such cow or animal found to be diseased to be destroyed or otherwise dealt with as the Central Board may direct.
- (k.) He shall, if so required by the said inspector or other person, tag, brand, or otherwise mark any isolated animal for the purposes of identification.
- (l.) No person shall apply the tuberculin test to any cow or other animal affected by these by-laws, and no cow-keeper shall allow such test to be applied to any cow or other animal under his control, without such person and such cow-keeper both notifying to the Secretary of the Central Board of Health, five full days before the application of such test, his intention of applying such test, together with the number of animals to be so tested, with full description of such animals, and a notification of the place where the test is to be applied and the time at which it is to be applied and without receiving written permission to apply such test on the animals named and at the time stated and place; and he shall further, on completion of the test, supply to the Secretary all and full details of the results of such test, and furnish to any inspector who may be present at the time or require such information or assistance, all the information and assistance that may be necessary to enable such inspector to ascertain the diseased condition or otherwise of such cow or other animal.

(m.) No license shall be granted after January 1st, 1909, except to cow-keepers having herds proved to the satisfaction of the Central Board to be free from tuberculosis.

3. Knowledge of Acts and Regulations affecting the Department or Branch in which the officer is employed, and of the Audit and Public Service Acts and Regulations.
4. Précis writing.
5. Making fair copies of rough and abbreviated notes.

B.

(Two, and only two, must be taken.)

6. Tabulating statistical returns and digesting same into summaries.
7. Indexing and registration.
8. Elementary bookkeeping.
9. Typewriting.
10. Shorthand.

C.

Assessment of Personal Qualifications.

(By Permanent Head and Head of Sub-department.)

11. A certain number of marks will be awarded under this heading for punctuality, accuracy, neatness in work, quickness in work, aptitude to grasp instructions quickly and promptitude in putting them into effect, general good behaviour, and satisfactory conduct.

No. 3, a list of Acts and Regulations showing those to be studied by officers of the various branches of the Service will be published in the *Gazette* towards the end of next month.

Nos. 4, 5, and 6 specimen papers can be obtained from the Commissioner's office.

No. 8 will be up to the first year's course of the Technical School.

No. 9, speed up to 35 words per minute.

No. 10, speed up to 100 words per minute.

Equal marks will be awarded for each of the selected subjects.

No officer can sit for this examination unless he has been in the Service for at least three years prior to November, 1908.

In future years No. 6 will be compulsory.

Attention is drawn to the classes held at the Technical Schools.

Officers who intend to present themselves for examination should record their names in the Commissioner's office, on or before the 1st of August next, stating the "B" subjects selected.
