### PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA,

FRED. G. D. BEDFORD,

} By His Excellency Admiral Sir FREDERICK GEORGE DENHAM BEDFORD, Knight  
Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor in and  
over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Constitution Act, 1889, it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being, to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly, and also from time to time by proclamation or otherwise to prorogue the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: AND WHEREAS the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly now stand prorogued to Thursday, the twenty-fifth day of June, now instant: NOW THEREFORE I, ADMIRAL SIR FREDERICK GEORGE DENHAM BEDFORD, G.C.B., Governor of the said State, in exercise of the powers so vested in me, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly to Thursday, the 23rd day of July now next ensuing; and I do hereby further announce and proclaim that the Fifth Session of the Sixth Parliament of Western Australia shall be holden for the despatch of business on the aforesaid Thursday, the 23rd day of July next, at the hour of 3 p.m. in the House of Parliament, in the City of Perth, and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

One thousand nine hundred and eight.
