WHEREAS under the Transfer of Land Act Justices of the Peace are specially authorised to witness the execution of documents affecting property under that Act, with a view to securing that such documents shall be in order before and at the time of execution: And whereas a practice has arisen of witnessing the execution of documents which have not been completed, in particular in regard to blanks occurring therein, either in regard to the consideration passing under the instrument, or in regard to the names and description of the parties thereto, and such irregularities lend themselves to defrauding the Revenue and to causing delay and inconvenience to all concerned: Now, therefore, I wish to notify to all persons authorised to witness signatures to instruments under the said Act, and more particularly to such persons as are Justices of the Peace and by reason of their office deserving of more credit, that before signing their names as witnesses they should fully satisfy themselves that all documents so witnessed by them are complete in all details required by the said Act, and I have further to notify that in the event of any documents purporting to have been executed by any parties and to have been witnessed by any such person being proved to my satisfaction not to have been executed at the time or for the consideration appearing thereon and therein, then, without prejudice to any penalty provided in the said Act, stringent measures will be taken by removal of the names of such parties from the list of those authorised to witness such signatures to prevent any further occurrence of any such proceeding.
