HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to repeal Regulation No. 8 of the Regulations under "The Fisheries Act, 1905," published in the *Government Gazette* on the 12th day of January, 1906, and to make the following Regulation in lieu thereof:—

Landing-place for Fish.

South jetty, situated in the South Bay, Fremantle, is hereby appointed the place for the landing of fish, and except as hereinafter provided, the landing of fish at any other place within 15 miles of the South jetty as aforesaid is prohibited.

Provided that fish lawfully caught in the Swan and Canning Rivers may be landed at William Street jetty, in the City of Perth, but not elsewhere, and William Street jetty is hereby appointed the place for landing such fish accordingly.

Any person committing a breach of these Regulations shall be liable to the forfeiture of their fish, and to a penalty not exceeding £50.

FREMANTLE MUNICIPALITY.

By-Law No. 76.
Hawking of Fish.

A By-law of the Municipality of Fremantle made under Section 179 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," numbered 76, for regulating the Hawking of Fish within the boundaries of the Fremantle Municipality, and prohibiting such hawking in any of the streets, ways, and public places hereinafter prescribed: And for prohibiting the wholesale Sale of Fish except in markets established within the Municipal District.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Fremantle order as follows:—

1. In the construction of this By-law the word "fish" shall include any fish, whether fresh, salt, smoked, or dried, oysters, crayfish, crabs, prawns, and shrimps.

2. No person shall hawk fish in a wheeled vehicle within that portion of the Municipal District hereinafter prescribed, namely:—

High Street, from Cliff Street to Queen Street.
Market Street, from Short Street to South Terrace.

South Terrace, from Market Street to Norfolk Street.

3. The wholesale sale of fish is hereby prohibited within the Municipal District of Fremantle, except in the Fremantle Fish Market established within the Municipal District, and no person shall sell wholesale, or offer or expose for wholesale, any fish within the Municipal District except within such fish market.

For the purpose of this By-law, the sea-shore, the sea, and the Swan River abutting on the boundary of the Fremantle Municipal District shall be deemed within the said Municipal District.

4. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty Pounds.

FREMANTLE MUNICIPALITY.

By-Law No. 77.
Licenses for Hawking Fish.

A By-law of the Municipality of Fremantle made under Section 181 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 77, requiring Licenses to be obtained by persons for the purpose of Hawking Fish within the Municipal District of Fremantle; and fixing the several fees payable for and the duration of such licenses; and prohibiting the Hawking by any unlicensed person of any Fish within the boundaries of the Fremantle Municipal District.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Fremantle order as follows:—

1. (a.) In the construction of this By-law, the word "fish" shall include any fish, whether fresh, salt, smoked, or dried, oysters, crayfish, crabs, prawns and shrimps.

(b.) "Council" shall mean the Fremantle Municipal Council.

2. The scale of fees fixed by the Council on the 27th day of June, 1904, to be paid for licenses for hawking within the Municipal District of Fremantle shall not apply to the hawking of fish.

3. There shall be levied and charged for each license to hawk fish in a wheeled vehicle in any part of the Municipal District of Fremantle, exclusive of the streets, ways, and public places prescribed in clause (2) of By-law No. 76, the fees specified in part one of the schedule hereto.

4. There shall be levied and charged for a license to hawk fish by basket, box, or tray, in any part of the Municipal District, the fees specified in part two of the schedule hereto.

5. Subject to the proviso to Section 181 (h) of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," no person shall hawk fish in any part of the Municipal District of Fremantle unless he is the holder of a then current license issued by the Council, or except by the mode and within the area prescribed by such license.

6. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty Pounds.

FREMANTLE MUNICIPALITY.

By-law No. 78.
Fish Market.

A By-law of the Municipality of Fremantle, made under Parts VII. and XXI. of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 78, for regulating the wholesale Sale of Fish within the Municipal District of Fremantle.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Fremantle order as follows:—

1. In the construction of this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires:—

(a.) The word "Market," whenever occurring, shall mean the Fremantle Fish Market provided for the wholesale sale of fish, erected on and being upon the South Jetty, Fremantle.

(b.) The words "Market Inspector," whenever occurring, shall mean any person appointed by the Council as an inspector in regard to the market, and any acting or assistant inspector.

(c.) The word "fish" shall include fish, whether fresh, salt, smoked, or dried, oysters, crayfish, crabs, prawns, and shrimps.

2. No person shall sell fish wholesale, within the said Municipality, excepting in the market.

3. No person shall place fish upon the floor of the market.

4. No person shall bring or cause to be brought into the market any fish otherwise than through such entrance or entrances thereto as may be authorised by the markets inspector, from time to time, by notice in writing to be posted up in the market.

5. No person shall place or expose for sale any fish in the market, except upon the tables and trolleys provided for the reception thereof.

6. No person shall act as auctioneer or agent for the sale of fish in the market, excepting the auctioneer or agent appointed from time to time by the Council for that purpose.

7. No person shall occupy any standing place or use any table, trolley, or trough without the approval of the market inspector, and then only after payment of the fees therefor respectively specified in the first part of the Schedule hereto.

8. No person shall use or occupy any portion of the market for the purpose of sleeping therein:

9. No person shall enter the market whilst drunk, or gamble, smoke, or excite any riot or fight, or curse, swear, or use any gross, insulting, indecent, obscene, filthy, or abusive language therein, or expectorate, or put or bring any dirt or offensive matter upon the floor, slabs, furniture, or appliances, or be guilty of any indecent or improper conduct therein.

10. No person shall place any nail, hook, or peg in any part of the market unless authorised so to do by the market inspector.

11. Every person occupying any stall, standing place, table, or trough in the market shall, to the satisfaction of the inspector, thoroughly cleanse the same on each day before the reception, deposit, or exposure for sale of fish thereon or therein, and shall also thoroughly cleanse the same immediately after the removal of the fish therefrom.

12. Every tenant or occupier of any stall, standing place, table, or trough in the market shall cause every avenue or passage in connection with such stall, standing place, table, or trough, whether used by him alone or in conjunction with any other person, to be properly swept and cleansed once at least during each day appointed for the holding of the market.

13. No person shall permit or suffer any garbage, papers, rubbish, or refuse of any kind to be scattered, emptied, swept, or thrown or deposited into or upon any part of the market. All garbage, papers, rubbish, and refuse must be placed in the refuse bins supplied for that purpose.

14. No person shall bring into or use in the market any stand, table, or any other such contrivance or thing without the sanction of the market inspector.

15. No person shall in the market use baskets or cases for the handling of fish except the same be of a holding capacity of one bushel (equal in weight to 80lbs.) or half-a-bushel (equal in weight to 40lbs.).

16. No person shall place or cause to be placed any fish in any part or parts of the market other than such as shall have been appropriated for the reception, deposit, or exposure for sale of the same.

17. If any person persists in occupying any standing place, table, or trough contrary to the foregoing provisions after having been requested by the inspector to quit the same, he may be summarily ejected therefrom, and his goods removed.

18. All persons purchasing fish in the market shall remove the same from the tables or trolleys from which it may have been sold immediately after the sale thereof.

19. There shall be levied and charged by the Council, for the use of troughs, tables, or trolleys in the market, the fees specified in the first part of the Schedule hereto.

20. There shall be levied and charged by the Council, in respect of fish brought into the market, the tolls or fees specified in the second part of the Schedule hereto.

21. Throughout the Schedule to this By-law, whenever the term "½-bushel basket, equal to 40lbs. in weight," occurs, or the term "bushel basket, equal to 80lbs. in weight" occurs, the said terms or either of them shall be read and construed to include any lesser part or weight thereof respectively.

Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Mullet (large).—4d. per dozen.

Garfish.—1s. 3d. per ½-bushel basket (equal to 40 lbs. in weight); or 2s. 3d. per bushel basket (equal to 80lbs. in weight).

Sea-Pike.—1s. 3d. per ½-bushel basket (equal to 40 lbs. in weight); or 2s. 3d. per bushel basket (equal to 80lbs. in weight).

Gar-Pike (or "Long Toms").—1s. 3d. per ½-bushel basket (equal to 40lbs. in weight); or 2s. 3d. per bushel basket (equal to 80lbs. in weight).

Groper.—1s. per half-bushel basket of 40lbs. weight (or the equivalent in weight); or 2s. per bushel basket of 80lbs. (or the equivalent in weight).

Mixed Fish.—1s. per ½-bushel basket (equal to 40 lbs. in weight); or 2s. per bushel basket (equal to 80 lbs. in weight).

For Second-class Fish.

Mullet (small), Taylor, Bream (silver), Pilehard, Salmon-Trout, Flat-head, Rock-Cod.—9d. per ½-bushel basket (equal to 40lbs. in weight); 1s. 3d. per bushel basket (equal to 80lbs. in weight).

For Third-class Fish.

Salmon (large), 3d. per dozen.

Barracoota, 3d. per dozen.

Sea-Herring, 6d. per ½-bushel basket (equal to 40 lbs. in weight); or 1s. per bushel basket (equal to 80 lbs. in weight).

King-Fish, 2d. for each 10lbs. of weight or part thereof.

Crabs, 1d. per dozen

FREMANTLE LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.
By-law No. 12.

Inspection of Fish.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in "The Health Act, 1898," and "The Health Act Amendment Act, 1902," the Municipal Council of Fremantle, acting in that behalf as the Local Board of Health thereof, doth hereby make the following By-law:—

1. In the construction of this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires,—

- (a.) The word "fish" shall include fish, whether fresh, salt, smoked, or dried, oysters, crayfish, crabs, prawns, and shrimps.
- (b.) The words "Market Inspector" shall mean the person appointed by the said Council as the inspector of the market establishment for the wholesale sale of fish in the Municipality of Fremantle, and any acting or assistant inspector.

2. The "Fremantle Fish Market" hereinafter described is hereby specified and appointed as the place at which all fish must be produced for inspection before being sold or offered for or exposed for sale within the district of the Fremantle Local Board of Health, viz:—

The Fremantle Fish Market, erected on and being upon the South Jetty, Fremantle.

3. No person shall sell or offer or expose for sale, within the District of the Fremantle Local Board of Health, any fish unless and until the same has been produced for inspection and passed by the Market Inspector at the place specified in the next preceding section of this By-law.

4. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

ADDITIONAL ROAD BOARD BY-LAWS.

Roads Act, 1902, and Amendments.

THE Peppermint Grove Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act and Amendments, doth hereby make the following By-laws in addition to those already published in the *Government Gazette* of 12th June, 1896, to extend over the whole of the District within the jurisdiction of the Board.

BY-LAW No. 40.

Roads, Reserves, etc.

a. No person shall cut down, pull up, injure, or destroy any tree, shrub, or plant growing on any road or on any public reserve, park, recreation ground, or common under the control or management of the Board.

b. No person shall throw, place, or leave on any road, public reserve, park, recreation ground, or common under the control or management of the Board, any paper, hand-bills, bottles, broken glass, scraps, litter, or rubbish of any kind.

c. No person shall paint, place, affix, or exhibit on any road, or on any tree, pole, post, or fence on any road, or on any public reserve, park, recreation ground, or common under the control or management of the Board, any advertisement or any hoarding, placard, plate, sign, or show-bill as an advertisement, in the nature of an advertisement.

d. No person shall discharge any firearm or any fireworks, or make any fire on any public reserve, park, recreation ground, or common, or public highway under the control or management of the Board.

e. No person shall camp, lodge, or tarry overnight in the open air in any park, public reserve, or public highway or road, or frequent the same for the purpose of camping, lodging, or tarrying overnight in the open air therein.

f. No person shall train or exercise any animal within any park or public reserve within the Road Board District.

g. No person shall erect any tent, pavilion, shed, house, building, or other structure on any park, recreation ground, or reserve within the limits of the District, without the written consent of the Board thereto.

BY-LAW No. 41.

Regulations for use of and Traffic on Roads and Footpaths.

a. No person shall suffer any animal belonging to him or under his control to stray on any road.

b. No person shall ride or drive, or permit or suffer to be ridden or driven, any animal suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, on any road.

c. Any animal being on any such road, suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, may be forthwith seized and destroyed by any officer of the Board or any person deputed thereto by him.

d. No person shall break in any animal in any road either by leading, riding, or driving the same.

e. No person shall allow any vehicle to remain in such a position as to obstruct any road, or any portion thereof, for a longer period than shall be necessary for loading or unloading such vehicle.

f. No person shall ride or drive any animal furiously or carelessly in any road.

g. No person shall ride, drive, or lead any animal, nor suffer any animal to be or remain on any footpath, except for the purpose of entering or leaving private property from or to a road by a recognised crossing, and then only as long as may be reasonably necessary for that purpose.

h. Every bicycle, tricycle, and motor car, and motor cycle shall, in passing any vehicle, keep on the left hand side of the road.

i. Every vehicle shall, while in use between sunset and sunrise, carry a bright light firmly fixed to a conspicuous part thereof on the right hand side.

j. Every owner of a bicycle, tricycle, motor car, motor wagon, and motor cycle shall, on the first day of January in every year, take out a license with the Board in respect of such bicycle, tricycle, motor car, motor wagon, or motor cycle, and shall pay a fee of 5s. on taking out any such license, and no person shall use any bicycle, tricycle, motor car, or motor cycle unless licensed under these By-laws.

k. Every owner or person in charge of a licensed vehicle plying for hire and of all bicycles, tricycles, motor cars, motor cycles, and motor wagons, shall affix and keep affixed thereto a regulation disc of a size, make, and pattern required by the Board inscribed with the name of the District and the registration number.

l. No person shall drive or ride any motor car, motor cycle, motor wagon, or bicycle across the intersection of any two roads nor round any corner of a road in the district, at a faster rate of speed than four miles an hour, nor in any part of the district of the Local Board at a greater rate of speed than ten miles per hour.

m. No person shall place or suffer to be placed, or allow to remain on a road, any goods, cases, or boxes, straw, paper, or litter, dead fish, or meat skins, or refuse of any description.

n. No person shall, either alone or with another or others, behave, act, or stand on any street or footpath so as to obstruct the free passage and traffic along, through, or upon the same.

o. No person shall drive, ride, or trundle or wheel any vehicle upon any footpath, except for the purpose of entering any private property by any recognised crossing-place.

p. No person shall pack or unpack, or cause to be packed or unpacked, any goods, wares, or merchandise or any articles or effects on any part of any road or footpath.

q. No person shall leave any perambulator unattended on any footpath.

r. No crossing over a footpath shall be constructed less than 8 feet or more than 20 feet in width, and all such crossings shall be constructed, where the footpath is gravelled or otherwise formed and timber kerbed, of capstone bottoming 8 inches in depth with a top layer of gravel 4 inches thick, well rolled and graded and completed to the satisfaction of the Board's Engineer or any other person appointed by the Board.

s. No person shall cross over any footpath in order to obtain access to any building in course of erection with any wagon, cart, or dray until he or she has deposited in the hands of the Secretary the fee of One pound, to be refunded when footpath is put in proper repair.

t. No owner or occupier of any house or premises shall permit or suffer any water to flow from such house or premises over any footpath.

u. No owner or occupier of any house or premises shall convey or discharge any water therefrom to a water channel without the permission and except under the direction of the Board's Inspector.

For the purposes of these By-laws the following words shall have the respective meanings given them in the following definitions:—

“ Animal ” shall include horse, cattle, camel, mule, ass, pig, and goat.

“ Vehicle ” shall include cart, carriage, motor car, or motor wagon, bicycle, hand-cart, perambulator, wheelbarrow.

“ Road ” shall mean a road as defined by “ The Roads Act, 1902. ”

“ Footpath ” shall mean and include any part of a street set apart for the sole use of foot passengers, whether the same shall be flagged, paved, asphalted, or made of or covered with gravel, shell, or other material, and kerbed or not.

Any person offending against any of the provisions of the above By-laws shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not less than 5s. and not exceeding £20.

"FRANCE" S.S.—STRANDING OF ON SOUTH BEACH, FREMANTLE.

The Under Secretary.

I beg to report, for the information of the Hon. the Minister, having held a preliminary inquiry into the circumstances attending the stranding of the s.s. "France" on the South Beach from Gage Roads, on the night of the 14th instant.

The "France" is a steel steamer, 257 gross tons and 134 net tons register, owned by Thomas Johnson, Merchant, of Sydney, at present residing at Noumea.

After examining the Master (Captain William Robino Pearsson), who holds a Board of Trade Foreign-Going Master's Certificate, No. 506, issued in South Australia, 14th November, 1897; Samuel T. Christie, Mate, holding a Foreign-Going Master's Certificate, No. 62288, issued in London, June 4th, 1881; and William Cooper, temporary engineer, holding a Board of Trade Foreign First-Class Engineer's Certificate, I have to report:—

The s.s. "France" completed loading a general cargo at Victoria Quay, the Inner Harbour, on Friday, the 12th inst., for North-West ports, en route to Noumea, and proceeded to Gage Roads to take in explosives; the weather then being fine, barometer steady, but weather looking unsettled. The following day, Saturday, the 13th inst., the weather was bad, wind Northerly, strong, and a heavy sea running, and the vessel was given the full benefit of the starboard cable, viz., 105 fathoms, and the port windlass was left open. The vessel rode safely to her moorings with a spring on the starboard cable till the next day (Sunday, the 14th inst.) at noon, when the starboard anchor began to drag. The port anchor was then out to 40 fathoms. As the vessel dragged, the port cable paid out till the full length, 105 fathoms, was reached. This was about 5.30 p.m. As the wind increased, it was decided to remove to a better anchorage, and orders were given to the engineer to get ready below. The cables were being hove in when the engineer reported that a stud and bolt in connection with the reversing gear had broken and rendered the engines useless. The cables were then paid out again to their full extent, and the spring replaced on the starboard cable. As the vessel continued to drag, a blue light was burnt and the pilot boat (steam life-boat) went off, and as the men were anxious to leave the ship—being afraid of the explosives—two men returned by her. The Master of the "France" states that when the pilot boat was leaving, he sang out to the pilot in charge to send a tug, but owing to the noise of the wind and sea this message was not heard. The tug "Uraidla" subsequently went out to Gage Roads, but as the vessel was then approaching shallow water, he did not deem it prudent to go near her. The "France" continued to drag both anchors till 10.30 p.m., when the starboard cable parted, and the vessel drove quickly, broadside on, to the beach, taking the ground at 1.10 a.m. on the 15th instant at South Bay.

On the evidence adduced, I find—

- (a.) That the "France," while anchored in Gage Road, on Sunday, the 15th June, 1908, commenced to drag, owing to the violence of the wind and sea.
- (b.) That in attempting to remove the vessel to a safer anchorage, the engines broke down and were thus rendered useless, in consequence of which the vessel drove on to the beach, where she still lies.
- (c.) That everything possible was done under the circumstances to save the vessel, inasmuch as the engineer made every endeavour to repair the damage to the broken machinery. The vessel's ground tackle was utilised to its fullest extent. That the Master of the Tug

was justified in taking the precaution he did, by not running the risk of stranding his vessel; and no blame can be attached to any person concerned. It might be contended that the Master should, immediately after the engines broke down, have signalled for a Tug; as against this, there was the probability of the anchors bringing the vessel up when she had dragged into smoother water, and further, that of the engineer being able to again get the engines into working order.

- (d.) That it is impossible to estimate the damage sustained by the vessel till her bottom is sighted.
