CITY OF PERTH.

By-law No. 30.

*Playing of Games.*

A By-law of the Municipality of the City of Perth made under Part VIII. of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 30, prescribing the Fees to be charged for playing any Game on any Park Lands or Public Reserves:—

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the City of Perth order as follows:—

1. In the construction of this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires:—

(a.) The word "match" shall mean and include any contest between opposing sides or teams in any game of athletics.

2. No match shall be played upon a public reserve, and no person shall play or take part in any such match, unless and until a permit authorising the same shall have been first obtained from the Town Clerk.

3. A permit authorising a match upon a public reserve may be obtained upon application to the Town Clerk, and upon payment of a fee of five shillings (5s.) per day.

4. Any person who shall play or take part in a match contrary to this by-law shall be liable, upon conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £20.

5. This by-law shall apply to the following Reserves, viz., Esplanade, Wellington Square, Forrest Park, and Loton Park.

So much of the Regulation made under "The Fisheries Act, 1905," and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 10th day of July, 1908, as prohibits the landing of fish at any place except at South Jetty in South Bay, Fremantle, within fifteen miles of South Jetty aforesaid, shall not apply to fish landed from fishing boats of or exceeding six feet draught.
