Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council gazetted from time to time, to make such Regulations

as he deems necessary for any part of the purposes mentioned in Section 24 of the said Act: And whereas it is deemed expedient to repeal the Regulations under "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," published in the *Government Gazette* on the 13th and 27th December, 1907, and 22nd May, 1908: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the aforesaid Regulations be repealed and the following Regulations be made in lieu thereof.

THE INSECT PESTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1898.

Regulations.

1. All potatoes imported into Western Australia from any country outside the Commonwealth of Australia shall be handed over by the Commonwealth Customs or Postal Authorities to the Department of Agriculture to be grown in quarantine by the Department for a period not exceeding twelve months:

Provided that parcels of over three hundredweight may, with the consent of the Minister, be planted on the importer's own land when such land has been gazetted as a quarantine area.

2. All potatoes planted on the importer's own land as aforesaid, and the resultant crop thereof, shall be deemed to remain in the possession of the said Department, and shall not be removed from the quarantine area without the permission in writing of an Inspector under the Act.

3. All potatoes imported into Western Australia from any other State of the Commonwealth shall be subject to inspection and disinfection at the port of entry by an Inspector under the Act.

4. The importer or his agent shall within twenty-four hours after the arrival of the potatoes assist the Inspector in such inspection and disinfection, and for such purpose shall, if required, open and empty the bags or packages, or remove the potatoes to any place or shed, and otherwise perform any labour connected with such inspection and disinfection.

Fractions of a stone, hundredweight, or bag, to be charged as a stone, hundredweight, or bag respectively.	

6. If an Inspector under the Act declares any imported potatoes or the resultant crops thereof to be diseased or infected with disease, he shall require the importer or owner to disinfect or destroy or otherwise dispose of such potatoes.

7. If the importer or owner fails or neglects to carry out the requirements of the Inspector as aforesaid, the Inspector may perform the work at the expense in all things of the importer or owner.

8. All bags or packages that have contained imported potatoes may be disinfected or destroyed or otherwise disposed of by an Inspector.
