LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH, DISTRICT OF NORTH PERTH.

WHEREAS by 'The Health Act, 1898,' and the Acts amending the same, the Local Board of Health has power to make By-laws: Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in the said Act and

the Acts amending the same, the Local Board of Health doth make the following By-law:

By-law No. 121.—Prohibiting the use of newspapers for crappers for meat, fish, etc.

No person shall use or cause to be used any coloured paper, or paper with any printed matter thereon for the purpose of wrapping up meat, fish, or other foodstuff, unless such foodstuff shall have first been wrapped in clean, white, unused paper.
