WHEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Magisterial Districts Act, 1886," the Governor is empowered to alter the boundaries of Magisterial Districts, either by separating part of a Magisterial District from and declaring that it shall no longer form part of a Magisterial District, or by adding to a Magisterial District other land, whether theretofore a Magisterial District other land, whether theretofore included or not, within the limits of a Magisterial District: And whereas by Proclamation dated the 13th day of November, 1900, the boundaries of the Murchison, North Coolgardie, and Yalgoo Magisterial Districts were duly declared: And whereas by Proclamation dated the 5th day of April, 1905, the boundaries of the Mount Margaret and East Murchison Magisterial Districts were duly declared: And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the said boundaries. Now deemed expedient to alter the said boundaries: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this Procla-mation declare the boundaries of the Murchison, North Coolgardie, Yalgoo, Mt. Margaret, and East Murchison Magisterial Districts shall be amended, and shall for the future be as follows:-

#### Murchison Magisterial District.

# Amended Boundaries.

Bounded by lines starting from the 199-mile post on the No. 1 rabbit-proof fence near Wyemandoo Hill; thence in a general North-Westerly direction along the North-Eastern boundary of Yalgoo Goldfield, and passing through the summit of Wyemandoo Hill and trig. station K40 to the summit of Coonamoudey Range, about 43 miles to a trig. station on the summit of Mt. Charles about 51 miles, passing near the 137-mile post on the Mullewa-Cue telegraph line to a trig. station on the summit of Mt. Luke, and about 39 miles to a trig. station on the summit of Mt. Murchison; thence at a bearing of 315deg. to the left bank of the

Murchison River; thence North-Easterly along the left bank of the river to its junction with a line between Mt. Hale and Mt. Gascoyne; thence South-Easterly to Mt. Hale; thence East-South-Easterly along the South boundary of the Peak Hill Goldfield, and passing through trig. station V35 on Murdaboo Hill and sing through trig station V35 on Murdaboo Hill and the 45-mile post on the Nannine-Peak Hill telegraph line to the 364-mile post on the rabbit-proof fence; thence South-Westerly along the rabbit-proof fence to the 333-mile post; thence South 441 chains; thence West 338½ chains to the 326-mile post; thence South-South-Westerly along the fence to the 302-mile post; thence South about 35 miles and West about 10 miles to the 265-mile post; thence again South-Westerly along the 265-mile post; thence again South-Westerly along the fence to the starting point.

Margaret goldfield about 2561/2 miles, and passing through a tree marked about 250½ miles, and passing through a tree marked B82, Brickey's Soak, to the 125th meridian of East longitude; thence South about 76½ miles; thence West along the North boundary of the North-East Coolgardie and Broad Arrow Goldfields about 228½ miles to survey mark R3, near Cane Grass Swamp; thence Westerly to survey mark NB1 at Wangine Souk and Wast about 50 miles to a point North of Soak, and West about 50 miles to a point North of survey mark H26 at Koorarawalyee Soak; thence West-North-Westerly about 96 miles along the Northern boundary of the Yilgarn Goldfield to the starting point.

#### Yalgoo Magisterial District. Amended Boundaries.



BY-LAWS OF THE TOODYAY ROAD BOARD. THE Toodyay Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act, doth hereby make and publish the following By-

Whereas by "The Roads Act, 1902," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned: It is hereby resolved by the Board of the Toodyay District, by and with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the following By-laws shall be in force within the said District from the date of the publication thereof in the Government Gazette.

#### 1.-Interpretation.

In these By-laws the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meanings set against them respectively, that is to say:—

- "The Act."—The Roads Act, of 1902, and all amendments thereto.
- "District."-The Toodyay Road Board District.
- " Board."-The Toodyay Road Board.
- "Chairman."—The member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board.
- " Member." -A member of the Board.
- "Secretary."-The Secretary of the Board.
- "Road or Reserve."—Any road or reserve, as the case may be, under the control of the Board.
- "Street" shall mean and include every public street, square, thoroughfare, or other place within the district under the control of the Board which the public is permitted to use.
- "Footpath or Footway" shall include any part of a street set apart for the sole use of footpassengers, and whether the same be made or kerbed, or otherwise.
- "Owner."—Any person in lawful possession or receipt either of the whole or of any part of the rents or profits of any house, building, land, or tenement.
- "Occupier."—Any person who shall have occupied any rateable property within the district during the period specified in the Act.
- "Cycle. "-A bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede, including motor cycle.
- "Cyclist."—A person riding or impelling, or otherwise using or having the management or control of any cycle.
- "Person" shall include the plural and also a body incorporate.
- " Masculine " shall include the feminine.
- "Permission of the Board."—The consent of the Board given in writing.
- "Vehicle." —Any eart, dray, lorry, carriage, van, omnibus, trap, sulky, motor, or other conveyance (not being a hand-eart) with or without springs.

#### 2.—Appointments.

No permanent appointment shall be made to an office under the Board until an advertisement has been published in one or more local newspapers calling for applications from persons competent to fill such appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution-passed by the Board.

#### 3.—Duties of the Secretary.

It shall be the duty of the Secretary-

- To attend all Board meetings.
- To attend Committees when considered necessary.
- To take notes of all minutes and prepare reports of Committees.

- To conduct all correspondence and to give the other officers instructions as directed by the minutes.
- To answer all questions on the Board's business.
- To supervise the preparation of the rate-books and Board's electoral lists, examine proofs of latter and arrange for distribution of copies prior to elections; also to attend all courts of revision or appeal, making the necessary arrangements for the elections and preparing papers, etc., for the clerks.
- To summon the members to Board and Committee meetings.

He shall cheek all accounts sent into the Board and see that all accounts for works (exceeding Five pounds in amount) have stated on them the authority under which such works have been done, and shall cheek all returns made by the collectors or other of the Board's officers, and shall see that, with all returns made, the heels of the receipt book accompany the returns; he shall supervise and attend to the due payment of all money coming through the hands of the Board's officers and payable to the credit of the Board; he shall report to the Board at the next meeting any officer neglecting to make his returns, as provided, with the necessary vouchers attached thereto.

He shall pay into the bank, within seven days after receipt, to the credit of the Board, any sum or sums of money that may be received by him on behalf of the Board.

He shall have the eash-book and bank pass-book made up in readiness for the meetings of the Board, and shall produce them at each meeting thereof; should any member of the Board desire to see them at any time during office hours, the Secretary shall produce them for his inspection. No money shall be paid into the bank to the credit of the Board by any officer of the Board except by or through the Secretary. The Secretary shall give all receipts on printed forms. The Secretary shall readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and shall attend to all other matters affecting the finances of the Board and not herein specified.

At each ordinary meeting of the Board an approximate balance-sheet shall be produced showing the financial position of the Board as regards receipts and expenditure incurred, also its present assets and liabilities, which latter shall specify and include moneys voted for special purposes which have not yet been undertaken or contracted for, and no further expenditure of any nature shall be incurred unless this balance-sheet shall be then produced.

#### 4.—Duties of Collector.

It shall be the duty of the Collector-

To send out all rate notices.

- To collect all moneys due to the Board for rates and licenses.
- To report to the Board at every meeting the business he has transacted for the Board, the amount of money collected and paid over to the Secretary.

# MEETINGS AND PROCEEDINGS.

## 5.—Notice of Meetings.

Notice shall be given by the Chairman or Secretary of ordinary or special meetings at least seven days before such meeting and "notice in writing" of every meeting adjourned for a term exceeding two days. The Chairman, if present, shall preside at all meetings of (a) ratepayers and of (b) the Board, and in his absence, or if after being present he shall retire, one of the members of the Board chosen by (a) the ratepayers or (b) members of the Board present shall preside.

### 6.—Meetings.

Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds, ordinary and special. It shall rest with the Chairman and any three members to exclude the public when in their opinion it is expedient to do so.

A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time and in the manner prescribed by the 81st Section of the Act, but the Chairman may call a meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper. No business shall be transacted at an ordinary or special meeting unless at least three of the members of the Board, inclusive of the Chairman or member of the Board chosen to preside in

his absence, shall be present, and no business shall be transacted other than that for which the special meeting was called.

At all meetings of the Board when there is not a quorum present or when the Board is counted out, which counting shall take place whenever there shall be less than a quorum present, such circumstances, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the minute book.

# 7.—Order of Business.

The ordinary business at all ordinary meetings shall be as follows, that is to say:

- (a.) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary and of special meetings, if any.

  (b.) Consideration of business arising out of
- minutes.
- (c.) Reading of correspondence (in and out), and taking such immediate action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto.
- (d.) Passing of accounts for payment.
- (e.) Presentation of petitions or memorials and Committee reports, and consideration thereof.
- (f.) Consideration of tenders and ratification of
- (g.) Ordinary business of the Board.

No discussion shall take place upon the minutes except as to their accuracy, or for the ratification of same, or alteration of any any clerical error.

Immediately after confirmation of the minutes the Chairman may make any communication to the Board which he may deem advisable, or bring under consideration any business he may think necessary, and it shall be competent for any member of the Board to ask a question or questions, but he shall confine himself to the question simply, and no debate shall ensue thereon at the time.

#### 8.--Voting.

Each member, including the Chairman, shall have one vote, and such Chairman shall in case of equality of votes have a casting in addition to his ordinary vote, and all questions at such meetings shall be decided by a majority of the votes of members present. All motions and amendments shall be decided by a show of hands, unless a division is demanded, before the next business is proceeded with.

## 9.—Minutes of Meeting.

In addition to the minute book prescribed to be kept by the 90th Section of the Act, a rough minute book shall be kept, in which all items of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be then and there noted by the Secretary, and subsequently entered by him in the manner prescribed by the Act in the minute book.

## 10.—Petitions.

Every petition or memorial shall be respectful and temperate in its language, and shall be presented to the Board by a member only; and any member presenting a petition or memorial to the Board shall affix his name to the beginning thereof with the number of signatures, and any member presenting a petition or memorial shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Board; the nature and prayer of every petition or memorial shall be stated to the Board by the member presenting the same.

# 11.—Tenders.

Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject matter of the tenders come on to be con-sidered at the meeting of the Board, or by a committee appointed for the purpose. Deposit—under £20, 10 per cent.; over £20, 5 per cent.

# 12.—Speaker must not digress.

Every member having audience shall address the Chairman and remain standing, and shall not digress from the subject of debate, nor speak for more than 10 minutes, unless by approval of the majority.

#### 13.-Motions and Amendments.

A motion once moved at a meeting cannot be withdrawn unless by consent of the Board.

One or more amendments may be proposed on a motion before the Board. When more than one amendment is moved, the question shall first be put on the last amendment, then on the next in succession, and then on the original motion, in the reverse order in which they

A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover nor put by the Chairman.

In submitting a motion or amendment the Chairman must put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.

When an amendment is carried, the motion as amended thereby becomes a substantive motion, upon which further amendment may be moved before it is finally

All notices of motion shall be in writing and shall be lodged with the Secretary 10 days before the regular meeting of the Board.

No motion shall be brought forward for discussion except given notice of or permission being granted by a majority of members and Chairman of Board present.

# 14.—Appointment of Committees.

The Board may at any meeting appoint three or four members as a committee to inquire into any matter, and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no committee shall incur any financial liability or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever without express and specific authority conferred by the Bylaws, or by a resolution of the Board.

The quorum of a committee shall comprise three mem-

#### 15.—Finance Accounts.

All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the Board by the chairman at the ordinary meetings, and after being certified as correct shall be so initialed by him and paid by cheque.

An account shall be opened with such bank as the Board may direct, and all money received from whatever source (with the exception of money granted by the Government) shall be paid into such bank to the credit of the Board, and no account shall be paid except by cheque signed by the Chairman and countersigned by another member of the Board and by the Secretary.

## 16.—Unauthorised Expenditure.

Every item of expenditure and every liability incurred by any committee or member of the Board, otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure.

# 17.—Offences, Omissions, or Neglects.

Any person guilty of any of the following offences, omissions, or neglects shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding £10:-

- (1.) Riding or driving horse, cattle, or other animals, or wheeling any barrow, driving any vehicle or cycle upon or along any footpath.
- (2.) Placing any timber, bricks, or any other building materials upon any footpath, channel, surface drain, or carriage road, without the permission of the Board having first been obtained.
- (3.) Burning any shavings or other materials or matter on any footpath, road, open or public place, or any private place, so as to be a nuisance or annoyance to the public.
- (4.) Leaving any inflammable materials or matter in any public shed or place or on any open space near any building, without having first obtained the permission of the Board.
- (5.) Allowing the drippings of the eaves of any house to fall upon any public footpath.
- (6.) Placing any advertisement board, placard, or other document, writing, painting on or otherwise defacing any house or building or any wall, fence, finger-post, lamp-post, or gate, without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof, or if on property under control of the Board without first obtaining the permission of the Board.

- (7.) Opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footpath or carriage road, without first obtaining the permission of the Board.
- (8.) Neglecting to clean all private yards, ways, passages, or avenues, by which neglect a nuisance, by offensive smell or otherwise, is caused.
- (J.) Rolling any cask, beating any carpet, breaking in any horse, flying any kite, using any bows and arrows, football, catapult, air-gun, or firearm, or playing at any game to the annoyance or danger of any person in any public place; or obstructing any footpath or carriage road, whether by allowing any cart or animal to remain across such footpath or carriage road, or by placing goods thereon or otherwise.
- (10.) Throwing or discharging any stone or other missile to the damage or danger of any person or property.
- (11.) Having any awning, verandah, or blinds on any footpath in any public street or thoroughfare not being of the full width of 10ft., and Sft. clear above the footpath, or hanging any goods on or under such awning, verandah, or blinds over the footpath; or erecting any signboard, sign awning, blind, overhanging lamp, or other thing over or near any footpath or road, without first obtaining permission of the Board.
- (12.) Blasting any rock, stone, or timber, in or near any public place, without permission of the Board, and not attending to any directions in regard thereto given by such Board.
- in regard thereto given by such Board.

  (13.) Furiously or negligently riding or driving through any public place.
- (14.) Making a cellar door or other opening from the footpath of any street or public thoroughfare without the consent of the Board.
- (15.) Any carter plying for hire without a license.

#### 18.—Cattle to keep off Roads.

The owner of any cattle, sheep, horse, pig, or other animal straying on any road within the district shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2. The owner of any bull or stallion straying on any road within the district shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

# 19.—Heavy Traffic.

The owner of every engine which, together with its load, shall weigh more than five tons, shall travel the roads, bridges, and culverts at his own risk, and shall be liable to pay for any damage done.

The Board may, by notice affixed to any bridge or culvert, declare the maximum weight of any engine, agricultural or other machine or vehicle of any kind, and of any load or material which shall be permitted to cross such bridge or culvert, and also the pace or speed at which such engine, machine, or vehicle, or load shall be curiven, led, or taken over any such bridge or culvert, and any person who shall cross such bridge or culvert, and any person who shall cross such bridge or culvert in contravention of this By-law shall, in addition to any liability for damage he may have caused, be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £10.

# 20.—Regulation of Traffic (General).

Every person having the care or conduct of any vehicle shall keep the same on the left or near side of the road, except in case of actual necessity or other reason for deviation, and shall not interrupt or interfere with any person or vehicle passing or attempting to pass his vehicle.

No person shall ride or drive any horse or other animal along any road or street at a speed exceeding eight miles per hour.

The driver of every vehicle or the rider of every horse or other animal turning for the purpose of proceeding in the opposite direction, or turning the corner of any road in the district, shall bring the horse or other animal to a walking pace before commencing to turn.

No person having the care or control of a horse or other animal, or of any vehicle, shall allow the same to remain in any road of the district, or to obstruct any portion of such road for a longer period than necessary for loading and unloading the vehicle; provided that where suitable bridle-posts are provided, the horses may

be securely fastened thereto for any period not exceeding 60 minutes, but immediately upon the request of any officer or member of the Board, or police constable, such shall be removed.

Any person leading an entire or stallion shall, on passing any vehicle or equestrian, keep on the side of the road, and the attendant must be on the near side of the stallion.

#### 21.-Water Supply.

Any person who shall injure or damage any well, bore, pipe, tank, or place for storage of water under the control of the Board, or any machinery, appliances, or property used in connection therewith, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and notwithstanding any civil remedy for damages so caused, shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £5.

Any person who shall waste or allow to escape, foul, or pollute any water contained in any bore, pipe, tank, or place of storage, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$20, in addition to any other sum which he may be legally required to pay for damages.

# 22.—To prevent Accidents from Riding, etc., on Bicycles.

- (a.) No person shall, between sunset and sunrise, ride a cycle or motor within the district unless there is attached thereto a lamp or lamps which shall exhibit a white light in the direction in which he is proceeding, at all times to be kept lighted.
- (b.) Every cycle or motor shall carry a bell, or other instrument suitable for giving warning of approach, which shall be used as a signal whenever any person on foot or on horseback or vehicle is being approached or passed.
- (c.) No person shall leave any cycle or motor in or on any road or footway so as to become an obstruction, and every person shall remove his cycle or motor immediately upon being requested to do so by any constable or officer or member of the Board.
- (d.) No person shall pass, at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour, any person who shall be riding or driving any horse or other animal.
- (e.) When a cyclist or motorist shall meet any horse or animal, and such horse or animal shall become restive or appear likely to get beyond control of the person in charge thereof, such cyclist or motorist shall stop his cycle or motor, and shall not proceed until such horse or animal has passed.
- (f.) No person shall ride any cycle or motor round the corner formed by the junction of any roads in the district or across the intersection of any of the said roads at a pace exceeding six miles an hour.

# 23.—To prevent Obstructions on the Footpaths of the Streets.

No person without having first obtained the permission of the Board shall permit any boxes, cases, coal, sand, firewood, goods, ware, merchandise, or other articles or effects to remain on any part of any street, footpath, or jetty (under the control of the Board) within the district after sunset, nor in any case for a longer period than shall be necessary for housing or removing same.

No person shall place, lay, deposit, shoot, or discharge any rubbish or materials whatsoever on the surface of any street, road, footpath, jetty, or public reserve within the district, without having first obtained the permission of the Board.

Every person shall after having received from the Board, as in the last preceding section provided, a permit to deposit rubbish or materials on the surface of any street, road, footpath, jetty, or public reserve, have and keep sufficient and continuous light burning thereon from sunset until the following suurise, during the time such rubbish or materials shall remain and continue so deposited.

#### 24.—To prevent Damages to Footpaths and other Board Property.

No person, without first obtaining the permission of the Board, shall break up, cut down, damage, destroy, or injure any footpath, drain, gutter, culvert, bridge, road, public way, kerbing, gate, fence, post, lantern, lamp-post, implement, materials, buildings, or other properties of the said Board, or under the control thereof.

#### 25.—Preservation of Trees, etc.

Any person who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove from its place any tree, shrub, or plants standing in any of the streets, enclosures, or public places of, belonging to, or under the care and superintendence of the Board, or wno shall carelessly or wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove out of its place, or ride or drive against any finger-posts, tree-guards, fences, or other protection to any such trees, shrub, or plants as aforesaid, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

#### 26.—Throwing Dangerous Substances on Footpaths.

Any person who shall throw vegetable substances, or any offensive, noxious, or dangerous substances upon any footpath within the district, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £1 for every such offence. Any person or persons so placing, or causing to be placed, or broken in or upon any road, pathway, reserve, or park lands under the control or supervision of the Board, any glass, metal, or earthenware bottles or utensils, without having first obtained the permission of the said Board to do so, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2, in addition to amount of damages caused thereby, and for the cost and charges incidental to the removal of such glass, metal, or earthenware.

# 27.—To prevent Rubbish being deposited on the Roads or Reserves.

No person shall deposit any bottle broken glass, crockery, empty tins, rubbish, or offensive matter, solid or liquid, on the roads or reserves within the boundaries of the district.

#### 28.-Park Lands, Reserves, and Recreation Grounds.

All park lands and recreation grounds shall be open to the public daily for recreation purposes, excepting as otherwise provided for in the By-laws. The Board shall have the power to grant exclusive right to use and occupy any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves placed under its control within the district, for holding public sports or amusements, to any responsible person or persons; and any person or persons obtaining such right shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences, buildings, and trees, or other improvements upon or enclosing such park lands, recreation grounds, and reserves, and shall pay to the Board a fee to be fixed for admission on such occasions.

No horses, cattle, or vehicles shall be allowed on any park land or recreation ground without the permission of the Board.

All persons using or being upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves, shall at all times conduct themselves in a becoming manner, and any person creating any disturbance or annoyance to the public shall be liable to be expelled from such lands by any police constable or officer of the Board.

The Board may, in its discretion, prohibit any games or gymnastics from being played or carried on by any person or persons upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves on any Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday.

No person shall sell or expose for sale any goods, wares, fruits, or merchandise in any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserve without first having obtained the permission of the Board, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

No person shall damage or injure any tree, shrub, or plant in any street, road, or park lands, recreation grounds or reserves. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence.

# 29.—Quarries and Timber.

Any person who shall quarry or remove stone or other materials on the lands belonging to or in charge of or under the control of the Board, without a license therefor, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

Any person who shall cut or remove any timber or bush on the lands belonging to, or in charge of, or under the control of the Board, without a license therefor shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

#### 30.—Damaging Kerbing.

The owner of any vehicle who shall (whether personally or by an agent) negligently or wilfully damage the kerbing of any road or footpath shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

#### 31.—Construction of Footpaths, Crossing-places.

It shall be lawful for the owner of any land fronting or adjoining any street or public way or requiring access thereto with horses and vehicles from such street to such land across any existing made footpath, kerbing, channel, or gutter, having first obtained the permission of the Board, to construct a crossing of such dimensions and materials, and in such form and manner as the regulations of the Board for the time being require, or as may be directed by the Secretary in writing, and shall thereafter keep and maintain the same in good and safe repair. Any person not complying with the provisions of this By-law shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £5.

Every person who wilfully, and without lawful excuse, shall ride or drive, or wheel any carriage, cart, or other vehicle, or shall ride any bicycle, velocipede, tricycle, or motor upon, along, or across any footway, kerbing, or water channel, or gutter by the side of any street, road, or public way, save in each such case upon or by or at some properly constructed crossing, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a sum not exceeding £5, and shall also pay to the Board such sum, not exceeding £10, by way of compensation for any damage done to the footway, kerbing, or channel, as the Justice adjudicating upon the formation shall on the hearing thereof order.

#### 32.—Lamp-posts, etc.

No person shall erect any lamp-post, bridle-post, telegraph, telephone, or electric lighting pole, or flagstaff in any street without the permission of the Board. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

#### 33.—Verandahs and Balconies.

Any verandah or balcony which obstructs the footpath or roadway, or is dangerous, and all other obstructions on the footpaths or roadways, or overlanging same, shall be removed when ordered, within such time as shall be notified by the Board, and all expenses incurred in removing same shall be borne by the owner or occupier of such verandah, balcony, or other obstruction, whether removed by the Board or otherwise; and any person whatsoever interfering or obstructing any officer or person employed by the Board in carrying out this By-law, on conviction, shall pay a sum not exceeding £20.

#### 34.—Encroachments or Obstructions to be removed.

On the order of the Board the Secretary, or other appointed officer, may direct the removal within 14 days of any building, fence, or other obstruction, or encroachment in or upon any street, lane, or public place under control of the Board.

In any case where, after service of notice for such removal, any such encroachment or obstruction has not been removed within the specified time, it shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Board to remove the same at the cost and charges of the person so offending and to proceed against the offender for the breach of this Bylaw, the penalty for which breach shall not be more than £20.

No person or persons shall construct any tramline, crossing, etc., across any road within the Board's district without first obtaining the permission of the Board.

No person or persons shall use any jinker whim on any road in the Board's district without permission of the Board. The Board may grant permission to an applicant applying to use a jinker whim on any road, the person applying to deposit bond, £5, and signing conditions that the Board may lay down for regulating the use of jinkers on roads.

#### 35.—Fires on Roads.

No person shall make or leave a fire by the road or track side without taking the proper precautions against such fire spreading, and any person offending against such By-law shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding £5.

- 36. No person shall set fire to standing trees on the road or track side, and any such offender shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding £5.
- 37. No person shall damage or destroy by means of horse team, waggon, dray, or other means, any road or portion of road under construction or repair. Any person found guilty of such damage or destruction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

38. Any person excavating or digging a pit on unfenced land abutting on to any road or street, the same being dangerous to the travelling public, shall, within seven days after receiving notice from the Road Board, fence such lands, or if he be absent from the State, the notice shall be posted on the land if the owner cannot be found. Board to have power to fence and charge owner with costs, or liable to a penalty of £20.

#### 39.—Licenses.

The owner of every licensed vehicle plying for hire or engaged in heavy or medium traffic, and of every licensed bicycle or motor, shall have license number affixed on some conspicuous part of such vehicle, cycle, or motor, and any owner who shall refuse or neglect to have such number so affixed shall be guilty of an offence against this Bylaw, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

#### 40.—Penalties.

Where any person or persons by the foregoing By-laws or any of them are required to do or perform any act or thing, and such act or thing remains undone, the Board may cause the same to be performed, and charge the cost and expenses against such person or persons, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.

- 41. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act or thing contrary to any of these By-laws shall, on conviction, for every offence, breach, or neglect, be liable to a penalty not exceeding (except when otherwise provided) the sum of £20.
- 42. Where any person by these By-laws or any of them is required to do or perform an act, and such act is not done, or remains unperformed, it shall be lawful for the Board to perform the same, and charge the costs and expenses against such persons, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.
- 43. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and be liable, when not otherwise provided for, to a fine or penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

# STALL LICENSES.

No person shall keep, manage, or conduct any movable or temporarily fixed stall in any road for the sale of any meat, fruit, vegetables, drinks, eatables, or articles of merchandise, without first paying the sum of Twenty shillings, and obtaining a License in form of Schedule A.
