WHEREAS by Sections 222 and 227 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Coun-

CITY OF PERTH.

BY-LAW N. 31.

Hawkers and Stallkeepers.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of the City of Perth made under Part VIII. of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 31, for regulating hawking and movable or temporarily fixed stalls, and the issue of licenses therefor.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the City of Perth order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 6 and the amendment thereof gazetted on the 2nd day of January, 1906, and By-law No. 26, are hereby repealed.

2. In the construction of this By-law the word "fish" shall include fish, whether fresh, salt, smoked or dried, oysters, crayfish, crabs, prawns, and shrimps.

3. For the purpose of regulating the issue of licenses to hawkers under this By-law, the Municipality shall be divided into two Zones, to be known as No. 1 Zone and No. 2 Zone.

No. 1 Zone shall comprise all that portion of the Municipality bounded on the North by the North side of Wellington Street, on the East by the East side of Pier Street, on the South by the South side of St. George's Terrace, and on the West by the West side of King Street.

No. 2 Zone shall comprise the whole of the Municipality not included in No. 1 Zone.

4. For the purpose of regulating the issue of stallkeepers' licenses under this By-law, the Municipality shall be divided into three Zones, to be known as Zone A, Zone B, and Zone C.

Zone A shall comprise all that portion of the Municipality bounded on the North by Wellington Street, from the intersection of King Street to the intersection of Pier Street; on the East by Pier Street as far as St. George's Terrace, and thence on to the South by a straight line to the Swan River; on the South by the Swan River, and on the West by King Street from the intersection of Wellington Street to St. George's Terrace, and thence on to the South by a straight line to the Swan River.

Zone B shall comprise all that portion of the Municipality bounded by a line drawn from the junction of William Street and the Swan River, thence along the river bank to Spring Street, thence along Spring Street to the junction of Mount Street, thence along Mount Street to the junction of Milligan Street, thence along Milligan Street and Melbourne Road to Russell Square, thence along Palmerston Street, to Newcastle Street, thence along Newcastle Street to Lord Street, thence along Lord Street to the Swan River, and thence to the corner of Pier Street; excepting thereout the area within Zone A.

Zone C shall comprise the whole of the Municipality not included in Zones A and B.

5. Every person who shall be desirous of obtaining a hawker's or a stallkeeper's license shall apply to the Town Clerk therefor, stating for which Zone he desires to be licensed. Such license shall be in such one of the forms set out in Schedule A hereto as shall be applicable.

6. Subject, so far as regards the hawking of fish, to the proviso to Section 131 (1 h) of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," no person shall hawk any fruit, meat, poultry, game, fish, vegetables, or other articles of merchandise, or keep or conduct any movable

or temporarily fixed stall, in or near any street or way for the sale of any meat, fruit, vegetables, drink, eatables, or other articles of merchandise within any Zone in the Municipality, unless and until he shall have applied for and obtained a license for such Zone from the Council.

7. Every licensed hawker and stallkeeper shall, whilst hawking or occupying his stall, have his name, the number of his license, and the words "Licensed Hawker" or "Licensed Stallkeeper," as the case may be, legibly painted on some conspicuous part of his cart, barrow, basket, vehicle, bundle, bag, package, tray, or stall.

8. Every hawker shall, whilst hawking, and every stallkeeper shall, whilst using or occupying his stall, carry his license with him, and shall at all times produce the same, on demand, to any officer of the Council or police officer.

9. No person licensed to hawk in No. 1 Zone shall take up a position in any street or public place or shall hawk or cry his wares within the said Zone, except on one of the following stands, viz:—

Hawkers' Stands.

- A stand on the Southern side of Murray Street, commencing at a point 99 feet East of the Eastern side of Barrack Street and extending Eastwards to the Western side of Pier Street.
- A stand on the Southern side of Wellington Street, commencing at a point 45 feet West of the Western side of William Street and extending Westwards to Queen Street.
- A stand on the Western side of William Street, commencing at the Southern side of Hay Street and extending Southwards 33 feet.
- A stand on the Western side of William Street, commencing at a point 68 feet South of the Southern side of Hay Street and extending Southwards to St. George's Terrace.

10. No person licensed to hawk in No. 2 Zone shall take up a position in any street or public place in such Zone for the purpose of soliciting custom or shall remain stationary at any one spot in any street or public place for a longer period than shall be necessary for the purpose of serving a customer then offering to buy.

11. Should the Traffic Inspector at any time be of opinion that it is necessary to move any licensed hawker from any appointed stand or place, it shall be lawful for him to direct the said licensed hawker to move to any place he shall deem fit, and any hawker who shall refuse to obey such directions shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

12. Every licensed hawker standing on any appointed stand shall at all times act under the directions of the Traffic Inspector, and any hawker who shall refuse to obey any such directions shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

13. The several fees specified in Schedule B hereto shall be the fees to be levied and charged in respect of licenses issued in pursuance of Section 5 of this By-law.

14. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

MUNICIPALITY OF YORK.

BY-LAW No. 54.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of York made under Part VIII. of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 54, for the Licensing of Stock Sale Yards.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of York order as follows:—

1. No person shall keep or maintain any premises as a Stock Sale Yard, unless and until a license shall have been first applied for and obtained from the Town Clerk in respect of such premises, and except during the currency of such license. The fee for every such license shall be £20.

2. Every such license shall expire on the 31st day of October next after the same shall be granted.

3. Before any such license is granted, the applicant therefor shall make application for the same on a form to be approved of by the Town Clerk, and shall pay the license fee hereinbefore provided.

4. The Town Clerk shall, upon any such application as aforesaid being made, cause an inspection to be made of the premises to which the same shall relate, and shall not grant the license unless such premises shall be found to be suitable for the purpose for which the same are intended to be used.

5. Notwithstanding any of the foregoing clauses, the granting of every or any license shall be at the option of the Council.

6. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

1. No person shall place on, drive into, or upon any Reserve any horses or cattle for the purpose of depasturing, unless and until a license shall have been first applied for and obtained from the Town Clerk, in respect of such horses and cattle, and except during the currency of such license.

2. The fee for every such license shall be Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per month for each horse and head of cattle.

3. Every such license shall expire on the last day of the month in which it has been issued.

4. Every licensed horse or head of cattle shall have hung from its neck, by a leather strap or chain, a numbered disc, representing the month of the year, whilst depasturing on any Reserve; the disc to be supplied by the Council.

5. A deposit of One shilling (1s.) shall be lodged for every disc issued, the amount to be forfeited should the same be lost, or not returned during the first week of the month following, for which a license has been issued.

6. No license as aforesaid shall be issued to any person for any number of horses or cattle exceeding four (4), and then only to ratepayers in the Municipality of York.

7. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

No person shall leave unattended, or allow to stray in any street, any horse, ass, mule, ox, cow, goat, or camel, or any vehicle to which may be attached and harnessed any animal, for a longer period than necessary for loading or unloading the same; provided that where suitable bridle-posts are erected, the horse or other animal may be securely fastened thereto for any time not exceeding 60 minutes, but immediately upon the request of any officer of the Council or police constable, such horse or other animal shall be removed; failing the carrying out of such request the horse or other animal, together with the vehicle, may be seized and removed to the nearest police station, municipal yard, or pound; and the person so leaving such animal or vehicle shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £10, in addition to any pound fees which may have become due and payable by such impounding.

2. No person shall feed any horse or other animal in any street in the Municipality, except with a proper regulation nose-bag.

Rules 20 and 25 of the Fremantle Hospital, as amended by the Board of Management on the 28th August, 1908:—

20. *Out-door Relief.*—No person shall be eligible for treatment as an out-patient unless provided with a letter of recommendation; such recommendation forms may be obtained from members of the Board of Management, medical practitioners, ministers of religion, subscribers to the Hospital, and members of the State Parliament. Every subscriber shall be granted the privilege of one order of recommendation for every pound (£1) subscribed. Life contributors shall have the same privilege in proportion, their donations being estimated as annual contributions of one-tenth. It is to be distinctly understood that these recommendations are only to be given to persons on account of their poverty, and who are proper subjects for hospital treatment in the opinion of the House Surgeon.

25. The proper hours for patients to present their recommendations for treatment or admission to the hospital shall be 9 a.m., except in cases of emergency or accident and such like. Cases of emergency are treated at any time, but should further treatment be required a letter of recommendation as an out-patient must be obtained.

Prisoners at Fremantle shall be classified as follows, and as far as the construction of the Prison and the necessities of the works and trades will admit shall be kept apart:—

1st.—Prisoners under sentence of imprisonment with hard labour or penal servitude on first conviction.

2nd.—Prisoners under sentence of imprisonment with hard labour or penal servitude on a second or subsequent conviction.

3rd.—Prisoners under sentence of imprisonment only and who have not previously been convicted.

4th.—Prisoners under sentence of imprisonment only who have been previously convicted.

5th.—Prisoners awaiting trial or on remand who have not been previously convicted.

6th.—Prisoners awaiting trial or on remand who have been previously convicted.

7th.—Debtors and persons imprisoned for contempt of Court or for failing to give security for the peace or for good behaviour.

Youthful offenders up to 25 years of age shall, as far as practicable, be kept apart from the other prisoners and sub-divided according to their disposition, previous history, etc.

"Previously convicted" shall mean "previously convicted in this State or elsewhere."

SANDSTONE PUBLIC CEMETERY.

By-laws.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in them, the Board of Trustees of the Sandstone Public Cemetery make the following by-laws, that is to say:—

1. That all fees and charges payable to the trustees, in accordance with Schedule A, shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.

2. That any person desiring ground in the Cemetery for a private grave, tomb, vault, cenotaph, tombstone and railing, wall, or for any other purpose, shall apply to the trustees therefor. If approved, the trustees, on payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying, a certificate of right of burial in the form specified in Schedule B.

3. (a.) Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery shall, before obtaining permission to do so, submit a plan of such monument, tombstone, or enclosure, and specify the materials of which it is to be composed, to the trustees, and shall obtain such permission in writing before proceeding with the work, in the form of Schedule D.

(b.) Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work in the Cemetery, deposit with the secretary to the trustees the sum of 10s., which shall be forfeited if any of the provisions of either this or the preceding by-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the secretary.

4. Any person who shall erect or place any monument or tombstone or enclosure upon any grave, the exclusive right of which has not been obtained, shall keep the same in repair: and if after receiving one month's notice in writing from the trustees such repairs are not effected, then the trustees may order such monument, etc., to be removed.

5. (a.) That all applications for interment shall be made to the secretary of the trustees, and six working hours shall be given to the sexton prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge will be made.

(b.) The name, age, and other particulars of the deceased shall be furnished when giving the order, as in Schedule C.

6. The trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person desiring to construct a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same under the direction of the secretary on payment of the required fees; and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in and made and kept air-tight.

7. That every coffin shall have upon the lid a tin plate with the name of the deceased and date of burial thereon.

8. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, except those for the burial of infants, which the trustees may allow to be of a lesser depth; but no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a lesser depth than three feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground.

9. That in the case of application for interment in any private grave or vault to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given with the application, or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so.

10. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in the Cemetery without an order for burial being obtained from the secretary of the Cemetery in the form of Schedule C, and delivered to the sexton of the Cemetery.

(a.) Prior to conducting any interment in the Cemetery, or making use of the Cemetery for any purpose connected with interments, every undertaker shall pay

to the trustees an annual fee of £2 2s., and shall, at the time of making such payments, give his assent to such conditions as the trustees may deem fit to impose. Upon such assent being given, and payment of the fee made, he shall receive a "permit," to hold good until the 1st day of January following; and unless in the possession of such a "permit" no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the Cemetery.

11. The hours for burials shall be as follows:—On week days, throughout the year, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; on Sundays, throughout the year, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.

12. That no burial shall be allowed to take place before or after the hours abovementioned, except by special permission and upon payment of the fee for burials "not in the usual hours."

13. That the time stated in Schedule C for any burial shall be the time for the funeral to be at the Cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

14. That every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance, and thence follow the sexton to the grave. No bicycle, velocipede, carriage, or vehicle, except hearses and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to pass the said entrance. Horses shall not be driven faster than at a walking pace, and no horses or other animals shall be ridden through the Cemetery.

15. That every erection shall be placed on proper foundations, and, if required by the trustees, shall extend to the bottom of the grave. All refuse and rubbish and material remaining after any work is completed shall be removed from the Cemetery at once and at the expense of the person causing the same.

16. All materials required in the making, repairing, or completion of any work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the Cemetery.

17. That no catacomb shall be allowed.

18. That the trustees shall not (except in very exceptional circumstances) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for re-interment in this or any other Cemetery, and before any such exceptional case be dealt with by the trustees a written application setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal of such corpse, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased; and, in the event of such application being granted, the permission of the Colonial Secretary, in addition to the permission of the trustees, shall be obtained. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and air-tight wooden or leaden coffin prior to removal.

19. That any workman or other employee employed by the trustees or by any other person shall, at all times when in the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision, direction, and control of the secretary, and shall obey all such directions and shall be removable from the Cemetery upon any breach of the by-laws, or any refusal or neglect to comply with or obey any such directions.

20. Any person taking part in the dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules, namely:—

(a.) That no rubbish or any material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave or pathway, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately after completion of the work.

(b.) That no loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing graves.

(c.) That no grave be dressed in wet weather except by special permission of the secretary, nor shall any materials be wheeled or carted along any path or road while the surface is soft by rain or otherwise. Work in all cases must be carried on with due despatch, and only in working hours.

21. No child under the age of ten years shall be admitted into the Cemetery except in charge of a responsible person.

22. That no smoking shall be allowed within the Cemetery; nor shall any explosives or fireworks be discharged therein except by special permission, and in the case of a military funeral.

23. That every driver of a hearse, mourning coach, or any other vehicle, and every pedestrian shall keep strictly to the roadways and paths as laid out respectively, and vehicles shall only be turned at points where provision for doing so is made.

24. That no person in the Cemetery or in its approaches shall commit any nuisance, or trespass or be guilty of any breach of decorum, or cut, pluck, gather, or take out of the Cemetery any flower, plant, shrub, or tree, or any part thereof, or do any injury whatsoever thereto, or to any plot, border, railing, fence, or an erection or road, or remove or interfere with anything laid, built, or placed on any grave or plot or place; and any person so doing shall be proceeded against under the provisions of the Act.

25. That no person shall promote or advertise or carry on within the Cemetery or its precincts or approaches any trade or business or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of cards or circulars, or otherwise, or any other system of advertisement whatever.

26. The Secretary, as referred to in these By-laws, means the person for the time being employed by the Trustees as such for the Cemetery, and such a person shall, subject to the Trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, and to the carrying out the enforcement of these By-laws; and the direction of such person shall in all cases and for all purposes be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the Trustees.

27. That all fees not paid may be recovered, and all proceedings under these By-laws taken before two Justices in Petty Sessions, except when otherwise provided for.

28. That any person committing a breach of any of these By-laws shall thereupon be forthwith removable from the Cemetery by the Trustees or Secretary, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly, in addition to any other proceedings or penalties to which such person may be subject.

29. That a plan of the Cemetery showing the distribution, sections, blocks, graves numbered, a register of burials, and certificates of right of burials shall be kept at the office of the Trustees.

30. That the officiating minister at any burial shall be given at least six hours' notice prior to the time stated for such burial.

31. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds, and in the case of a continuing breach, not exceeding one pound for every day during which such breach continues.

Conditions in respect of the carriage of Exhibits for Agricultural Shows, etc.:—

1. The undermentioned conditions shall be applicable in respect of agricultural machines and implements, machinery, produce, live stock (including dogs, poultry, and other birds), buggies, drays, wagons, and other goods of a like nature, sent for exhibition to Agricultural Shows.

2. The exhibits will, in the ordinary course, be carried in goods or cattle trucks by goods or mixed trains; but valuable animals may, if it be convenient to the Commissioners, be carried by passenger trains.

3. When the exhibits are consigned on the forward journey, the consignor will require to declare on the consignment note therefor that they are for exhibition, specifying the Show for which they are intended, and the entry must be indorsed accordingly.

The ordinary freight charges shall be imposed and prepaid in respect of the forward journey in all cases, except that valuable animals carried by passenger trains, in accordance with Clause 2, will be charged goods train rates.

The consignor must also obtain from the Station-master or Goods Agent a certificate on form shown below. For exhibits sent from unattended platforms or sidings, or non-booking stations, owners must obtain certificate from Station-master at destination station.

4. On the return journey any exhibits, or portion thereof, which are certified by the Secretary of the Show as having been exhibited, and not sold, will be carried "free" to the station whence they were forwarded, provided the journey is completed at any time within one month from the date of despatch on the forward journey. A certificate in the approved form must be handed in when the exhibits are consigned.

If a greater number of vehicles be used for the carriage of exhibits on the return journey than was used on the forward journey, ordinary freight charges will be imposed in respect of exhibits carried in the additional vehicles.

5. The Roads Act, 1902.

UPPER GASCOYNE ROAD BOARD BY-LAWS.

THE Upper Gascoyne Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of "The Roads Act, 1902," do hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

Whereas by "The Roads Act, 1902," the Board in any district is empowered to make By-laws for all and any purposes in the said Act mentioned: It is hereby resolved by the Board of the Upper Gascoyne district, by and with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the following By-laws shall be enforced within the said district from the date of the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*:—

Interpretation.

1. In these By-laws the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meaning set against them respectively, that is to say:—

- (a.) The interpretations of the various terms used throughout these By-laws shall be those as defined in Clause 4 of "The Roads Act, 1902," with additional terms defined hereunder.
- (b.) "The Act"—The Roads Act of 1902, and all amendments thereto.
- (c.) "Secretary"—The Secretary of the Board.
- (d.) "Animal"—Shall include horse, mare, filly, gelding, bull, cow, calf, heifer, steer, mule, donkey, camel, goat, sheep, or foal.
- (e.) "Water Supply"—Any public well or works for the conservation of water constructed by or under the control of the Board.
- (f.) "Month"—Shall mean calendar month.

Duties of Secretary.

2. The duties of the Secretary shall be—
 - (a.) To attend all meetings of Board and committees.
 - (b.) To take note of all minutes and prepare reports of committees.
 - (c.) To conduct all correspondence and give the other officers instructions as directed by the minutes.
 - (d.) To answer all questions on Board's business.
 - (e.) To see that all accounts are audited once a year and the balance-sheets prepared and printed yearly.
 - (f.) To supervise the preparation of the rate book and Board's electoral lists, making the necessary arrangements for the elections, and preparing papers, etc., for the clerks.
 - (g.) To summon the members to Board and committee meetings.
 - (h.) The Secretary shall keep the cash and other books as may be issued by Minister, as well as any and all other books required to show the receipts and expenditure made by the Board. The said books shall be kept written up every fortnight ready for the inspection of the Board or any member of the Board who may at any time during office hours desire to see them.
 - (i.) He shall check all accounts sent in to the Board, and see that all accounts for works have stated on them the authority under which such works have been done, and shall check all returns made by the collectors or other of the Board's officers, and shall see that, with all the returns made, the heels of the receipt books accompany the returns. He shall supervise and attend to the due payment of all money coming through the hands of the Board's officers and payable to the credit of the Board; he shall report to the Board, at their next meeting, any officer neglecting to make his return as provided, with the necessary vouchers attached thereto.
 - (j.) He shall pay to the bank, as soon as possible after receipt, any sum or sums of money that may be received by him on behalf of the Board.
 - (k.) He shall have the cash book and bank pass-book made up in readiness for the meeting of the Board, and shall produce them at each meeting thereof if requested. Should any

member of the Board desire to see them at any time during office hours, the Secretary shall produce them for his inspection. No money shall be paid into the bank to the credit of the Board by any officer of the Board except by or through the Secretary.

- (l.) The Secretary shall give all receipts on printed forms.
- (m.) The Secretary shall cheerfully and readily obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and shall attend to all matters affecting the finances of the Board and not herein specified.

Meetings.

- 3. (a.) Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds—ordinary and special.
- (b.) An ordinary meeting of the Board shall be held every three months.

Order of Business.

- 4. The ordinary business of all ordinary meetings shall be as follows, that is to say:—
 - (a.) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary or special meeting, if any.
 - (b.) Consideration of business arising out of minutes.
 - (c.) Reading of correspondence received and despatched, and taking such immediate action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto.
 - (d.) Passing accounts for payment.
 - (e.) Presentation of committee reports, and consideration thereof.
 - (f.) Consideration of tenders, ratification of contracts.
 - (g.) General business of Board.
 - (h.) No discussion shall take place upon the minutes except as to their accuracy or for the rectification of any clerical errors.
 - (i.) Immediately after confirmation of the minutes, the Chairman may make any communication to the Board which he may deem advisable, or bring under consideration any business that he may think necessary; and it shall be competent for any member of the Board to ask a question simply, and no debate shall ensue thereon at the time.

Tenders.

5. Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject matters of the tenders come on to be considered at the meeting of the Board, or by a committee appointed for that purpose.

Motions and Amendments.

- 6. (a.) A motion once moved at a meeting cannot be withdrawn unless by consent of the Board.
- (b.) One or more amendments may be proposed on a motion before the Board. When more than one amendment is moved the question shall be first put on the last amendment, then on the next in succession, and then on the original motion, in the reverse order in which they are moved.
- (c.) A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member or put by the Chairman.

Appointment of Committees.

7. The Board may at any meeting appoint one or more members as a committee to inquire into matters and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no committee shall incur any financial liability or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws or by resolution of the Board.

Finance Accounts.

- 8. (a.) All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the Board by the Chairman at the ordinary meetings, and, after being certified as correct, shall be so initialed by him and paid by cheque.
- (b.) An account shall be opened with such bank as the Board may direct, and all money received from whatever source (with the exception of money granted by the Government) shall be

paid into such bank to the credit of the Board, and no account shall be paid except by cheque, signed by the Chairman and countersigned by another member of the Board.

Urgent Work.

9. The Chairman, with one member, may, in the case of urgency, authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding Ten pounds, but shall, in every case, report the same at the next meeting of the Board.

Elections.

- 10. (a.) In the event of a vacancy occurring in the Board arising from any cause except annual retirement, the Chairman shall give at least one month's public notice of the day upon which the election shall be held to fill such vacancy.
- (b.) The chief polling place for the holding of election of members to the Board shall be the office of the Board at Clifton Downs.

General Traffic, etc.

11. In all cases of camels meeting or overtaking a horse or bullock team, or a vehicle of any description, the person in charge or the driver of such camels shall, when within two hundred yards of the team or vehicle, take the camels off the road and at least twenty yards from the centre thereof.

12. The person in charge of any camels shall not keep, or permit to be kept, the camels in any street of or any road within the boundaries of any town within the district for any longer time than actually necessary to load or unload the camels; neither shall any camels be brought into any street of any town for the purpose of being loaded until all the loading shall be actually ready and packed to be placed on the camels.

13. Every camel-driver shall, whenever requested by a constable, member of, or Secretary to the Board, produce for inspection his license.

14. Every person having the charge of any camels shall, whenever requested by a constable, member of, or Secretary to the Board, produce the certificate of registration of all the camels under his charge.

15. No camel-owners or persons in charge of camels shall allow the camels to remain at a well or pool more than half an hour for the purpose of watering, or allow any camels to camp within a-half of a mile of any well or natural surface water, nor allow any camels to camp less than 300 yards from any road.

16. No camel-drivers' licenses to be issued to aboriginals.

17. No teamster or person in charge of a horse or bullock team shall, without good cause, delay on any road or street when loaded or unloaded.

Penalties.

18. Where any person by these By-laws, or any part of them, is required to do or perform any act, and such act is not done, or remains undone or unperformed, it shall be lawful for the Board to perform the same and charge the cost and expenses against such person, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.

19. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and be liable, when not otherwise provided for, to a fine or penalty not exceeding £10 for each offence.
