With reference to my predecessor's Circular despatch of 20th September, 1907, I have the honour to transmit to you, for the information of your Ministers, copies of a notice issued by the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament with regard to the nomination of candidates for the Nobel Peace Prize of 1909.

- 2. I have to request that your Ministers will be so good as to cause the conditions of the prize to be made known to those bodies and persons who are qualified to nominate candidates.
- It will be observed that the names of candidates should be received by the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament before the 1st of February, 1909.

NOBEL PEACE PRIZE.

All proposals of candidates for the Nobel Peace Prize, which is to be distributed 10th December, 1909, must, in order to be taken into consideration, be laid before the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament by a duly qualified person before the first of February of the same year.

Any one of the following persons is held to be duly qualified: (a) Members and late members of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, as well as the advisers appointed at the Norwegian Nobel Institute; (b) Members of Parliament and Members of the Government of the different States, as well as Members of the Interparliamentary Union; (c) Members of the international Arbitration Court at the Hague; (d) Members of the Commission of the Permanent International Peace Bureau; (e) Members and Associates of the Institute of International Law; (f) University professors of Political Science and of Law, of History and of Philosophy; and (g) Persons who have received the Nobel Peace Prize.

The Nobel Peace Prize may also be accorded to institutions or associations.

According to the Code of Statutes, Sec. 8, the grounds upon which any proposal is made must be stated, and handed in along with such papers and other documents as may therein be referred to.

According to Sec. 3, every written work, to qualify for a prize, must have appeared in print.

For particulars, qualified persons are requested to apply to the office of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, Drammensvei 19, Kristiania.

KALGOORLIE ROAD BOARD.

Section 96, "Roads Act, 1902;" Section 8, "Parks and Reserves Act, 1895."

By-law.

- 1. The Board shall have power to grant the exclusive right to use and occupy any park lands or reserves under its control, for holding sports or amusements, to any responsible person or persons for any time not exceeding three consecutive days, subject to such conditions and such fee as may be decided upon by the Board. The public shall have the right to enter upon such lands, on paying to the person or persons so using and occupying the same, of a sum of not more than one shilling per head per day provided that an extra charge of not more than one shilling per head may be made to any part of the ground set apart as a special reserve or stand.
- 2. All park lands and reserves shall be open to the public daily, between sunrise and sunset, for recreation

purposes, except when matches or games authorised by a committee or the Board are being played and to which an admission fee is being charged.

- 3. All persons using or being upon any park lands or reserves shall at all times conduct themselves in a becoming and orderly manner, and any person creating any disturbance or annoyance to the public, or playing any unlawful game or games which, in the opinion of the Board or a committee of management, are objectionable or dangerous, shall be liable to be expelled therefrom.
- 4. The Board may, in its discretion, prohibit any games or gymnastics from being played or carried on by any person or persons, upon any park lands or reserves, on any Sunday.
- 5. No animals of any kind, except horses in harness or saddle, shall be allowed upon any park lands or reserves without the previous consent in writing of the Board.
- 6. The charge of sixpence may be made for the admission of all vehicles and horses.
- 7. Any police constable, special constable, or park ranger may remove from park lands and reserves any person or persons who in his or their opinion are guilty of a breach of any By-law of the Board applying to parks and reserves.
- 8. No person shall sell or expose for sale any goods, wares, fruit, or merchandise in any park lands or reserves without first having obtained the written consent of the Board, and shall pay a fee, the amount of such fee to be fixed and paid to the Board.
- 9. No person shall damage or injure any trees, shrub, plant, building erected, or other property in any park lands or reserves, or do any damage to the soil or surface thereof.
- 10. No person shall commit any offensive nuisance on any park lands or reserves vested in or under the jurisdiction of the Board.
- 11. The fees to be charged the public for admission to any park lands or reserves, during the procedure of any game, shall be as set out in section one of these By-laws.
- 12. Any person guilty of any offence against any of these By-laws shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Ten pounds.
