Dominions. CIRCULAR.

Sir,

Downing Street 28th September, 1908.

With reference to my predecessor's Circular despatch of 20th September, 1907, I have the honour to transmit to you, for the information of your Ministers, copies of a notice issued by the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament with regard to the nomination of candidates for the Nobel Peace Prize of 1909.

- 2. I have to request that your Ministers will be so good as to cause the conditions of the prize to be made known to those bodies and persons who are qualified to nominate candidates.
- 3. It will be observed that the names of candidates should be received by the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament before the 1st of February, 1909.

NOBEL PEACE PRIZE.

All proposals of candidates for the Nobel Peace Prize, which is to be distributed 10th December, 1909, must, in order to be taken into consideration, be laid before the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament by a duly qualified person before the first of February of the

Any one of the following persons is held to be duly qualified: (a) Members and late members of the Nobel committee of the Norwegian Parliament, as well as the Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, as well as the advisers appointed at the Norwegian Nobel Institute; (b) Members of Parliament and Members of the Government of the different States, as well as Members of the Interparliamentary Union; (c) Members of the international Arbitration Court at the Hague; (d) Members of the Commission of the Permanent International Peace Bureau; (e) Members and Associates of the Institute of International Law; (f) University professors of Political Science and of Law, of History and of Phylosophy: and (g) Persons who have received the Philosophy; and (g) Persons who have received the Nobel Peace Prize.

The Nobel Peace Prize may also be accorded to institutions or associations.

According to the Code of Statutes, Sec. 8, the grounds upon which any proposal is made must be stated, and handed in along with such papers and other documents as may therein be referred to.

According to Sec. 3, every written work, to qualify for a prize, must have appeared in print.

For particulars, qualified persons are requested to apply to the office of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, Drammensvei 19, Kristiania.

FREMANTLE LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH. BY-LAW No. 13.

Wool-scouring Establishments.

In pursuance of the powers contained in "The Health Act, 1898," and amendments, the Municipal Council of

Fremantle, acting in that behalf as the Local Board of Health thereof, doth hereby make the following Bylaw:—

- 1. In this By-law the expression "wool-scouring establishment" shall mean a place where sheep or lambs' wool is received for the purpose of being cleansed by washing in water.
- 2. The building or part of a building in which the trade of a wool-scourer is carried on shall be at least fifty feet distant from any dwelling-house or place where food intended for human consumption is prepared or stored.
- 3. The occupier of a wool-scouring establishment shall not permit or suffer any of the wool obtained from sheep or lambs that have died of disease to be received or stored upon the premises in which his trade is carried on.
- 4. He shall not permit or suffer any skins or pelts, or other parts of animal carcases (other than wool), to be received, treated, or stored upon such premises.
- 5. He shall not use or permit, or suffer to be used, in any of the processes of the trade carried on in such premises, urine, lant, or any chemical or material which gives off or produces an offensive smell.
- 6. He shall cause the floor of every room in which any cleansing process is carried on to be constructed of approved impervious and non-absorbent material, which shall be laid with proper falls so that any liquid falling or deposited thereon shall readily flow to a trapped drain inlet placed outside the building.
- 7. He shall also cause the walls of every such room, for a height of at least five feet above the floor, to be lined with durable and non-absorbent materials, and the surfaces of such walls and of the floor of each such room shall be smoothly finished so as not to afford a lodgment for dirt or for liquid.
- 8. He shall cause all liquid wastes produced on the premises in which his trade is carried on to be conducted by approved impervious drains to the nearest sewer or to such other place as may be approved of by the Board.
- 9. He shall, at the close of every working day, cause every room and receptacle upon his premises, in which any cleansing operation has been carried on, to be thoroughly cleansed.
- 10. He shall cause every floor, wall, receptacle, and drain or means of drainage upon or in connection with his premises to be maintained at all times in good order and efficient action.
- 11. He shall cause the internal wall surfaces and the ceilings of every building in which his trade is carried on to be thoroughly limewashed at least twice in every year, that is to say, at least once in the month of October and once in the month of March in every year.
- 12. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
