DOMINIONS. CIRCULAR.

Downing Street, 28th September, 1908.

Sir, With reference to my predecessor's Circular despatch of 20th September, 1907, I have the honour to transmit to you, for the information of your Ministers, copies of a notice issued by the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament with regard to the nomination of candidates for the Nobel Peace Prize of 1909.

2. I have to request that your Ministers will be so good as to cause the conditions of the prize to be made known to those bodies and persons who are qualified to nominate candidates.

It will be observed that the names of candidates should be received by the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament before the 1st of February, 1909.

NOBEL PEACE PRIZE.

All proposals of candidates for the Nobel Peace Prize, which is to be distributed 10th December, 1909, must, in order to be taken into consideration, be laid before the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament by a duly qualified person before the first of February of the same year.

Any one of the following persons is held to be duly qualified: (a) Members and late members of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, as well as the advisers appointed at the Norwegian Nobel Institute; (b) Members of Parliament and Members of the Gov-ernment of the different States, as well as Members of the Interparliamentary Union; (c) Members of the international Arbitration Court at the Hague; (d) Mem-bers of the Commission of the Permanent International bers of the Commission of the Permanent International Peace Bureau; (e) Members and Associates of the In-stitute of International Law; (f) University professors of Political Science and of Law, of History and of Philosophy; and (g) Persons who have received the Nobel Peace Prize.

The Nobel Peace Prize may also be accorded to institutions or associations.

According to the Code of Statutes, Sec. 8, the grounds upon which any proposal is made must be stated, and handed in along with such papers and other documents as may therein be referred to.

According to Sec. 3, every written work, to qualify for a prize, must have appeared in print.

For particulars, qualified persons are requested to ap-ply to the office of the Nobel Committee of the Nor-wegian Parliament, Drammensvei 19, Kristiania.

- (4.) Salaries—rates computations, castings, and dicharges: The rates to be tested only to the extent considered necessary by the Auditor General.
- (5.) Appropriations: The Auditor General may accept certificates on the vouchers, provided they are correct upon the information disclosed thereon, and always providing the vouchers are made out in the form prescribed by the Regulations. by the Regulations.
- (6.) Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to deter the Auditor General from making any investigation he may consider expedient.
