By-law No. 80.

Discount on Payment of Rates.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Fremantle, made under Section 179 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 80, for regulating the percentage by way of discount allowed to any person liable to pay any rates, who pays such rates within thirty days after notice given to him to pay the same.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Free.

the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Fremantle order as follows:-

Any person liable to pay any rates made and levied by the Council of the Municipality of Fremantle who pays such rates at the office of the Council, Town Hall, Fremantle, within thirty days after notice given to him to pay the same, will be allowed a percentage by way of discount equal to the amount of five pounds per centum of the amount of such rates.

FREMANTLE MUNICIPALITY. By-law No. 79.

Bathing.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Fremantle made under Section 179 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 79, for regulating bathing in the sea on the boundary of the Municipal District of Fremantle.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Fremantle order as follows:—

Interpretation .- In the construction of this by-law, unless the context otherwise requires, the following terms shall have the meanings respectively given them here-

- "Bathing Costume" means a full bathing dress from neck to knees with a covering skirt attached thereto from the waist to the knees.
- "Bathing House" means a bathing house, shed, or machine, whether fixed or removable, approved by the Council and authorised by the Council to be placed or erected upon the South Beach at Fremantle.
 "Council" means the Fremantle Municipal Council.

- 1. No person shall bathe in the sea at the South Beach North of a point opposite the Southern boundary of Florence Street within the Municipal District of Fremantle, except in enclosed sea-baths erected before the making of this by-law.
- 2. For the preservation of decency, all bathers over the age of seven years shall wear a bathing costume while bathing in the sea at any point on the boundary of the Fremantle Municipal district, as prescribed in Clause 1 of this by-law.
- 3. The Council may authorise the erection and use of bathing-houses, and may provide for such other matters as appear expedient for preserving decency or promoting the convenience of the public in connection with bathing.
- 4. No person shall expose himself or herself when undressing for the purpose of bathing, nor when bathing, or before or when dressing after having bathed.
- No person shall place or erect any bathing-house within the limits of or on the boundary of the Municipal district of Fremantle unless and until the same shall have been authorised and approved by the Council in writing under the hand of the Town Clerk.
- 6. No male person over the age of seven years shall go into, upon, or loiter in the vicinity of any bathinghouse or of any dressing-room, lavatory, or other convenience set apart for the use of females.
- 7. No female person whatsoever shall go into, upon, or remain near any bathing-house or any dressing-room, lavatory, or other convenience set apart for the use of males.
- 8. For the promotion of the convenience of the public in connection with bathing, it shall be unlawful for any person to lead, ride, or drive any horse or any cattle whatsoever, or drive any vehicle along or upon the South Beach, South of the Southern boundary of Florence Street within the limits of or on the boundary of the Municipal district of Fremantle without the consent of the Council in writing, under the hand of the Town Clerk, first had and obtained.
- By-law numbered six of the Fremantle Municipality published in the Government Gazette on the 18th day of November, 1904, is hereby repealed.
- 10. Any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds nor less than Two pounds.

By-law No. 51.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Geraldton, made under Section 412 of "The Municipal Corporations Act,

1906," and numbered 51, empowering the Council to make allowances by way of discount for the prompt payment of rates.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Geraldton order as follows:—

The Council may allow to any person liable to pay rates a discount not exceeding Five pounds per centum when a whole year's rates are paid not later than the thirty-first day of January, and Two pounds ten shillings per centum in the event of one-half year's rates being paid on or before the said date. Provided that such allowance shall only apply to rates due and payable for the year then current.

LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH BY-LAWS.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Bayswater Local Board of Health, at its meeting on the 29th October, 1908, resolved to adopt the following By-laws.

W. SHEPHERD,

Secretary to the Bayswater Local Board of Health. SECTION 2.

Slaughter Houses.

- 1. Every occupier of a slaughter house shall cause every animal brought to such slaughter house for the purpose of being slaughtered, and confined in any pound, stall, pen, or lair upon the premises previously to being slaughtered, to be provided during such confinement with a sufficient quantity of wholesome water.
- 2. Every occupier of a slaughter house and every servant of such person employed upon the premises in the slaughtering of cattle shall, in the process of slaughtering any animal, use such instruments and appliances and adopt such method of slaughtering and otherwise take such precautions as may be requisite to secure the infliction of as little pain or suffering as possible.
- 3. Every occupier of a slaughter house shall cause the means of ventilation provided in or in connection with such slaughter house to be kept at all times in proper order and efficient action, and so that the ventilation shall be by direct communication with the external air.

- 4. Every occupier of a slaughter house shall cause the drainage provided in or in connection with such slaughter house to be kept at all times in proper order and efficient action.
- 5. (a.) Every occupier of a slaughter house shall cause every part of the internal surface of the walls and every part of the floor or pavement of such slaughter house to be kept at all times in good order and repair, so as to prevent the absorption therein of any blood or liquid refuse or filth, which may be spilled or splashed thereon, or any offensive or noxious matter which may be deposited thereon or brought in contact therewith.
- (b.) He shall cause every part of the internal surface above the floor or pavement of such slaughter house to be thoroughly washed with hot limewash, at least four times in every year, that is to say, at least once during the periods between the first and tenth of March, the first and tenth of June, the first and tenth of September, and the first and tenth of December respectively, and at such other times as he may be directed by the Inspector. He shall cause every part of the floor or pavement of such slaughter house, and every part of the internal surface of every wall on which any blood or liquid refuse or filth may have been spilled or splashed or with which any offensive or noxious matter may have been brought in contact with during the process of slaughtering or dressing in such slaughter house, to be thoroughly washed and cleansed within three hours after the completion of such slaughtering or dressing.
- 6. (a.) An occupier of a slaughter house shall not at any time keep any dog or cause or suffer any dog to be kept in such slaughter house.
- (b.) He shall not at any time keep, or cause, or suffer to be kept, in such slaughtering house any animal of which the flesh may be used for the food of men, unless such animal be so kept in preparation for the slaughtering thereof upon the premises.
- (c.) He shall not at any time keep any cattle, or cause or suffer any cattle to be kept, in such slaughter house for a longer period than may be necessary for the purpose of preparing such cattle, whether by fasting or otherwise, for the process of slaughtering.
- (d.) If, at any time, he keep or suffer to be kept in such slaughter house any cattle for the purpose of preparation, whether by fasting or otherwise, for the process of slaughtering, he shall not cause or suffer such cattle to be confined elsewhere than in the pounds, stalls, pens, or lairs provided on the premises.
- 7. Every occupier of a slaughter house shall cause the hides or skins, fat and offal of every animal slaughtered on the premises to be removed from the slaughter house within twenty-four hours after the completion of the slaughtering of such animal.
- 8. Every occupier of a slaughter house shall cause the means of water supply provided in or in connection with such slaughter house to be kept at all times in proper order and efficient action, and shall provide for use on the premises a sufficient supply of water for the purpose of thoroughly washing and cleansing the floor or pavement, every part of the internal surface of every wall of such slaughter house, and every vessel or receptacle which may be used for the collection and removal from such slaughter house of any blood, manure, garbage, filth, or other refuse products of the slaughtering of any carease on the premises.
- 9. (a.) Every occupier of a slaughter house shall provide a sufficient number of vessels or receptacles properly constructed of galvanised iron or other non-absorbent material, and furnished with closely fitting covers, for the purpose of receiving and conveying from such slaughter house all blood, manure, garbage, filth, or other refuse products of the slaughtering of any cattle, or the dressing of any carcase in such slaughter house.
- (b.) He shall forthwith, upon the completion of the slaughtering of any cattle, or the dressing of any carcase in such slaughter house cause such blood, manure, garbage, filth, or other refuse products to be collected and deposited in such vessels or receptacles, and shall cause all the contents of such vessels or receptacles to be removed and properly disposed of at least once in every twenty-four hours.
- (c.) He shall cause every such vessel or receptacle to be thoroughly cleansed immediately after such vessel or receptacle shall have been used for such collection and removal, and shall cause every such vessel or receptacle, when not in actual use, to be kept thoroughly clean.

- 10. No occupier of a slaughter house shall at any time after the registration of his premises, without the assent, in writing, of the Board, make any change or alteration whatsoever, or permit or suffer any change or alteration whatsoever, to be made in the slaughter house or any of the buildings to which such license applies in respect of the drainage of the same; or in respect of the flagging or paving of the same, or in respect of the ventilation of the same, or in respect of the supply of water of the same. of the supply of water of the same.
- 11. (a.) Every occupier of a slaughter house shall cause every vehicle and other things used by him for the carriage or transport of meat to be thoroughly cleansed at least once in every day.
- (b.) He shall also maintain every such vehicle and such other things at all times in a cleanly state.
- (c.) He shall not cause or suffer any meat intended for human consumption to be carried in such vehicles, or such other things, unless such meat is covered with some clean material in such a manner as to completely protect such meat from the sun and dust.
- 12. Any person who shall remove from any slaughter house any carcase or any portion of any carcase, or any meat for purpose of sale, shall cause the cart, wagon, or other conveyance in which such carcase, portion of a carcase or meat shall be removed to be thoroughly cleansed on each occasion on which it shall be so used before being so used. And any carcase or meat so removed shall be covered with clean material, kept solely for such purpose, during the process of removal.
- 13. (a.) No occupier of a slaughter house shall keep pigs, or suffer or permit pigs to be kept, except for immediate slaughter, within 100 feet of his slaughter
- (b.) He shall not keep or stable any horses, of permit or suffer any horses to be kept or stabled within 100 feet of his slaughter house.

- (1.) All stone accepted for treatment at State Batteries shall be estimated at 22 cubic feet per ton, except where weighing machines are provided, when stone must pass over same to ascertain weight.
- (2.) The manager of the Battery may refuse any stone considered too poor to pay crushing charges, unless a deposit is paid in advance.
- (3.) The charge for crushing at each Battery, as determined from time to time by the Hon. the Minister for Mines, shall be posted up at each Battery and strictly adhered to while in force.
- (4.) A minimum charge will be made for all parcels of less tonnage than will return five pounds on the rate charged per ton.
- (5.) Payment for treatment shall be made to the Manager on completion of crushing, or sufficient gold will be retained to pay the amount due.
- (6.) Where a cyanide plant has been erected at a battery, tailings consisting of sands and slimes resulting from stone crushed at that battery may be purchased, but the Manager may, in his discretion, refuse to purchase any tailings should be consider them unsuitable for treatment by cyanide.
- (7.) The tailings (including slimes) produced from each parcel crushed may be purchased at such plants as may be approved and will be paid for by the Department within two months of the date of agreement of assays, at the rate of seventy-five per cent. (75%) of the gold contents after deducting three (3) pennyweights per ton to cover loss and costs of cyanide treat-
 - Gold to be paid for at the rate of 80s. per ounce.
- (8.) The number of tons of tailings to be paid for from each parcel shall be determined by the Manager, whose decision shall be final, but the amount shall not be less than 80 per cent. or more than 90 per cent. of the tons crushed.
- (9.) The Manager shall take samples of the tailings (9.) The Manager shall take samples of the tailings as they pass through the battery or from the vats into which the tailings may be deposited. The sample collected shall be thoroughly mixed and divided into four samples, one for assay by the Manager, and one for the vendor; the other two shall be sealed, one being sent to the Perth office of the Mines Department, and the other kept by the Manager for reference or umpire if necessary. if necessary.

Within three weeks of the completion of the crushing the vendor and Manager shall compare assays, and if these differ by not more than six grains per ton the mean of the assays shall be accepted as correct. If there should be a greater difference than six grains between the assays, the umpire sample shall be sent by the Manager to the Government Assayer at Perth, whose the Manager to the Government Assayer at Perth, whose assay shall be accepted as final by both parties. The cost of the umpire's assay (10s.) shall be borne by the party whose assay differs most from the umpire's result. The Manager's assay shall not be made known to the vendor until he has produced his assay certificate for comparison of assays or has agreed in writing to accept the Manager's assay. If the vendor does not produce an assay certificate for comparison within 21 days of the completion of the crushing, the Manager's assay shall be final. shall be final.
- If the Manager considers any sample shows an abnormal assay value for the grade of ore producing the tailings, he may refer the matter to the Minister, whose decision as to the values to be paid on shall be indisputable and final.

- (11.) All tailings assaying less than three (3) pennyweights per ton shall become the property of the Government.
- Where no cyanide plant has been erected at a Battery, any person desirous of claiming tailings, the proceeds of his crushing, may remove them to a site clear of the settling area immediately the crushing is completed, and must notify the Manager of his intention to do so previous to commencement of the crushing. THE ROADS ACT, 1902.

Special By-laws to regulate the Lights to be carried by all Vehicles.

PEPPERMINT GROVE ROAD BOARD.
WHEREAS by virtue of the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1902" (2 Edward VII., No. 48), the Board of every Road District is empowered to make, alter, or repeal By-laws for any of the purposes of the said Act: It is therefore ordered by the Peppermint Grove Road Board that the By-law dealing with lights to be carried by vehicles, No. 41, subsection i, passed on the 4th day of May, 1908, and published in the Government Gazette on the 10th day of July, 1908, is hereby repealed, and that the following By-laws shall, from and after the approval thereof by the Governor and publication in the Government Gazette, have the force of law within the said district.

Interpretation.

- 1. In these By-laws the following terms shall have the meaning set out against them respectively, that is to say:—
 - (a.) "Cycle" means and includes a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede, or motor cycle.
 - (b.) "Motor Car" means and includes any motor car, automobile, motor carriage, or other carriage or vehicle propelled either partly or wholly by any volatile spirit or electricity, or by any means other than animal power.
 - (c.) "Vehicle" means any cart, dray, lorry, carriage, van, omnibus, trap, hand-cart, or other conveyance whatsoever, with or without springs.
 - (d.) "Portable Engine" means any steam lorry, traction or other engine or machine on its own wheels, and includes a street roller whether driven by steam or horse power.
 - whether driven by steam or horse power.

 (c.) "Trailer" means any, vehicle, motor car, or portable engine attached to or hauled or drawn by another vehicle, motor car, or portable engine.
- 2. It shall be unlawful between sunset and sunrise for any person to ride, drive, impel, haul, or place on any road any cycle, motor car, vehicle, portable engine, or trailer unless a lamp or lamps as hereinafter prescribed is or are attached to the cycle, motor car, vehicle, portable engine, or trailer, exhibiting a light or lights as hereinafter prescribed kept continually burning sufficient to afford clear and adequate means of signalling the approach or position of the cycle, motor car, vehicle, portable engine, or trailer.

Cycles.

One lamp attached to the front of the cycle and exhibiting a white light in the direction in which the cycle is proceeding or is intended to proceed.

Hand Carts.

One lamp attached to the front of the hand cart and exhibiting a white light in the direction in which the hand cart is proceeding or intended to proceed.

Vehicles other than hand carts.

One or two lamps attached to the front of the vehicle and exhibiting a white light or white lights in the direction in which the vehicle is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and if only one such lamp it shall be attached on the "off" or "right" side of the vehicle

Motor Cars.

At least two lamps attached to the front of the motor car, one to be affixed on each side of the motor car, and exhibiting white lights in the direction in which the motor car is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and one lamp attached to the back of the motor

car and exhibiting a red light from the rear of the motor car and throwing a white light on the number of the car.

Portable Engines.

Two lamps attached to the front of the portable engine, one to be affixed on each side of the portable engine, and exhibiting white lights in the direction in which the portable engine is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and one lamp attached to the front of the portable engine between the white lights exhibiting a green light in the direction in which the engine is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and one lamp attached to the back of the portable engine and exhibiting a green light from the rear of the portable engine.

Trailers.

Similar lights as would be required to be attached if the vehicle was driven or impelled.

- 3. Any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
- 4. Also to amend By-law No. 41, published on 4th day of May, para. j, by increasing the licensing fee for motor cars from five shillings to forty shillings.
