H1S Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to appoint E. Udy to be Certifying Officer for the Denmark and Ringbarking Stores Accounts, Lands Department, during the absence on leave of H. Hamersley.

Also to approve, under Section 48 of "The Audit Act, 1904," of the Railway Department being exempt from detailed audit, as per statement hereunder, by the Auditor General; and to cancel the Executive Council approval of the 2nd December, 1908.

- (1.) Station receipts and rents which are audited by the Auditor of Receipts: A certificate by the Auditor of Receipts of the total amount which should be brought to account by the Chief Accountant, Railways, to be supplied to the Auditor General monthly.
- (2.) Form No. 3, as provided for in Regulation No. 11, to be forwarded monthly to the Auditor General by all officers receiving money, the accounts of which are not controlled by the Auditor of Receipts: This will apply to the officers of the Commissioner, Chief Mechanical Residual Engineer, Chief Engineer for Existing Lines, Chief Traffic Manager, and Chief Railway Storekeeper—these declared returns to be taken by the Auditor General as sufficient proof for the correctness of the accounts.
- (3.) What are known as wages and temporary clerical assistance: Rates computations, castings, and discharges.
- (4.) Salaries—rates computations, eastings, and discharges: The rates to be tested only to the extent considered necessary by the Audi tor General.
- (5.) Appropriations: The Auditor General may accept certificates on the vouchers, provided they are correct upon the information dis-closed thereon, and always providing the vouchers are made out in the form prescribed by the Regulations.
- (6.) Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to deter the Auditor General from making any investigation he may consider expedient.

MUNICIPALITY OF GERALDTON.

By-law No. 23-Number of Stock to be run on Commonage.

Amendment.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Geraldton do hereby order as follows:

Sections 1 and 2 of By-law No. 23 are hereby repealed, and the following sections are substituted in lieu there-

1. Except as provided for in Section 2 of this Bylaw no person or business firm shall run a greater number of stock than the numbers stated below:

> Horned stock of any age 30 head. 30 head. Goats 30 head. Horses

Any person who shall run more stock on the Geraldton Commonage than is allowed by this By-law shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every offence.

- 2. Except for the purposes mentioned in sub-sections (a) and (b) of this By-law, the grazing of sheep on the Geraldton commonage is hereby prohibited, and any person infringing this By-law shall be liable, upon conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £5 per day:
 - (a.) Owners of sheep awaiting shipment or to be entrained may use the commonage for grazing purposes for a period not exceeding three days.
 - days.

 (b.) Any butcher who is licensed to keep a slaughter house within the boundaries of the municipality and who carries on the business of a retail butcher shall be permitted to use the commonage for the purpose of grazing such sheep as may be required for slaughtering purposes in connection with his said business, provided the number shall not at any time exceed one hundred (100).

 (Cettle and because shell not be permitted to graze.
- 3. Cattle and horses shall not be permitted to graze on roadsides or streets within the municipality under a penalty of £1 for the first offence and £2 for every subsequent offence.
- 4. All cattle and horses grazing upon Geraldton commonage shall be in charge of an approved herdsman, who shall receive at the rate of not less than 1s. 6d. per head per week.
- 5. Stock shall not be permitted to be driven through the municipality after 9 o'clock in the forenoon nor before 5 o'clock in the afternoon.
