WHEREAS by Section 12 (7) of "The Municipal Cor-porations Act, 1906," the Governor is empowered to alter the boundaries of the wards existing in any municipal district: And whereas a petition has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, signed with the com-mon seal of the Municipality of Bunbury, praying for the alteration of the boundaries of the Central and

South Wards of the said Municipality: And whereas the said petition was publicly advertised in the Government Guzeite on the fifth day of February, 1909. Now, there-fore, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance of the powers so vested in him by the said Act, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby alter the boundaries of the Central and South Wards of the Municipality of Bunbury and declare them to be as follows:

Central Ward.-Bounded on the Northward by the Northern side of Prinsep Street and its prolongation to the Western shore of the entrance to Leschenault Estuary; thence Southward and Eastward along the Eastern and Southern shores thereof to the North-East corner of Subdivisional Lot 1 of Location 26. On the East-ward by the East boundary of said Lot 1; thence by the Northern side of Austral Parade to a point North of its intersection with the Eastern side of King Road; thence South to coil intersection and there east the Terture South to said intersection, and thence along the Eastern side of King Road to the North side of Carey Road. On the Southward by the North side of Carey Road to the Western side of the Bunbury-Boyanup Railway Reserve; thence by the latter to the North side of Ramsay Street; thence by the latter to the Eastern side of Spencer Street; thence by the Eastern side of Spencer Street to the North-West corner of Subdivisional Lot 9; thence North-Westward to the South-East corner of Lot 25 at the intersection of Sampson Road with Spencer Street; thence by the North side of Sampson Road to the Eastthe North-West corner of Lot 15; thence Westward along the South boundary of Lots 11, 10, 9, and 266 to the sea-coast. LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH BY-LAW.

KALGOORLIE ROAD DISTRICT LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

WHEREAS by "The Health Act, 1898," and "The Health Act Amendment Act, 1900," a Local Board of Health may make by-laws and whereas by the provisions of the last-named Act a Local Board may amend, repeal, or alter any by-laws so made: Now, therefore, the Kal-goorlie Road District Local Board of Health doth repeal and amend its by-laws as follows:-

By-law No. 2 of the by-laws of the said Board being duly made and published in the Government Gazette of the 6th October, 1905, is hereby repealed and the following by-law substituted therefor :--

BY-LAW No. 2.

Regulating the position and manner of construction of Privies.

1. No person shall erect within the District any earthcloset, privy, or urinal the walls of which are not of stone, wood, wood and iron, or brick.

2. No closet, privy, or urinal shall be erected at a lesser distance than 20 feet from any business place or dwelling, unless with the express permission of the Board; every such closet, privy, or urinal shall be erected as near the right-of-way as conveniently can be, and every such structure shall be adequately ventilated as near the ceiling as practicable, to the satisfaction of the Board's Officers.

3. He shall provide every such earth-closet or privy with a proper roof, floor and door, and the door shall be hung so that its bottom edge is at least three inches above the floor.

4. He shall cause every earth-closet or privy upon his premises to be fitted in the following manner:---

- The seat to be hinged so as to lift up for inspection and cleansing.
- The riser to be removable and not to come within three inches of the floor.

Guide bars to be inserted so as to insure the pan being placed in exact position.

- The top of the pan when in position under the seat to be not more than one inch from the underside of the seat.
- A service or trap-door to be fitted to enable the pan to be readily withdrawn from the outside.
- Unless the floor is constructed of impervious materials, a metal tray to be placed under the pan so laid and fitted that any spillage or leakage from the pan shall be received by it and be dis-charged over and clear outside of the sill of the service door frame.

5. He shall cause every urinal erected upon his pre-mises to be so constructed that all urine deposited therein shall be conducted to a removable impervious recep-tacle of approved dimensions and manufacture, or to a septic tank, or other approved system of drainage.

6. Provided that in the case of firewood cutters, miners, or other camps situated outside a townsite boundary, trenches or drop pits properly screened may be used in lieu of earth-closets or privies, conditionally that the deposits of faecal matter made therein are covered up after use with earth and so that such conveniences are kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and are so situated as not to endanger the purity of any water supply.

The occupier of every house or premises, whether public or private, shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a box containing either ashes dry earth, lime, saw-dust, carbolic powder, or other disinfectant, approved by the Board, and shall cause all nightsoil or other matter which may be deposited in such pan or receptacle in such closet or privy, to be immedi-ately deodorised or disinfected with a sufficient quantity of the disinfectant kept in such box.

Penalty.

8. Any person guilty of any breach of, or neglect, or failure to observe or perform any of the provisions of this By-law, or any notice or order given thereunder, shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, or in case of a continued breach or neglect, not exceeding five pounds for each day during which such breach or neglect continues, and the Justices before whom any such penalty is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than five shillings) of such penalty to be paid.

Bunker Coal,

Regulation No. 118 is hereby amended by adding thereto the following paragraph under the heading of "Bunker Coal," viz.:---

In respect to coal previously loaded into boxes or skips for tipping into ships bunkers, and arriving along-side a ship on railway wagons, the handling charge shall be 5d. per ton of coal handled for each separate service performed. A separate service shall consist of adjusting the slings to the boxes or skips, refitting the empties into the wagons, bringing the full wagons into position for the work, and shunting the discharged wagons out of the way, and it shall not include any shovelling beyond that necessary for cleaning up coal spilled while operating the boxes or skips, nor any lifting appliance.
