MUNICIPAL BY-LAW.

BY-LAW No. 73.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Bunbury, made under Section 179 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 73, for regulating the lights to be while the section of the secti exhibited by all vehicles.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Purshaver and the said Bunbury order as follows: -

Interpretation.

1. In these By-laws the following terms shall have the meaning set out against them respectively, that is to say:-

- (a.), "Cycle" means and includes a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede or motor cycle.
- (b.) "Motor Car" means and includes any motor car, automobile, motor carriage, or other carriage or vehicle propelled either partly or wholly by any volatile spirit or electricity, or by any means other than animal power.
- (c.) "Vehicle" means any cart, dray, lorry, ear-riage, van, omnibus, trap, hand cart, or other conveyance whatsoever with or without conveyance springs.
- (d.) "Portable Engine" means any steam lorry, traction or other engine or machine on its own wheels, and includes a street roller whether driven by steam or horse power.
- (c.) "Trailer" means any vehicle, motor car, or portable engine attached to or hauled or drawn by another vehicle, motor car, or portable engine.

2. It shall be unlawful between sunset and sunrise for any person to ride, drive, impel, haul, or place on for any person to ride, drive, impel, haul, or place on any road any cycle, motor car, vehicle, portable engine, or trailer unless a lamp or lamps as hereinafter pre-scribed is or are attached to the cycle, motor car, vehicle, portable engine, or trailer exhibiting a light or lights as hereinafter prescribed kept continually burn-ing sufficient to afford clear and adequate means of signalling the approach or position of the cycle, motor car, vehicle, portable engine, or trailer.

Cycles.

One lamp attached to the front of the cycle and exhibiting a white light in the direction in which the cycle is proceeding or is intended to proceed.

Hand carts.

One lamp attached to the front of the hand cart and exhibiting a white light in the direction in which the hand cart is proceeding or intending to proceed.

Vehicles other than hand carts.

One or two lamps attached to the front of the vehicle and exhibiting a white light or white lights in the direction in which the vehicle is proceeding or is intending to proceed, and if only one such lamp it shall be attached on the "off" or "right" side of the vehicle.

Motor cars.

At least two lamps attached to the front of the motor At least two lamps attached to the front of the motor car, one to be affixed on each side of the motor car, and exhibiting white lights in the direction in which the motor car is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and one lamp attached to the back of the motor car and exhibiting a red light from the rear of the motor car and throwing a white light on the number of the car.

3. Any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

NANNINE CEMETERY.

By-laws.

1N pursuance of the powers vested in them, the Board of Trustees of the Nannine Cemetery make the following By-laws, that is to say:—-

1. All fees and charges payable to the trustees in accordance with Schedule A shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.

2. No interment shall be permitted in the cemetery unless an order for burial be obtained, in the form of Schedule B, from the secretary to the trustees, and delivered to the sexton not less than six working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge will be made, as in Schedule A.

3. The following information must be handed to the secretary in writing when application for interment is made:—

(a.) The age, name, and denomination of deceased.

(b.) The date and time of the burial.

(c.) The officiating minister.

(d.) The undertaker.

4. The consent of the local secretary of the denomination must be obtained, in writing, when the deceased is to be buried in that part of the cemetery set apart for that denomination; also the consent of the owner of a private block must be obtained, in writing, if it be desired that such block be used for a person who was, when living, not the owner of such block.

5. The time stated in the application for burial as in By-law 3 shall be the time for the funeral to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed, or a further charge will be made, as in Schedule A.

6. No burial shall be allowed to take place before eight in the morning, nor after six in the evening, on any day throughout the year, except by special permission, and upon payment of the fee for burials not in the usual hours, as in Schedule A.

7. The trustees shall eause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person desiring to construct a brick grave or vault upon land to which he has obtained the exclusive right, shall be permitted to construct the same under the direction of the secretary, provided that the plans thereof be submitted to and approved of by the trustees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, and made and kept air-tight.

8. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, except that the trustees may allow a lesser depth in those for the burial of infants; but no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a lesser depth than three feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground.

9. Prior to conducting any interment in the cemetery, or making use of the cemetery for any purpose connected with interments, every undertaker shall pay to the trustees an annual fee of two guineas, and shall at the time of making such payments give his assent in writing to such conditions as the trustees may deem fit to impose. Upon such assent being given, and payment of the fee, he shall receive a permit, in the form of Schedule C, to hold good until the first day of January following; and unless in the possession of such a permit, no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the cemetery.

10. Every coffin shall have upon the lid a lead or copper plate, with the name of the deceased and date of burial thereon.

11. Any person desiring ground in the cemetery for a private grave, tomb, vault, cenotaph, tombstone and railing, wall, or for any other purpose, shall apply to the trustees therefor. If approved, the trustees shall, on payment of the required fees, issue to such person so applying a grant of exclusive right of burial in the form specified in Schedule D; and such person or his executor may, with the consent of the trustees, assign this right to any other person on payment of a registration fee. See Schedules A and E.

12. No catacomb shall be allowed.

13. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery shall submit a plan of such monument, tombstone, or enclosure, and specify the materials of which it is to be composed, to the trustees, and shall obtain permission, in writing, before proceeding with the work, in the form of Schedule F.

14. Monumental masons and other tradesmen or any person, other than the sexton, employed to do any work in the cemetery shall before commencing such work deposit with the secretary to the trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if the provisions of these By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the secretary.

15. Any person who shall erect or place any monument or tombstone or enclosure upon any ground, the exclusive right of burial in which has not been obtained, shall keep the same in repair; and, if after receiving one month's notice in writing from the secretary to the trustees, such repairs are not effected, then the trustees may order such monument, etc., to be removed.

16. All materials required in the making, repairing, or completion of any work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and all refuse and rubbish and material remaining after any work is completed shall be removed from the cemetery at once and at the expense of the person causing the same.

17. Any person taking part in the dressing of or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules, namely:---

- (a.) No rubbish or any material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave or pathway, and if placed upon any adjoining ground, it shall be removed immediately after the completion of the work.
- (b.) No loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing graves.
- (c.) No grave shall be dressed in wet weather, except by special permission of the secretary, nor shall any materials be wheeled or carted along any path or road while the surface is soft by rain or otherwise.
- (d.) The work in all cases must be carried on with due despatch, and only in working hours.

18. Any workman or other employee, employed by the trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, when in the cemetery, be subject to the supervision, direction, and control of the secretary, and shall obey all such directions, and shall be removable from the cemetery upon any breach of the By-laws, or any refusal or neglect to comply with or obey such directions.

19. No bicycle or vehicle of any description shall be allowed in the cemetery, except the hearse, the horse. of which shall not be driven faster than a walking pace, nor anywhere, except on the roads. And, with the exception of these horses, no animals of any kind shall be allowed in the cemetery, except by the permission of the trustees.

20. No child under the age of ten years shall be admitted into the cemetery, except in charge of a responsible person.

21. No smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery, nor shall any explosives or fireworks be discharged therein except by special permission.

22. No person in the cemetery or its approaches shall committ any nuisance, or trespass, or be guilty of any breach of decorum, or cut, pluck, gather, or take out of the cemetery any flower, plant, shrub, or tree, or any part thereof, or do any injury whatsoever thereto, or to any plot, border, railing, fence, or any erection, or road, or remove or interfere with anything laid, built, or placed on any grave or plot or place; and any person so doing shall be proceeded against under the provisions of the Act.

23. No person shall promote or advertise, or carry on, within the cemetery or its precincts or approaches, any trade or business or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of cards or circulars, or otherwise, or any other system of advertisement whatever. to which such person may be subject. 25. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds, and in the case of a continuing breach, not exceeding one pound for every day during which such breach continues.

26. All fees may be recovered and all proceedings under these By-laws may be taken before two justices in petty sessions except when otherwise provided for.

27. The trustees shall meet in the months of February, May, August, and November for the ordinary transaction of business, and may be called to a meeting at any time by the chairman for any special purpose.

28. The secretary, as referred to in these By-laws, means the person for the time being employed by the trustees as such for the cemetery, and such a person shall, subject to the trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, and to the carrying out the enforcement of these By-laws, and the direction of such person shall in all cases and for all purposes be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the trustees.

29. A plan of the cemetery, showing the distribution, sections, and graves numbered, a register of burials, and grants of exclusive right of burial, shall be kept by the secretary.
