MUNICIPALITY OF COTTESLOE.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Cottesloe, made under Section 179 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 36, providing for a special roll of persons entitled to vote at a Referendum.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Cottesloe order as follows —

For the holding of a Referendum, a special roll shall be prepared by the Town Clerk, and corrected and completed, of owners appearing in the Rate Book, within fifteen days from time of demand, in the manner prescribed for in the form of Schedule A below, and every elector shall at every such election have a number of votes proportionate to the rateable value of the land owned by him, as set against his name on the roll, according to Schedule B hereunder:---

MUNICIPALITY OF COOLGARDIE.

By-law No. 119.

A By-law re Special Roll for Loan Poll.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Coolgardie made under Section 447 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 119, providing for a Special Roll of persons entitled to vote at a Loan Poll.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Coolgardie order as follows :-

1. When any demand shall have been duly made under Section 446 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Town Clerk shall forthwith prepare a special roll of the names of all persons who appear to him to be owners of rateable land within the meaning of the said Section 446.

The said roll shall be in the form of Schedule A, and shall be available for inspection by any ratepayer at the Town Clerk's office not later than thirteen days before the date fixed for the holding of the poll.

2. Persons whose names appear on the said special roll shall have a number of votes proportionate to the rateable value of the land owned by them within the meaning of the said Section 446 of the said Act as set against their names on the roll according to the scale set forth in Schedule B.

On or before the sixth day before the date fixed for the holding of the poll any person-

(a.) Whose name does not appear on such roll; or

(b.) Whose name appears on such roll and who is dissatisfied with such roll as not specifying a sufficient number of votes opposite his name:

may apply to the Town Clerk in one of the forms in Schedule C to have his name inserted on such roll, or to have the number of his votes increased as the case may be.

4. The Council at a meeting to be held for that purpose before the day fixed for the holding of the poll shall determine upon the validity of all such claims and shall make all corrections in the said roll necessary to give effect to such determination.

Any such meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

5. The determination upon the validity of claims shall be the majority of those present at the meeting or adjourned meeting, and in case of an equal division the Mayor or Chairman shall have a casting vote in addition to his deliberative vote.

The Council at any such meeting may also cor-6. o. The council at any such meeting may also cor-rect any mistake or supply any omission which may appear to the Council to have been made in the roll in respect of the name, place of abode, or description of any person included therein, or in respect of the description of any rateable property or the situation or rateable value thereof or rateable value thereof.

7. The Mayor or Chairman shall initial every addition or alteration to the roll; he shall also initial every page of the roll as completed, and shall cause to be written at the foot or end of the roll a certificate that the same has been revised and is correct, with the date thereof.

The Mayor or Chairman and not less than two other members of the Council shall severally sign such certificate.

8. Any owner whose name appears upon the special roll, and who does not reside within the Municipality of Coolgardie, may at any time before the date ap-pointed for the holding of the poll apply personally to the Returning Officer for a Postal Voting Paper.

The Returning Officer shall thereupon supply the same and shall make a mark against the name of the said owner upon the said roll.

Any owner who has applied for and received a 9. postal voting paper for the purpose of voting under Subsection 5 of Section 447 shall not be entitled to vote otherwise.

MUNICIPALITY OF COOLGARDIE.

By-law No. 120.

To regulate the Carrying of Lights on all Vehicles.

WHEREAS by virtue of the provisions of "The Muni-cipal Corporations Act, 1906," Sections 179 and 181, the Municipality of Coolgardie is empowered to make, alter, or repeal By-laws for any of the purposes of the said Act. It is therefore ordered by the Municipality said Act. It is therefore ordered by the Municipality of Coolgardie that the By-law dealing with the lights to be carried by vehicles, No. 95, passed on the 27th day of August, 1903, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th of November, 1903, is hereby re-pealed, and that the following By-law shall, from and after the approval thereof by the Governor and publi-cation in the *Government Gazette*, have the force of law within the said district: within the said district:-

Interpretation.

1. In these By-laws the following terms shall have the meaning set out against them respectively, that is to say :-

- (a.) "Cycle" means and includes a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede, or motor cycle.
- (b.) "Motor Car" means and includes any motor car, automobile, motor carriage, or other carriage or vehicle propelled either partly or wholly by any volatile spirit or electricity, or by any means other than animal power.
- (c.) "Vehicle" means any cart, dray, lorry, car-riage, van, omnibus, trap, hand cart, or other conveyance whatsoever, with or without springs.
- (d.) "Portable Engine" means any steam lorry, traction or other engine on its own wheels, and includes a street roller whether driven by steam or horsepower.
- (e.) "Trailer" means any vehicle, motor car, or portable engine attached to or hauled or drawn by another vehicle, motor car, or portable engine.

It shall be unlawful between sunset and sunrise for any person to ride, drive or impel, haul or place on any person to ride, drive or impel, haul or place on any road any cycle, motor car, vehicle, portable engine, or trailer unless a lamp or lamps as hereinafter pre-scribed is or are attached to the cycle, motor car, vehicle, portable engine, or trailer, exhibiting a light or lights as hereinafter prescribed kept continually burn-ing sufficient to afford clear and adequate means of signalling the approach or position of the cycle, motor car, vehicle, portable engine, or trailer.

Cycles.

One lamp attached to the front of the cycle, and exhibiting a white light in the direction in which the cycle is proceeding or is intended to proceed.

Hand carts.

One lamp attached to the front of the hand cart and exhibiting a white light in the direction in which the hand cart is proceeding or is intended to proceed.

Vehicles other than hand carts.

One or two lamps attached to the front of the vehicle and exhibiting a white light or white lights in the direc-tion in which the vehicle is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and if only one such lamp it shall be attached to the "off" or "right" side of the vehicle.

Motor cars.

At least two lamps attached to the front of the motor car, one to be affixed on each side of the motor car, and exhibiting white lights in the direction in which car, and motor car is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and one lamp attached to the back of the motor car and exhibiting a red light from the rear of the motor car and throwing a white light on the number of the car.

$Portable \ engines.$

Two lamps attached to the front of the portable engine, one to be affixed on each side of the portable engine, and exhibiting white lights in the direction in which the portable engine is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and one lamp attached to the front of the portable engine, between the white lights, and exhibit-ing a green light in the direction in which the engine is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and one lamp attached to the back of the portable engine and exhibiting a green light from the rear of the portable $% \left({\left({n_{\rm en}} \right)} \right)$ engine.

Trailers.

Similar lights as would be required to be attached if the vehicle was driven or impelled.

Any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Re alteration in character of the light at Muttum Point.

NOTICE is hereby given that the present dioptric first order white fixed light exhibited on a rocky promontory, 300 yards from the sea at Muttum Point, West Coast of India, will be extinguished on or after the 1st July next and that, in its place, in the same locality, and with the same magnetic bearings, a dioptric second-order single flashing white light showing one flash every inve seconds (the power of the light being about 200,000 candles), will be exhibited from the 1st September next. The light will, after alteration, be as before 141 feet above H.W.L., and be visible in clear weather at a distance of 18 miles.

During the interval a temporary fixed white light of less intensity than the existing one will be shown from the existing lantern.

The dates given are only approximate, and further information will be issued later on giving the exact dates of extinguishing and re-lighting.

DERBY CEMETERY RESERVE. By-laws for governing same:

1. That all fees and charges payable to the trustees in accordance with Schedule A shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.

2. That any person desiring ground in the Cemetery for a private grave, tombstone, and railing, or for any other purpose, shall apply to the trustees. If approved, the trustees, on payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person se applying a certificate of right of burial in the form specified in Schedule B.

3. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery shall make application to the trustees, and if approved shall obtain permission in writing, in the form of Schedule D, before proceeding with the work.

4. Every person who has the exclusive right of burial in any grave shall keep such grave, and any crection thereon, in proper repair, and if after receiving notice in writing from the trustees, requiring such repairs to be executed, shall fail to do so, then after the expiration of 28 days the trustees may cause such repairs to be executed, and may recover the cost thereof from such person before any two justices in petty sessions.

5. (a.) That all applications for interment shall be made to the secretary of the trustees, and six working hours shall be given to the sexton prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge will be made.

(b.) The name, age, and other particulars of the deceased shall be furnished when giving the order, as in Schedule C.

6. That every coffin shall have upon the lid a plate, with the name of deceased and date of death thereon.

7. Every grave shall be at least five feet deep for adults and four feet for infants.

8. That in case of application for interment in any private grave to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given with the application.

9. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in the Cemetery without an order for burial being obtained from the secretary of the trustees, in the form of Schedule C, and delivered to the sexton of the Cemetery.

10. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—On week days throughout the year, from 8 a.m. to ℓ p.m.; on Sundays throughout the year, from 9 a.m. to 10 a.m., and from 12 noon to 5 p.m.

11. That no burial shall be allowed to take place before or after the hours above mentioned, except by special permission and upon payment of the fee for burials not in the usual hours.

12. That the time stated in Schedule C for any burial shall be the time for the funeral to be at the Cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

13. That every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance, and thence follow the sexton to the grave. No bicycle, velocipede, carriage, or vehicle, except hearses and mourning coaches shall be permitted to pass the said entrance. Horses shall not be driven faster than at a walking pace, and no horses or other animals shall be ridden through the cemetery.

14. That every erection shall be placed upon proper foundations, and if required by the Trustees, shall extend to the bottom of the grave. All refuse and rubbish and material remaining after any work is completed shall be removed from the Cemetery at once, and at the expense of the person causing the same.

15. All materials required in the making, repairing, or completion of any work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the Cemetery.

16. That no catacombs shall be allowed.

17. That any workmen employed by the Trustees, or by any other person, shall, at all times while in the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision, direction, and control of the Surveyor, comply with or obey the direction of the officer, and shall be removable from the Cemetery upon any breach of the by-laws, or any refusal or neglect to comply with or obey the directions of the officer.

18. Any person taking part in the dressing or attending to any graves shall comply with the following rules, namely:—

- (a.) That no rubbish or any material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave or pathway, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately after completion of work.
- (b.) That uo loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing graves.
- (c.) That no graves shall be dressed in wet weather, except by special permission of the Surveyor, nor shall any material be wheeled or carted along any path or road while the surface is soft with rain or otherwise. Work in all cases must be carried on with due despatch, and only in working hours.

19. No child under the age of 10 years shall be admitted into the Cemetery, except in charge of a responsible person.

20. That no smoking shall be allowed within the Cemetery, nor shall any explosives or fireworks be discharged therein, except by special permission, and in case of a military funeral.

21. That every driver of a hearse or mourning coach, and every pedestrian, shall keep strictly to the roadways and paths as laid out respectively, and vehicles shall only be turned at points where provision for doing so is made.

22. That no animals other than horses drawing hearses or mourning coaches shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery. No dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery; any found therein shall be liable to be destroyed.

23. That no person in the Cemetery, or in its approaches, shall commit any nuisance or trespass, or be guilty of any breach of decorum, or cut, pluck, gather, or take out of the Cemetery any flower, plant, shrub, or tree, or any part thereof, or do any injury whatsoever thereto, or to any plot, border, railing, fence, or any erection or road, or remove or interfere with anything laid, built, or placed upon any grave or plot, or space, and any person so doing shall be guilty of a breach of this by-law, and, on conviction, be liable to a penalty as hereinafter provided for.

24. That no person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery, or its precincts or approaches, any trade or business or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of cards or circulars, or otherwise, or any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

25. The Secretary or Surveyor, as referred to in these by-laws, means the person for the time being employed by the Trustees as such for the Cemetery, and such person or persons shall, subject to the Trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, and to carry out the enforcement of these by-laws; and the direction of such person or persons shall in all cases and for these purposes be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the Trustees.

26. That all fees not paid may be recovered, and all proceedings under these by-laws taken before any two Justices in Petty Sessions, except where otherwise provided for.

27. That any person committing a breach of any of these by-laws shall be proceeded against, and shall be liable, on conviction, to such penalties as are hereinafter provided for.

28. That a plan of the Cemetery showing the distributive sections, blocks, graves numbered, a register of burials, certificates of right of burials shall be kept at the office of the Trustees.

29. That the officiating minister at any burial shall be given at least six hours' notice prior to the time stated for such burial.

30. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing by-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in case of a continuing breach, not exceeding One pound for every day during which such breach continues.
