## BY-LAW OF THE GERALDTON LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

Whereas by "The Health Act, 1898," and the Acts amending the same, the Local Board of Health has power topmake By-laws: Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in the said Act and the Acts amending the same, the Geraldton Local Board of Health doth hereby make the following addition to By-law 17, compelling the use of deodorants in closets and urinals: -

(g.) The occupier of every house or premises shall cause to be kept, in every closet belonging thereto, a receptacle containing either ashes, dry earth, lime, sawdust, or other disinfectant approved of by the Board, and shall cause all night-soil or other matter which may be deposited in the pan used in connection with such closet to be immediately deodorised with a sufficient quantity of such disinfectant. Re alteration in character of the light at Muttum Point.

NOTICE is hereby given that the present dioptric first order white fixed light exhibited on a rocky promontory, 300 yards from the sea at Muttum Point, West Coast of India, will be extinguished on or after the 1st July next and that, in its place, in the same locality, and with the same magnetic bearings, a dioptric second-order single flashing white light showing one flash every nve seconds (the power of the light being about 200,000 candles), will be exhibited from the 1st September next. The light will, after alteration, be as before 141 feet above H.W.L., and be visible in clear weather at a distance of 18 miles.

During the interval a temporary fixed white light of less intensity than the existing one will be shown from the existing lantern.

The dates given are only approximate, and further information will be issued later on giving the exact dates of extinguishing and re-lighting.

1.18 Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following addition to Regulation 97, and new Regulation 70A, under "the Mining Act, 1904," as set forth hereunder; to take effect from 1st April, 1909.

Add to Regulation 97 the following words:-

Provided that it shall be unlawful for the holder of any mining tenement (other than a Water Right) within the water area set apart under "The Goldfields Water Supply Act, 1902," or within any water area declared under "The Water Boards Act, 1904." to seli water without the consent of the Minister, in writing, being first obtained.

# REGULATION 70A.

If the holder of a residence or business area is convicted of selling liquor contrary to the provisions of any Act in force for the time being to regulate the sale of intoxicating liquor, the Minister may in his absolute discretion, and without any further proof of or inquiry into the offence, declare the area forfeited and direct the cancellation of the registration thereof, and thereupon the area shall be forfeited accordingly.
