#### BOULDER LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

WHEREAS by "The Health Act, 1898," and "The Health Act Amendment Act, 1900," a Local Board of Health may make by laws, and whereas by the prowisions of the last named Act a Local Board may ancnd, repeal, or alter any by-laws so made: Now, therefore, the Boulder Local Board of Health doth re-peal and amend its by-laws as follows:---

India-West Coast-Arabian Sea. Re alteration in character of the light at Muttum Point.

NOTICE is hereby given that the present dioptric first crater white fixed light exhibited on a rocky promontory. 300 yards from the sea at Muttum Point, West Coast of India, will be extinguished on or after the 1st July next and that, in its place, in the same locality. and with the same magnetic bearings, a dioptric secondorder single flashing white light showing one flash every nve seconds (the power of the light being about 200,000 candles), will be exhibited from the 1st September next. The light will, after alteration, be as before 141 feet above H.W.L., and be visible in clear weather at a distance of 18 miles.

During the interval a temporary fixed white light of less intensity than the existing one will be shown from the existing lantern.

The dates given are only approximate, and further information will be issued later on giving the exact dates of extinguishing and re-lighting.

### Amendment of Boundaries.

#### Department of Lands and Surveys Perth, 30th April, 1909.

H1S Excellency the Lieut.-Governor in Excentive Council has been pleased to approve of the following boundaries of the Townsite of Bridgetown, in lieu of those published in the *Government Gazette* of the 4th of October, 1907, which are, together with all previous gazettals, hereby cancelled, and has also been pleased to set apart the Crown lands within such boundaries as Town and Suburbar: as Town and Suburban :-

Bounded by lines starting from the South-West corner of Nelson Location 665, and extending Easterly along its South boundary and that of Location 662 to the North-East corner of Lot 618; thence South along the East boundaries of Lots 618 and 621 to the Northern boundary of Location 199, and West and South res-pectively along its North and West boundaries to its South-West corner; thence South-Westward and South along the Eastern side of May Street and the Western boundaries of Locations 1101, 273, 1102, and 234 to the latter's South-West corner, and along its Southern boundary to the South-West corner of Location 235; thence South to the South side of Tweed Road (No. 497), and along it North-Westerly to the East corner of Subbrban Lot 28; thence West along the South bound-aries of Suburban Lots 28 to 35, inclusive, to the North-West corner of Location 44, South to the North bound-ary of Location 656, and along it West to the Eastern side of the Balbarrup Road; thence Southerly along said side of road to the South-West corner of Location 980 (Reserve 4334); thence Northerly and Westerly along the Western side of Moriarty Street and South side of Shepherd Street to the East boundary of Suburb-an Lot 595; thence & South and West passing along the Bounded by lines starting from the South-West corner side of Shepherd Street to the East boundary of Suburb-an Lot 595; thence South and West passing along the East and the South boundaries of Suburban Lots 595 and 641 to the latter's South-West corner; thence West, passing along the South boundary of Suburban Lot 589 to the Eastern side of Grange Road, and along it South-Westerly to a point South of the South-West corner of Suburban Lot 588; thence Northerly, passing along the West boundaries of said Lot 588 and Suburban 587, 586, and 643 to the South side of Road No. 1654; thence Easterly along part of the said side of road to the East boundary of Location 1010; thence North to the right bank of the Blackwood River, and along said bank downwards to a point South of the South-West corner of Location 1040; thence North to the said rorner, and South-Easterly along the Northern side of Peninsula Road to the South-East corner of Location side of Shepherd Street to the East boundary of Suburb-Peninsula Road to the South-East corner of Location 296, and Easterly along the South boundaries of Loca-tions 296, 227, and 295 to the West boundary of Loca-tion 665 aforesaid; and thence South along said bound-ary to the starting point.
