WHEREAS by Section 219 of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900" (64 Vict., No. 8), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the Government Gazetie, to declare any land reserved used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Pro-clamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force: And whereas the North Perth Municipal Council has requested that certain land named and described in the Schedule hereunder which has been used for a street or way within the Municipality of North Perth, be declared a public highway: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land shall, from the date of this Proclamation. be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

CITY OF PERTH.

By-law No. 2.

Amendment.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Mayor and Councillors of the City of Perth do hereby amend By-law No. 2, regulating licensed vehicles, as follows:—

- 1. Part I. of Schedule B to the said By-law No. 2 is hereby amended by inserting, between the fourth and fifth paragraphs in such schedule, the words and figures following:
 - "A stand on the Western side of William Street beginning at a point 33 feet South of the Southern side of Hay Street, and extending Southwards 20 feet."
- Part II. of Schedule B to the said By-law No. 2 is hereby repealed, and the following schedule is substituted in lieu thereof:-
 - A stand on the Northern side of Wellington Street, beginning at a point 72 feet West of the Western side of Barrack Street, and extending Westwards 130 feet.
 - A stand on the Northern side of Wellington Street, beginning at a point 364 feet West of the Western side of Barrack Street, and extending Westwards 122 feet.
 - A stand on the Northern side of Wellington Street, beginning at a point 575 feet West of the Western side of Barrack Street, and extending Westwards 118 feet.
 - A stand on the Northern side of Wellington Street, beginning at a point 81 feet East of the East-ern side of William Street, and extending Eastwards 60 feet.
 - A stand on the Northern side of Wellington Street, beginning at a point 163 feet East of the East-ern side of William Street, and extending Eastwards 122 feet.
 - A stand on the Northern side of Murray Street, beginning at a point 22 feet West of the Western side of Barrack Street, and extending Westwards 40 feet.
 - A stand on the Southern side of Murray Street, beginning at the Eastern side of William beginning at the Eastern side of Wi Street, and extending Eastwards 40 feet.

CITY OF PERTH.

By-law No. 31.

Amendment.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Mayor and Councillors of the City of Perth do hereby amend By-law No. 31, regulating hawking and movable or temporarily fixed stalls, as follows:-

- Section 9 of the said By-law is amended by the addition of the following stands for hawkers:
 - A stand on the Northern side of Wellington Street, beginning at a point 30 feet West of the Western side of Barrack Street, and extending Westwards 42 feet.
 - A stand on the Northern side of Wellington Street, beginning at a point 342 feet West of the Western side of Barrack Street, and extending Westwards 22 feet.
 - A stand on the Northern side of Wellington Street, beginning at a point 486 feet West of the Western side of Barrack Street, and extending Westwards 34 feet.
 - A stand on the Northern side of Wellington Street, beginning at a point 530 feet West of the Western side of Barrack Street, and extending Westwards 30 feet.
 - A stand on the Northern side of Wellington Street, beginning at a point 66 feet East of the East-ern side of William Street, and extending Eastwards 15 feet.
 - A stand on the Southern side of Wellington Street, beginning at the Western side of William Street, and extending Westwards 20 feet.
 - A stand on the Eastern side of William Street, beginning at a point 12 feet North of the Northern side of Hay Street, and extending Northwards 40 feet.
 - A stand on the Northern side of Murray Street, beginning at the Eastern side of William Street, and extending Eastwards 34 feet.
 - A stand on the Southern side of Murray Street, beginning at a point 10 feet West of the West-ern side of Barrack Street, and extending Westwards 33 feet.
 - A stand on the Southern side of Murray Street, beginning at a point 12 feet East of the East-ern side of Barrack Street, and extending Eastwards 33 feet.
- 2. The following sections are added to the said Bylaw:
- (a.) No person shall hawk or be licensed to hawk any kind of merchandise, including fish, in that portion of the Municipality described as Zone 1 in Section 3 of By-law No. 31, except with a wheeled vehicle.
- (b.) Every hawker taking up a position on a stand shall take up such position thereon as shall be allotted to him by the Traffic Inspector.
- 9. (c.) No hawker shall take up a position or allow his vehicle to be or remain upon any stand except between the hours of seven, a.m., and half-past eleven, p.m.
- 9. (d.) No hawker whilst upon any stand shall deposit or store any box or basket under his vehicle or on the roadway or footpath.
- 9. (c.) No hawker whilst upon any stand shall shout his wares or make any violent outery, noise, or dis-turbance to the annoyance of the inhabitants of the City or of persons passing by.
- (f.) Every hawker taking up a position on a stand shall place and keep his vehicle parallel to the kerb, and in such a position that the distance between the kerb and his vehicle shall not exceed one foot.
- (g.) No hawker whilst upon any stand shall place or allow to remain upon his vehicle any flag or streamer.
- 3. Part I. of Schedule B of the said By-law No. 31 is amended by striking out the following words and figures, viz.:-
 - "3. For a license to hawk with hand-basket, tray, bundle, bag, or package, 10s."

MUNICIPAL BY-LAW.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to confirm the following By-law, made by the Council of the Municipality of Claremont.

BY-LAW No. 17.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Claremont, made under Section 179 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 17, for regulating the lights to be exhibited by all vehicles.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Claremont order as follows:-

Interpretation.

- 1. In these By-laws the following terms shall have the meaning set out against them respectively, that is to say:
 - "Cycle" means and includes a bicycle, tri-(a.) cycle, or other velocipede, or motor cycle.
 (b.) "Motor Car" means and includes any motor
 - car, automobile, motor carriage, or other carriage or vehicle propelled either partly or wholly by any volatile spirit or electricity, or by any means other than animal power.
 - (c.) "Vehicle" means any cart, dray, lorry, carriage, van, omnibus, trap, hand-eart, or other whatsoever, with or without conveyance springs.
 - (d.) "Portable Engine" means any steam lorry, traction or other engine or machine on its own wheels, and includes a street roller whether driven by steam or horse power.
 - (e.) "Trailer" means any vehicle, motor car, or portable engine attached to or hauled or drawn by another vehicle, motor car, or portable engine.
- 2. It shall be unlawful between sunset and sunrise for any person to ride, drive, impel, haul, or place on any road, any cycle, motor car, vehicle, portable engine, or trailer unless a lamp or lamps as hereinafter prescribed is or are attached to the cycle, motor car, vehicle, portable engine, or trailer, exhibiting a light or lights as hereinafter prescribed kept continually burning sufficient to afford clear and adequate means of signalling the approach or position of the cycle, motor car, vehicle. the approach or position of the cycle, motor car, vehicle, portable engine, or trailer.

Cycles.

One lamp attached to the front of the cycle and exhibiting a white light in the direction in which the cycle is proceeding as its interval to is proceeding or is intended to proceed.

Hand Carts.

One lamp attached to the front of the hand cart and exhibiting a white light in the direction in which the hand cart is proceeding or intended to proceed.

Vehicles other than hand carts.

One or two lamps attached to the front of the vehicle and exhibiting a white light or white lights in the direction in which the vehicle is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and if only one such lamp it shall be attached on the "off" or "right" side of the

Motor Cars.

At least two lamps attached to the front of the motor ar east two lamps attached to the front of the motor car, one to be affixed on each side of the motor car, and exhibiting white lights in the direction in which the motor car is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and one lamp attached to the back of the motor car and exhibiting a red light from the rear of the motor car and throwing a white light on the number of the car.

Portable Engines.

Two lamps attached to the front of the portable engine, one to be affixed on each side of the portable engine, and exhibiting white lights in the direction in which the portable engine is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and one lamp attached to the front of the

portable engine between the white lights exhibiting a green light in the direction in which the engine is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and one lamp attached to the back of the portable engine and exhibiting a green light from the rear of the portable engine.

Trailers.

Similar lights as would be required to be attached if the vehicle was driven or impelled.

Any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

The above By-laws were passed at a meeting of the Claremont Municipality on the 8th day of February, 1909.

IN connexion with pediodical exercises or manœuvres, or in the event of relations becoming strained between Great Britain and any Naval Power, an Examination Service may come into force at the ports or localities mentioned at the end of this notice.

Masters are warned that before attempting to enter masters are warned that before attempting to enter any of these ports they must, in their own interests, strictly obey all instructions given to them by the vessels which will be charged with the duty of examining ships desiring to enter the ports, and allotting positions in which the ships shall anchor. In case of fog they should on no account attempt to enter before receiving permission from the Examination Officer.

The institution of an Examination Service at any port will never be publicly advertised, but at all times when the relations of Great Britain with foreign powers are known to be in a state of tension, especial care should be taken in approaching the ports, by day or by night, to keep a sharp look-out for the Examination steamer, and to be ready to "bring to" at once when hailed by her or warned by the firing of a gun.

If the entrance to a port is closed three red vertical lights by night, or three red balls by day, will be exhibited in some conspicuous position, in or near to its approach, and as far as possible notice of this fact will be given by look-out vessels in the offing.

If the Examination Service is in force the Examination steamer will be distinguished at night-

SUBSIDIES ON SHIPMENTS OF LEAD ORES.

SUBJECT to the following conditions, subsidies will be granted to shippers of lead ores at the rates herein stated, for one year from the date hereof, viz.:—

- 1. Such ore shall be the produce of mines in the State of Western Australia situated north of the Tropic of Capricorn, and shall be shipped from ports in the said State lying north of the said Tropic to any other ports within or without the Commonwealth of Australia.
- 2. The owner of the ore shall send notice to the Department of Mines, Perth, of his intention to ship ore and claim subsidy thereon, and of the probable quantity to be shipped and date of shipment, at least three weeks before each shipment, and forthwith after shipment shall forward to the said Department a duplicate copy of the bill of lading and a full statement of the gross and net quantity of ore shipped, its assay value for base and precious metals therein contained, and its estimated net value at the port of shipment, together with any other information which may be from time to time called for by the said Department relative to the cost of mining and marketing and value of such ore.
- 3. The owner shall, before or forthwith after each shipment of ore, forward to the Department of Mines at Perth a fair sample of such ore for assay purposes, of not less than two pounds weight. The sample shall be a fair average sample of the parcel of ore shipped,

and shall be taken by the owner in accordance with ore-buyers' practice approved by the State Mining Engineer.

- 4. No subsidy shall be payable (a) on any parcel of ore of less weight than five tons, or (b) on any ore the gross value of which, taking the metals contained according to assay at the current prices in London for the week of shipment, exceeds £13 per ton, or (c) on any ore of a gross assay value of less than £6 per ton, unless the Minister is satisfied that such ore is marketable with reasonable expectation of realising enough to cover expenses of shipment, treatment, and sale.
- 5. The total amount of subsidy payable shall not exceed an average disbursement of £50 per month, and claims will be paid in order or priority of shipment. The Minister shall decide and apportion the amounts payable to various claimants in the event of the claims exceeding the amount of subsidy available.
- 6. When the price of lead in London is £13 12s. 6d. a ton, the subsidy payable shall be 5s. per net ton of ore, but shall be decreased at the rate of one shilling and eightpence per ton for every two shillings and sixpence that the price of the metal rises above £13 12s. 6d., until no subsidy is payable. The subsidy shall be increased at the rate of fourpence per ton for every two shillings and sixpence that the price of the metal falls below £13 12s. 6d. per ton until the maximum subsidy of seven shillings per ton of ore is reached; beyond which amount no subsidy shall be payable.
- 7. The price of lead on which the subsidy is based shall be the average quotation for soft, foreign lead for the week in which shipment is made, as given in George Smith & Son's weekly reports or other published list of London metal market prices approved by the Minister.
- 8. Accounts for subsidy shall be rendered in triplicate on Treasury Form No. 10, and shall be endorsed by the claimant with a statutory declaration that all particulars contained therein are true and correct.
- 9. Copies of all account sales, showing the particulars of sale and all expenses in connection therewith of each parcel of ore, shall be furnished by the owner to the Department of Mines immediately after receipt of same by the said owner, and all payments of subsidy shall be subject to final adjustments in accordance with the figures of net tonnage and assay value on which the parcel is sold, if these are found to make material difference in the amount payable as reckoned from the shipper's statement of weights and value.
- 10. The Minister or any person deputed by him shall have full power and authority to settle finally any question as to the meaning of the foregoing conditions, and from time to time to make such other conditions, not inconsistent therewith, as may seem to him necessary fer fuller explanation thereof in order to carry out the intention of the Government in providing the subsidies.

I beg to state, for the information and approval of the Hon, the Minister, having held a preliminary inquiry into the circumstances attending the stranding of the s.s. ''Koombana,'' in Sharks Bay, on the morning of the 15th March, 1909.

The 'Koombana' is a single-screw steamer, 3668 tons gross, and 2182 tons net register, official number 122723; owned and registered by the Adelaide Steamship Company of Adelaide.

After taking the evidence of the Master, Captain John Rees, who holds a Board of Trade Foreign-going Certificate, No. 444, issued at Adelaide; Henry John Clark, the Chief Officer, who holds a Board of Trade Master's Foreign-going Certificate, No. 480, issued at Sydney; William Joly Shimmins, Second Engineer, holding a Board of Trade Chief Engineer's Certificate, No. 36619, issued at Dublin; and Morris Griffiths, Quartermaster, I have to report:—

- 1. The s.s. 'Koombana' sailed from Fremantle on the 12th March, for Derby via ports, and rounded Cape Levillain at 3 a.m., March 15th, and steered the usual course for Heirisson Flat Buoy (the outer or Westerly mark for the entrance to the Channel leading to Denham) painted red.
- 2. At 7.10 a.m., when nearing the channel, the Westernmost black buoy marking the North side of the Channel was sighted, but the morning being hazy, together with the rising sun, gave the buoy a red appearance, which led the Master, also the Chief Officer who was present on the bridge, to conclude the ship had made her course good from off Cape Levillain and that the buoy in sight was the red one marking the North end of meirisson Flats, and a course was shaped for the Channel accordingly, the result being that the ship grounded on a small isolated patch of sand, having a least depth of 14 feet over it, the ship's draught being approximately 16 feet 10 inches.
- 3. Some twenty minutes before sighting the buoy a leadsman was placed in the chains, and the lead was kept going till the buoy was sighted. The engines were also stopped immediately prior to picking up the buoy, and when the buoy was sighted the engines were ordered full speed, and the vessel took the ground about ten minutes after the order was given.
- 4. Every endeavour was made, with the appliances to hand, to refloat the vessel, but without success, until the s.s. 'Winfield'' rendered assistance. The bottom being soft sand and the water smooth, the vessel sustained no damage.

My finding is:-

- (a.) The s.s. 'Koombana,'' whilst on a Coasting trip from Fremantle to Derby via Ports, grounded in the vicinity of the entrance to the channel leading to Denham.
- (b.) That the grounding was caused by the Master mistaking the Mark buoy in North side in the channel for the outer or Westerly buoy.
- (c.) Under the circumstances owing to the haze preventing the Master from verifying his position by bearings from the headlands, and the fact that the lead would give little warning of the approach to shoal waters, more care should have been exercised when approaching Bar Flats, and the speed of the ship reduced to "slow" until the vessel's position had been definitely ascertained.
- (d.) Considering the past good record of the Master and the fact that the vessel did not sustain any injury, I recommend that no further action be taken.
