WHEREAS by Section 39 of "The Aborigines Act, 1905" (5th Edward VIL, No. 14), the Governor may by Proclamation, whenever in the interests of the Abor-igines he thinks fit, declare any municipal district or town or any other place to be an area in which it shall be unlawful for Aborigines or Half-castes not in lawful emuloyment to be or remain. Now therefore L Six employment to be or remain: Now, therefore I, Sir Edward Albert Stone, Knight, Lieutenant-Governor as aforesaid, by and with the advice of the Executive Couneil, do hereby declare the land included within the following boundaries to be an area in which it shall be unlawful for Aborigines or Half-castes not in lawful employment to be or remain :-

Starting from Cliff Point, situate in La Grange Bay, thence 150 chains South; thence Westerly to Tryon Point; thence along the seashore to the starting point.

WHEREAS by Sections 222 and 227 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by

notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a pub-lic highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force: And whereas the North Perth Municipal Council has requested that certain land named Municipal Council has requested that certain land named and described in the Schedule hereunder which has been used for a street or way within the Municipality of North Perth, be declared a public highway: Now there-fore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Procla-mation declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

 - For every such horse, ass, or bull, in the night time, not less than £3 nor more than £5. For every other head of eattle by night or day, not exceeding twenty shillings.

For trespass on a public street or thoroughfare in the Municipality, or in any enclosed public cemetery: -For every entire horse, ass, or bull, not less than £3

- nor more than £5.
 - For every other head of cattle, not exceeding forty shillings.

Poundage Fees.

1s. 6d. per head on all horses, cattle, calves, and foals; bulls and stallions, 3s. per head.

Sustenance.

- 3s. 6d. per diem of 24 hours on all horses, cattle, calves and foals.
- 1s. 9d. per diem of 12 hours on all horses, eattle, ealves, and foals. 6s. per diem of 24 hours on all stallions and bulls.
- 3s. 6d. per diem of 12 hours on all stallions and bulls.

IN connexion with pediodical exercises or manœuvres, or in the event of relations becoming strained between Great Britain and any Naval Power, an Examination Service may come into force at the ports or localities mentioned at the end of this notice.

Masters are warned that before attempting to enter any of these ports they must, in their own interests, strictly obey all instructions given to them by the vessels which will be charged with the duty of examining ships desiring to enter the ports, and allotting positions in which the ships shall anchor. In case of fog they should on no account attempt to enter before receiving permis-sion from the Examination Officer.

The institution of an Examination Omcer. The institution of an Examination Service at any port will never be publicly advertised, but at all times when the relations of Great Britain with foreign powers are known to be in a state of tension, especial care should be taken in approaching the ports, by day or by night, to keep a sharp look-out for the Examination steamer, and to be ready to "bring to" at once when hailed by her or warned by the firing of a gun.

If the entrance to a port is closed three red vertical lights by night, or three red balls by day, will be ex-hibited in some conspicuous position, in or near to its approach, and as far as possible notice of this fact will be given by look-out vessels in the offing.

If the Examination Service is in force the Examination steamer will be distinguished at night-

(a.) When the port is closed, by three red vertical lights.

(b.) When the port is open, by three white vertical

. lights. The pilots attached to the ports will be acquainted with the regulations to be followed.

Section 8 of By-law No. 25, regulating the erection of hoardings on private property, is hereby repealed, and the following section is substituted in lieu thereof:—

8. The fee for a license under this By-law shall be at the rate of twopence for every superficial yard comprised in such hoarding, provided that the minimum fee for a license shall be ten shillings.
