#### MUNICIPAL BY-LAW.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, 4th June, 1909. HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to confirm the following By-law, made by the Council of the Municipality of Menzies.

#### BY-LAW No. 16.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Menzies, made under Section 179 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 16, for regulating the lights to be exhibited by all vehicles.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Menzies order as follows:-

# Interpretation.

- 1. In these By-laws the following terms shall, have the meaning set out against them respectively, that is to say: -
  - (a.) "Cycle" means and includes a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede, or motor cycle.
  - (b.) "Motor Car" means and includes any motor car, automobile, motor carriage, or other carriage or vehicle propelled either partly or wholly by any volatile spirit or electricity, or by any means other than animal power.
  - (c.) "Vehicle" means any cart, dray, lorry, carriage, van, omnibus, trap, hand-cart, or other conveyance whatsoever, with or without springs.
  - (d.) "Portable Engine" means any steam lorry, traction or other engine or machine on its own wheels, and includes a street roller
  - whether driven by steam or horse power.

    (e.) "Trailer" means any vehicle, motor car, or portable engine attached to or hauled or drawn by another vehicle, motor car, or portable engine.
- 2. It shall be unlawful between sunset and sunrise for any person to ride, drive, impel, haul, or place on any road any cycle, motor car, vehicle, portable engine, or trailer unless a lamp or lamps as hereinafter prescribed is or are attached to the cycle, motor car, vehicle, portable engine, or trailer, exhibiting a light relighted to be expected. or lights as hereinafter prescribed kept continually burning sufficient to afford clear and adequate means of signalling the approach or position of the cycle, motor car, vehicle, portable engine, or trailer.

# Cycles.

One lamp attached to the front of the cycle and exhibiting a white light in the direction in which the cycle is proceeding or is intended to proceed.

#### Hand Carts.

One lamp attached to the front of the hand cart and exhibiting a white light in the direction in which the hand cart is proceeding or intended to proceed.

#### Vehicles other than hand carts.

One or two lamps attached to the front of the vehicle and exhibiting a white light or white lights in the direction in which the vehicle is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and if only one such lamp it shall be attached on the "off" or "right" side of the vehicle.

#### Motor Cars.

At least two lamps attached to the front of the motor car, one to be affixed on each side of the motor motor car, one to be affixed on each side of the motor car, and exhibiting white lights in the direction in which the motor car is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and one lamp attached to the back of the motor car and exhibiting a red light from the rear of the motor car and throwing a white light on the number of the car.

#### Portable Engines.

Two lamps attached to the front of the portable engine, one to be affixed on each side of the portable engine, and exhibiting white lights in the direction in which the portable engine is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and one lamp attached to the front of the portable engine between the white lights exhibiting a green light in the direction in which the engine is proceeding or is intended to proceed and one lamp attached to proceed and one lamp attached to proceed and one lamp at the proceed a ceeding or is intended to proceed, and one lamp attached to the back of the portable engine and exhibiting a green light from the rear of the portable engine.

Similar lights as would be required to be attached if the vehicle was driven or impelled.

Any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Caution when approaching Australian Ports.

(The bearings are magnetic, and those concerning the visibility of lights are given from seaward.) THE following Notice, which has been received from the Naval Board, is published for the information of mariners and others concerned.

Melbourne, 23rd March, 1909.

IN connexion with periodical exercises or manœuvres, or in the event of relations becoming strained between Great Britain and any Naval Power, an Examination Service may come into force at the ports or localities mentioned at the end of this notice.

Masters are warned that before attempting to enter any of these ports they must, in their own interests, strictly obey all instructions given to them by the vessels which will be charged with the duty of examining ships desiring to enter the ports, and allotting positions in which the ships shall anchor. In case of fog they should on no account attempt to enter before receiving permission from the Examination Officer.

The institution of an Examination Service at any port will never be publicly advertised, but at all times when the relations of Great Britain with foreign powers are known to be in a state of tension, especial care should be taken in approaching the ports, by day or by night, to keep a sharp look-out for the Examination steamer, and to be ready to "bring to" at once when hailed by her or warned by the firing of a gun.

If the entrance to a port is closed three red vertical lights by night, or three red balls by day, will be exhibited in some conspicuous position, in or near to its approach, and as far as possible notice of this fact will be given by look-out vessels in the offing.

If the Examination Service is in force the Examination steamer will be distinguished at night-

- (a.) When the port is closed, by three red vertical lights.
- (b.) When the port is open, by three white vertical lights.

The pilots attached to the ports will be acquainted with the regulations to be followed.

SUBSIDIES ON SHIPMENTS OF LEAD ORES. SUBJECT to the following conditions, subsidies will be granted to shippers of lead ores at the rates herein stated, for one year from the date hereof, viz.:—

- 1. Such ore shall be the produce of mines in the State of Western Australia situated north of the Tropic of Capricorn, and shall be shipped from ports in the said State lying north of the said Tropic to any other ports within or without the Commonwealth of Australia.
- 2. The owner of the ore shall send notice to the Department of Mines, Perth, of his intention to ship ore and claim subsidy thereon, and of the probable quantity to be shipped and date of shipment, at least three weeks before each shipment, and forthwith after shipment shall forward to the said Department a duplicate copy of the bill of lading and a full statement of the gross and net quantity of ore shipped, its assay value for base and precious metals therein contained, and its estimated net value at the port of shipment, together with any other information which may be from time to time called for by the said Department relative to the cost of mining and marketing and value of such ore.
- 3. The owner shall, before or forthwith after each shipment of ore, forward to the Department of Mines at Perth a fair sample of such ore for assay purposes,

of not less than two pounds weight. The sample shall be a fair average sample of the parcel of ore shipped, and shall be taken by the owner in accordance with ore-buyers' practice approved by the State Mining Engineer.

- 4. No subsidy shall be payable (a) on any parcel of ore of less weight than five tons, or (b) on any ore the gross value of which, taking the metals contained according to assay at the current prices in London for the week of shipment, exceeds £13 per ton, or (c) on any ore of a gross assay value of less than £6 per ton, unless the Minister is satisfied that such ore is marketable with reasonable expectation of realising enough to cover expenses of shipment, treatment, and sale.
- 5. The total amount of subsidy payable shall not exceed an average disbursement of £50 per month, and claims will be paid in order or priority of shipment. The Minister shall decide and apportion the amounts payable to various claimants in the event of the claims exceeding the amount of subsidy available.
- 6. When the price of lead in London is £13 12s. 6d. a ton, the subsidy payable shall be 5s. per net ton of ore, but shall be decreased at the rate of one shilling and eightpence per ton for every two shillings and sixpence that the price of the metal rises above £13 12s. 6d., until no subsidy is payable. The subsidy shall be increased at the rate of fourpence per ton for every two shillings and sixpence that the price of the metal falls below £13 12s. 6d. per ton until the maximum subsidy of seven shillings per ton of ore is reached; beyond which amount no subsidy shall be payable.
- 7. The price of lead on which the subsidy is based shall be the average quotation for soft, foreign lead for the week in which shipment is made, as given in George Smith & Son's weekly reports or other published list of London metal market prices approved by the Minister.
- 8. Accounts for subsidy shall be rendered in triplicate on Treasury Form No. 10, and shall be endorsed by the claimant with a statutory declaration that all particulars contained therein are true and correct.
- 9. Copies of all account sales, showing the particulars of sale and all expenses in connection therewith of each parcel of ore, shall be furnished by the owner to the Department of Mines immediately after receipt of same by the said owner, and all payments of subsidy shall be subject to final adjustments in accordance with the figures of net tonnage and assay value on which the parcel is sold, if these are found to make material difference in the amount payable as reckoned from the shipper's statement of weights and value.
- 10. The Minister or any person deputed by him shall have full power and authority to settle finally any question as to the meaning of the foregoing conditions, and from time to time to make such other conditions, not in consistent therewith, as may seem to him necessary for fuller explanation thereof in order to carry out the intention of the Government in providing the subsidies.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws of the Ashburton Road Board, under Section 117 of the Roads Act (2 Edw. VII., No. 48).

WHEREAS by virtue of the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1902" (2 Edward VII., No. 48), the Road Board of every district is empowered to make, publish, alter, modify, amend, or repeal by-laws for any of the purposes of the said Act mentioned: It is therefore ordered by the Ashburton Road Board that from and after the publication thereof in the Government Gazette the following special By-laws relating to the registration of camels, and licensing of camel-drivers, shall come into force.

Special By-laws for the Registration of Camels and the Licensing of Camel-drivers.

The Ashburton Road Board in exercise of the powers conferred by "The Roads Act, 1902," and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make the following By-laws:—

#### Camels to be registered.

1. No person shall own, keep, or use within the Ashburton Road District (hereinafter referred to as "the District") any camel unless such camel is registered for the time being at the office of the Road Board of the said District. Provided that no person shall be required to register a camel under this By-law during such time as the camel is duly registered in the office of some other Road District.

Application for registration. -

2. Application for registration shall be made to the Secretary to the Board by writing in the Form "A" in the Schedule, and shall contain the particulars indicated thereby, and shall be signed by the applicant or his agent.

# Registration fees.

3. The following fees shall be payable on registration of camels plying for hire:—

In respect of every bull camel over three years of age-10s. per annum.

In respect of every camel used for packing—
For every bull camel under three years of age—
10s. per annum.

For every cow or gelding-5s. per annum.

In respect of every camel used for draught only (except bull camels over three years of age)—5s. per annum.

Provided that no registration fee shall be payable in respect of camels used solely by prospectors for prospecting purposes.

# $Certificate\ of\ registration.$

4. A certificate of registration shall be issued by the Secretary to the Board to the applicant in the Form "B" in the Schedule.

# Duration

5. Every registration shall expire on the thirty-first day of December in the year for which such registration is effected.

### Registration discs.

6. On the annual registration of every camel the Board will issue to the applicant a registration disc inscribed with the name of the district and the registration number.

Every person in charge for the time being of such camel shall keep the disc attached to the neck of the camel.

# Camel-drivers' licenses.

7. No person shall drive any camel or camels within the district unless he is the holder of a camel-driver's license in force for the time being issued by the Board of the said district, or unless he is the holder of a license in force for the time being issued by the Board of some other road district.

#### Form of license.

8. A camel-driver's license shall be in the Form "G" in the Schedule, and the licensee shall be required to sign his name in the margin thereof before the license is issued to him.

#### License fee.

9. The fee payable for a camel-driver's license shall be five shillings per annum.

#### Duration of license.

10. Every camel-driver's license shall expire on the thirty-first day of December in the year for which it was granted.

#### Transfer.

11. A camel-driver's license shall be transferable by indorsement at the office of the Board on payment of a fee of one shilling, the transferee to sign his name in the margin thereof.

License and registration certificate to be produced.

12. Every camel-driver shall produce his camel-driver's heense and the certificate of registration for each and every camel in his charge whenever called upon so to do by any constable or officer of police, or any member or officer of the Road Board.

#### Limit of number of camels to be driven.

13. No person shall at the same time drive or take the charge of more than eleven camels, whether draught or pack camels, or partly draught and partly pack camels.

#### Camels to give place to horses, etc.

14. Every camel-driver or other person driving or having the charge of any camel or camels on any road or track, or at any well or watering place, shall, at the request of any person in charge of any horse or mule, forthwith remove any camel or camels which he is driving, or of which he is in charge, to a distance of not less than a quarter of a mile from such road, track, well, or watering place.

#### Unregistered camels may be destroyed.

15. Any unregistered camel found straying in any part of the Board's district may be seized and either sold or destroyed, after such camel has been advertised for three weeks in some paper circulated in the district; the owner shall be liable to pay to the Board the cost and expense incurred, in addition to registration fees.

# Penalty for suffering camels to stray.

16. If any camel is suffered to stray, the owner thereof and any person who having been in charge thereof has suffered it to stray shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

### Penalty for driving diseased camels.

17. If any person drives or rides any camel suffering from any infectious or contagious disease on any road within the district he shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

Public watering places not to be used by diseased camels.

18. No camel suffering from any infectious or contagious disease shall be allowed to water at any public watering place.

Any person who having, as owner, driver, or otherwise, the custody of any camel suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, permits such camel to water at any public watering place shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

#### Diseased camels may be destroyed.

19. It shall be lawful for any officer of the Board or any person acting with the authority of the Board or of any officer of the Board to slaughter and destroy any camels found suffering from any infectious or contagious disease on any road.

# Penalties.

20. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing, contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws and, where not otherwise provided, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.
