The Inspection of Machinery Act, 1904. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

1856/05.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 28th day of July, 1909.

The Colonial Secretary. WHEREAS by Section 14 of "The Inspection of Machi-nery Act, 1904," the Governor may, by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time declare that any kinds of machinery, except as provided in the first paragraph of Section 14 aforesaid, shall be subject to the provisions of the said Act; and in like manner from time to time to declare that any kinds of machiner role time to the to declate that any kinds of machinery shall cease to be machinery subject to the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby declares and orders that from and after the date hereunder mentioned the follow-ing here and after the date hereunder mentioned the following kinds and descriptions of machinery shall be deemed to be machinery for the purposes of the said Act, in addition to those mentioned in the second Schedule thereto, namely:

All machinery used in, upon, or in connection with Mines under the operation of "The Mines Regula-tion Act, 1906," or "The Coal Mines Regulation Act, 1902," air-compressing, conveying, pumping, exhausting, blowing, refrigerating, propelling any boat, ship, or vessel, dredging, preserving, grinding, chopping, crushing, and blending of vegetable or other substance, bone-crushing, malting, wool-pressing, flock-milling, in the working of wood, metal, leather, stone, fabrics, or glass, in the making of gas, brieks, soap or confectionery in potteries of gas, bricks, soap or confectionery, in potteries, laundries, bakeries, electric light and power stations, and aerated water and bottling works."

And declares and orders from and after the date hereunder mentioned to be exempt from, and no longer sub-ject to the said Act, the following machinery (in addition to that specified in Section 4 thereof):

All machinery where the maximum horse-power of All machinery where the maximum horse-power of the engine or motor used in connection therewith is under one horse-power and to which "The Inspec-tion of Machinery Act, 1904," now applies or may hereafter apply. Also all machinery used for domes-tic purposes only. Also direct acting pumps worked by compressed air, and motor cars used for carrying passengers for reward, electric tram cars, railway carriages, and wagon rolling stock, also ropes and cages used in mining." It is hereby further declared and ordered that, from and after the date hereunder mentioned, the two notices dated respectively the 25th day of April, 1905, and the 28th day of February, 1907, each signed by the Hon. the Minister for Mines for the time being, and published respectively at page 1073 of the *Government Gazette* of the 28th day of April, 1905, and page 802 of the *Government Gazette* of the 1st day of March, 1907, and purporting to affect additions to or exemptions from the second Schedule to "The Inspection of Machinery Act, 1904," are and shall be cancelled and revoked.

This Order shall come into operation and take effect from the 28th day of July, 1909.

MUNICIPALITY OF YORK.

BY-LAW No. 57.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of York, made under Part VIII. of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 57, to regulate the lights to be carried by all vehicles.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of York order as follows:---

1. By-law No. 23, gazetted on the 7th day of November, 1902, is hereby repealed.

Interpretation.

1. In these By-laws the following terms shall have the meaning set out against them respectively, that is to sav:

- (a.) "Cycle" means and includes a bicycle, tri-cycle, or other velocipede, or motor cycle.
- cycle, or other velocipede, or motor cycle.
 (b.) ''Motor Car'' means and includes any motor car, automobile, motor carriage, or other carriage or vehicle propelled either partly or wholly by any volatile spirit or electricity, or by any means other than animal power.
 (c.) ''Vehicle'' means any cart, dray, lorry, carriage, van, omnibus, trap, hand-cart, or other conveyance whatsoever, with or without springs.
- springs.
- (d.) "Portable Engine" means any steam lorry, traction or other engine or machine on its own wheels, and includes a street roller. whether driven by steam or horse power. (c.) "Trailer" means any vehicle, motor car, or
- portable engine attached to or hauled or drawn by another vehicle, motor car, or portable engine.

2. It shall be unlawful between sunset and sunrise for any person to ride, drive, impel, haul, or place on any road any cycle, motor car, vehicle, portable engine, or trailer unless a lamp or lamps as hereinafter pre-scribed is or are attached to the cycle, motor car, vehicle, portable engine, or trailer, exhibiting a light or lights as hereinafter prescribed kept continually burning suf-ficient to afford clear and adequate means of signalling the approach or position of the cycle, motor car, vehicle, portable engine, or trailer.

Cycles.

One lamp attached to the front of the cycle and exhibiting a white light in the direction in which the cycle is proceeding or is intended to proceed.

Hand Carts.

One lamp attached to the front of the hand cart and exhibiting a white light in the direction in which the hand cart is proceeding or is intended to proceed.

Vehicles other than Hand Carts.

One or two lamps attached to the front of the vehicle and exhibiting a white light or white lights in the direc-tion in which the vehicle is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and if only one such lamp it shall be attached on the "off" or "right" side of the vehicle.

Motor Cars.

At least two lamps attached to the front of the motor and exhibiting white lights in the direction in which the motor car is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and one lamp attached to the back of the motor car and exhibiting a red light from the rear of the motor car and throwing a white light on the number of the car.

Portable Engines.

Two lamps attached to the front of the portable engine, Two lamps attached to the front of the portable engine, one to be affixed on each side of the portable engine, and exhibiting white lights in the direction in which the portable engine is proceeding or is intended to pro-ceed, and one lamp attached to the front of the port-able engine between the white lights exhibiting a green light in the direction in which the portable engine is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and one lamp attached to the back of the portable engine and exhibiting a green light from the rear of the portable engine.

Trailers.

Similar lights as would be required to be attached if the vehicle was driven or impelled. Any person committing a breach of this By-law shall

be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

BULONG CEMETERY.

By-laws.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in them, the Board of Trustees of the Bulong Cemetery make the following By-laws, that is to say:

1. All fees and charges payable to the trustees in accordance with Schedule A shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.

2. No interment shall be permitted in the cemetery unless an order for burial be obtained, in the form of Schedule B, from the secretary or the trustees.

3. The following information must be handed to the secretary in writing when application for interment is made:—

- (a.) The age, name, and denomination of deceased.
- (b.) The date and time of the burial.
- (c.) The officiating minister.
- (d.) The undertaker.

4. The time stated in the application for burial as in By-law 3 shall be the time for the funeral to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed, or a further charge can be made, as in Schedule A.

5. No burial shall be allowed to take place before eight in the morning, nor after six in the evening, on any day throughout the year, except by special permission, and upon payment of the fee for burials not in the usual hours, as in Schedule A.

6. The trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person desiring to construct a brick grave or vault upon land to which he has obtained the exclusive right, shall be permitted to construct the same under the direction of the secretary, provided that the plans thereof be submitted to and approved of by the trustees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, and made and kept air-tight.

7. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, except that the trustees may allow a lesser depth in those for the burial of infants.

8. Prior to conducting any interment in the cemetery, or making use of the cemetery for any purpose connected with interments, every undertaker shall pay to the trustees an annual fee of 10s. 6d., and shall at the time of making such payments give his assent in writing to such conditions as the trustees may deem fit to impose. Upon such assent being given, and payment of the fee, he shall receive a permit, in the form of Schedule C, to hold good until the first day of January following; and unless in the possession of such a permit, no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the cemetery.

9. Every coffin shall have upon the lid a lead or copper plate, with the name of the deceased and date of burial thereon.

10. Any person desiring ground in the cemetery for a private grave, tomb, vault, cenotaph, tombstone and railing, wall, or for any other purpose, shall apply to the trustees therefor. If approved, the trustees shall, on payment of the required fees, issue to such person so applying a grant of exclusive right of burial in the form specified in Schedule D; and such person or his executor may, with the consent of the trustees, assign this right to any other person on payment of a registration fee. See Schedules A and E.

11. No catacomb shall be allowed.

12. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery shall submit a plan of such monument, tombstone, or enclosure, and specify the materials of which it is to be composed, to the trustees, and shall obtain permission, in writing, before proceeding with the work, in the form of Schedule F.

13. Monumental masons and other tradesmen or any person, other than the sexton, employed to do any work in the cemetery shall before commencing such work deposit with the secretary to the trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if the provisions of these By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the secretary.

14. Any person who shall erect or place any monument or tombstone or enclosure upon any ground, the exclusive right of burial in which has not been obtained, shall keep the same in repair; and, if after receiving one month's notice in writing from the secretary to the trustees, such repairs are not effected, then the trustees may order such monument, etc., to be removed.

15. All materials required in the making, repairing, or completion of any work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and all refuse and rubbish and material remaining after any work is completed shall be removed from the cemetery at once and at the expense of the person causing the same.

16. Any person taking part in the dressing of or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules, namely:---

(a.) No rubbish or any material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave or pathway, and if placed upon any adjoining ground, it shall be removed immediately after the completion of the work.

- (b.) No loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing graves.
- (c.) No grave shall be dressed in wet weather, except by special permission of the secretary, nor shall any materials be wheeled or carted along any path or road while the surface is soft by rain or otherwise.
- (d.) The work in all cases must be carried on with due despatch, and only in working hours.

17. Any workman or other employee, employed by the trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, when in the cemetery, be subject to the supervision, direction, and control of the secretary, and shall obey all such directions, and shall be removable from the cemetery upon any breach of the By-laws, or any refusal or neglect to comply with or obey such directions.

18. No bieycle or vehicle of any description shall be allowed in the cemetery, except the hearse, the horses of which shall not be driven faster than a walking pace, nor anywhere, except on the roads. And, with the exception of these horses, no animals of any kind shall be allowed in the cemetery, except by the permission of the trustees.

19. No child under the age of ten years shall be admitted into the cemetery, except in charge of a responsible person.

20. No smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery, nor shall any explosives or fireworks be discharged therein except by special permission.

21. No person in the cemetery or its approaches shall commit any nuisance, or trespass, or be guilty of any breach of decorum, or ent, pluck, gather, or take out of the cemetery any flower, plant, shrub, or tree, or any part thereof, or do any injury whatsoever thereto, or to any plot, border, railing, fence, or any erection, or road, or remove or interfere with anything laid, built, or placed on any grave or plot or place; and any person so doing shall be proceeded against under the provisions of the Act.

22. No person shall promote or advertise, or carry on, within the cemetery or its precincts or approaches, any trade or business or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of cards or circulars, or otherwise, or any other system of advertisement whatever.

23. Any person committing a breach of these By-laws shall thereupon be forthwith removable from the cemetery by the trustees or secretary, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly in addition to any other proceedings or penalties to which such person may be subject.

24. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds, and in the case of a continuing breach, not exceeding one pound for every day during which such breach continues.

25. All fees may be recovered and all proceedings under these By-laws may be taken before two justices in petty sessions except when otherwise provided for.

26. The secretary, as referred to in these By-laws, means the person for the time being employed by the trustees as such for the cemetery, and such a person shall, subject to the trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, and to the carrying out the enforcement of these By-laws, and the direction of such person shall in all cases and for all purposes be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the trustees.

27. A plan of the cemetery, showing the distribution, sections, and graves numbered, a register of burials, and grants of exclusive right of burial, shall be kept by the secretary.

#### THE ROADS ACT, 1902.

Special By-laws to regulate the Lights to be carried by all Vehicles.

#### BULONG ROAD BOARD.

WHEREAS by virtue of the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1902" (2 Edward VII., No. 48), the Board of every Road District is empowered to make, alter, or repeal By-laws for any of the purposes of the said Act: It is therefore ordered by the Bulong Road Board that the By-law dealing with lights to be carried by vehicles, No. 50, passed on the 29th May, One thousand nine hundred, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the tenth day of August, One thousand nine hundred, is hereby repealed and that the following By-laws shall from and after the approval thereof by the Governor and publication in the *Government Gazette* have the force of law within the said district.

#### Interpretation.

1. In these By-laws the following terms shall have the meaning set out against them respectively, that is to say:---

(a.) "Cycle" means and includes a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede, or motor cycle.

- (b.) "Motor Car" means and includes any motor car, automobile, motor carriage, or other carriage or vehicle propelled either partly or wholly by any volatile spirit or electricity, or by any means other than animal power.
- (c.) "Vehicle" means any cart, dray, lorry, carriage, van, omnibus, trap, hand-cart, or other conveyance whatsoever, with or without springs.
- (d.) "Portable Engine" means any steam lorry, traction or other engine or machine on its own wheels, and includes a street roller whether driven by steam or horse power.
- (e.) "Trailer" means any vehicle, motor car, or portable engine attached to or hauled or drawn by another vehicle, motor car, or portable engine.

2. It shall be unlawful between sunset and sunrise for any person to ride, drive, impel, haul, or place on any road any cycle, motor car, vehicle, portable engine, or trailer unless a lamp or lamps as hereinafter prescribed is or are attached to the cycle, motor car, vehicle, portable engine, or trailer, exhibiting a light or lights as hereinafter prescribed kept continually burning sufficient to afford clear and adequate means of signalling the approach or position of the cycle, motor car, vehicle, portable engine, or trailer.

#### Cycles.

One lamp attached to the front of the cycle and exhibiting a white light in the direction in which the cycle is proceeding or is intended to proceed.

#### Hand Carts.

One lamp attached to the front of the hand cart and exhibiting a white light in the direction in which the hand cart is proceeding or intended to proceed.

## Vehicles other than hand carts.

One or two lamps attached to the front of the vehicle and exhibiting a white light or white lights in the direction in which the vehicle is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and if only one such lamp it shall be attached on the "off" or "right" side of the vehicle.

#### Motor Cars.

At least two lamps attached to the front of the motor car, one to be affixed on each side of the motor car, and exhibiting white lights in the direction in which the motor car is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and one lamp attached to the back of the motor car and exhibiting a red light from the rear of the motor car and throwing a white light on the number of the car.

### Portable Engines.

W.A.

Two lamps attached to the front of the portable engine, one to be affixed on each side of the portable engine, and exhibiting white lights in the direction in which the portable engine is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and one lamp attached to the front of the portable engine between the white lights exhibiting a green light in the direction in which the engine is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and one lamp attached to the back of the portable engine and exhibiting a green light from the rear of the portable engine.

#### Trailers.

Similar lights as would be required to be attached if the vehicle was driven or impelled.

Any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

The above By-laws were passed at a meeting of the Bulong Road Board, held on the 1st day of March, 1909.
