The question has recently been raised as to the period during which flags should be flown at half-mast in the event of the death of Foreign Sovereigns.

2. As it is desirable to adopt a uniform practice in this respect in all parts of the Empire, the matter was submitted to His Majesty the King for decision, and His Majesty has signified his pleasure that flags should be flown at half-mast on the day of the Sovereign's death,

THE following Report and Finding relating to the circumstances attending the stranding of the s.s. "Ferret" on a reef off Israelite Bay on the night of the 16th July, 1909, have, on the recommendation of the Chief Harbour Master, been approved by the Hon, the Colonial Secretary.

"Ferret" s.s.—Stranding of, on Reef off Israelite Bay.
Albany, 27th July, 1909.

The Chief Harbour Master.

In compliance with your instructions, I have held the preliminary inquiry into the circumstances attending the stranding of the steamer "Ferret" on the night of the 16th July, 1909.

The "Ferret" is an iron vessel of 246 tons net register, and owned by the Adelaide Steamship Company; she is engaged in Coastal service between Albany and Eucla.

After examining Arthur Walden, Master; Roy D. Hack, Chief Engineer; Stephen George Webb, 2nd Officer; Lawrence George Gorman, Boatswain, and Patrick Farrell, A.B., I have to report that the s.s. "Ferret" left Alexander River on the 16th inst., at noon, for Point Malcolm and Israelite Bay. She arrived off Cape Paisley at 4.45 p.m. and had Bellinger Island abeam, distant one mile, at 5.32 p.m. At 6.22 p.m. the vessel was off Point Malcolm, where it was intended to land mails, etc.; but as no light was shown to guide the vessel to the anchorage, the engines were slowed and the vessel kept, as far as could be judged, in the vicinity about an hour. Signals were made to attract attention, but no shore light could be seen, and the Master decided to proceed to Israelite Bay. The engines were put at full speed, and a course set N.E.N. This was at 7.23 p.m. The wind was light from N.E., night very dark and gloomy with rainy appearance. At 8.56 p.m. the light usually shown at Israelite Bay to guide vessels to the anchorage bore West Magnetic. The course was altered towards the light, and the engines slowed. At 9.3 p.m. the 2nd Officer reported breakers ahead. The engines were reversed, but the vessel struck before her way could be stopped. The engines were kept going astern at intervals, and the vessel floated at 9.45 p.m. The Master, being uncertain of his position, anchored in four fathoms, and at daylight next morning went into Israelite Bay, landed mails, etc., and left for Albany via Ports at 11.40 a.m. same data 17th inst

The "Ferret" has been surveyed, and is apparently only slightly damaged. She will, however, be docked next month.

After careful consideration of evidence, I find:

- (a.) That the steamer "Ferret" was well navigated to a position off Point Malcolm.
- (b.) That it is probable that while the vessel was off Point Malcolm she was, unknown to the Master, set off shore.
- (c.) That the course steered took her farther off Dempster Point than usual, and that the reef she struck is uncharted.
- she struck is uncharted.

 (d.) That in view of the coast being imperfectly surveyed, and with no light or other well defined mark to enable the Master to ascertain

his position off Point Malcolm correctly, he, the Master, was injudicious in trying to make Israelite Bay, but that no charge can be brought against any person concerned.

(e.) That the practice of vessels calling at Israelite
Bay and Point Malcolm at night-time should,
under existing conditions, be discontinued.
