[L.s.] WHEREAS by "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," it is provided that the Governor may from time to time by Proclamation prohibit, either absolutely or to time by Proclamation prohibit, either absolutely or except in accordance with the regulations under the said Act, the bringing into any specified portion of Western Australia from any other portion or specified portion of Western Australia of any specified plant, fruit, fungus, parasite, insect, or other thing, which in his opinion is diseased or likely to spread disease: And whereas in the opinion of His Excellency the Governor the bringing of locally grown potatoes from any place within a radius of twenty (20) miles from the Central Railway Station in Perth to any other portion of the State of Western Australia, with the exception of the Eastern Goldfields, is likely to spread the disease known as Irish Potato Blight: Now therefore I, the said Governor, do hereby prohibit the bringing of locally grown potatoes from any place within a radius of twenty (20) miles from the Central Railway Station in Perth into any portion of the State, except the Eastern Goldfields, without a permit in writing of an Inspector under the said Act or other duly authorised Officer.

This Proclamation shall have operation and effect on and from the date of its publication in the Government Gazette of Western Australia.

WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Roads Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter bylaws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the Government Gazette: And whereas it is deemed expedient that all the unalienated portions it is deemed expedient that all the unalienated portions of Boyup Brook Townsite for the purpose of a temporary common should be placed under the control of Upper Blackwood Road Board as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserve under the control of Upper Blackwood Road Board as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said Reserve, for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon, for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

THE following particulars of a Prize Competition, to be held under the direction of the Chamber of Commerce of Turin, Italy, in connection with the International Exhibition at Turin in 1911, are published for general information.

Conditions for the Prize-Competition opened by the Chamber of Commerce of Turin.

- 1. The Chamber of Commerce of Turin has instituted a prize of Two thousand pounds (£2,000), to be assigned on the occasion of the International Exhibition of work, which will take place in Turin in 1911, to any invention, discovery or contrivance of whatever nature, or applied to whatever activity, which in practice will prove advantageous to the national economy.
- 2. The prize of Two thousand pounds is constituted of contributions by instalments, made by the Chamber with sums allotted for that purpose in their own balanceaccount.
- 3. The prize will be awarded by the Chamber of Commerce of Turin on the basis of the designation of a special Jury appointed by the aforesaid Chamber of Commerce.
- 4. The Jury shall be composed of an odd number of members. They will elect their own President, and the Secretary of the Chamber of Commerce, with a right of vote, will act as Secretary to the Jury.

They will have to pronounce within the year 1911, save that the Chamber may prorogue this term of time for six months more, at the request of the Jury.

The judgment of the Jury will be final.

- 5. A special Commission, appointed by the President of the Chamber among the members of the same, will provide for the regulation of the Competition and for all relative charges.
 - The competition is international.

Those among the competitors who have sent the object with which they compete to the Exhibition of Turin in the year 1911 will have a right to ask to be exempted from presenting documents or objects under art. 9, provided they prove their being exhibitors, and declare that they authorise the Jury to examine their invention on the object exhibited.

- 7. The prize will not be divisible among several competitors.
- 8. The inventions or works discovered or made public before the year 1908 will not be admitted to the competition.
- The competitors wishing for admission may supply their applications with such memorials, projects, drawings, as they will think fit, and send also the machines. apparatuses, tools, relative to their invention. In case of cumbersome objects the Chamber does not engage to supply the space necessary for their deposit.
- 10. The application, to be written in Italian or French, must have the competitor's signature duly authenticated by a competent authority. In the case of a manufacturer or a merchant dwelling in Italy, the authentication by the Chamber of Commerce of the district will be sufficient.
- 11. The term for the application to be made in is, without prorogation, due on the 31st of March, 1911, This term having expired, neither documents nor projects will be accepted, nor any addition permitted in any form to be made by the competitors to that which they will have sent to the Commission.
- 12. The applications to be sent with return-receipt and any other communication relative to the aforesaid Competition must be addressed to the Chamber of Commerce of Turin-Commission for the Prize-Competition.

MUNDARING GENERAL CEMETERY.

By-laws.

By virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Mundaring General Cemetery, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:-

- 1. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the Cemetery shall make application to the Cemetery Superintendent, in the prescribed form.
- Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon. No coffin not complying with this By-law shall be admitted to or be interred in the Cemetery.
- 3. Subject to the By-laws, and to the directions of the Trustees, the Superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the Cemetery.
- 4. No headstone, board, or grave-fence shall be erected on or near any grave unless the ground on which such grave is situated be first leased.
- 5. Any person desiring to place or erect, or to alter or to add to any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of the principal Act (61 Vict., No. 23).
- 6. No person shall be allowed to bury in any part of the Cemetery except the public or common ground, unless the ground be first leased.
- 7. No carriage, except that bearing the corpse, shall be allowed to enter the Cemetery; and any such carriage must, on leaving the Cemetery, proceed round one or other of the blocks to avoid turning on the road.
- 8. Any person who shall enter or leave the Cemetery by any other means than through the gate, or wilfully destroy, injure, or remove, or cause to be destroyed, injured, or removed, any Cemetery records, or certified copies thereof, or any monument, tombstone, grave, enclosure, pegs, Cemetery fencing, trees, plants, or seats will be prosecuted according to law.
 - 9. Smoking within the Cemetery is strictly prohibited.
- 10. The following fees shall be payable for the several objects in connection with the Cemetery, and in all cases such fees shall be prepaid:—

For lease of block 9ft.0in. x 4ft. 6in., for 99 years, £1 5s.

- For lease of block 9ft. 0in. x 9ft. 0in., for 99 years, £2, and 2s. 6d. per annum for keeping such grave clean, unless lessee attends to it. Intergrave clean, unless lessee attends to it. Interment fee, including digging grave, 7ft. 0in. by usual length and breadth, 15s. Interment fee, including digging grave 6ft. 0in. by usual length and breadth, 11s., and a further charge of 5s. per cubic yard for any extra dimensions of grave. For delay in burial beyond appointed time, 1s. for every hour or part of hour; search of Cemetery records, 2s. 6d.; certified copy of entry, 2s. 6d.
- 11. Any person committing any breach of any of these By-laws and Regulations, or of any other Rules, Regulations, or By-laws, lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to cemeteries, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and in case of a continuing breach, a further sum not exceeding £1 for every day during which such breach continues, and shall be forthwith removable from the Cemetery by the Trustees, the Superintendent, or other officer of the Trustees, and shall be treated as a trespasser and may be proceeded against accordingly.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws of the Upper Blackwood Road Board, under Section 117 of the Roads Act, 2 Edwardi VII., No. 48.

The Roads Act, 1902.

WHEREAS by "The Roads Act, 1902," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned, the Upper Blackwood Road Board, being the Road Board for the District of Upper Blackwood, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act, and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

Interpretation.

- 1. In these By-laws the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meanings set against them respectively, that is to say:—
 - "District"—The locality or area for the time being under the control of the Upper Blackwood Road Board.
 - "Chairman"—The member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board.
 - "Member"-A member of the Board.
 - "The Act" -- "The Roads Act of 1902," and all amendments thereto, or which may come into force hereafter, as far as the Act allows.
 - "Road or Reserve" —A road or reserve, as the case may be, under the control of the Board.
 - "Person" shall include the plural and also a body corporate.

Duties of Secretary.

- 2. The duties of Secretary shall be:-
 - (a.) To attend all Board meetings.
 - (b.) To attend all Committee meetings.
 - (c.) To take notes of meetings and prepare reports of Committees.
 - (d.) Conduct all correspondence and to give the other officers instructions as decided by the minutes.
 - (e.) To answer all questions on the Board's business.
 - (f.) To see that the accounts are audited once a year, and the balance sheet prepared and published yearly in the Government Gazette and at least one newspaper circulating in the district.
 - (g.) To supervise the preparation of the Rate Book and the Board's Electoral Lists; to examine proofs of the latter and to arrange for the distribution of copies prior to elections; also to attend all courts of revision or appeal; to make the necessary arrangements for the elections; to issue instructions to the supervisor in accordance with the Board's resolutions.
 - (h.) To summon the members to Board and Committee meetings.
 - (i.) To keep the cash-book and other books required to show receipts and expenditure of the Board, and to write up the said books every month ready for inspection by the Board or any member of the Board desiring to see them.
 - (j.) To pay into the bank, within seven days after receipt, to the credit of the Board, all money received by him on behalf of the Board.
 - (k.) No money shall be paid into the bank to the credit of the Board by any officer except by or through the Secretary, who shall give all receipts; to readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board; and

to attend to all other matters affecting the finances of the Board and not herein specified.

Supervisor's Duties.

- 3. (a.) The duties of the Supervisor shall be to promptly attend all instructions received through the Secretary.
 - (b.) To prepare proper plans and specifications of all works and improvements, as regards roads and bridges under the control of the Board, situate within the District; to examine all material employed in such work, and to see that same is faithfully and properly executed and performed; to lay out such work as to height, lines, and dimensions; to submit all specifications to the Board before tenders are called.
 - (c.) To see that the work of repairing all public roads is properly carried out.
 - (d.) To see that all drains, culverts, and bridges are maintained in a state of efficiency.
 - (c.) To attend all Board and Committee meetings, if required.
 - (f.) To examine all roads throughout the District at least twice a year.
 - (g.) To render to the Secretary, when required, reports and accounts of all matters under his control; to supply monthly to the Board returns of all work completed or in progress, with remarks thereon.

Appointment of Officers.

4. No permanent appointment shall be made to any office under the Board until an advertisement has been published in one or more local newspapers calling for applications from persons competent to fill such appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board.

Meetings and Proceedings.

- 5. (a.) Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds, "Ordinary" and "Special." Ordinary meetings are those called by the Chairman or Secretary as often as seems proper for the transaction of ordinary business of the Board; special meetings are those called to consider special business, the nature of which shall be notified on the notice paper summoning the meeting. No business shall be transacted at a special meeting other than that for which the special meeting was called. Ordinary meetings shall be held at the Agricultural Hall, Upper Blackwood, on the last Saturday in the month, at 10 o'clock a.m., unless otherwise arranged by resolution carried to that effect at the preceding ordinary meeting of the Board.
- (b.) Any three members may require the Board room to be cleared of strangers, and the Chairman, or other presiding Chairman, shall immediately give directions to have the order executed.
- (c.) At all meetings where there is not a quorum present, or when the Board is counted out (which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than a quorum present), such circumstances, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the minute book.
- $(d\cdot)$ The first business at all meetings of the Board shall be the reading of the minutes of the preceding meeting aloud, with a view to their confirmation.

$Order\ of\ Business.$

- 6. The order of all business at ordinary meetings shall be as follows, that is to say:—
 - (a.) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary and special meetings (if any).
 - (b.) Consideration of business arising out of minutes.
 - (c.) Reading of correspondence (in and out), and taking such action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto.
 - (d.) Presentation of petitions and memorials, and Committee reports, and consideration thereof.
 - (e.) Consideration of tenders, and ratification of contracts.
 - (f.) General business.
 - (g.) Passing of accounts for payment,

Order of Debate.

7. A member having audience shall not digress from the subject of debate.

Motions and Amendments,

- 8. (a.) A motion once moved cannot be withdrawn unless by consent of the Board.
- A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the Chairman.
- (c.) No member shall speak twice on the same subject, except by way of explanation.

Urgent Work.

9. Any member is empowered to authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding Two pounds, but shall in every case report the same at the next meeting of the Board.

To prevent Damage to Board Property.

10. No person, without having first obtained the written sanction of the Board, shall break up, cut down, damage, destroy, or injure any gutter, drain, culvert, bridge, road, public way, tree, gate, fence, post, implements, materials, buildings, or other property of the Board, or under the control thereof.

Damaging Roads.

11. No person shall damage or destroy by means of horse, team, wagon, dray, or other means, any road or portion of a road, under construction or repair, and any person found guilty of such damage or destruction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

12. Any person who:-

- (a.) Cuts or removes, without the consent in writing of the Chairman of the Board, timber, earth, sand, gravel, stone, or other materials from a road; or
- (b.) Erects any building or structure whatsoever, without the consent aforesaid, upon a road so as to encroach thereon; or
- (c.) Draws, without the consent aforesaid, across the waterside of a road, except over a properly constructed approach or culvert, a dray or other wheeled vehicle; or
- (d.) Draws upon a road timber, stone, or other material otherwise than on a wheeled vehicle, or suffers such material, when carried principally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle, to drag or trail upon a road, or draws upon a road a whim or timber carriage any portion of which, or any portion of chains attached thereto, or any portion of any other attachment trails or drags upon a road, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

Heavy Traffic.

13. A yearly license fee of £2 per pair of wheels shall be paid for every jinker or whim used within the District, and no person shall use, on any declared road within the District, any jinker or whim for which a current license shall not have been issued. No single or two-wheeled jinker or whim shall be allowed on any declared read within the District. declared road within the District.

Licenses.

- 14. All licenses are due on the first day of January, and the owner of every vehicle within the District shall take out a license for same on or before the first day of March in each year.
- 15. The owner of every licensed vehicle shall have his license number affixed on some conspicuous part of the off side of such vehicle.

Any person who shall refuse or neglect to have such numbers so affixed shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

Penalties.

16. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall

be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and, where not otherwise provided, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

It is hereby resolved by the Road Board of the Upper Blackwood District, subject to and by and with the approval and confirmation of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the above By-laws shall be in force within the said Upper Blackwood District from the date of publication thereof in the Government Gazette.
