None of the above-mentioned services include the cost of any crane or other appliance hired from the Trust to do the work.

NOTICE is hereby given that on and after the 20th inst. the 1st Order Flashing White Light will be exhibited from the Lighthouse erected on Hokasho (Agincourt Island).

The position of the Lighthouse, according to the Japanese Admiralty Chart No. 232, is in Latitude 25deg. 37min. 45sec. North, and in Longitude 122deg. 4min. 15sec. East of Greenwich.

The Lighthouse is built of brick, circular in shape, painted white, and 70 feet high from the base to the centre of the light.

The light will illuminate the whole horizon, showing one flash every 15 seconds, but for an arc of 52deg. of the horizon from N. 42deg. W. to S. 86deg. W., it may be obscured by the land if the vessel comes within two nautical miles from the Lighthouse. The bearings are magnetic and from seaward.

The light will have a power of 864,000 candles. It will be 480 feet high above high water, and visible in clear weather at a distance of 30 nautical miles.

The Lightkeepers at this station on hearing fog-signals, during thick and foggy weather, will fire two guns with an interval of two minutes between them, and, if the vessel's fog-signal is still heard, will repeat the firing after a space of five minutes.

# Regulation No. 118.

Charges on Bunker Coal.

Regulation No. 118, as made on the 6th day of September, 1907, and the amendment of same, as made on the 9th day of March, 1909, are hereby repealed, in so far as regards the handling charges on Bunker Coal, and the following is enacted in lieu thereof, viz:—

- (a.) Coal loaded into boxes or other similar receptacles, prior to being brought on to the premises of the Trust for tipping into ship's bunkers, and arriving alongside a ship on railway wagons, being tipped by the ship's labour, shall be 5d. per ton of coal handled.
- (b) Where the above-mentioned boxes or receptacles are tipped by Trust labour, 8d. per ton of coal handled.

Whereas by virtue of the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1902" (2 Edward VII., No. 48), the Road Board of every district is empowered to make, publish, alter, modify, amend, or repeal by-laws for any of the purposes of the said Act mentioned: It is therefore ordered by the Upper Gascoyne Road Board that from and after the publication thereof in the Government Gazette the following Special By-laws relating to the registration of camels and licensing of camel-drivers shall come into

# UPPER GASCOYNE ROAD DISTRICT.

Special By-laws for the Registration of Camels and the Licensing of Camel-drivers,

The Upper Gascoyne Road Board, in exercise of the powers conferred by "The Roads Act, 1902," and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make the following By-laws:-

# Camels to be Registered.

1. No person shall own, keep, or use within the Upper Gascoyne Road District (hereinafter referred to as "the District") any camel unless such camel is registered for the time being at the office of the Road Board of the said District. Provided that no person shall be required to register a camel under this By-law during such time as the camel is duly registered in the office of some other Road District. Road District.

# Application for Registration.

2. Application for registration shall be made to the Secretary to the Board by writing in the Form "A" in the Schedule, and shall contain the particulars indicated thereby, and shall be signed by the applicant or his agent.

#### Registration Fees.

3. The following fees shall be payable on registra-

tion of camels plying for hire:—

In respect of every bull camel over three years of age—£1 per annum.

In respect of every camel used for packing—

For every bull camel under three years of age— £1 per annum.

For every cow or gelding—10s, per annum.

In respect of every camel used for draught only (except bull camels over three years of age)—

10s. per annum.

Provided that no registration fee shall be payable in respect of camels used solely by prospectors for prospecting purposes.

#### Certificate of Registration.

4. A certificate of registration shall be issued by the Secretary to the Board to the applicant in the Form "B" in the Schedule.

#### Duration.

5. Every registration shall expire on the thirty-first day of December in the year for which such registration is effected.

# Registration Discs.

6. On the annual registration of every camel the Board will issue to the applicant a registration disc inscribed with the name of the district and the registration number.

Every person in charge for the time being of such camel shall keep the disc attached to the neck of the camel.

#### Camel-drivers' Licenses.

No person shall drive any camel or camels within the district unless he is the holder of a camel-driver's license in force for the time being issued by the Board of the said district, or unless he is the holder of a license in force for the time being issued by the Board of some other Road District.

#### Form of License.

8. A camel-driver's license shall be in the Form "C" in the Schedule, and the licensee shall be required to sign his name in the margin thereof before the license is issued to him.

# $License \ \ Fee.$

9. The fee payable for a camel-driver's license shall be five shillings per annum.

# $Duration \ of \ License.$

10. Every camel-driver's license shall expire on the thirty-first day of December, in the year for which it was granted.

# Transfer.

11. A camel-driver's license shall be transferable by indorsement at the office of the Board on payment of a fee of one shilling, the transferee to sign his name in margin thereof.

License and Registration Certificate to be produced.

12. Every camel-driver shall produce his cameldriver's license and the certificate of registration for each and every camel in his charge whenever called upon so to do by any constable or officer of police, or any member or officer of the Road Board.

## Limit of Number of Camels to be driven,

13. No person shall at the same time drive or take the charge of more than eleven camels, whether draught

or pack camels, or partly draught and partly pack camels.

14. In all cases of camels meeting or overtaking a horse or bullock team, or a vehicle of any description, the person in charge or the driver of such camels shall, when within two hundred yards of the team or vehicle, take the camels off the road and at least twenty yards from the centre thereof.

15. No camel-owners or persons in charge of camels

shall allow the camels to remain at a well or pool more than half an hour for the purpose of watering, or allow any camels to camp within a-half of a mile of any well or natural surface water, nor allow any camels to camp less than 300 yards from any road.

# Unregistèred Camels may be destroyed.

16. Any unregistered camel found straying in any part of the Board's district may be seized and either sold or destroyed, after such camel has been advertised for three weeks in some paper circulated in the district; the owner shall be liable to pay to the Board the cost and expense incurred, in addition to registration fees.

# Penalty for suffering Camels to Stray.

17. If any camel is suffered to stray, the owner thereof and any person who having been in charge thereof has suffered it to stray shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

# Penalty for driving Diseased Camels.

18. If any person drives or rides any camel suffering from any infectious or contagious disease on any road within the district he shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

Public Watering Places not to be used by Diseased Camels.

19. No camel suffering from any infectious or contagious disease shall be allowed to water at any public

watering place.

Any person who having, as owner, driver, or otherwise, the custody of any camel suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, permits such camel to water at any public watering place shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

## Diseased Camels may be destroyed.

- 20. It shall be lawful for any officer of the Board or any person acting with the authority of the Board or of any officer of the Board to slaughter and destroy any camels found suffering from any infectious or contag-ious disease on any road.
- 21. No camel-driver shall permit his camels to camp within a quarter of a mile of any gate on any road in the District.
