MUNICIPALITY OF NORTH PERTH.

In pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf under Section 204 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Mayor and Councillors of North Perth hereby repeal subsection (c) of By-law No. 47 (Building By-laws), and adopts the following in lieu thereof:—

(c.) Every room used or intended to be used for the purpose of habitation and being part of the main

building, must be at least 10 feet 6 inches in height from floor to ceiling; and rooms with lean-to roofs must average at least 9 feet in height from floor to ceiling.

REGULATIONS APPLYING TO CROWN LANDS WITHIN THE DENMARK ESTATE.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations made by the Minister for Lands under Section 16 of "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1909."

Regulations.

1. These Regulations apply to all Crown Land open for selection within the Denmark Estate (Plantagenet District).

2. In addition to the improvements prescribed by Subsection (5) of Section 55 of "The Land Act, 1898," every lessee under Section 55 and 56 respectively of the said Act of land within the said estate shall expend on the land applied for during every half-year of the term of three years from the date of the approval of his application such sum as is hereinafter provided in scrub cutting, sucker cutting, cultivating, grubbing, or in some other manner, to the satisfaction of the Minister, so as to keep down the scrub and undergrowth.

The said sum to be so expended in each half-year shall be an amount equal to one-fortieth of the purchase money for the land, less threepence per acre.

3. Every lessee shall, until the purchase money is paid in full, effectually maintain all improvements on the land, including clearing, to the satisfaction of the Minister.

ARMADALE-KELMSCOTT DISTRICT ROAD BOARD.

Special By-laws dealing with Heavy Traffic, and with Cycle and Motor Traffic.

WHEREAS by "The Roads Act, 1902," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all and any purposes in the said Act mentioned, the Armadale-Kelmscott Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act, and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

Heavy Traffic.

1. The owner of every vehicle or engine which, together with its load, shall weigh more than five tons, shall travel the roads, bridges, and culverts at his own risk, and shall be liable to pay for any damage done.

2. That the special yearly license fee for vehicles engaged in heavy traffic, that is to say, in carrying stone, bricks, lime, timber, earth, gravel, mineral, liquid, or any other heavy substance whatever, shall be as follows:—

- (a.) For vehicles of two wheels, 2s. 6d. per wheel per calendar month, or portion of a calendar month, or an alternative fee of £2 per annum.
- (b.) For vehicles of four wheels or more, 5s. per wheel per calendar month, or portion of a calendar month, or an alternative fee of £8 per annum.
- (c.) Such amounts shall be additional to those prescribed under "The Cart and Carriage Licensing Act, 1876."

3. The Board may, by notice affixed to any bridge or culvert, declare the maximum weight of any engine, agricultural or other machine, or vehicle of any kind, and of any load or material which shall be permitted to cross such bridge or culvert, and also the pace or speed at which such engine, machine, vehicle, or load shall be driven, led, or taken over any such bridge or culvert, and any person who shall cross such bridge or culvert in contravention of this By-law shall, in addition to any liability for any damage he may have caused, and except with the written permission of the Board, be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Cycle or Motor Traffic.

4. (a.) Every cycle or motor shall carry a bell, or other instrument suitable for giving warning of approach, which shall be used as a signal whenever any person on foot or on horseback or vehicle is being approached or passed.

(b.) No person shall leave any cycle or motor in or on any road or footway so as to become an obstruction, and every person shall remove his cycle or motor immediately upon being requested to do so by any constable or officer or member of the Board.

(c.) No person riding or driving any cycle or motor shall pass at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour any person who shall be riding or driving any horse or other animal.

(d.) When any person riding or driving any cycle or motor shall meet any horse or other animal, and such horse or animal shall become restive or appear likely to get beyond the control of the person in charge thereof, such person shall stop his cycle or motor, and shall not proceed until such horse or animal has passed.

(e.) No person shall ride or drive any cycle or motor round the corner formed by the junction of any roads in the district, or across the intersection of any of the said roads, at a pace exceeding six miles an hour.

5. No person shall use any motor cycle or motor car in the district unless such motor cycle or motor car is licensed.

Provided that if a license is taken out for a motor cycle or motor car by any person in the district in which he resides, he shall not be required to take out a license in any other district.

6. A motor cycle or motor car license shall be in the form "A" in the schedule, and application for the same shall be made to the Secretary to the Road Board at the office of the Board.

Fee.

The fee for every motor cycle or motor car license shall be five shillings per annum.

7. Every license for a motor cycle or motor car shall expire on the thirty-first day of December in the year for which it was issued.

8. Every licensee of a motor cycle or motor car shall affix and keep affixed the license number on some conspicuous part of the motor cycle or motor car.

Park Lands, Reserves, and Recreation Grounds.

9. The Board may, in its discretion, prohibit any games or gymnastics from being played or carried on by any person or persons upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves upon any Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday.

Penalties.

10. Every person who does, permits, or suffers to be done any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits, or permits, any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and, where not otherwise provided, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

11. All penalties or other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board, and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the district, except so much as may be payable to any informer.

Reg. 21.—For “£4 10s.” read “£6,” and for “£5” read “£7 10s.”

Reg. 26.—For “will” read “may.”

Reg. 46 (d) Note.—In lines 7 and 8 omit “domestic economy and.”

Reg. 49.—In line 2, after “travelling,” insert “expenses.”

Reg. 57.—Add “The amount of leave provided in the above schedules is to be regarded as the maximum amount to be allowed in any triennial period. The first triennial period shall be counted from the first day on which leave is granted. A subsequent triennial period shall be counted from the first day on which leave is granted after the expiration of the previous triennial period.”

Reg. 69.—Add “If a Teacher holding the C2 Classification is placed in charge of a School of Class VI. or an ‘A’ Provisional School, the salary shall be for a male £120 to £140, and for a female £100 to £120.”

Reg. 73.—Delete “They may be of two classes—Junior Monitors and Senior Monitors.”

Reg. 74.—For “14” read “16,” in line 2.

Reg. 75.—Delete “Junior” in line 2, and also the following:—“Applicants whose age, qualifications, experience, etc., make them eligible to sit for the Senior Monitors’ Examination, may do so by special permission of the Department.”

Reg. 76.—Delete Reg. 76 and read, “Candidates who have passed the Junior or Senior Adelaide or some other equivalent University Examination not more than two years previously are eligible to be appointed as Monitors on probation on reaching the age of 16 years, but will be required to sit at the next Monitors’ Examination for those subjects which are not covered by their University Examination. They will be required to serve at least one month without salary, and will not receive permanent appointments as Monitors until they have completed the required examination.”

Reg. 77.—Delete “or by the staff of the Normal School,” and read “or other persons appointed by the Department.”

Reg. 78.—After “rates,” in line 2, read as follows:—

First year: males, £50; females, £36.

Second year: males, £60; females, £45.

Delete the following:—“Before a Monitor can draw the Senior salary he must have passed the examination prescribed for Senior Monitors.” In second paragraph delete “£5 per annum for Juniors or £10 for Seniors,” and insert “£10 per annum.”

Reg. 80.—Delete Reg. 80, and read “Monitors may sit for the ‘C’ Examination, and will be expected to complete it in their second year.”

Reg. 81.—Delete the following words:—“Junior Monitors will assist teachers in the Schools during five half-days in each week; the other five half-days will be devoted to study. Senior.”

Reg. 83.—Delete the following:—“The salary will be within the limits of the scale set out in Regulation 78, but the exact amount will be fixed by the Department,” and substitute the following:—

“Monitors on Supply must be over 14 years of age, and must have passed the Sixth Standard, or an equivalent examination. They will be paid according to the following scale:—

First year: males, £18; females, £12.

Second year: males, £27; females, £18.

On reaching the age of 16, they may sit for the Monitors’ Examination. If they do not pass this Examination, they may sit for the Examination for Unclassified Teachers, and on passing this may be paid according to the following scale:—

First year: males £44; females, £30.

Second and subsequent years: males £55; females, £40.”

Reg. 84.—Delete Reg. 84, and substitute:—

“Candidates who have completed a Secondary School course to the satisfaction of the Department may be appointed as Monitors. They may be required to sit for those subjects specified in the Monitors’ Examination which have not been covered by their school work.”

Reg. 85.—Delete the last sentence, as follows:—“Half-time Manual Training Monitors shall receive their general instruction in the State School to which the Manual Training Centre is attached.”

Reg. 86.—Delete the last sentence, as follows:—“Junior Monitors shall receive their general instruction in the State School to which the Cookery and Laundry Centre is attached.”

Reg. 92.—Delete the following:—“The Final Examination at the Normal School and the Senior Monitors’ Examination will be the Entrance Examinations for the Training College. Candidates who have not been in the Normal School or served as Monitors, and who gain a sufficiently high place in the Examination, will be required to attend a State School for three months without pay, and to give evidence of their fitness for the profession before entering the College,” and substitute “Candidates who have served satisfactorily for at least one year as Monitors may be admitted to the Training College. The Department may, if necessary, hold a competitive examination.”

Reg. 95.—In lines 5 and 6 omit the words “and will be classified as ‘B2’ Teachers when they have gained the Practical Skill Pass,” and insert “provided that they satisfy the Examiners in the subjects prescribed for the ‘B’ Certificate, and in their practical skill in teaching. They will receive the ‘B2’ Classification when they gain the Practical Skill Pass from their Inspectors.” In lines 9 and 11 omit the words “and will be classified as ‘C1’ Teachers when they have gained the Practical Skill Pass,” and insert “provided that they satisfy the Examiners in the subjects prescribed for the ‘C’ Certificate, and in their practical skill in teaching. They will receive the ‘C1’ Classification when they gain the Practical Skill Pass from their Inspectors.”

Reg. 149.—Delete the following:—

- “(b.) Provisional, £3 per annum (or 5s. per month).
 (c.) Schools with an average of 21-35, £4 per annum (or 6s. 8d. per month).
 (d.) Schools with an average of 36-50, £6 per annum (or 10s. per month).
 (e.) In schools of over 50 an allowance at the rate of 2s. per room per week may be granted; closets to be counted as one room. Verandahs and shelter sheds to be counted at half the ordinary rate.”

and substitute—

“All other schools to be paid for at the rate of 2s. per week for a room with floor space of 550 square feet. Smaller rooms to be paid for at proportionate rates. Corridors, passages, and cloak-rooms to be included in the calculation.

Verandahs and shelter sheds, if floored, will be counted at half the ordinary rate; if not floored, at one-quarter the ordinary rate.

Eight closets will be counted at the same rate as one room. Smaller numbers will be paid for at proportionate rates.

Where a school is held in a public hall or other hired building, special rates may be fixed.”

Regulations 21, 69, and 149, as amended, will come into force on 1st July, 1910.
