ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 4th day of April, 1910.

WHEREAS by "The Water Boards Act, 1904," the Governor is empowered by Order in Council to constitute the District of a Local Authority or the Districts of two or more Local Authorities or any part or parts of such, a District or Districts, a Water Area under such name as may be directed: And whereas under the provisions of the said Act the Governor is empowered by Order in

Council to constitute a Water Board to manage and control such area: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby constitute that part of the Kelmescott Road District having the boundaries described in the Schedule hereto a Water Area for the purpose of the said Act under the name of the Armadale Water Area, and does hereby appoint the Kelmescott Road Board to be a Water Board under the name of the Armadale Water Board for the administration of the Act within such area.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 4th day of April, 1910.

Schedule of Boundaries of Armadale Water Area.

Bounded by lines starting from a point on the East-ern side of the Railway Reserve, Armadale, at the inter-section of the South-Western side of John Street with the Western side of Eleventh Avenue, in Canning Loca-tion 31, and extending North-Eastward along the East-ern side of Railway Reserve to the Railway Crossing at the junction of Ninth Avenue and Third Road, thence along Orchard Avenue Eastward and Southward to Gov-ernment Road, thence along Government Road, including all small blocks abutting on the North side of Govern-ment Road, Easterly to junction with Perth-Bunbury Road, thence North-Eastward along the Perth-Bunbury Road to the junction with Albany Road, thence East-ward along Albany Road to a point 2 chains 50 links East of the Eastern side of the Perth-Bunbury Road, thence South-Westward and Southward respectively par-allel to and at a distance of 2 chains 50 links from the Eastern side of the said road to a point in prolongation East of the South side of John Street, thence Westward and North-Westward along the South side of John street to the starting point.

THE Government of Western Australia gives notice that on and after the 1st March, 1910, a Dioptric Fixed, Occulting Light of the 3rd Order will be exhibited from a cement concrete tower of a natural grey colour, erected on Cape Inscription (Dirk Hartog Island), in Latitude 25deg. 29min. 30sec. South, Longitude 112deg. 58min. East.

The Light will be Occulting, showing an eclipse of 2½ seconds every 7½ seconds, as follows:—

Bright, 5 seconds.

Eclipse, 2½ seconds.

Total period, 7½ seconds.

The focal plane of the light, above high water, will be 127 feet, and will be visible between the bearings of North 42deg. East and North 54deg. West. (Bearings magnetic, and given from seaward.)

The Light will be visible in clear weather from a distance of 18 nautical miles.

DENMARK ESTATE.

(Land Open for Selection.)

IT is hereby notified that the unselected improved rural lots within the Denmark Estate are now open for selection under Part V. of "The Land Act, 1898," subject to the value of improvements being assessed on application, and to the Regulations applying to land within the Denmark Estate published hereunder. 2. In addition to the improvements prescribed by Subsection (5) of Section 55 of "The Land Act, 1898," every lessee under Section 55 and 56 respectively of the said Act of land within the said estate shall expend on the land applied for during every half-year of the term of three years from the date of the approval of his application such sum as is hereinafter provided in scrub cutting, sucker cutting, cultivating, grubbing, or in some other manner, to the satisfaction of the Minister, so as to keep down the scrub and undergrowth.
