WHEREAS by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edw. VII, No. 32), the Governor may sever any portion of a municipal district therefrom, and annex the same to any road district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area: And whereas a petition has been presented to His Excellency the Governor of the State of Western Australia, praying for the severance of a portion of the Collie Municipal District therefrom, and for the annexation of such portion to the Collie Road District, signed by a majority of the ratepayers in such portion who have paid their rates on or before the signing of such petition: And whereas the said petition was publicly advertised in the *Government Gazette* on the 11th day of March, 1910, as required by law: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers so vested in him by the said Act, does hereby sever from the Municipality of Collie and annex to the Collie Road District the said portion, the boundaries of which are as follows:—

All that portion of the Collie Municipality situate North of a line passing along the North-Western boundary of Collie Sub. Lot 343, the North-Eastern boundary of Lot 340, the South-Eastern side of Steere Street to Deakin Street, the latter's North-Eastern side, and the North-Western boundaries of Lots 335 and 336 to the right bank of the Collie River.

THE Government of Western Australia gives notice that on and after the 1st March, 1910, a Dioptric Fixed, Occulting Light of the 3rd Order will be exhibited from a cement concrete tower of a natural grey colour, erected on Cape Inscription (Dirk Hartog Island), in Latitude 25deg. 29min. 30sec. South, Longitude 112deg. 58min. East.

The Light will be Occulting, showing an eclipse of 2½ seconds every 7½ seconds, as follows:—

Bright, 5 seconds.
Eclipse, 2½ seconds.
Total period, 7½ seconds.

The focal plane of the light, above high water, will be 127 feet, and will be visible between the bearings of North 42deg. East and North 54deg. West. (Bearings magnetic, and given from seaward.)

The Light will be visible in clear weather from a distance of 18 nautical miles.
