IN consequence of the lamented death of His Most Gracious Majesty King Edward VII., and in pursuance of the provisions contained in the fifth section of "The Bank Holidays Act, 1884," I, the Governor of the State, do by this my Proclamation appoint

Monday, the 9th May, 1910.

a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout the State of Western Australia, in order to admit of the day being set apart as a Day of Mourning by His Majesty's loyal and dutiful subjects in the said State of Western Australia.
